

was crowned as the first "queen of the ball" at Durham High. The seniors thoroughly enjoyed the entertainment provided by the junior class.

# The Hi-Rocket Staff

The *Hi-Rocket*, like thousands of other high-school newspaper members of the Columbia Scholastic Press Association, responded to the appeal of the United States government to use the publication as an active agent for promoting the war effort effectively in the school community.

Realizing the need of a continuation of normal educational activities in direct relation to the war effort, the 1942-43 Hi-Rocket retained its coverage of school activities, and enlarged its scope to include all phases of war service in which students are participating. The Hi-Rocket has published authentic information essential for individuals and groups; it has explained by pen and picture new courses and activities besides those readapted to timely work; and it has featured the unusual in achievement by students, teachers, and alumni in service. This year's staff has endeavored to vary the make-up and types of articles, making each new issue contain something vastly different from the last.

Keeping in step with national rationing of paper and meeting the increased cost of print-

ing, the 1942-43 *Hi-Rocket* curtailed its regular 18 issues to publish only a round dozen. By this sacrifice of quantity the staff has managed to maintain the quality of the publication in keeping with the journalistic standards of former years.

When John Kerr III, editor-in-chief, left for the University of North Carolina to enter the Naval Reserve, the editorship of the 1943 *Hi-Rocket* was assumed by Betty Rezner, former managing editor, while Ralph Rogers, capable business manager, continued in this capacity.

An interview with Wendell Wilkie, 1940 Republican candidate for president, highlighted the host of interviews with famous people presented in the paper this year. Betty Rezner, editor, Carolyn Hooper, and Barbara Barnes were invited to the press conference for Mr. Wilkie at Duke University.

The *Hi-Rocket* was again awarded the gold medal and, in addition, a Victory star for outstanding war effort and All-Columbian honors at the Columbia Scholastic Press Association annual contest.





The collection was exhibited on October 25 for the student body, and on October 29 at the Washington Duke Hotel with the display of the entire Guild.







The high light of the year was the address


of Rev. Richard Adams, of the First Baptist Church of Richmond, Va., who drew an effective analogy between the school and the army on the subject of compiling records of life.





The Physical Education Department of the Durham High School, with limited personnel, is making a vital contribution to the war effort.



Durham High School's Bulldogs of Football were first off just about as easy as any athletic team in "Dear Old D. H. S." because of the present war transportation difficulties. Of course, they spent quite a few days (and nights) riding in day coaches and sleeping on train station floors, but football players are supposed to be tough so you didn't hear any complaining coming from those boys.

Although the Bulldogs had only a 500 percentage in the total of all their games, they had a very good .800 percentage in Eastern Conference play. The boys opened with a victory over a strong Hillsboro High team. The second game resulted in a 3-0 setback at the hands of a powerful Oxford Orphanage eleven. The Bulldogs lost three more games to non-conference foes. They lost close ones to Greensboro, High Point, and the Commodores of Maury High in Norfolk.

The only conference foe who succeeded in knocking off the Bulldogs was the powerful Cyclone eleven of Wilson High School. The Bulldog eleven defeated the four remaining Conference teams, with the most welcomed victory being over the annual rival, Raleigh High School. The other three Conference teams which Durham defeated were Fayetteville, Rocky Mount, and Wilmington.

Durham had one of the lightest teams ever to come out of the school. There was no boy on the first string who weighed over 175 pounds. Although the team was green and inexperienced most of the boys had a better spirit than has been seen around this school in many a year. Coach Seaton Holt did much to bring about this spirit in the boys and much credit goes to him for the showing of the boys on the gridiron this past year.



Durham High's Bulldogs relinquished their hold on the State Scholastic basketball title this year for the first time in six seasons. After capturing the Eastern Conference Class "A" title from Wilming-ton's Wildcats in a play-off series, the locals, coached by Paul G. Sykes, dropped a hotly contested decision to the High Point Black Bisons by the score of 37 to 34 in Chapel Hill for the state title. The Bulldogs, sparked by the play of co-captains Malcolm Earp and Raymond Barnes, captured 12 out

of 16 starts during the season for a won-lost percentage of .750.

New Hanover High School of Wilmington stopped the locals' Conference winning streak at 56 consecutive victories "down by the sea" when they knocked off the Bulldogs by the score of 30 to 25. Durham later came back to polish off the Wildeats twice in a row, however, to win the Eastern title for the sixth straight year.




# Girls Monogram Club



One of Durham High School's greatest contributions to the war effort this year was their part in the rationing program. The Commercial Department was called upon on two occasions to ration fuel oil, first in January and again in April.


On the first occasion approximately 4,000 blanks were filled out, and on the last occasion this figure was raised to 12,000, and the envelopes typed. Assisting in this work were students taking commercial subjects and students having a high scholastic average.

In the first rationing, filling out blanks and typing envelopes was only a part of the process of rationing. Each student, who was helping, counted ration coupons, prepared the validating stamps, and recorded on a single sheet all they had done. The second rationing program was very much the same except the students worked in groups of five rather than individually.

This was under the supervision of Miss Ethel M. Solloway, head of the Commercial Department, assisted by the other commercial teachers.

On several other occasions, the faculty of Durham High was called on to help in the rationing of sugar and gasoline. This rationing was done after school hours and by all the teachers.

## Civilian Defense



Durham High's All-Out-for-Victory Campaign to collect scrap netted 90,000 pounds of metal, rubber, paper, and tin cans, thereby exceeding by 30,000 pounds the expectations of Mr. B. G. Stewart, director of the drive in Durham High.

In order to encourage the salvaging of scrap, a plan was organized along the line of Harold Gray's comic strip, "Little Orphan Annie." This system gave each person turning in over ten pounds a rank, these ranks being

based on those of the Army. They range from a Private to a General, turning in ten and five thousand pounds, respectively.

The homeroom turning in the most scrap was 4A7 with approximately 20,000 pounds. 4A8 came in second with 15,000 pounds. 5A8 led in the tin can collection with a total of 6,000 cans.

Pat Muirhead turned in the most for the individual with 17,765 pounds of scrap. Walter Perry came in second with 14,746.

## Sale of War Stamps

This year members of the Hi-Y Club have made a notable contribution to the war effort by selling war stamps and bonds during activity and lunch periods. To create an interest among the students and faculty, a unique booth in which to sell the stamps was arranged in front of the school office. In the background of this booth was a poster picturing the popular army jeep, which has been

used so much in sponsoring stamp and bond sales throughout this nation. The plan of the club was to sell enough stamps and bonds to buy a jeep and various other war weapons for our country.

Each club member has served loyally and sacrificially in this campaign with the hope that his small part would be a strong link in the chain of victory for the Allied Nations.

## Contributions

"This morning we have been asked to make a contribution to..." These words of the teacher are familiar to all students by the time they reach the high school. Due to the war these words are heard even more frequently. Durham High has provided ample opportunity for the students to share in the running of the war. In turn, the students are planning and carrying out various campaigns, among them the War Bond drive.

The Chinese War Relief was the newest cause this year, and therefore, probably, was less publicized than the others. This may account for the fact that only \$12.43 was gleaned from the students' pockets. This year the call of the Community Fund was more urgent than ever before, due to the number

of agencies that are closely connected with the war effort receiving aid from the fund. The cash contributions of the teachers surpassed those of the students; the quantities are, respectively, \$137.50 and \$122.17. The teachers also pledged a sum of \$66.50.

There are two funds whose receipts are used to heal sick bodies. These are the March of Dimes for polio and The Christmas Seal Campaign for tuberculosis. Their high-school contributions this year amounted, respectively, to \$37.99 and \$61.45.

The Durham High students give their money readily, ever eager to help a good cause. You may be sure that Durham High is doing its part to win the war.






