We took an active role in the school's organizations, serving on the MESSENGER, the

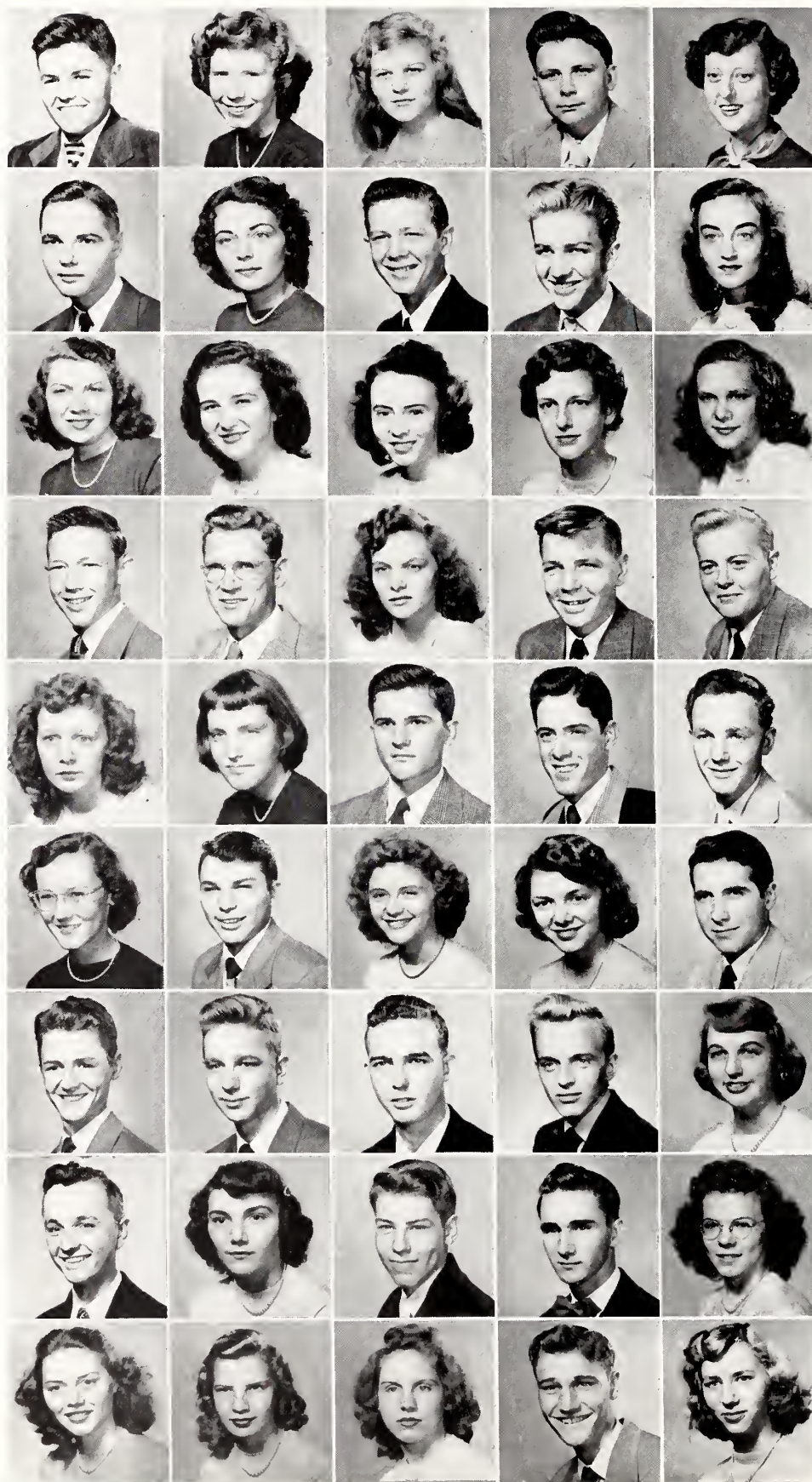
Hi-Rocket, the school's weekly radio program, and in the societies, clubs, and athletics.

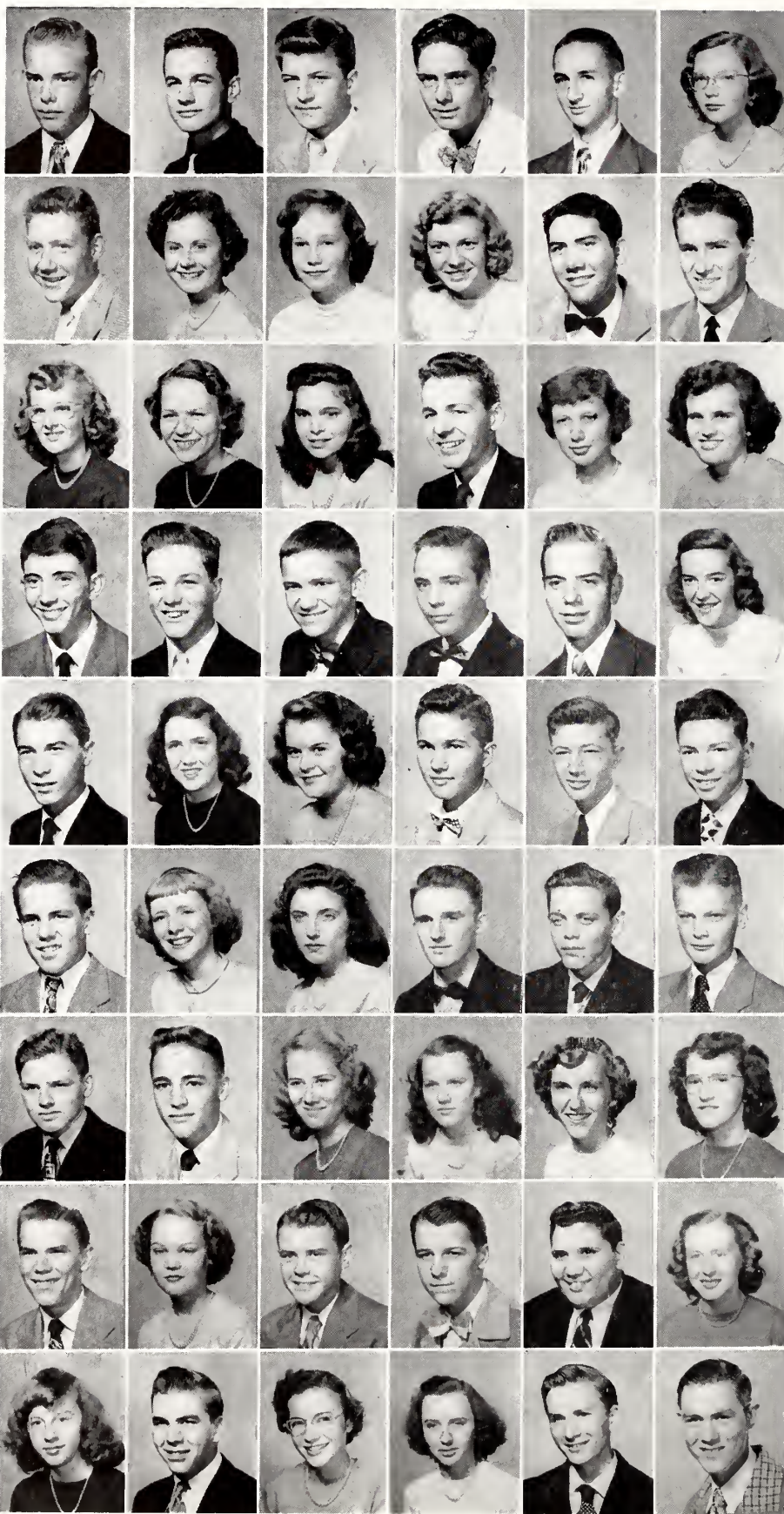
Very shortly after orientation week we elected our class officers and chose blue and

THE second year of Distributive Education was most profitable at Durham High. Our club was composed of twenty members, all of whom were working in local retail stores.

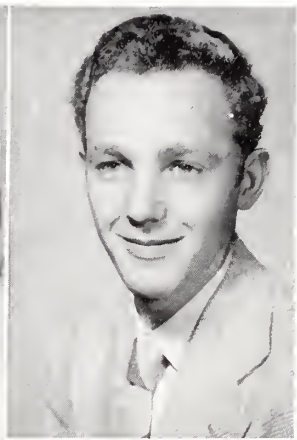
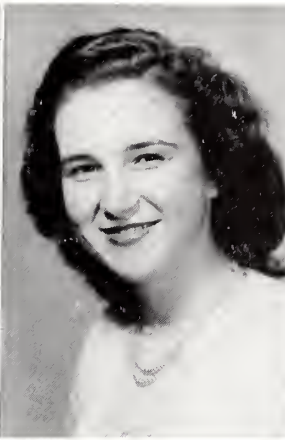

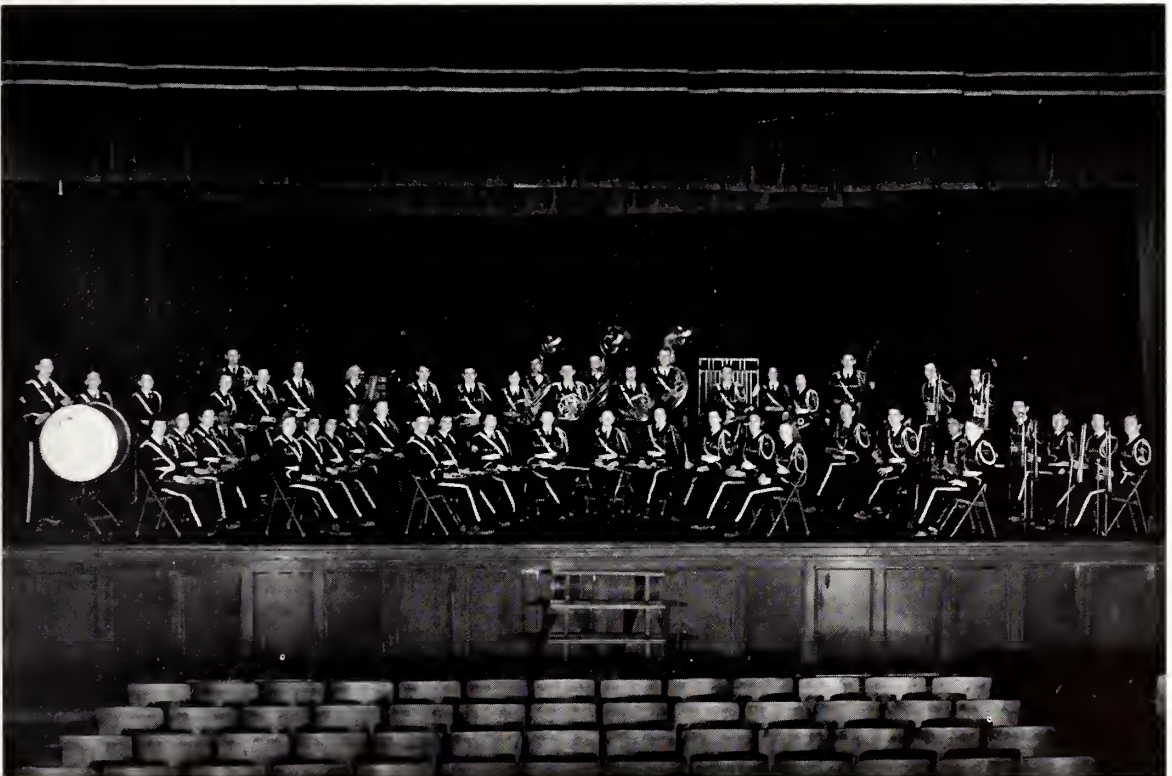

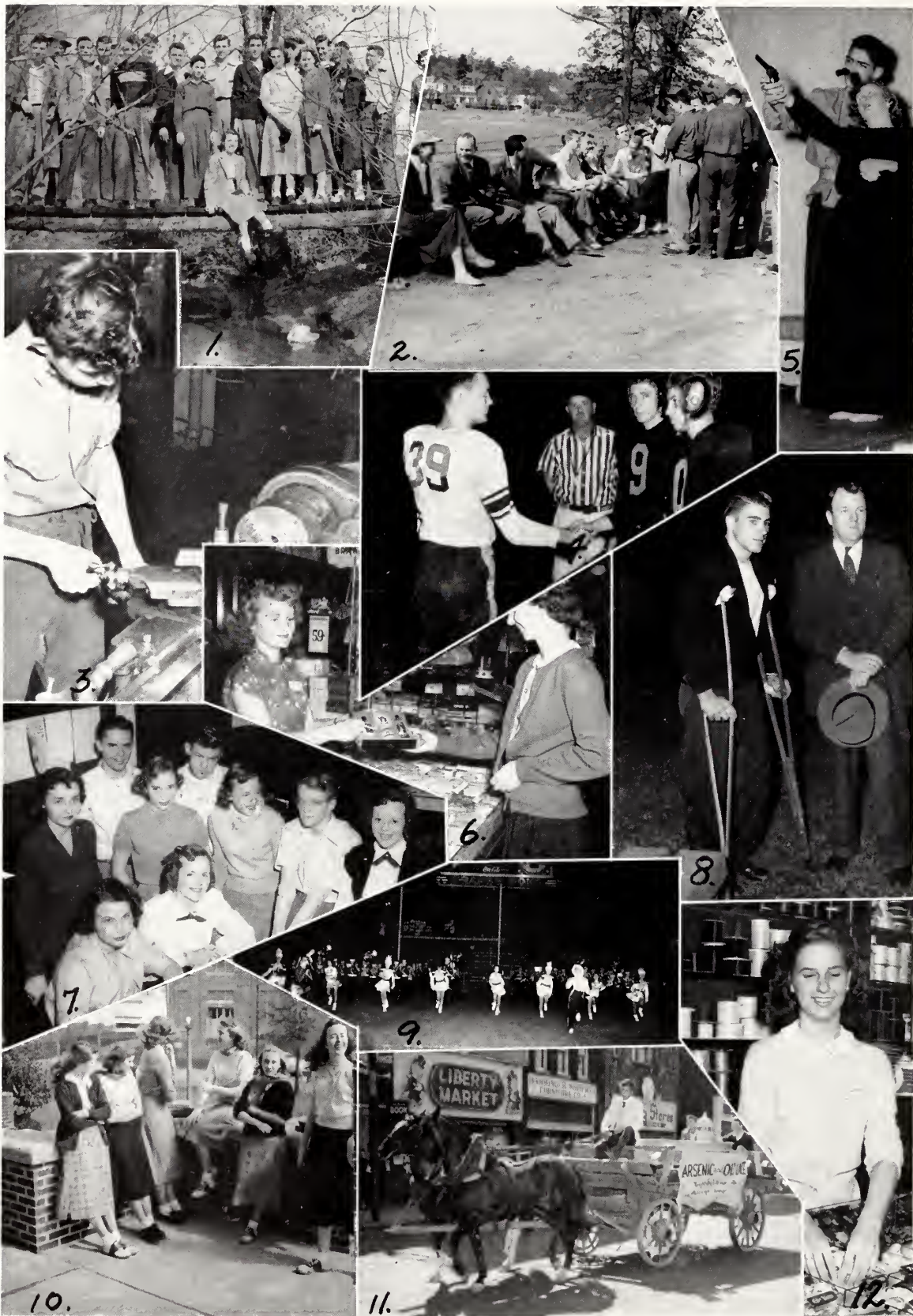

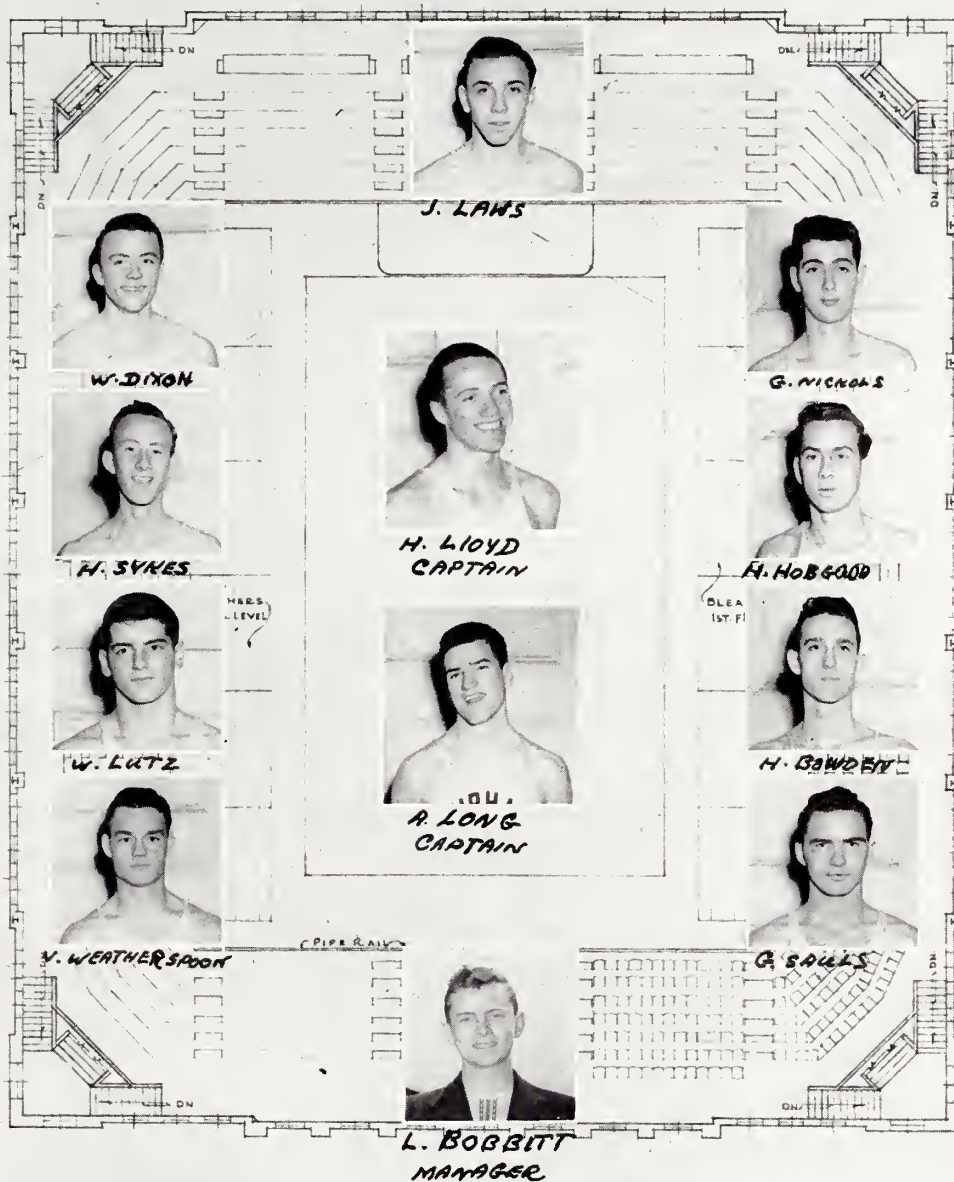
With Coach Paul Sykes at the helm to steer the way, the Durham High eagers finished their hardwood season in March, leaving behind them a path of victory.

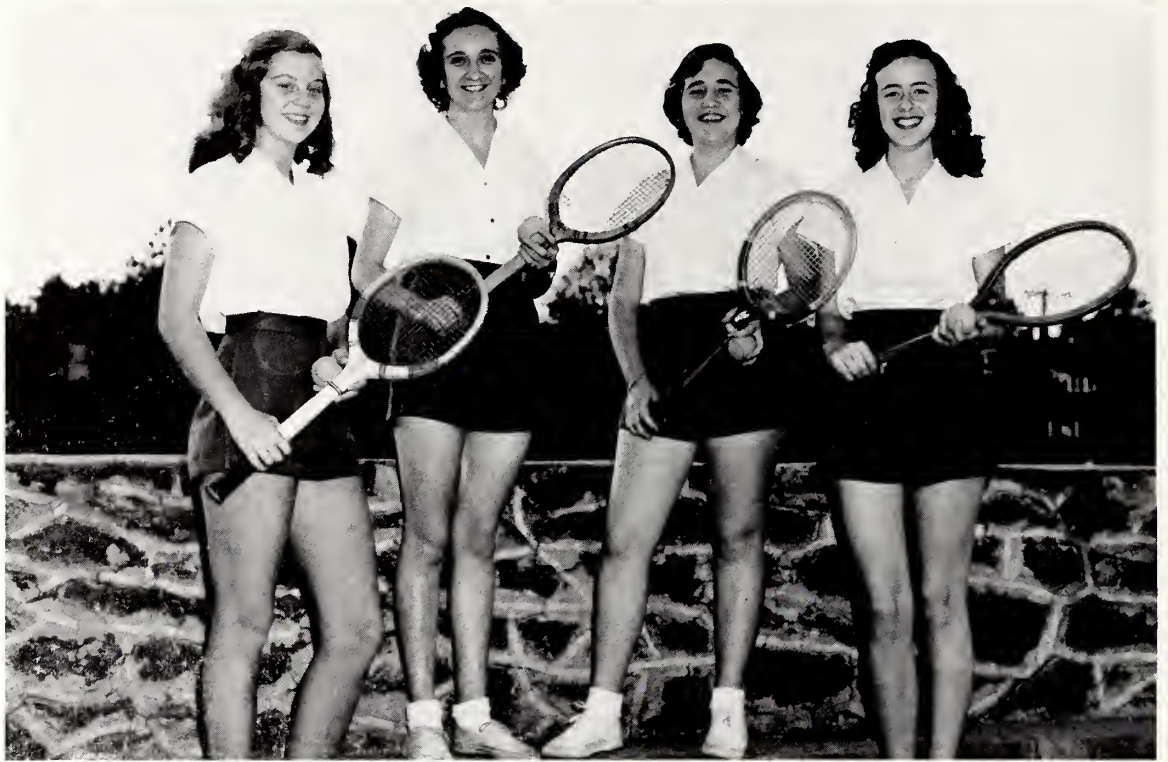
cally fit to participate in athletics before these points could be accredited.

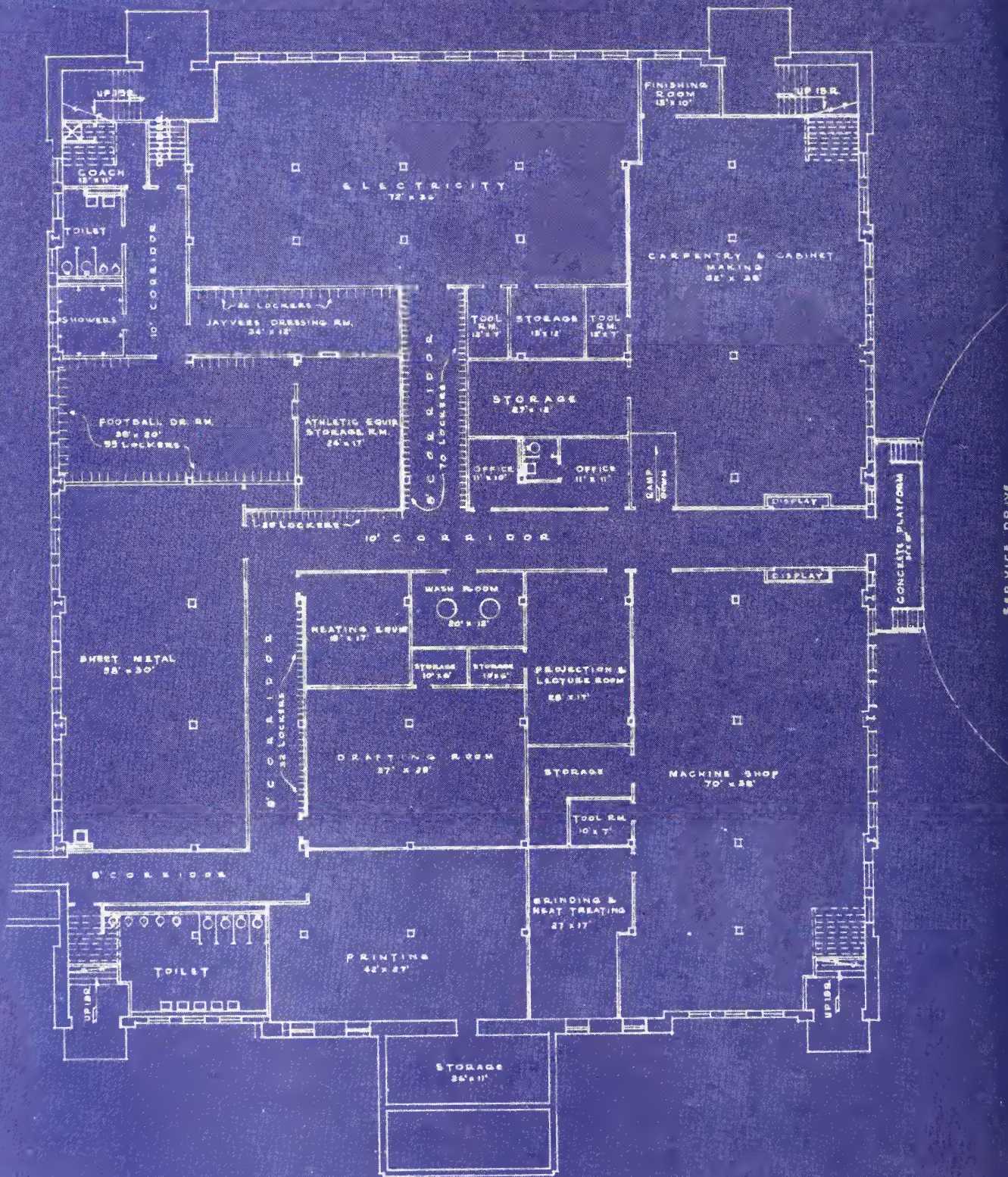

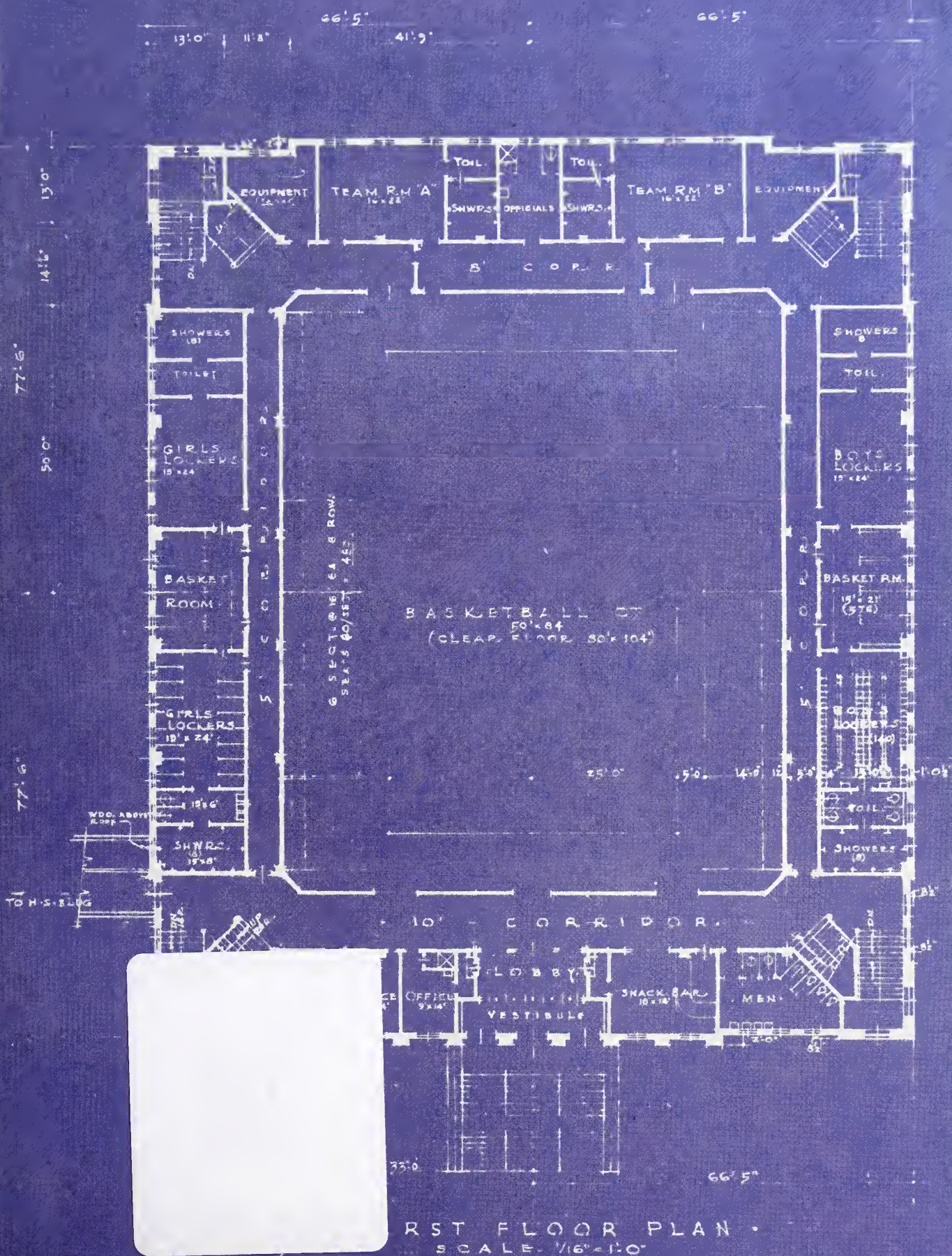
