Senior Class History

September, nineteen-fifty-one. "Too Young" was at the top of the Hit Parade. Two hundred-odd sophomores entered D.H.S. We realized that the next three years would be the most wonderful we'd ever spend, but now—it was all new, and most of us were scared to the bottom of our boots.

We went to Orientation Week programs where the seniors told us all about the school—and mainly made us feel how big, and new, it was.

We wandered around the place, tried to understand why there was no connection between the two halves of the basement, gazed in wonder at the beautiful new gym and the *two* eafeterias—one old and interesting, the other sunny and spacious like the gym it had been before.

We elected our sophomore class officers, Julius Compton, Elizabeth Jordan, Betty Lou Tilley, and Patsy Stegall. We chose our colors, light blue and white, our flower, the white carnation, and our motto, "Tomorrow will prove today's ambitions."

We joined clubs and societies and Student Council committees. We signed up for Hi-Rocket and Messenger staffs, went out for teams. We bought combination tickets and sat in the bleachers yelling for the Bulldogs—who came through with a four win, five lost, and three tied football season. We took part in Homecoming, putting up Elizabeth Jordan as our candidate for Queen.

Our first touch of social life was the Leap Year Hop, held, appropriately enough, on February 29. Girls asked boys to the dance and for program dances.

We followed the fortunes of the basketball team (nine wins, three losses, second in the State Champ race), baseball team (six and six), and track team (second in the State meet).

To raise money we sold Bulldog stationery. We went to the Senior Play, "Smilin' Through," a romantic tragedy.

We chose our next year's officers, Sonny Evans, Bobby Northcutt, Jane Perry, and Bug Compton.

At Graduation we bid farewell to those wonderful seniors who'd helped so much to get us acquainted with Durham High.

Singing "Auf Wiedersehen," we came back next September, much more experienced now in matters concerning Durham High. Now we were more than ever a class, instead of separate individuals. Again we sold that stationery!

The first big activity was Homecoming, and again we nominated Liz for Queen. It was exciting as ever, but this year it had an extra special touch—the state championship was depending on the game. We came through on top that time with a perfect season, but few of us will soon forget that cold December night when the State Championship game was played. We lost to Reynolds, but win, lose, or draw, we still thought our team was best!

We found ourselves having more to do with Page 21

preparations for the Christmas dance. The theme this year was "Winter Wonderland."

Junior Talent Show! Just those three words were enough to bring fear to any junior's heart. Could we do it? Would it be a wonderful success or a dismal flop? We used the theme "Under the Big Top" and it was a wonderful success. We made over five hundred dollars, which we knew would mean a grand Junior-Senior Prom.

Sure enough, come May 15, the Junior-Senior came off in expert style, and we felt it was a true tribute to our class. After days of planning and decorating, the gym showed the "touch of genius." Our theme, "An Enchanted Evening on an Enchanted Island," was carried out with South Sea Island murals, a hula dancer, a mammoth lei, and a giant silver seashell throne for king and queen Edgar Fisher and Margaret Ann Kornegay.

The seniors entertained us with their play, "Double Door," a tense mystery drama superbly carried out.

We elected our class and Student Council officers—the ones whose pictures dot this book. Finally, graduation came upon us again. We couldn't believe that now we were the seniors, and would be the next to wear those fateful caps and gowns!

September again, and singing "Vaya Con Dios" we began school for the last time. Now we were the ones with obligations and responsibilities—it was we who had to print the Hi-Rocket, win the games, help the sophomores. We sponsored Orientation Week and organized again the clubs and societies, adding three new ones this year, Tillet and Blackwell Literary Societies and the Math Club. We did our best to publicize the school and to the traditional

weekly "D.H.S. on Parade" added one experimental TV session.

We went about our work to the sound of construction as the new auditorium slowly rose.

Queen Elizabeth reigned over Homecoming and we cheered our team to victory in the Eastern Triple A—then many of us trekked to Winston-Salem for that heartbreaking State Championship tie with Reynolds High.

"Under the Christmas Tree," the Christmas dance, was almost completely our responsibility. Covering the gym with a giant "tree" which dwarfed the dancers to doll-size, the Social Committee achieved a thing of beauty and a memory forever.

We cheered our luckless basketball team and loved them all the same. When our classmates on the team left it, our school spirit brought us out to cheer the scrappy sophomores. Class meeting took on a new importance as we chose the class gift (a fan for the gym), Messenger dedication, and senior play, and made plans for graduation.

Spring rolled around bringing with it baseball, track, the senior play "Children of the Moon," an unusual and touching drama.

And all of a sudden it was time for the Junior-Senior Prom. Now we were the guests, and it seemed almost a bon voyage party.

And then, the last week! Awards Day, Class Night, the Baccalaureate Sermon, and—Graduation itself. We received those precious diplomas, and then enjoyed ourselves together for the last time, at the Graduation Dance.

Now, hard as it is to believe, we are Alumni. We look back and we see the happiest three years of our lives. We look forward and proudly face the uncertain future. Tomorrow will prove today's ambitions.


Sophomore Class
