What fun it was attending those games . . . winning the Eastern Championship. Homecoming came and Bobbie Dean Purvis was our candidate for queen. Oh, of course, in our opinion the Christmas Dance was a great success.

Now we were old members of D. H. S., being

active in clubs, societies, and on committees. How we rushed down the halls when 4A and 4B period bells rang and for what? . . . SPICED HAM SANDWICHES. We acquired a taste for those sandwiches and ate them for three years.

New Year's resolutions were to STUDY, STUDY, STUDY; but when finals came, we were still cramming for biology, algebra, and English. Those final exams also meant that our first year at D. H. S. was over.

Beginning our junior year we anticipated great things ahead. After electing officers Jimmy Erwin, president; Ken Hall, vice-president; Joyce Jernigan, secretary; and Joanna Holloway, treasurer, we realized that with only 83 cents in the treasury, something would have to be done . . . 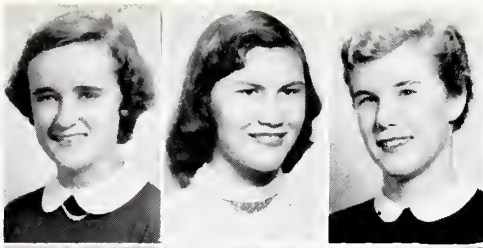
Money and talent—these were our biggest problems of the year. We began to raise this money by selling tags before all the football games to the students.

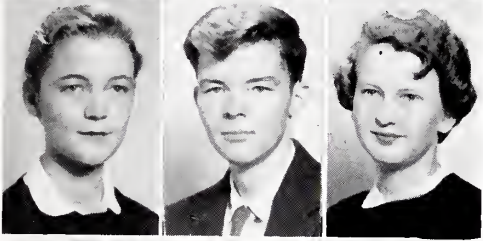
In the spring we elected members of our class to the offices of the Student Council and of the Senior Class for next year.

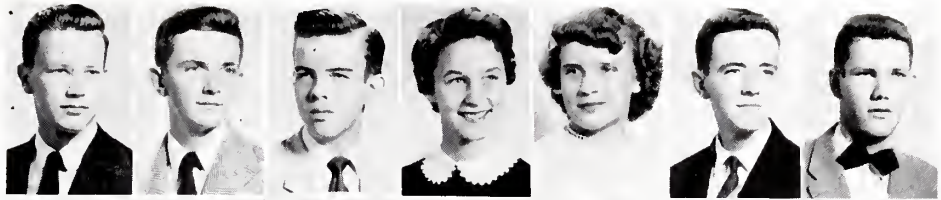
We first worked together as a class when we elected our officers. Then we set about planning and presenting our Sophomore Stunt Day.

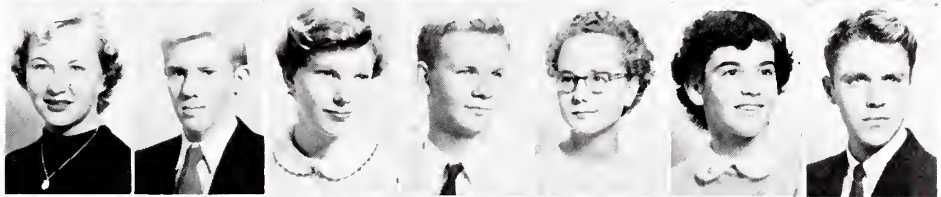
The end of the year saw us stage another project to raise funds. It also saw us as old members of D. H. S., looking forward to next year when we as juniors could tease the new “Sophs.”

"What in the world are those figures on the board," wondered the Messenger as he glanced in the door of one of the second floor rooms. We explained to him they were part of the math program for our club.

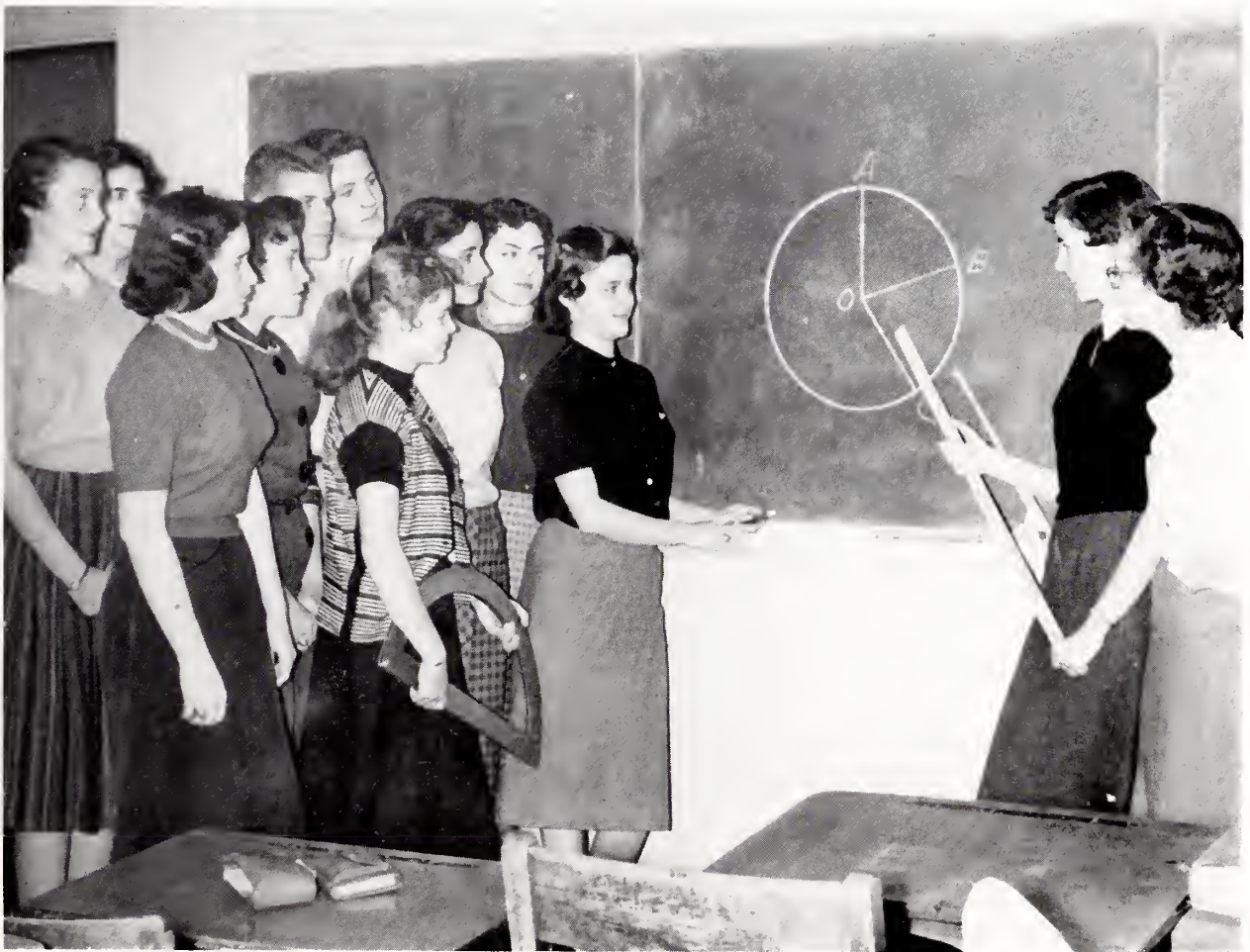

All of this continued until the end of May when the pages were again closed on an athletic year at D. H. S.

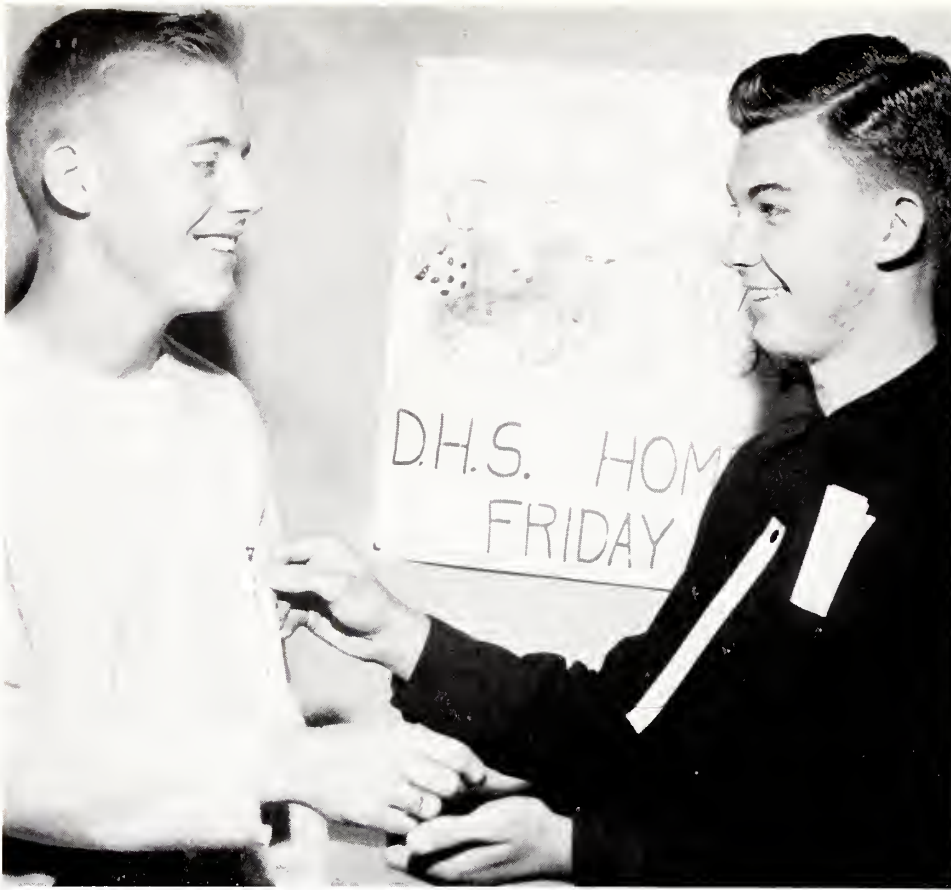

April, May, and June were crammed full of activities. One of these was the election of the important officers of the school. Remember trying to decide who would make the best Student Council president or who to elect as class secretary?

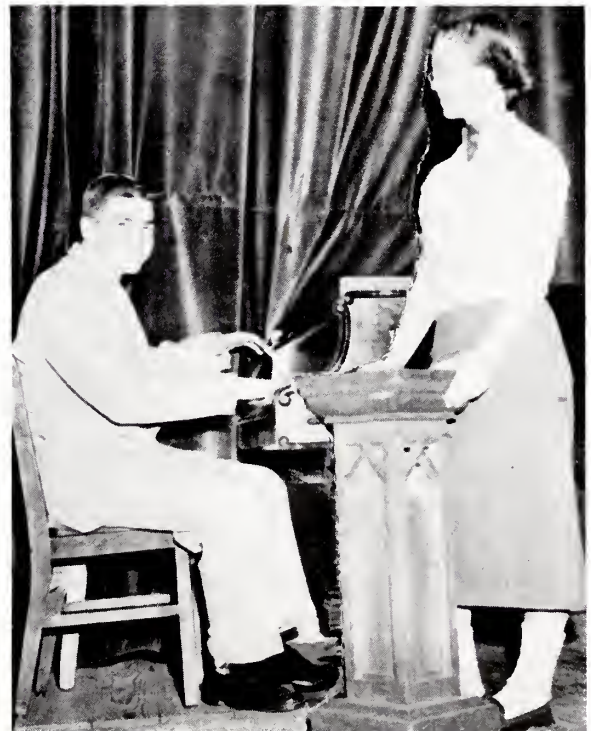
