



Senior Class History

"What we are to be, we are now becoming."

Our first touch of social life was the Christmas Dance, "Beneath the Christmas Tree," sponsored by the Student Council. Soon after followed our exams. We then united in the presentation to the school of "Sophomore Stunt Day," and later produced a screamingly successful "Backward Wedding."

The second chapter in our book was our

Junior Year. We had then hit a happy medium in that we were not leaders but then we weren't Skins. We started our year by electing Morris Weisner, President; Johnson Ross, Vice-President; Barbara Fortune, Secretary; and Michael May, Treasurer.

Florence Grantham was our candidate for Homecoming Queen. Again our class won top honors in the Parade. Our wonderful football team won Eeastern AAA honors, only to lose to Greensboro for the State title.

Next we attended the Christmas Dance, "Silver Belles," with the girls asking the boys. Boys, do you remember how sweet you were beforehand?

In early spring we presented our Junior Talent Show, "Our Best to You." The highlight of the show was the French Can-Can Girls. With our money we made from the Show, we gave the Seniors a wonderful going-away dance in the form of the Junior-Senior Prom. "Cherry Pink and Apple-Blossom White" was the theme. Much to our delight, the Seniors gave a superb performance of the entertaining play, "Our Town."

Seven of our classmates were inducted into the National Honor Society, which was quite an honor. Also delegates were chosen for Girls' and Boys' State.

In May we again elected officers, this time for the Student Council and the Senior Class. Jim Herring, Johnson Ross, Ellen Harris, and Coleman Markham were chosen for the Student Council; while Cecil Cooke, Jr., Morris Weisner, Gail Joyner, and J. D. Wellons held honors for the Senior Class.

The next chapter of our book will be the

most remembered. It was our third—and last. We began the year as leaders—Presidents of various organizations, captains of teams, and leaders in our Student government.

The Class of '56 was accredited with the first Fall Festival that was ever held at D. H. S. Again elected by her classmates, Florence reigned as "Fall Festival" Queen. For the third year, our class walked off with the Parade prizes. Our football team came through with the Eastern AAA Championship under the excellent leadership of captains Johnson Ross and Jimmy Markham.

In an impressive candlelight ceremony, forty-nine Seniors were tapped into the National Honor Society.

Soon followed the first Senior Day at D. H. S. With Cecil presiding, the Senior Class gave to the school a well-remembered auditorium program. All Seniors wore their "Sunday best" and really looked wonderful.

"Golden Fantasy" was the theme of our Christmas Dance. Amid gold and green decorations, the Student Body danced to Seventh Heaven and back.

"Ten Little Indians" was chosen for the Senior Play. With Beverly Everitt and Cranny Cranford in the leading roles, and the capable directing of Mrs. Sorrels, we really "did ourselves proud."

Our classmates now became the stars of the basketball and baseball teams. All of a sudden it was time for the "Junior-Senior." Now we were the guests, and it almost seemed like a farewell party. We finally were called to the office to be measured for our caps and gowns. And then, the last week! Awards Day, Class Night, the Baccalaureate Sermon, and Graduation itself. Our last page was the marvelous Graduation Dance. This was the ending of our wonderful book of high school days.

Now that we are Alumni, it is hard to believe that we cannot relive our wonderful times. We can only read about them, hoping that others on their road to success may be rewarded with as magnificent an education in books and good times as we.






As Juniors we learned the technique of selling tags, that is, football tags to all our D. H. S. friends.


First, we worked together on the budget drive and homeroom decoration contest.
