AS TIME GOES BY

It was a sultry September morning in 1954 when that crowd of thrilled, but nervous sophomores, later to become the graduating class of 1957, first entered the halls of D.H.S.

After a week of confusing orientation, we elected our officers to guide us through our first year. They were: president, Russell Hollers; vice-president, Mary Fuller Strange; secretary, Betsy Christmas; and treasurer, Tommy Ricks.

It wasn't long before we heard talk about chieken wire, napkins, trucks, etc. and went around dumbfounded until we learned that this was all part of making a float for Homecoming. Mary Fuller Strange was our candidate for queen.

Very few organizations can exist without the question of finances arising and dear old class of '57 was no exception. The first idea produced to remedy this situation was to hold Sophomore

Stunt Day for the juniors and seniors. Next on the agenda was a basketball game with the faculty vs. the sophomore girls which proved to be a hilarious success. Still short of the necessary funds, a paper napkin sale was launched, and for several weeks, we pestered our neighbors until they made a purchase.

As the year came to a close, we again put our faith in Russell and Betsy by electing them president and secretary. Doug Kidd and Ann Clark assumed the duties of vice-president and treasurer respectively.

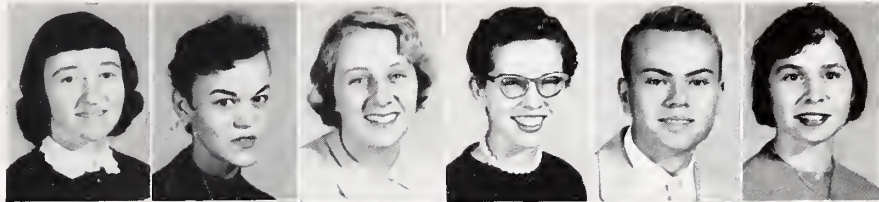
September ushered us back to school, a proud and happy Junior class. Unbelievably soon, we were enveloped in the football tags and chicken wire of the football season.

Talent . . . talent . . . talent . . . and "That's Entertainment" came from backstage to be a real and wonderful production.

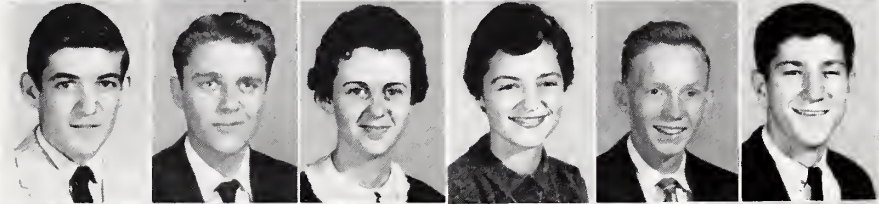
Our going away present to the seniors was a bit of imaginative fantasy called the Junior-Senior Prom. It was, for us the juniors, the first prom and a most cherished memory.
