Before serving the Durham community, he was


associated with the school systems of Charlotte, X. C. and Jefferson, Ga.

WIND ENSEMBLE

If any class can claim the best years of the history of the D.H.S. Band, it is the Class of '62. Since Mr. Joseph Seerest accepted the post of band director in 1959, there has been a renaissance of the bands—Wind Ensemble, Varsity Band, and Marching Band.
