Naw let us discuss a few individual persanalities. Example $A$ wants ta be an avacada and a nectarine. He desires romantic adventure yet is ratianal and calculating. Example $B$ wishes ta be carn and a grape. He seeks acceptance and is a canfarmist, having a graup desire. These qualities can be lagically discavered thraugh the vegetable and fruit interpretatians. It's sa easy even a gracer can da it.

A basic questian remains: Were the answers spantaneous motivatians ar calculated respanses? To a great extent the replies were given with previaus knowledge af fundamental symbalism. Even sa by choosing them in this manner, basic qualities were still evident in thase chaices. Spontaneous respanses are often the best as they tend ta shaw the individual in an hanest and natural light. Either way, the interpretations can be valid, shawing deeper understanding thraugh symbalism.
