
Homecoming was a joyous occasion for the juniors with our lovely representative Jonet Jones, who represented us well.




tion come the Junior's stotus symbol—their closs rings. It was opporent to all os they "cosually" glanced at and displayed their rings.



There were days spent under tables and on tables as students played "cat and mouse" games with "Big Daddy". Someone snitched our lunch one day, toobut fat warts are lovable!

Of course there was the day it snowed and the staffers worked in the unheated art room as pencils and fingers were reduced to nubs. The New York trip brought unprecedented excitement. The year ended with the crude artwork of nineteen folks who were so dedicated to Durham High that they took art in order to be a member of the Messenger Staff of 1965.
