-tum so well authenticated.



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
Will you give me date of

Dear Sir,

I send the enclosed list that you may see what vascular Cryptogams, other than ferns are already in the Herbarium.

I have not made any effort to obtain specimens, being too busy on the ferns and having but little time. Mr Bott very kindly gave me a set of New England Insects several years ago but I put them into a set of N.E. Acrogens which I gave to the Dumb Animal Farm, and what I now have are mostly scraps that were left.

I. schinopora var Bottii
I collected several years ago, and two years ago revisited the place to get more but it was so dried up (the pond) that I got none although I think of going again the coming season and if you should want any would be pleased to collect some for you.

I received a few days ago a new Polypodium from Curtis (Florida) which I have placed with an unnamed fern from Porto Rico that Mr Baker had marked n.s.p., but Prof. Eaton thinks ~~is~~ ^{is} P. Swartzii Baker.

I shall announce it in the April Bulletin and



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my distribution tables will appear in the May
Naturalist. I will send you an "extra"

I would like to see your C. elongata Hett
some time. I have some queer looking C. micro
phylla, with which Baker places the above, in
Palmer's collection but have not had a chance to
study them
