

Saint Louis, July 27th, 1840.

Dear Sir:-

Your communication dated June 13th, came to hand this day and was placed in my hands by the Corresponding Secretary, (Dr. Carpenter.) In reply, I have to say, that nothing would gratify me more than to send the Specimens, to which you refer, by the first Conveyance; but in consequence of the absence of Dr. Engelmann from the U.S. (he having undertaken to exchange with you) ~~here~~, I am unacquainted with his arrangements relating to it, hence, I feel a delicacy in interfering with his plans. Your communication of to-day is the first intimation which I possess relative to a correspondence upon the subject.

Mr. Engelmann will return in August or September when you may expect the fulfilment of his promise and in the mean time I expect to make some valuable acquisitions to our collection of Reptiles, however, if the Dr. should not return within the time specified, I will take it upon myself to comply strictly with your wishes.

If at any time you will honour us with objects of Natural History, (whatever you can spare) they will be gratefully received and promptly reciprocated.

Dear Sir

Some months since I wrote you, with a request
to that you would give my thanks to the Gentleman of your
association for the honor done in electing me a corresponding
member of their body - & expressing my willingness to enter
fully into any of their terms for the advancement of Nat. Science
in our country - and requesting them to inform me in what way
I could be of any service to them - At the same time I wrote to Dr
Engleman in answer to some propositions of his touching my
exchanges for my work on the Reptiles of the United States - but
as no answer has been received to either letter it is presumed
they are correct & I again address you on the subject -
The Dr. A. Herpetology is finished as far as Vol IV. and the
5 & last will be out in December next - this will complete
the external forms &c of our replies after that I shall
go on with the anatomical portion of the work - as far as
is done is at the service of your Society - and I only wish
to know how it can be forwarded to you - I have previously
sent dropt books to Nashville by way of N. Orleans &
perhaps this might be the preferable way - as to specimens
for your cabinet I will send whatever you desire if
they can be procured in our state and such duplicates
as can be spared from our Museum - In return will
I - forward of all your replies at once to be forwarded to
Dr E. Holbrook in Philadelphia - who will charge himself
with them and have drawings done of necessary parts
these shall all be returned to you safely next December.


