new form of development of the *Perono-*



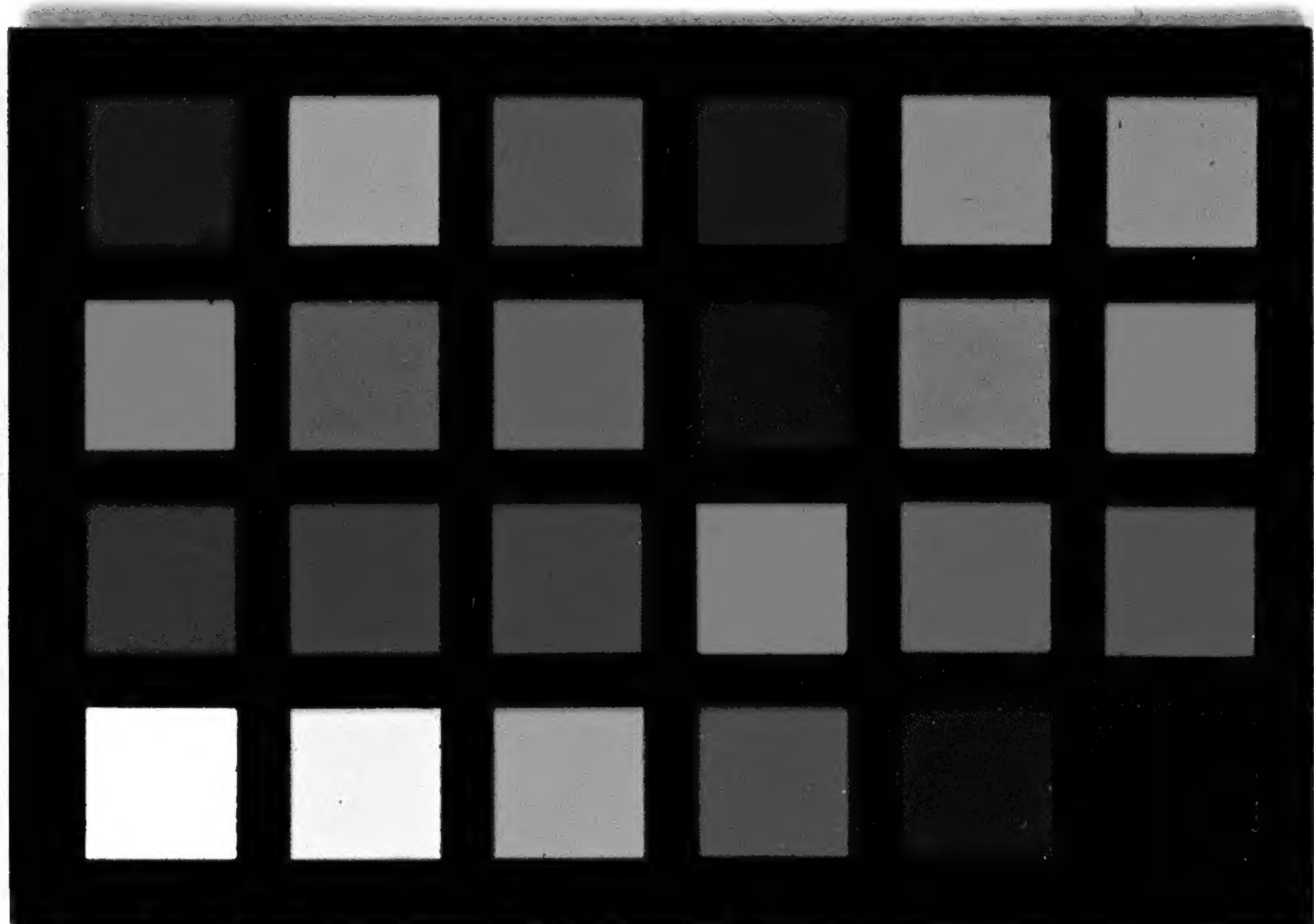
