

Dear Sir,

Dr. Gray wrote during the summer that you were desirous of specimens of *Ellisii* *Myrtella* L. to compare with *E. ambigua* Nutt. Being sick at that time I desired Mr T. O. James to send you specimens from his that I gave him at the time I collected, as my specimens were 40 miles beyond my reach at that time: He says you, I believe, and as I have, during my convalescence, visited the place of my Herbarium, have brought specimens to replace Mr. James' and also send you some more: You will find some old seed; whether they possess vitality enough for your purpose you will judge: Fresh seed may be obtained next June unless the locality has been interfered with. Will be glad to serve you in any way botanically in my power

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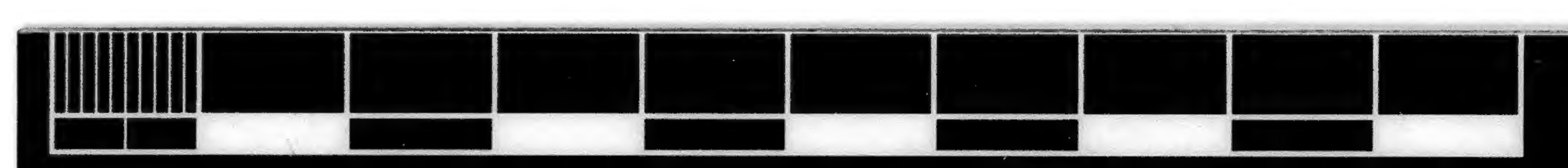
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
