Dear Sir;

I find it difficult to name satisfactorily many of the plants of this region, & would esteem it a great favor if you will examine & name some specimens for me. I have now on hand specimens of 100 or more doubtful plants, including several Cruciferae, <sup>a Claytonia</sup> a *Callitriche*, a *Lupinus*, an *Astragalus*, a *Sophora* (?) & other Leguminosae, 2 or 3 Brassulaceae, 2 or 3 Enocheraceae, <sup>2 or 3</sup> some Umbelliferae, a *Galium*, a number of Compositae, <sup>some Callitricheae</sup> 1 or 2 Crozoneae, some few Eriogonae, & a number of Cyperaceae & Gramineae.
