

Esteemed Colleague!

Merchant Carstens has called to my attention that you are occupied with Zoology and namely with entomology. I possess a fairly large insect collection, containing approximately 8500 species of insects. My purpose in writing is to offer you an exchange of insects. If you are interested in this, a fitting opportunity would be Mr. Carsten's intended trip this coming summer; whereby you could have a shipment brought to me and, on his return trip, I could have a equivalent brought to you. If you could not specify all matters because of insufficient resources, I would be glad to take care of it. If you would label the things which are to be sent with numbers, which correspond with the things in your collection, then that would be helpful to me in establishing an inventory. Most agreeable to me would be insects, which moreover are less fragile than the other orders of insects. Also sand sand and sweet-water are easy to ship, and an exchange in these would also be agreeable to me. With overseas shipments which I have received, the insects were also not impaled but, after they were killed in alcohol or hot water, they were packed in layers between cotton; whereby many can be shipped close together. Asking you to please forgive the brashness in my turning to you, I am
