I think it must be *I. echinospora*,
Durieu var. *Braunii*; should

viz. *I. lacustris*, L. & *I. Engelmanni*, ^{Braun}
both of which were given to me.
Am adding to my herbarium
from time to time although
Musci, Hepaticae & Fungi receive
most attention particularly the



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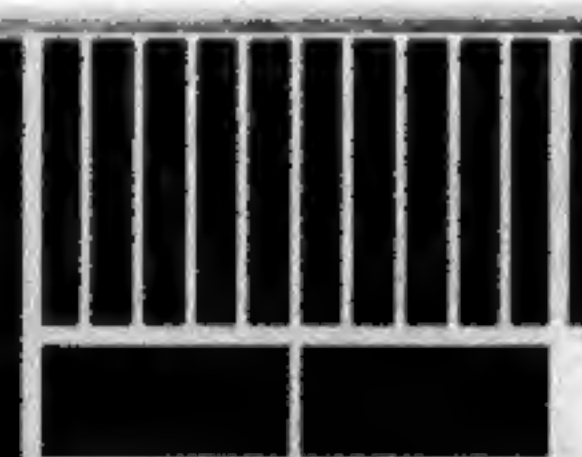
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Musci - since this was the place in

Mosses particularly Sphagnum.
I found a number of species
that are confined to the southern

scanty leisure. Being in the

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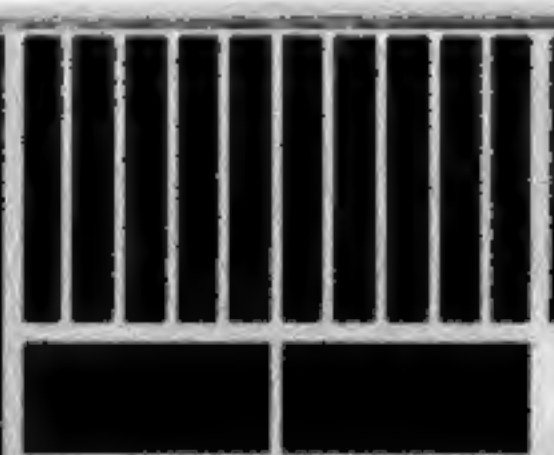
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Oreg business my time is very
