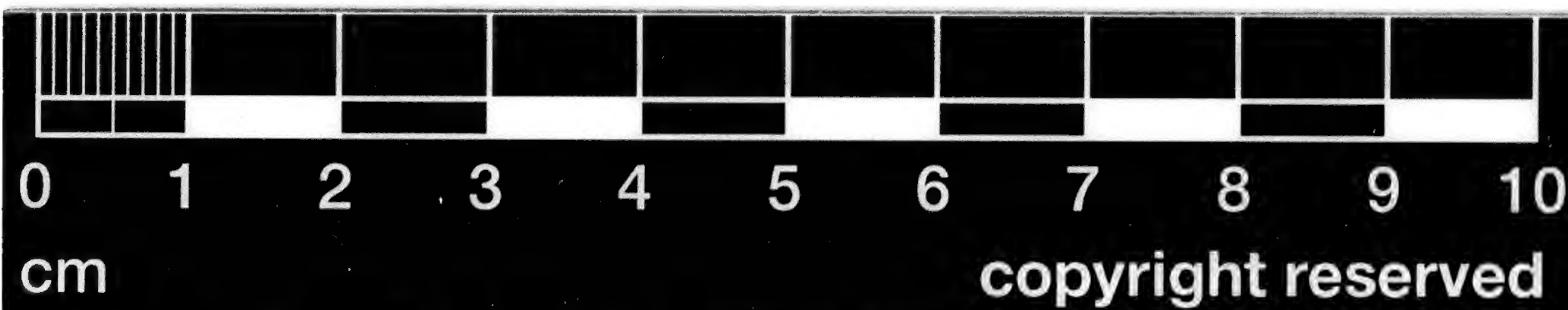
Very Dear Sir.

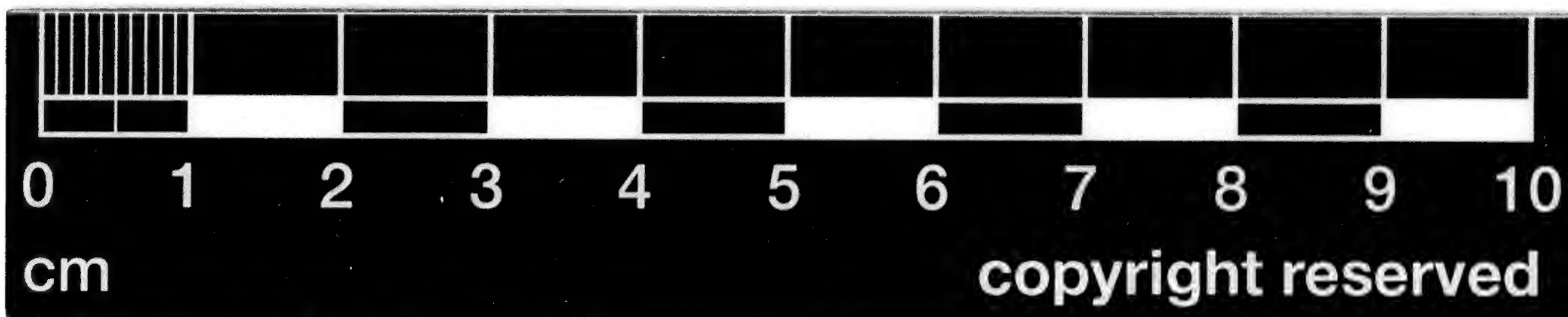
