# ARBORETUM NEWS

The Arboretum has an amazing history, one that you are probably well aware of. Since its conception in the late 1940's, this 127-acre parcel of land has been a botanical clearinghouse for many of Southern California's most popular landscape plants, and home to many cinema classics. Today, it is a botanically diverse urban forest, and an important habitat to many species of migratory birds.

For some, The Arboretum provides simple pleasures, such as the joy of a morning stroll while interacting with our abundant wildlife. Last year alone, over 26,000 children studied and enjoyed The Arboretum. Perhaps you, too, have youthful memories of The Arboretum. I can't count the number of times visitors have enthusiastically recounted to me their Arboretum memories.

Our botanical collections rival some of the best in the world, with more mapped accessioned plants than any other garden in the country. In addition, we curate one of the country's largest public orchid collections. Smart gardening practices are first and foremost in our daily operations, and all of our green waste is recycled.

This year, we have many educational offerings, including our Family Adventures

program, botanical illustration classes, culinary programs, Tour and Taste, and our new addition of Guided Evening Arboretum Hikes (I will be leading these). Additionally, this spring and summer we will see the return of many festivals, shows, and concerts. Mark your calendar for Baldwin Bonanza, our annual plant sale & garden show April 30th through May 2nd, and be sure to attend one of the many Festivals on the Green ([www.calphil.org](http://www.calphil.org)). These concerts are fabulous!

I would like to thank Angee Beckett, the West Hollywood Tree Preservation Society, and the Arcadia Rotary Club for generously aiding The Arboretum in obtaining two billboards to advertise The Arboretum and California Arbor Day. The billboards were located in Santa Monica and Highland Park, bringing The Arboretum message to communities beyond our local neighborhoods.

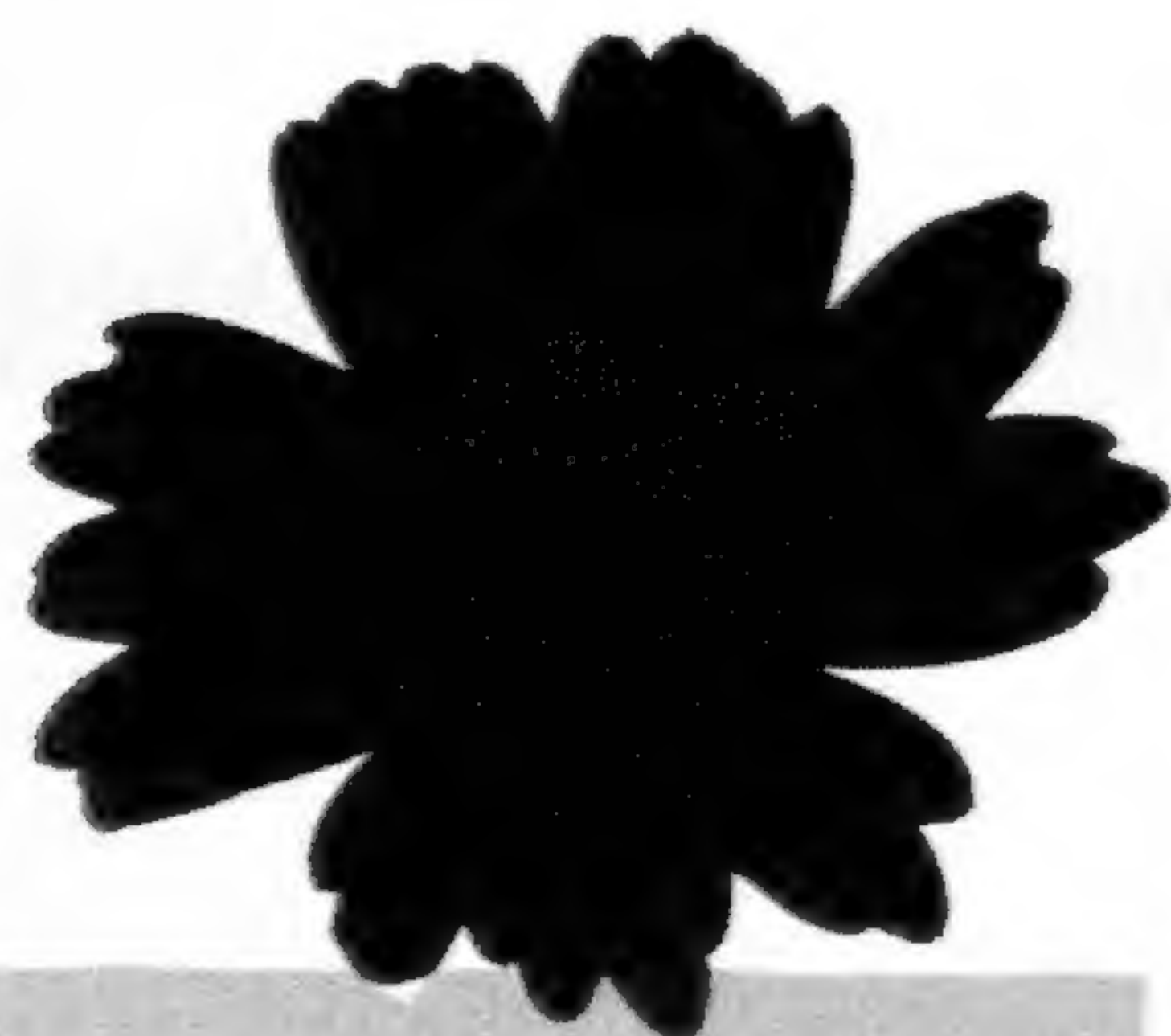

### **Gifts of Life Insurance**

If you own a life insurance policy that is no longer needed, consider it as a wonderful vehicle for a 2004 charitable gift! To receive a charitable deduction, just name the Los Angeles Arboretum Foundation as both the owner and beneficiary of the policy. If the policy has a cash value, you can take a charitable deduction approximately equal to the cash value at the time of the gift. If annual premiums are still to be made and you continue to pay them, those premiums will become tax deductible each year. Your life insurance agent can advise you on which forms to complete.
