ECLIPSES.

In the year 1868 there will be two Eclipses of the Sun, and a transit of Mercury over the Sun's disc.

February 22-3.—Annular Eclipse of Sun, invisible at Greenwich, although visible throughout the greater portions of Africa and South America, Spain, Portugal, &c.

August 17.—Total Eclipse of Sun, invisible at Greenwich, but visible in Australia, the Southern portion of Asia, and the East of Africa.

November 5.—A transit of Mercury, partly visible at Greenwich, 6.12 a.m.

During strong north-westerly gales the tide marks high water earlier than is given by the Table, and does not rise to its usual height, while the ebb tide runs out longer and falls lower; but upon the gales abating, and weather moderating, they are later, higher, and possess a greater velocity of current, until the equilibrium is restored. A south-westerly gale has a contrary effect, and an easterly gives some additional water.

Spring Tides are the highest and occur at or about New and Full Moon. Neap Tides are the lowest and occur at the first and last quarters. Ebb Tide is that between high and low water, lasting on an average 7½ hours; and Flood Tide is that between low and high water, lasting about 5½ hours. (Cor. C. B. June 19, 1866).

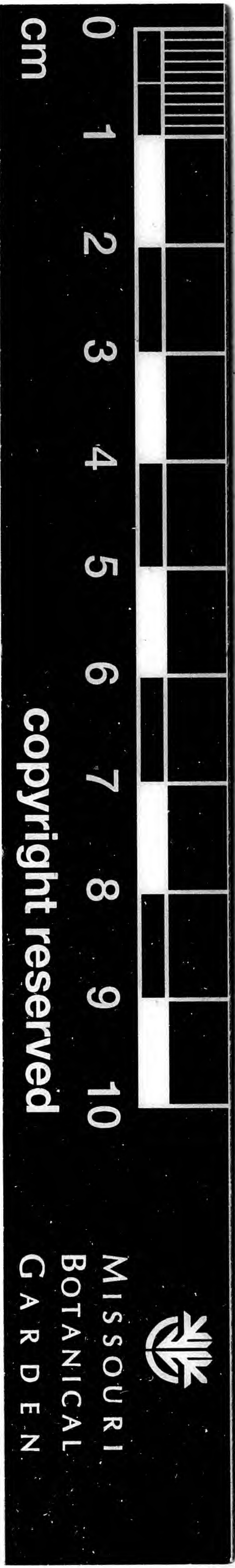

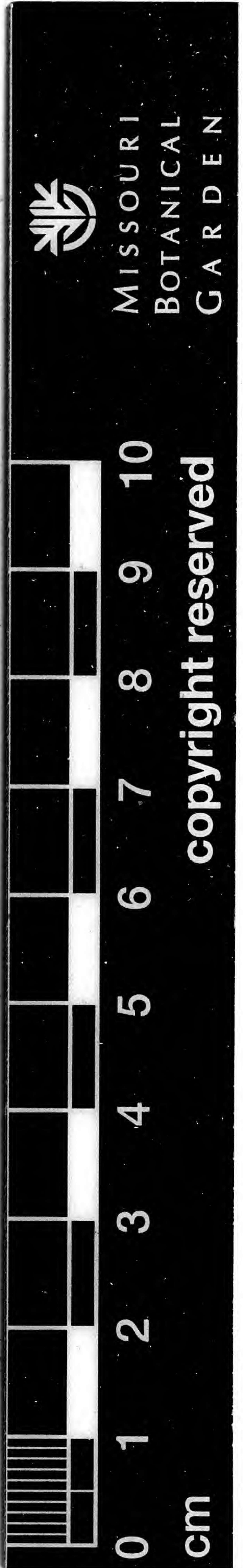

The days for applying for the allowance of Spoiled Stamps are Tuesdays and Thursdays between 12 and 2, and Saturdays 10 to 12 (and during which time country affidavits cannot be received), at Somerset House; and on Tuesdays and Thursdays, between 11 and 2, at 19 Winchester buildings, and 1 & 2 Great Winchester-street.

The application may be in person, or by affidavit, when a ticket will be given entitling the party to Stamps of same value and denomination.

Allowance can be obtained under certain circumstances for Sea Policy and other Stamps rendered useless, within 6 calendar months after the same may have been spoiled; and when they belong to parties not residing within 10 miles of London, 6 months are allowed in the former case, and 12 in the latter, from the time they may have been spoiled or rendered useless.

Parties are entitled to have Agreements stamped within 14 days from the making, and the Commissioners as a rule forego the penalty on Deeds if produced within 2 months from the date. To get instruments stamped after these periods without a penalty a memorial must be presented, stating the reasons for the delay, accompanied by an affidavit on a 2s. 6d. stamp. After 12 months the penalty must be paid.

Receipts may be stamped within 14 days of the date on payment of a penalty of £5, and within a month on payment of £10, and not afterwards.

PASSPORTS

Are no longer necessary for an Englishman to travel through any part of France (or Austria, except through Italian frontier). Elsewhere, however, the disagreeable necessity still prevails, though reduced to a minimum by application to our Secretary of State in accordance with the subjoined form (*signed by the person* in whose favour such application is made); which, being forwarded to us, shall be completed in due course of business, and returned, in most cases, within twenty-four hours of receipt. Should it occur to old travellers, however, who have felt the annoyance of delay, that surety is better made doubly sure if it can be, the Visas of the various Consuls may be added, according to the fees mentioned in "Bradshaw's Continental Guide," or the "Practical Swiss Guide," p. xiv. As the foregoing Foreign Office Passport holds good for any subsequent occasion through life, is subject to much wear, and has, not unfrequently, to be given up to the Officials wholly, *pro tem*, it is advisable (if not positively indispensable) that it be strengthened with linen and enclosed in a light pocket case, with the owner's name, and (in case of loss) address legibly stamped upon the outside. The cost of these is also appended.

Obliterations or alterations of any
sort in a Will ought, if possible, to
be avoided as dangerous; and when
of necessity made, ought to be
signed by the Testator and Wit-
nesses in the margin, or as near to
the alterations as possible, and the
alterations specially noticed in the
Attestation Clause as having been
made *before* the Will was signed.

Marriage after making a Will ren-
ders the will void. If a person wish
to dispose of all his property in one
gift the words "all my real and
personal estate" may be used.

It is not indispensable for a Wit-
ness to know the contents of a Will,
which may be so folded as to prevent
any other part than the Signature
and Attestation Clause being read.

It may be useful to remark that
Personal* Property left **WITHOUT A
WILL** is divisible as under.

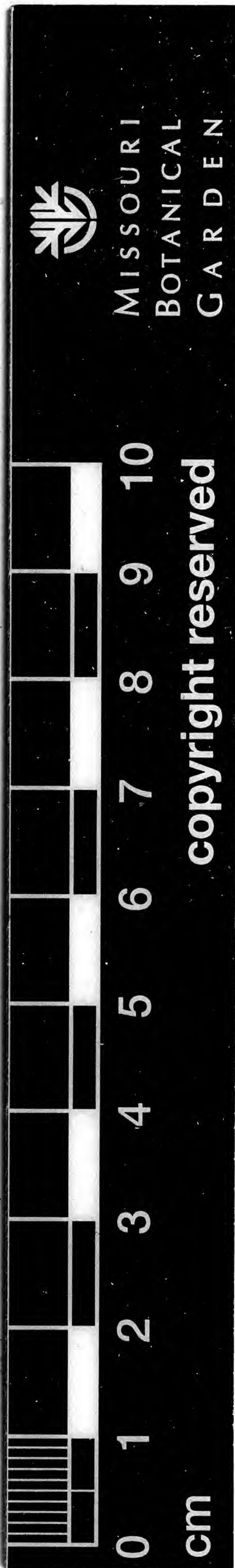

(a) FORMS OF WILL, published at 6d. each.

1. Devise of Property to one or more persons absolutely.

2. Devise of Property to Executors in trust, to be sold, and to pay proceeds to any number of persons.

3. Devise of Property to Executors in trust, to be sold, and to pay proceeds to Testator's Children with provision for maintenance during minority of Children, and with clauses for appointment of other trustees.

4. Devise of Property to Wife for life, and after her death to Children absolutely.

5. Devise of Property to Wife absolutely.

6. Devise of Property for a Married Woman to bequeath her separate personal Estate, independently of her Husband.

7. Devise of Property in trust for Testator's children, and the portions of Daughters settled for their separate use.

8. Special Legacies and Bequests.

9. Seamen's forms of Wills.

(In ordering any of the foregoing, the No. 1, 2, 3, or otherwise, ought to be specified.)

(b) These must be parties not interested in the Will, or their claim to such interest becomes forfeited.

(c) In all cases where a name is given, it is essential to describe fully and clearly the Christian name, the surname, residence, and trade or profession.

(d) The Residue becomes the property of the next of kin, unless otherwise provided for.

POST OFFICE REGULATIONS.

RATES OF POSTAGE.

LETTERS.—INLAND.—The rate of postage throughout the United Kingdom is 1d. for each $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., or fraction of the same, or double if not prepaid.

No letter packet must exceed 2 feet in length, or 1 foot in width or depth.

No person, except the Postmaster-General and the Secretary, may send or receive Letters free of Postage; but addresses to Her Majesty and petitions to either House of Parliament, if not exceeding 2 lbs. in weight, and open to inspection, are free.

The Fees and Postage upon *Late Letters* must be entirely prepaid in Stamps.

For "Registration" of Letters, see special clause so headed.

FOREIGN.—The postage of letters (under $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.) to and from Soldiers and Sailors, prepaid 1d. only (in addition to Foreign rates), if to or through a Foreign Country, but no further charge on re-direction. Letters for foreign places should have the route written on the cover.

The average rate (payable as a rule in advance) on letters between the United Kingdom and places beyond the sea, when conveyed by private

ship is 6d., but such letter must have the words "by private ship" written on the cover. Newspapers by the same are charged 1d. each.

NEWSPAPERS (Stamped) and other registered periodicals — INLAND — must be made up in covers open at the sides, have the stamp exposed to view, and be posted within thirty-one days of publication; have no marks or writing in any part except the address, or they will be charged 2d. extra on each paper. They are forwarded from one part of the Kingdom to another free (except those delivered within the free delivery, or three miles of the place where posted, which are charged 1d.) Unstamped Newspapers are treated as Books.

FOREIGN.—Newspapers or periodicals registered at the General Post Office for transmission abroad, are sent under certain privileges, and at rates (see Table) lower than those not so registered, which are treated as Books.

BOOK PACKETS — INLAND — may be forwarded by Post within the United Kingdom if they do not exceed 24 inches in length and 12 inches in width, the ends be left open, and they be pre-paid in stamps, at the following rates: not exceeding 4 oz., 1d.; 8 oz., 2d.; 12 oz., 3d.; and 1d. additional for every $\frac{1}{4}$ lb. or fraction of same. If they be insufficiently paid they will be charged with the deficient book postage and an additional rate, but any packet which bears no postage stamps will be charged double postage. A Book Packet may consist of any number of separate books, magazines, circulars, invoices, maps, photographs not on glass, or prints, and any quantity of paper, vellum, parchment, or any mixture of the three, in any legitimate binding, covering or mounting fixed or detached, necessary either to their safe transit or naturally pertaining to them (to the exclusion of letters, or any communication of the nature of a letter), and the books, maps, paper, &c., may be printed, Written, or plain.

FOREIGN.—The same rules as to the nature of an Inland Book Packet are applicable for foreign countries, with the following notes: that for India, no packet may exceed 4 lbs, and Queensland, N. S. Wales, and the continent, *via* Belgium, 3 lbs.; or for Austria, *via* Sardinia, 1 lb., and as a rule (except to British Colonies), should have no writing in or upon them beyond the address.

No reprints of English copyright works from any place abroad are allowed by book post, but are charged at letter rates.

For rates and other exceptions, see Table.

PATTERNS of merchandise can now be forwarded between any places in the United Kingdom, at the rate of

The privilege has also been extended to Liberia, France, French Offices in the Levant, Italy (except Papal States), and to Constantinople, India (4 lbs), *via* Marseilles, ditto *via* Southampton; Canada, by Canadian Packet; Malta, Gibraltar, Alexandria, Cairo, Suez, Hong Kong, Mauritius, and Ceylon; also New Brunswick, Newfoundland, Prince Edward's Island, Nova Scotia, Hayti, British West Indies, British Settlements on the W. C. of Africa, the Australian Colonies, Labuan, the German States, Belgium, Switzerland, Denmark, Queensland, Cape of Good Hope, Natal, St. Helena, Russia, Portugal, and New Granada, at the rates of postage chargeable upon printed matter, provided such packets or patterns (for France ex-

cepted) do not exceed 2 ft. in length by 1 in width. Packets addressed to France must not exceed 18 inches, and to the German States, Belgium, and countries *via* Austria, the weight must not exceed 8 ozs. They must not have any writing contained in them other than the address, trade marks, numbers, and prices of the articles, and the articles themselves must not be of intrinsic value.

PRICES CURRENT AND OTHER STAMPED PUBLICATIONS.—Every Price Current, Commercial Course of Exchange, Shipping List, or other publication, printed and published in the United Kingdom, not weighing more than 3 oz. (the circulation of which by Post has been sanctioned by the Postmaster-General, and registered at the G.P.O. for circulation abroad), will be placed upon the same footing as a Newspaper.

DELIVERY.—London.

There are twelve deliveries daily—seven within a circle of four miles, and five for longer distances; the first at 7.30 a.m., the second at 9 a.m., and the remainder every hour until 6 p.m. The last delivery is at 7.45 p.m. The pillar letter boxes and receiving houses close about one hour before each delivery. There is no delivery in the London District on Sundays.

SERVICES OF PARLIAMENTARY NOTICES.—These Notices may be sent through the Post, provided they are posted on or before the 12th of December, at the chief offices of London, Dublin, or Edinburgh, or one or other of the following Offices:—Birmingham, Bristol, Exeter, Lincoln, Liverpool, Leeds, Manchester, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, Norwich, Shrewsbury, Aberdeen, Glasgow, Inverness, Athlone, Belfast, and Cork. The words "Parliamentary Notice" must be legibly printed on the face of the letter; the postage and a registration fee of 4*d.* must be prepaid in stamps at the time of posting, which may be known by applying to the above Offices. Duplicate lists of the Addresses must be sent with the notices, which must be arranged as on the lists.

PRINTED VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS IN PARLIAMENT, if the same be written on the cover, are charged at Book rates, and in the United Kingdom need not be paid in advance, but to Colonies are treated as *Books*.

REGISTERED LETTERS, BOOKS, &c.—All letters containing coin *must* be registered, or they will be subject to a *double registration fee* in addition to the postage, on delivery. Letters, Book Packets, Newspapers, &c., may be registered for Inland circulation, or to the British Colonies, upon payment of the registration fee in stamps, in addition to the ordinary postage. The fee upon Inland letters, &c., is 4*d.*; upon those for British Colonies, 4*d.* Books for Foreign Countries (Italy excepted) can only be registered as letters.

MONEY ORDERS are granted and paid at every Post Town in the United Kingdom, the commission for which is 3*d.* for sums not exceeding £2; 6*d.* not exceeding £5; 9*d.* not exceeding £7, and 1*s.* not exceeding £10, the highest sum for which a single Order is granted. Money Orders are also granted and paid at Canada, Malta, Gibraltar, New Zealand, Victoria, West Australia, Cape of Good Hope, Queensland, South Australia, Barbados, Tobago, Jamaica, Antigua, Gambia, S. Leone, N. Scotia, P. Edward's Island, Newfoundland, Honduras, Montserrat, Bahamas, St. Lucia, St. Kitts, Constantinople, Alexandria, Rio Janeiro, Bahia, Pernambuco, New Brunswick, Buenos Ayres, Monte Video.

SAVINGS' BANK.—Deposits of not less than one shilling can be made daily at any Post Office Savings' Bank during the same hours in which money-order business is transacted. The total amount of deposits made in one year must not exceed £30. Interest, £2 10*s.* per cent. per annum upon total amount deposited, when it does not exceed £150. When the interest & principal together amount to £200, no interest will be given.

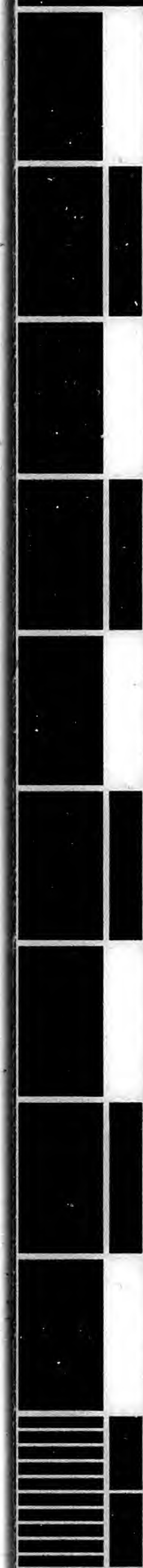

To insure regularity, Passengers are requested to see that their Names are properly inserted in the List, and are particularly requested to notice that all Merchandise brought with their Baggage is liable to seizure unless duly reported as such by the Master of the Vessel.

Minute Commissioners of Customs, 11th May, 1844, permits Cambric or Lawns, Leather Gloves, Silk and Tobacco, found in Passengers' Baggage, to be admitted to entry, although not entered on the Report.

CAUTION.

If any Passenger or Person on board any Vessel or Boat, shall upon being questioned by any Officer or Officers of Her Majesty's Customs, whether he or she have any Foreign Goods upon his or her person, or in his or her possession, deny the same, and any such Goods after such denial be discovered upon his or her person or in his or her possession, such goods to be forfeited, and such person to pay treble the value of such goods.

British Carriages, British Plate, and Foreign Books, Maps, or Musical Instruments, re-imported into Great Britain, allowed to be passed free on declaration.

COMMERCIAL SUMMARY.

Or record of all matters affecting our Commerce, the Markets, &c., for the year beginning January 1, and ending December 31, 1866.

It is arranged in divisions or parts, viz.,
1. *Chronological Statement of events.*
2. *Fluctuations of prices in the markets*
3. *Probable or immediate cause of such Fluctuations.*

THE year 1866 will long be remembered in commercial and financial circles as the year of *Credit Panic* in this country; the inflation of credit by the agency of Finance Companies having given undue expansion to reckless and unsound speculation—until in the month of May the stoppage of the largest discounting house in the world (Overend, Gurney, & Co.) brought on a crisis of unexampled financial pressure, which affected all the great centres of commerce, and being speedily followed by the suspension of Agra and Masterman's and other Banks and Finance Companies, reacted upon Calcutta and Bombay with crushing effect. The Bank rate of discount which opened in January at 7 per cent., reached 10 per cent. in May, and was maintained for a period of fourteen weeks, when on the 16th of August, it was reduced to 8 per cent. In the meantime, the records of the Court of Chancery show that upwards of 200 firms were in process of liquidation. Abroad, an apprehended war between Prussia and Italy allied against Austria, accompanied by a political agitation on the subject of Reform, a rise in wages all over the country, and a change of Ministry at home, together with a severe visitation of Cholera in London, aggravated to intensity the anxieties and sufferings of all classes. An average harvest was regarded as a blessing, for which the country was profoundly grateful to Providence. And although individual suffering was widely inflicted, the returns of the Board of Trade demonstrated that our national resources are not impaired, but on the contrary, continue to exhibit a substantial increase.

JANUARY.

Financial and commercial affairs were comparatively quiet, owing to the opening rate of 7 per cent. discount, which was in the course of the month advanced to 8 per cent. This arose from the drain of gold to Paris and of silver to the East. English securities had a tendency to decline, but Consols exhibited a variation of $\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. Foreign stocks declined from 1 to 2 per cent., and all speculative stocks were greatly depreciated. There was also a fall in Railway, as also in Banking shares generally, whilst in discount and Finance Companies the

appearance was very discouraging. National Discount fell $1\frac{1}{2}$; Overend, Gurney, & Co., $1\frac{1}{2}$; Consolidated, $2\frac{7}{8}$; and Discount Corporation 2 per cent. The Buenos Ayres Loan was not very successful, nor was the Egyptian Loan very buoyant. The high rate of discount, in fact, operated against all financial schemes, and a rise in the rate of discount by the Bank of France checked speculation on the other side of the Channel. Great uncertainty of opinion prevailed as to an early rise, or the contrary, in the value of money.

FEBRUARY.

The Bank rate of discount was maintained for the first fortnight of this month at 8 per cent., and consequently during this period, there was little activity in financial and commercial affairs; but the lowering of the rate to 7 per cent. induced some new projects to be brought out in this market; and we may note that it was in this month that the Bank of England were by an Order in Council, in accordance with the provisions of the Bank Charter Act of 1844, empowered to create an additional issue of notes to the amount of £350,000, to replace the lapsed issue of the National Provincial Bank of England, which had elected to be a London bank. But low rates of money were not anticipated, and the uncertainty of political affairs abroad, as well as disturbances in Ireland, caused a good deal of anxiety, which imparted a general flatness to the Money market. Consols fluctuated between $87\frac{3}{4}$ and $86\frac{1}{2}$; and Foreign stocks were inactive. Railway and Banking shares showed little disposition to advance; but Finance and Credit shares were prejudiced by disclosures in connection with the Joint Stock Discount Company. Produce markets slightly firmer.

MARCH.

The Bank of England reduced the rate from 7 to 6 per cent., and the Bank of France then reduced from 4 to $3\frac{1}{2}$ per cent.; but, in spite of this, money was by no means abundant. In short, there was great mistrust prevailing in reference to Discount Companies, owing to the break up of the Joint Stock Discount Corporation and the Contract Corporation Company. Consols fluctuated $\frac{3}{4}$ to 1 per cent., and there was a general depreciation in Foreign stock. The situation of affairs in Mexico brought down the Mexican, and Spanish was much weaker. Turkish securities were, however, less fluctuating this month. Railway shares generally declined. But the remarkable feature of the month was a most unprincipled conspiracy to affect quotations prejudicially by false rumours. The conspiracy succeeded, and the fall in Credit and Finance shares was frightful.

COMMERCIAL SUMMARY—CHRONOLOGICAL STATEMENT.

APRIL.

The aspect of the market was very unsettled. A general want of confidence prevailed. Notwithstanding that in the early part of the month an expectation was entertained that the Bank rate would be reduced to 5 per cent.; but then occurred the failure of Barned's Bank at Liverpool to the astonishment of every one, and increased the disfavor in which Bank, Finance, and Credit Companies were held. The hostile attitude of Prussia, Italy, and Austria created great disturbance in the Continental trade and materially checked operations in Foreign stocks. Spanish and Mexican still formed the chief attraction to the speculator, but the funds of neither of them exhibited anything like encouragement, and were considerably lower at the end of the month. Turkish managed to maintain its ground, and the Scrip of the Brazilian, Chilian, and the Viceroy of Egypt loans were fairly supported. The Railway market was weak; Banks were heavy; but Finance and Credit shares every day more depressed. The operations of the "Bears," were directed against every class of security. The signs of the times were very discouraging both abroad and at home. Coming events cast their shadows before.

MAY.

On the 3rd of May the Bank advanced the rate of discount from 6 to 7 per cent.; on the 8th, to 8 per cent.; on the 11th, to 9 per cent.; and on the 12th, to 10 per cent.; and on the same day the Bank Charter Act of 1844 was extended by authority of the Government, permission being given to the directors to issue notes to an indefinite extent beyond the limits prescribed by the Act. Meanwhile, the rate of the Bank of Holland was 6 per cent., and at the Bank of France, 4 per cent.; Prussia, 7; and Frankfort, 6. The immediate influencing causes of this crisis were the failure of Peto and Betts, on the 11th (£4,000,000); Shrimpton (£200,000); English Joint Stock Bank (£800,000); Overend, Gurney, & Co. (£10,000,000); of which £6,000,000 to depositors); and on the 15th, Hallet, Ommaney, & Co. (£30,000); Imperial Mercantile Credit (£4,000,000); Commercial Corporation of London on the same day; Framjee & Co., East India House (£400,000); European Bank, on the 19th; Luckie Bros. (£80,000), on the 22nd; Kynaston, colonial brokers (£100,000), on the 23rd; Macculloch, of Liverpool (£800,000), on the 25th; and suspension of the Consolidated Bank, on the 28th, to which the Bank of London had transferred its business so recently as the 23rd; Enthoven & Sons, in the Spanish trade, suspended on the 30th, liabilities £300,000. These are the principal failures; but the list of firms and companies un-

able to meet the crisis would fill a volume. The severity of the crisis is said never to have exceeded in intensity. Lombard-street on the morning of the 12th, Black Friday as it was called (the day of the suspension of Overend and Gurney's), was densely crowded by a silent gloomy crowd as witnesses of a great national calamity. All securities, of course, went down, and even Consols fluctuated between $87\frac{1}{2}$ and $84\frac{1}{2}$. The ruin was wide-spread

JUNE.

During the whole of this month the Bank rate of discount was maintained at 10 per cent., and the crushing severity of the crisis was manifested in the failure of Agra and Masterman's Bank on the 6th, with liabilities to the enormous amount of £19,000,000. On the 9th, the St. Columb. and Falmouth Bank stopped with liabilities of £200,000. The Universal Banking Corporation (formerly Challis' Bank); Rattray & Co. £70,000; Sir Charles Price & Co.; Snead & Co.; Chepstow, and innumerable others. The breaking out of the war between Italy and Austria on the 23rd, which was rapidly followed by open hostilities between Austria and Prussia, led to serious commercial and political embarrassments abroad; and the resignation of the Gladstone Administration, the agitation for Reform, and numerous strikes all over the Kingdom, complicated affairs at home. The fluctuations in Consols were principally upwards. At one time the declaration of war between Austria and Prussia stimulated distrust, and there was a fall. A recovery, however, took place, but towards the end of the month, there was further depression. The maintenance of the Bank rate increased the distress. Bank shares fluctuated violently; but Finance and Credit exhibited a slight recovery. Railway shares improved. The Produce markets were comparatively deserted, and much difficulty was experienced in effecting sales.

JULY.

The strain of a 10 per cent. rate of discount continuing, the failure of the Birmingham, Preston, and other Banks took place, occasioning great local distress. There was also a great drain of bullion abroad, which was regarded as very extraordinary, whilst the Bank of France reduced its rate to $3\frac{1}{4}$, and at Berlin the rate was down at 6. There was general inactivity manifest during the whole of the month. Consols fluctuated $2\frac{1}{4}$ per cent., and the market for Railway shares greatly declined; and in the foreign stock market business gave way to the extent of 3 to 4 per cent.

AUGUST.

Still 10 per cent.! The Bank directors refused to make any reduc-

tion in the rate, and the Joint Stock Banks of the Metropolis had an interview with the Chancellor of the Exchequer, with a view of inducing him to make some amelioration in the terms of the Government letter issued by Mr. Gladstone on the 12th of May. They could make no impression on Mr. D'Israeli. But the arrivals of the precious metals continued to increase, and without any action on the part of the Government, the Directors of the Bank of England found themselves in a position, on the 16th of this month, to reduce the rate of discount to 8 per cent. On the 23rd the rate was further reduced to 7 per cent.; and on the 30th, there was a further reduction to 6 per cent. The value of Consols was favorably influenced by the reduction of the rate and the prospect of an abundant harvest. But all classes of securities were heavy on the market, although there was a satisfactory improvement in the realization of produce.

SEPTEMBER.

In the course of this month (6th) the Bank rate was reduced to 5 per cent., and on the 27th, to $4\frac{1}{2}$ per cent.; yet the reduction had little or no effect in stimulating enterprise. This was, in all probability, due to the apprehension that the harvest would prove unfavorable, and that, consequently, money would be hereafter required for grain purchases. There were also short crops in France, and the stock of bullion in the Bank of France exhibited a decline. Nevertheless, the market for English securities did not fluctuate to any great extent, owing to the state of foreign politics and the absence of business. Railway shares declined, because there was a falling off in the traffic; and Banking, Finance, and Credit shares were quite inactive.

OCTOBER.

Although the *minimum* rate of $4\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. still continued, and the supply of money was everywhere abundant, a general inactivity prevailed, and an indisposition to embark in any new speculations. Public confidence had been so grossly abused during the previous months of the year, that although some promising undertakings were introduced to the market, it is generally understood that they were chiefly sustained by the subscription of a small number of capitalists, rather than by any important contribution on the part of the general public. The revelations in connection with the London, Chatham, and Dover, and the North British Railway Companies, strengthened the previous distrust in all railway enterprise and terribly damaged the credit of railway property generally. Finance Companies and Banking Companies had no speculative operations to supply with capital; and as to foreign

securities, there were some operations in Mexican and Turkish, but of no great magnitude. The month was altogether a month of stagnation.

NOVEMBER.

The general characteristics of the money market during the month were increasing firmness in almost every description of security. An enormous increase in the bullion of the Bank of England, was coupled with an inactivity of enterprise and a rise in Consols. The month was also memorable for the re-constitution of the Agra and Masterman's Bank, under the title of the Agra Bank; the resignation of the Directors of the North British Railway Company, and the election of an entirely new Board; and last, but not the least significant feature of the month, was the loan by Russia for six millions sterling, which was so eagerly received that applications were made to the amount of twenty millions. This was interpreted by many to be an unwelcome indication that the abundance of unemployed capital in the market would seek investment in foreign loans, in which so large an amount of British capital has in past years been sunk, and in too many cases, utterly lost. The price of the issue of the Russian Loan was 86 per cent., and was introduced by Messrs. Baring, in conjunction with Messrs. Hope, of Amsterdam.

DECEMBER.

On the 20th of this month the rate of discount fell from 4 to $3\frac{1}{2}$ per cent., and there was a general reduction of rate by the principal Banks of the Continent. The great increase in the resources of the Banks of England and France had a favorable effect on Consols; foreign stocks were better, and Railway securities exhibited an encouraging rise in prices. India and China engagements were reported to be greatly lessened; and Australian Bills so greatly diminished, that there appeared to be a general plethora of money; but all these favorable circumstances had no effect in introducing any new schemes to the market. The disposition seemed rather in favor of foreign loans, from the good reception which was given to the Russian Loan in November. But the high financial credit of Russia may be said to be almost exceptional; and although a rush of foreign borrowers was expected, none were bold enough to try the experiment. Nevertheless, it is obvious that this inactivity of capital cannot, in the nature of things, be of long continuance. With discount rates at $3\frac{1}{2}$ per cent., and a surplus on the year's revenue, which is estimated at one and three-quarter millions in the hands of the Chancellor of the Exchequer, and Bullion exceeding £18,000,000 in the coffers of the Bank, we may fairly presume that speculation is already preparing for the year 1867.

COMMERCIAL SUMMARY—PROBABLE CAUSES OF FLUCTUATIONS.

THE MARKETS.

1st Jan. to 31st Dec. 1866.

LOOKING over the Produce Markets for 1866, we have to note that the revival of trade in Autumn was maintained far beyond the Autumn revival of 1865. Although the high rate of discount checked business, the curious fact is, that *in spite of it* the year 1866 was in advance of all former years. When the monetary difficulty made its appearance, the best authorities pronounced that it would be disastrous. It was feared that merchants would be induced by the high rate of interest to *realise* immediately, and that *in consequence*, the stimulus usually accompanying a low rate would not be experienced. But this theory was wrong on this occasion. No *bonâ fide* collapse took place. Business proved itself sufficiently sound to sustain a temporary high rate; and although an unexpected depression in prices continued after the reduction in the rate of discount, we apprehend that business is quite ready to expand again under more favorable auspices. Trade generally was never more legitimate and sound than at the close of the year; and if not in proportion to the abundance of money, its extent is such as that we have reason to be satisfied with it after the exhaustive process of the panic.

ASHES.—Both Pots and Pearls—the one being the crude ash of the burned forest tree, being principally supplied from Montreal, the United States, and Sweden; and the other being reduced to a soda—have, of course, different values in the market. They enter, both sorts, very largely into our manufactures, and a rise in price may affect the profitableness of a contract in many branches of manufacture. During the year 1866 the price of “Pots” has varied from 42s. to 45s., at which it closed in December for the best sort, and 42s. and 48s. for “Pearls.”

COCOA.—By reference to the table subjoined, it will be seen that the fluctuations in the price of Cocoa have been but of moderate range. It opened in January at 57s. to 115s.; attained 118—62 on August, and closed at 120 for the highest price, and 70 for the lowest. In the year 1865 the fluctuations were more extensive.

COCHINEAL.—The highest price of Cochineal was touched in August, after the reduction of the 10 per cent. rate; but at no time did the prices exceed those of the opening month of the year, the average being about 3s. 10d.

COFFEE.—At the commencement of the year the demand was active, and the prices ranged for ordinary and triage, 59s. to 67s. 6d.; grey, 72s.; good and fine middling, 88s. to 91s. per cwt. In February prices declined, and throughout the whole of March the markets presented a quiet appear-

ance, very small arrivals having been landed. In April, however, limited public sales of Ceylon went off at firm prices, 65s. to 78s. 6d.; fine ordinary to low middling at 77s. 6d. to 79s.; middling to good middling, 81s. to 89s. In May no Ceylon was brought to auction, but the prices were fully 5s. lower than in April. This, it will be remembered, was the month when the Bank rate was raised to 10 per cent. In June the outbreak of hostilities in Germany caused a still further depression, the market giving way 3s. to 4s. more. Plantation fell to 69s. and 70s., establishing a decline of from 14s. to 16s. per cwt. In July there was a slight rise; and in August the prices would have risen but for the large quantity of produce which had been hitherto held back being thrown upon the markets. At the end of September there was an average advance of 6d. per cwt., which was scarcely sustained in October and November; and even at the close of December prices had not recovered.

CORN.—It appears a curious fact that the money panic of 1866 scarcely touched the Corn trade. Our home production fell short; so much so, in fact, that whilst we imported grain in 1865 to the extent of 49,237,598 cwt., we took 63,259,922 cwt. in 1866, the difference involving an excess of payment of nearly eight millions sterling. The harvest of the past year has not been as prosperous as was at one time expected. The crop of wheat is estimated at 14 per cent. below the average; Barley, 15 per cent. less; Oats, middling; Beans and Peas, about an average, though injured by rain; Potatoes, the worst crop since 1847. The total stocks of grain on the 31st December, 1866, were 459,660 quarters against 657,004 quarters at the close of 1865.

COTTON.—The stock of Cotton in Liverpool at the beginning of the year was 370,275 bales against 466,300 in 1865, the American bales numbering 143,722 against 23,210 at the corresponding date; but the difference in the weight must be taken into consideration. The average prices in January were: Uplands, 18½d.; middling Orleans, 21d.; and Dhollerah, 17¾d. In February prices declined 1d. to 1½d. per lb.; and in March prices recovered the January rates. In April there was a rapid fall, owing to the announcements of arrivals from the United States, and from Bombay, Calcutta, and Madras; the unsettled state of foreign politics, and the stringency of the Money market. The month of May witnessed a frightful collapse, and the loss represented in the prices of Cotton was estimated at from £7,000,000 to £8,000,000, which fell to a considerable extent on native Indian and American shippers. Prices were down as low as Uplands, 13½d.; middling Orleans, 13½d.; and Dhollerah, 6½d. per lb. A good trade

sprung up in June for the better sort: but Surats were heavy, and Dhollerah went down to 5½d. Prices ruled higher in July, and the reduction of the rate of discount in August from 10 to 8 per cent. gave greater activity to the demand; but the supply was so large, that the advance in price was small. In September there was a fall of 2d. per lb. in Sea Island, with a general downward tendency of all descriptions. A good deal of speculation arose from the wide difference in the various estimates of the American yield for the year. By some it was calculated as high as 2,680,000 bales. A subsequent calculation gave a total of 2,000,000, whilst the lowest placed it at 1,400,000. The prices in December were fully 3d. per lb. lower than in January.

HEMP.—The quotations in Hemp, notwithstanding that Jute has entered into competition with it, have shown but few fluctuations. The present stock in London — 31st December 1866—is about 3,000 tons, being less than at the corresponding period of 1865.

Hops.—The year 1866 opened with the prospect of a general scarcity of Hops, both at home and abroad, owing to the universal appearance of vermin in the plantations; but to whatever climatic or other cause it may have been due, the visitation suddenly ceased, and towards the close of spring the plant generally showed signs of recovery. The proportion of the English crop not fatally injured was two-thirds; of the Belgian, Bavarian, and Bohemian, one half; whilst the crops in the United States escaped with comparative impunity. The unfavorable weather of September portended scarcity, and holders took full advantage of the circumstances; but although choice samples brought high prices, the advance generally was not on the scale which had been calculated. The prices were not unreasonable, considering the limited stock of yearlings and old on hand. The quality of the Bavarian crops was very superior. The limitation of produce by unfavorable seasons generally had the effect of stimulating cultivation, and the article of Hops proves no exception. At home, and as reported abroad, Hop gardens are being multiplied and extended.

INDIGO has shown a variation of at least 1s. per lb. on the best qualities, and every shade of price distinguishes the inferior kinds from 1s. per lb. to 8s. 6d.

IRON.—The strong speculative movement which set in towards the close of 1865 continued for the first four months of the year 1866, increasing daily in intensity till the price touched 82s. on the 28th April. The market had, in fact, been what is familiarly termed "rigged." Prices then rapidly declined touching 50s. 6d.

on the 25th May, recovering in June to 77s. 9d.; the fluctuations since having been of a trifling character. After the panic, the Ironmasters restricted the furnaces in blast, and the statistics, in consequence, show a falling off in the production of 170,000 tons compared with 1865. The export, and consumption also, fall short of last year by 136,000 tons, which is not surprising, considering the disastrous condition of the iron-ship building trade and the disturbance in the labor market. Prices at the close of 1865 were £3 5s. 6d cash; in December, 1866, cash £2 14s. 9d.

LAC DYE, in proportion to its selling price, has exhibited a greater fluctuation than any in our list. In January Lac Dye was 2s. 4d. per lb. to 1s. 10d. In June it was 2s. and 1s., at which it stood also at the close of the year.

LINSEED OIL.—The year 1866 opened at £36 10s. Rape Oil; £53 English; and £54 Foreign brown Olive only; £51 Cocoa-nut; £52 Cochin; and £48 Ceylon. There was an advance in February in Linseed Oil, but other oils were rather under the previous rates; the improvement in Linseed Oil was not, however, maintained in March, but in Olive there was an advance. In May, Linseed was still lower, say at £35. In June, however, it was £36; Cocoa-nut, Cochin, £52 10s.; but Ceylon showed a decline, and was sold at £41. In August there was a remarkable fall in Linseed Oil, the price being £41. In September prices were a shade cheaper, but in October there was a heavy fall to £39. From this period the market continued to grow weaker until the close of the year, when we quote Linseed at £37; Rape, £39 10s.; Olive, £61; Cocoa-nut Cochin, £61 10s.; and Ceylon, £51.

MOLASSES.—There was very little variation in the quotations throughout the year, from January until August. West India goods standing at 17s., and 15s. for cattle feeding. The supply was not always equal to the demand, and holders kept back, yet the prices did not rise in September or October, and in November they declined to 14s. for good West India; but a rise took place on the closing month of the year of 16s. per cent.

NITRATE OF SODA, an article of very large consumption, has shown a continuous decline throughout the year, which opened at 14s. a ton and closed at 12s. 6d.

RICE.—The prices of all descriptions of Rice have exhibited a very considerable rise during the last few months of the year. The inquiry for January was chiefly for the home trade, and prices were easier than in the previous month. Bengal White being 12s. 6d. to 16s.; Rangoon and Bassein, 11s. to 13s.; Madras, 12s. 0d. to 13s. 9d.; and Java, 14s. to 27s. per cwt. The easiness in price

was mainly due to advices from Rangoon and Bassein in anticipation of a large supply, but which actual results subsequently contradicted. There was an improvement in prices of 1d. per lb. in February, and there was a further advance of 1½d. per lb. in March, owing to the small stock on hand. This was followed by a downward tendency, which was afterwards checked by bad news from Rangoon and Bassein of the prospects of the crop. In June, however, the prices gave way, but business was pretty steady in August; and in September prices advanced 3d. to 6d. per cwt. on all descriptions, with very large business in Bengal, and the soft grain varieties on the spot, and for arrivals in the London market, and for the Continent. Rangoon and Bassein ruled at 11s. to 16s. 6d.; Madras, 12s. to 14s. 6d.; and other descriptions advanced in proportion. This advance was followed by the failure of the crop in the Bengal and Madras Presidencies, and prices ran up 1s. per cwt.

SALTPETRE.—The market opened at the beginning of the year at a decline upon the rates of 1865, the prices being for Bengal 6¼ to 7¼ refracting, 23s. 3d., and remained flat at reduced prices in February. They were still lower in April, a better article being bought at 22s. 6d. There was a rise, however, in May, only to go down again in June. At the close of July a further fall had taken place, Bengal refracting—8½ being sold at 21s. cash in fourteen days, and pure German at 22s. At the end of August the same prices ruled upon the terms previously mentioned for July, and for the rest of the year Saltpetre continued to sell cheaper; and in the opinion of the best informed at the time at which we write, a further decline seems probable.

SILK.—At the commencement of the year prices of China Silk were low, as Tsatlee No. 3. 30s. to 30s. 6d. Nor did they exhibit any rise until in August after the reduction of the rate of discount to 8 per cent., when the quotations showed advancing rates for all descriptions. Tsatlee, 32s.; Japan Mybash, 35s. The Silk trade throughout the year has been very depressed, nor at the close does it show any symptom of activity.

SPIRITS.—In Brandies and Rum the prices have ruled very regularly throughout the year.

SUGAR.—The market for Sugars exhibited very little variation throughout the year. British West India, low brown Tobago, at 31s.; and good brown Demerara at 33s.; brown Mauritius, at 22s.; and low grain at 34s. 6d. to 35s. 6d. (duty 10s. 6d.); Bengal, 24s.

TALLOW.—The highest price of St. Petersburg P.Y.C. was reached in March, and continued to decline until the close of the year, when it was as low as 41s. 9d.

TEA.—The result of the reduction of the Tea Duties in 1865 has been a continuously increased consumption; that of 1866 far exceeding that of any previous year. The loss to the revenue is being gradually recovered; our exports, too, have experienced an enlargement. Since the restriction placed by Prussia on seaborne Teas, considerable orders have been received from that country. The United States demand was also recovering, but with the renewal of their Eastern trade we may expect a reduction; at the same time, the American demand has had considerable influence in maintaining prices. The arrival in China of the news of the money crisis in this country checked the extravagant purchases of Tea when the season opened. This check, however, did not last long, and prices were again paid for Teas which only enabled purchasers to lay them down at the coast ports at about London rates; for the export to Great Britain was unprecedentedly large, amounting to the 1st of July to 30,000,000 lbs.! The Tea trade of Japan exhibited little sign of increase, and the quality was better suited to the American than the British markets. The Indian Teas exhibited great falling off, and the cultivation of Tea in India has been greatly discouraged by the financial irregularity of some of the Companies in the Assam valley, and the defective management abroad—thus, this important industry is seriously threatened. The total amount of stock in the United Kingdom at the close of the year 1866 was 76,075,629 lbs., and was 2,000,000 lbs. less than at the opening of 1865. In January the prices were flat, Congou 1s. 8d. to 1s. 11d.; fine and common, 1s. 1d.; medium and Canton were declined; a further decline took place owing to forced sales. In March prices were steady at the public sales; Congous 1s. to 1s. 2d., Karsows (medium) 9¼d. to 2s., all cash; Green Teas sold freely. Prices were full 2d. a lb. lower in April, and the money panic in May caused an almost total suspension of business; but holders did not press sales, and there was no disastrous fall. An increase in the exportation to France was expected, owing to an enactment imposing a preferential duty of only 2d. a lb.—the duty being previously 2s. 2d.—on all Teas imported on other than French bottoms; and on French vessels 6¼d., if the Teas came from India, and 1s. 9d. if from other countries. Prices continued to rule lower in the succeeding months, but importers generally held back in view of the favorable position of the supplies. Prices were very irregular during the remainder of the year, and another fall took place on all kinds—the exceptions being fine Monings, Young Hysons, and Imperials! The total stock in London at the close of the year was 82,957,085 lbs., of which

77,749,197 lbs. black, and 5,207,888 lbs. green. For Liverpool the stock was 2,301,933 lbs., of which 2,211,787 lbs. black, and 90,146 lbs. green. Total for London and Liverpool on the 31st December, 1866, 85,259,018 lbs.; whilst the stock on the 31st December, 1865 was, as we have stated above, 76,075,629 lbs. On a comparison of the value of China Teas sold at auction in December last, common Monings advanced 1d. per lb.; medium qualities did not advance; Young Hyson fetched better prices; Gunpowder and scented Teas sold in small quantities, but not at prices that afforded a comparison with the sale of these kind of Teas in December 1865.

TIN.—At the close of 1865 Tin was £4 a ton higher than at the beginning of that year; and the first movement of the year was a decided fall. At the end of the first six weeks, the fall was £10 a ton! By the close of May prices were at £20 a ton lower. In June and July prices slightly improved, and continued rising to the close of the year, when the quotations were—Banca, per cwt., £4 6s. to £4 7s., as against £4 17s. in 1865. Straits, £4 5s. against £4 15s. in 1865. English Blocks, £4 5s. against £5 2s. in 1865.

WOOL.—The year 1866 opened with far more favorable prospects for the Wool Market than 1865, for then the supply from all quarters to us was unusually heavy, and various branches of trade were contracted. In January last the stocks were extremely limited, and buyers visited London a month before the March sales. The biddings at these sales were very animated. The Colonies sent 81,108 bales; other countries, 545 bales. Of the former, 43,414 bales were from Port Philip and Portland Bay; 11,409 bales from Adelaide; and 20,000 bales from the Cape. The average advance was 1d. per lb. on the November series, but some superior descriptions of Victoria commanded 3s. 8d. to 3s. 10d. per lb.; a few select bales fetching 4s. 1½d. per lb. The average price for superior flocks was 2s. 2d. to 2s. 11d.; for average, 1s. 10d. to 2s. 1d. per lb. The Adelaide wool was in the grease and injured by drought. Superior flocks, 2s. to 2s. 2d.; and average 1s. 10d. to 1s. 11d. Swan River wools were in bad condition. The Cape included prime flocks, but the bulk was medium, the former 1s. 10d. to 2s. 5d.; inferior, 1s. 7d. to 1s. 9d. Of the wool sales in March, one-half was from Prussia and one-eighth from India and China. Indian and Persian white brought 1s. 2d. to 1s. 6d.; Prussia merino, 1s. 9d. to 2s. 2d.; Egyptian white, 1s. 4d. to 1s. 7d.; Turkey, Angora, 1s. 3d. to 1s. 4½d.; whilst Peruvian, Chilian, and Lima fine washed merino fleece, brought from 1s. 5d. to 1s. 8d. per lb. The next sales were in May, and it

was curious enough that they commenced on the very day that Overend and Gurney closed their doors prices were 10 per cent. lower than in March—a fall of 3d. per lb., and Cape 2d. Belgian and German buyers appeared in full force at these sales, and the quantity taken on French account amounted to 68,000 bales. In August, 133,339 bales (Colonial) were offered. The buyers were not so numerous, but the opportune reduction of the Bank rate of discount to 5 per cent. favorably affected prices. A further reduction in the rate, before the quantity catalogued had been disposed of, gave a firmer tone to prices. The Cape wools showed great improvement in condition. At the November sales, Australian and Port Philip advanced ½ to 1d. per lb., but Cape declined that amount. The sales of Colonial wools now assume great importance. A show of Merino wool is to be held in London in August of the present year, 1867. Not only our own Colonial, but Foreign growers will be invited to compete. This honorable rivalry cannot fail to lead to interesting commercial results.

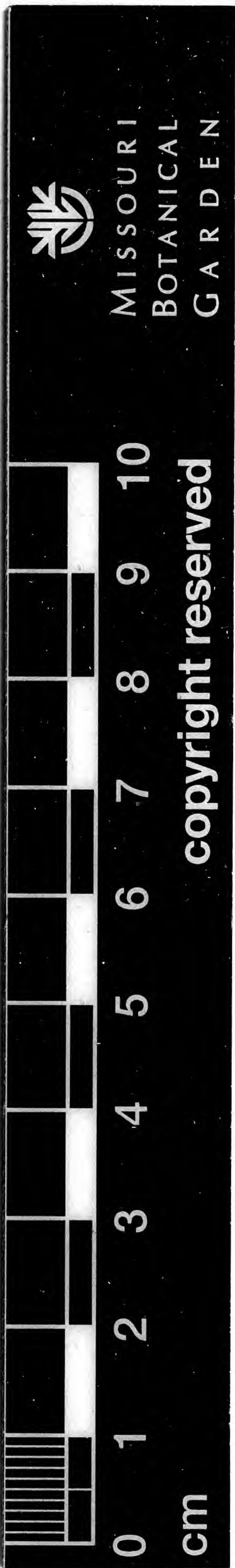

COST OF LIFE ASSURANCE.

The following Table is a List of Life Assurance Companies in Great Britain and Ireland, with the dates of their foundation, and a statement of the Annual Premiums charged by them respectively, corrected up to the present period. We would remark that a Low Rate of Premium ought not alone to be made the test of the advantage proffered to Assurers; the Principles described by the Notes 1, 2, 3 afford considerable explanation. Ultimate security to the Assured ought to be considered, nor ought the reputed character of the Office for liberality, or otherwise, be lost sight of; for circumstances over which one has no control, will sometimes jeopardize a Policy to a serious or even fatal extent, unless the Company be disposed to carry out the spirit of just dealing in preference to the letter of the law. Indeed, there are so many features to be considered previous to effecting a Life Assurance, that the Prospectuses of the Companies themselves ought first to be consulted.

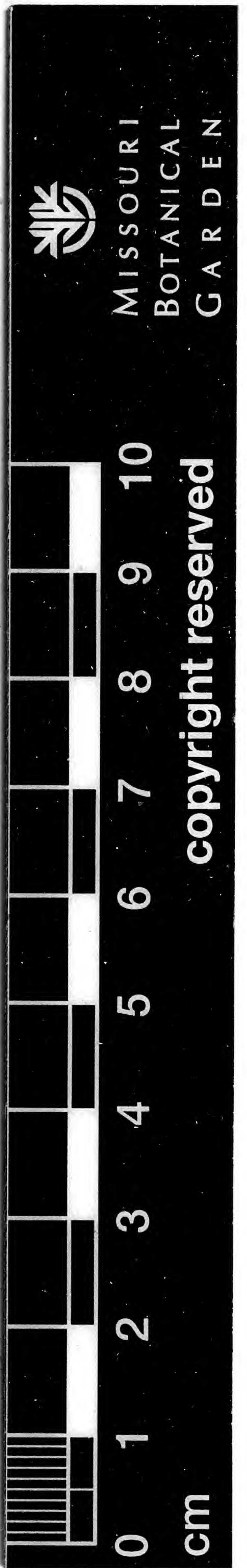
THERE ARE THREE DESCRIPTIONS OF LIFE ASSURANCE COMPANIES, VIZ. :—

1. The *Mutual*. In which the Assured are their own Assurers, and receive the whole of the profits and incur liability, there being no other Proprietary Body. These Offices are marked 1.
2. The *Proprietary*. These Companies are composed of shareholders who are responsible to the Assured each to the extent of his subscribed Capital, and among whom the whole of the profits are divided. These Offices are marked 2.
3. The *Mixed*. In which a defined portion of the profit is given to such of the Assured as prefer to pay increased premiums to entitle them to such participation, the remainder of the profits belonging to the Shareholders. These Offices are marked 3, and the rates quoted are those of the PARTICIPATING scale.
