PREFACE

The interrelationships and interweaving of Mr. Shaw's various business ventures made logical division of the business papers into extant series difficult. Papers were first sorted and arranged by year, then divided by record type into five groups as follows:

Group 1 - ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE. In some instances this group may also contain an account of the expenses for a particular activity but was included in this group (according to modern business practice) if the activity was without question for money making purposes, e. g. rental property accounts.

Group 2 - BUSINESS CORRESPONDENCE. Included in this group is any manuscript which contains some correspondence. Copies of invoices for hardware shipments and other imports accompany James Hoole's letters to Shaw. Bills of lading were enclosed with the correspondence of Jos. Robidoux. Carolyn Shaw's letters are included with the Business Correspondence during the years when she was Shaw's business manager, but other wise constitute a series within the Personal Correspondence.

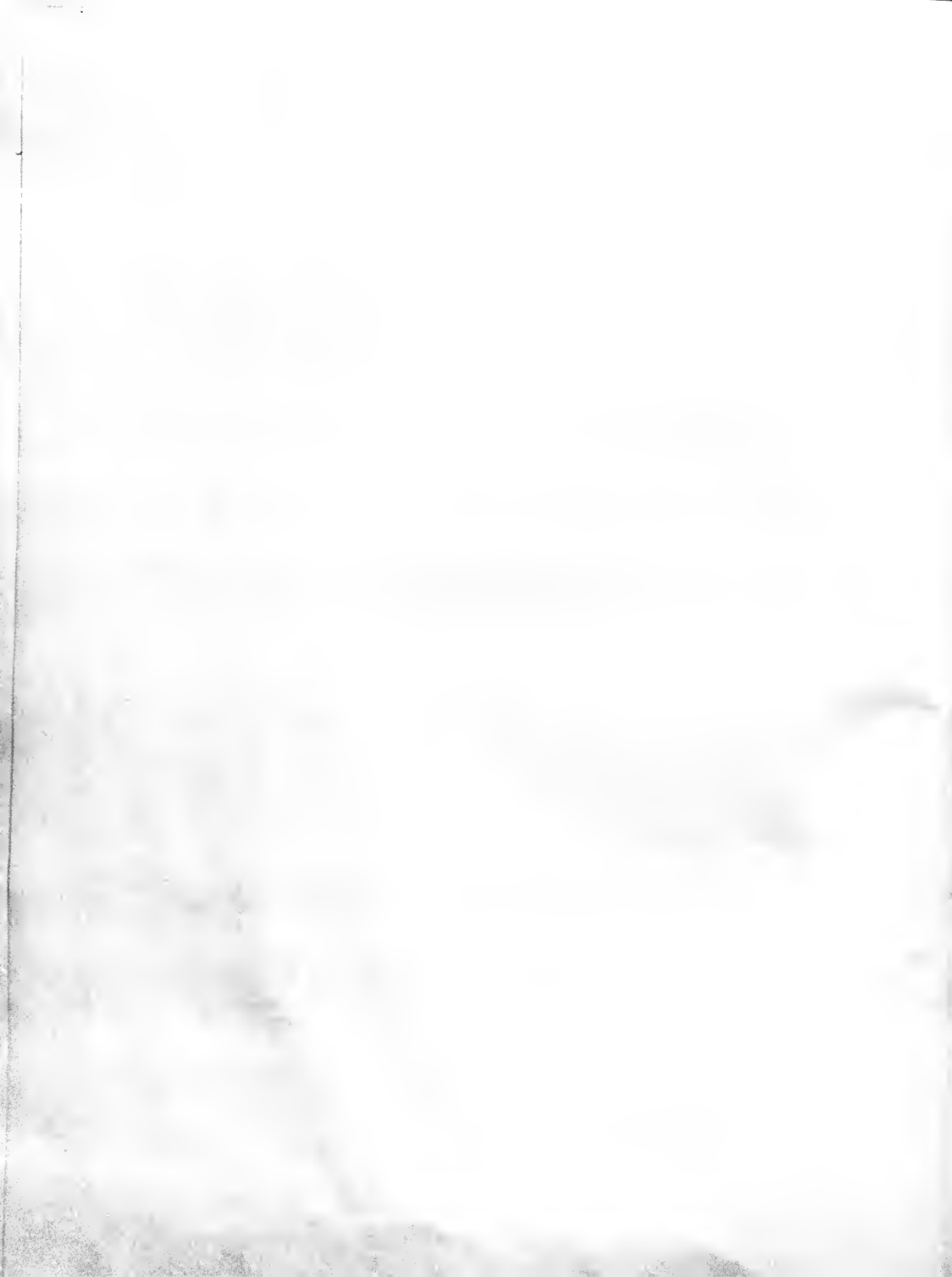
Group 3 - LEGAL DOCUMENTS, AGREEMENTS AND BIDS. Entries in this group are described in clusters and in some cases, albeit briefly, even at an item level, particularly in the case of deeds and leases. Persons with whom a land or building transaction was made are listed with a description of the land, etc.

Group 4 - RECEIPTED BILLS. Most listings in this classification are indeed receipted bills, however, anything which could be considered an Accounts Payable (again according to modern business practice) was included.

Group 5 - MISC. FINANCIAL TRANSACTIONS. Papers in which the record type and/or activity was not readily apparent such as accounts, promissory notes, sight drafts and bills of exchange.

Folder titles within the inventory are underlined and followed by the inclusive dates for the folder and the number of manuscripts enclosed. Folders constitute the major series within the record type and are divided according to the type of activity in which Mr. Shaw was engaged. Persons with whom he transacted business are listed once under each activity with a brief description of the nature of the business with which the vendor was involved.

The number of papers in the 1860s is significantly less than in the other periods. A definite gap occurs in the correspondence with his family, especially James Hoole. Whether caused by the paper shortage, fire or simply intentional destruction is not explained.

Henry Shaw 1800 - 1869

Henry Shaw was born in Sheffield, England on the 24th of July, 1800. His father was Joseph Shaw, a native of Leicester, and his mother, Sarah Hoole, was a native of Sheffield. Educated at Thorne and at Mill Hill, Shaw completed his schooling in 1817 or 1818, and accompanied his father on a merchandising trip to the United States and Canada in 1818. Fortified with hardware and cutlery supplied by the Hoole family cutlery factory in Sheffield, Henry and his father travelled to Quebec, where they separated. While his father confined his movements to southeastern Canada, the more adventurous Henry spent the winter of 1818-1819 travelling through New England and New York, and later sailed to New Orleans. After visiting a family friend there he boarded the "Maid of Orleans" and was deposited, 45 days later, on the brink of that sprawling, bustling outpost known as St. Louis.

Having spent the winter and early spring surrounded by the elegance and civilization of the continent's three most cultured cities -- Quebec, New York and New Orleans -- Shaw was undoubtedly unprepared for the rough and tumble style of life in frontier St. Louis. With his sharp eye for business, however, he quickly realized that what St. Louis lacked in civilization and polish could be more than compensated for in economic opportunity. He lost no time in establishing himself at 7 North First Street, combining a downstairs shop with upstairs living quarters for maximum efficiency. From the outset he lived frugally and traded shrewdly, as his business rapidly expanded to include not only trade in hardware and cutlery, but investments in agricultural commodities, lead mining, real estate and fur as well. Finding time for both recreation and industry, Shaw was frequently seen on his daily afternoon horseback rides; stopping to chat with the local residents and admiring the well-tended gardens of his French neighbors, or exploring the rolling prairies that stretched beyond the city limits. It was on one such excursion that he stumbled across that tract of land upon which his fortune would eventually enable him to establish the Tower Grove estate.

Fortune was not long in coming to the industrious young merchant; when he had completed the books for the year 1839, Shaw discovered, to his surprise, that his net gain for the year had been an astonishing \$25,000. Realizing that this sum "was more money than any man in my circumstances ought to make in a single year," he decided to retire from active trading, and the following year sold his entire stock of merchandise. Thus, at forty years of age Shaw found himself in the enviable position of being in the prime of life, substantially wealthy, and quite free of any business or familial responsibilities.

In the years 1840-1851 Shaw travelled extensively, both in this country and in Europe, returning from his first European trip to commission the noted architect George I. Barnett to begin work on a country house to be situated on Barrier Des Noyers, the prairie that had enchanted him and which he had succeeded in making his own. Barnett accepted this commission, and in 1849 work was completed on what came to be known as Tower Grove House.

Upon completion of the house, and an additional residence at Seventh and Locust, Shaw resumed his European travels, apparently visiting the Great Exhibition in London in 1851, and probably stopping at the Royal Botanic Gardens at Kew. He had been provided with a letter of introduction to Dr. William Hooker, Kew's Director.

Once back from this last voyage to the continent, Shaw began to entertain the idea of developing portions of his estate as a park for the display of exotic trees and plants, a park which would eventually be given to the public. Learning of Shaw's plans, the famed physician-botanist, Dr. George Engelmann, approached him to suggest that he expand his idea and create a botanical garden on the European model to include greenhouses, a botanical library, and a herbarium of dried plant specimens, along with the collection of living plants. Engelmann eventually succeeded in convincing Shaw, and was commissioned by him to travel to Europe to purchase herbarium specimens and books. Shaw remained in St. Louis to oversee the erection of a museum building designed by George I. Barnett, to store the fruits of Engelmann's travels.

In the years after his retirement from business and travel, Shaw devoted his personal resources and energies not only to the development of the Garden's research programs, but also to the construction of greenhouses and to the landscaping of substantial portions of his estate. Shaw brought Mr. James Gurney from England to become Superintendent of both the Garden and Tower Grove Park, and together they developed an arboratum of woodland trees of North America on the site of the present-day English Woodland and Japanese Gardens, and in Tower Grove Park itself.

Although the Garden was the focal point of Shaw's interests during the last forty years of his life, it was by no means his sole avocation. In 1867, he donated to the City of St. Louis a large tract of land directly south of the Garden to be established as a public park. A special act of the Missouri State Legislature accomplished the establishment of Tower Grove Park, and under the terms of this act, the city was required to issue bonds for its improvement. The sale of these bonds yielded \$360,000, which the Park's Commissioners, in subsequent years, used to construct its many features under the direction of Mr. Shaw, who served as comptroller.

Henry Shaw retained an active involvement in the administration of the Park until his death, serving as both Executive Officer and Comptroller of the Park's Board of Commissioners. Not content with these two substantial undertakings -- the Botanical Garden and Tower Grove Park -- Henry Shaw's philanthropy also extended itself to several important cultural and educational institutions in the city. In 1885 he endowed the Henry Shaw School of Botany at Washington University "for scientific study and investigation," and created an endowed professorship at the same university to be known as the George Engelmann Professor of Botany. The Henry Shaw School of Botany was established to maintain a close relationship with the Missouri Botanical Garden, and this relationship has flourished for nearly a century.

Shaw was quite aware of the historical importance of his interest and activities, and he therefore meticulously preserved the records of his

involvements in the economic, social and cultural development of St. Louis, and in the development of his botanical garden. As a result of his foresight, these records now constitute an important part of the Garden's historical manuscript collections, and have been described by historians as being among the most important surviving collections of personal and business papers of a nineteenth century frontier merchant. Even a brief examination of his account books reveals the care and exactitude with which he managed finances, bringing the same precision and frugality to the administration of his public trusts as he had exercised in private business. For the last thirty years of his life he served as the Missouri Botanical Garden's chief administrator and business manager, drawing no salary from the Garden's accounts, and shrewdly saving thousands of dollars in payroll costs each year.

In his last decade Shaw was recognized as one of St. Louis' leading citizens and benefactors, and consequently was the frequent recipient of public honor and acclaim. In addition to public celebrations, acclaim took the form of civic and business awards, including an elaborate gold-fringed scroll from the St. Louis Merchants Exchange citing him for materially aiding "the reputation and growth of St. Louis" and for creating "delightful and permanent pleasure-resorts for our citizens." The scroll praised him further, asserting that "he worthily represents the spirit and liberality which should characterize the merchants of a metropolis representative of western civilization."

Shaw did not rest on the reputation evidenced in these awards and citations, but devoted his last years to his beloved estate and garden. Almost to the day of his death he retained close personal interest in the Park and Garden, and an active interest in the progress of his chosen city.

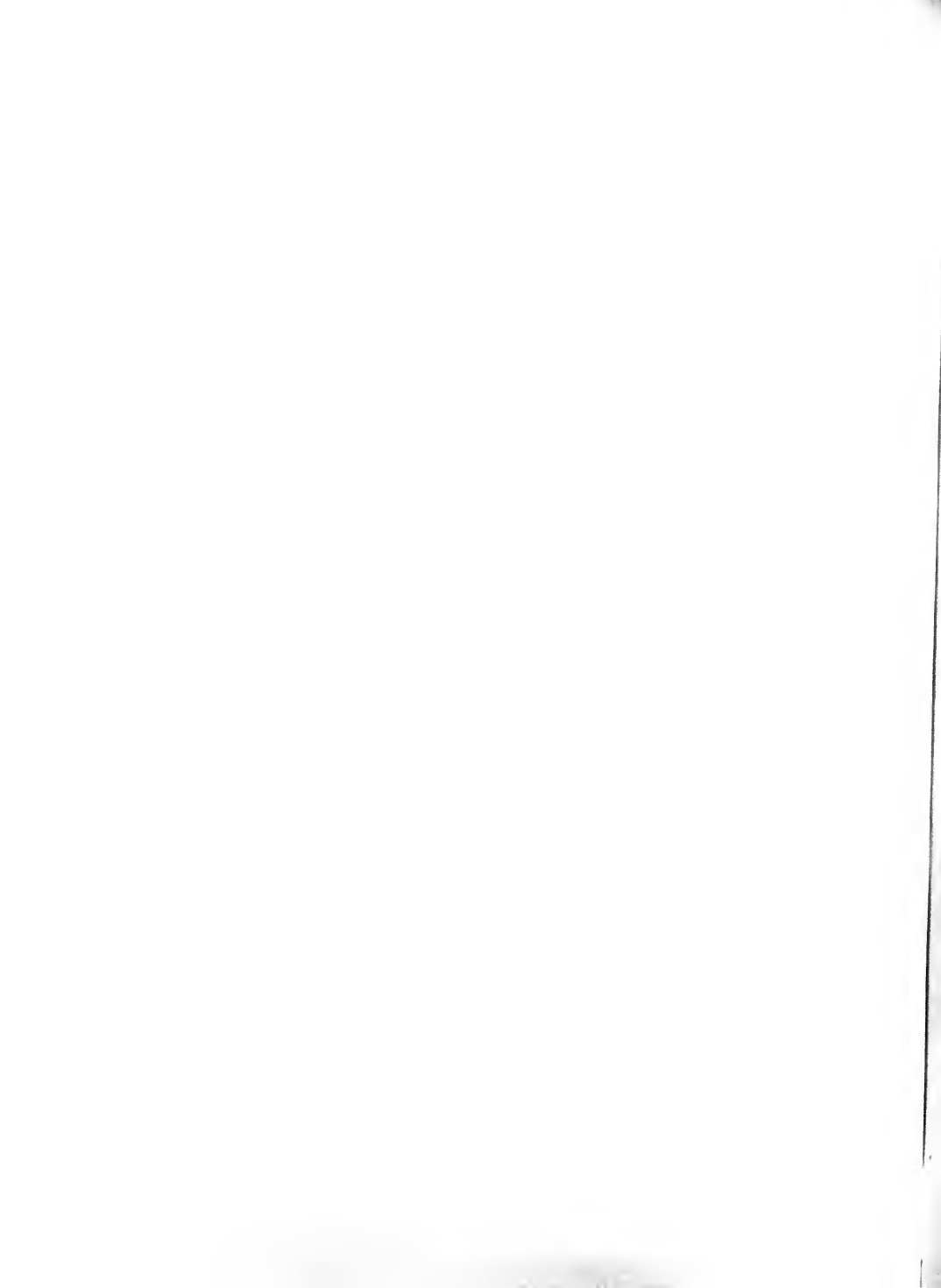

Sarah Shaw Letters to Henry Shaw

Feb. 20, 1822 - Apr. 18, 1851 205 mss

Letter of Feb. 1822 from Sheffield reveals no word from father for an entire year and they were determined to go to America with Uncle Benjamin Shaw who was in Sheffield for a reason unknown to them. He was returning to America in April. She warned Shaw against associating with Wm. Holiday even though he was to deliver a letter to Holiday from Uncle James Hoole. Uncle Hoole(?) had been very unkind to Mrs. Shaw.

Letters for years 1826 and 1827 from Pittsford tells of living in a house the front room of which Mr. Shaw uses as a store. Mr. Stone was working on getting deed ready and they need payment. In these letters it is clear Joseph Shaw is not responsible and is making still worse business judgements and "squandering" what little he earns from sale of goods on foolish ventures and was neither paying nor collecting real debts. Mr. Newbould from Remington and Younges in Sheffield had attempted to settle affairs with him but so far to no avail. They had promised Shaw 1/4 of proceeds for sale of Kingston business if he would agree and he had procrastinated again.

Letters for year 1828 from Pittsford finds Mr. Shaw in an accounting office in Rochester - hopefully to earn enough to pay living expenses and some debts but his efforts are doubtful. He is of opinion that H. Shaw has been turned against him by tale of his misdeeds by his daughters. Caroline has a school and Mr. Stone died. Mr. Shaw still owes for old shop notes but Sarah assures Henry how very contented they are to be in America. Uncle William Hoole had remarried. Mr. Newbould sold the Kingston goods that had been left with Samuel Shaw but it was on 12 months credit. Their Uncle Benj. Shaw had died.

Letters of year 1829 from Pittsford saying their father had written he was coming home. They were surprised to hear Henry was looking for a wife and they had just the girl for him if only he would visit. Wm. Shaw their cousin had been to England and visited them in Pittsford telling them of the news of the poor Cornthwaites. William was no better person than when he and Henry were boys. Sarah disliked him intensely. She wrote of meeting someone who knew of Henry and his prosperity. She says they all look the same as when he visited (?) except a little older. He had written a Mr. Alderson was visiting him. She read of St. Louis being very prosperous.

Letters for 1830 from Pittsford thanked Shaw for gift to his parents at Christmas. They had a letter from Aunt Martha which said the Shaw's old home at Netherthorpe was turned into an academy and called Netherthorpe Academy. Sarah sent Shaw an accounting of household expenses giving total of \$147 for last six months, declaring winter was more expensive because of wood and cost of meat. The amount did not include clothing for sisters. She did not wonder at immigrants flocking to Missouri if newspaper accounts were correct. Sarah was having chilblains and recalled Shaw having them when he was a boy. He had not answered any letters recently. Carolines school business was at an end. They inquired if Shaw could

take in Mr. Guernsey's nephew as a clerk in his store but later said thank - you but Merrill had gotten a position there in Pittsford. She gave him the cost of the fence as he had requested - it being \$40. The mail was robbed in June near Schenectady and Albany and there is a question if Shaw had any in it. A Mr. Hutchinson from carriage works in Sheffield and a Mr. Moss had visited them. They had been in school together.

Letters of 1831 from Pittsford - Sarah tells Shaw that Samuel Hoole, according to their mother can scarce be called a relation, tho' he may belong to a distant branch of same family. She recollected plum pudding was never a great favorite of Shaw's. She assumes he doesn't trouble himself with going to church any more than she does. She has been told "prairies around St. Louis are far more beautiful than anything we can boast of, that the flowers we cultivate with greatest care grow on them - is it true?" She felt the last letter from him told them more of him than they had ever known before. It seems he had a gay winter but did not enjoy himself very much. Mr. Shaw had gone to Rochester for first time in fourteen months to settle old accounts. He was composing a Greek grammar lexicon. He had one Shaw had used. They thanked Shaw for his kind present, and asked him to remember Aunt Martha to Samuel Hoole. Out of eight White House cousins only one was married. Their father was well and intended to go to St. Louis. They had heard in letter of September that Shaw had been ill.

Letters for 1832 from Pittsford show they learned of death of Robt. Jobson in Jan. from Mr. Hutchinson in New York. "He was buried in St. Philips graveyard, that tongue of land between Roscoe Place and Globe works. There were multitudes and a eulogy on his business talents occupie 25 lines of the newspaper. It is tho't there will be little left for his family." It was 7 years ago that Caroline, Sarah and Henry attended church together and evidently was the last time they had seen him. She inquired if St. Louis had been flooded. The Indians seemed to be troublesome down his way. (Letter from Caroline attached). Shaw had written he had taken precautions against Cholera, and had left the city and had evidently mentioned Mr. Lindell. Caroline thought he was a bachelor who lived near St. Louis but Sarah thinks he is a married man. Shaw's account of Henry E. Hoole didn't sound flattering tho' their father said "such affairs are not thought very dishonest in the commercial world." They had to purchase a cooking stove for \$45. Father was 68 in December, 1832. Stewarts' journal of Great Britain and Ireland mentioned Mill Hill School. He promised to write before he began his journey(?)

Letters of 1833 from Pittsford - Sarah says Shaw mentioned floating ice in the Mississippi. There had been some discussion of removal of sand bar. She had read Pauldings "Westward Ho". There was talk of Shaw building a brick house for them but Sarah said the old one would do until he quit business and came to live with them. The papers there in St. Louis said there was still Cholera in Aug.

The Wm. Saunders' were settled in New York and he was manufacturing steam engines. Their cousins Joseph and Ann Hoole would be staying with them in about 2 years. There was discovery that several of Shaw's letters to them were lost but evidently none with money. They discussed building a brick house but Sarah said she thought it would be a laughing matter without Shaw there to superintend it as their father was totally unable to work with local people. The postmaster at Pittsburg was arrested for robbing mail and she wondered if he had stolen Shaw's money and could he get any back?

Letters of 1834 - Mr. Guernsey says prices will fall and Rochester would be a good place to buy tho' taxes are high. He subscribed to a Philadelphia newspaper for them. She reminds him that it had been nine years since they last saw him in Pittsford. There had been a steamboat snagged in the Mississippi with great loss of goods bound for St. Louis from New Orleans. She asked again if he wouldn't come for a visit since his business probably would be poor just now during the hard times - evidently a national money problem. He had sent them a \$50 gift and told them to find a house in either Rochester or Pittsford as best suited them. He had been stock taking and had entrusted them with the state of his affairs which they promised to keep confidential. "You must feel the inconvenience of having your goods so long afloat. I hope they have arrived before this." He had told them that he anticipated with great pleasure traveling on the continent when he retired and she asked to go with him as far as England. By what he said about Cholera it appears not to have been bad in St. Louis. She asked how he lost his favorite horse - "was it stolen, did he run away or did he die?" The Guernseys met a Mr. Wharburton in New York who claimed to know Shaw and reported him "as well and doing well". The wine and brandy he sent arrived safely and Mr. Ellison wrote them about Shaw's ordering it - five cases in all. Shaw mentioned taking brandy and water whenever he felt symptoms of Cholera. The canals are so low that merchants boats are tied up. He was obliged to go to Columbus in December and she reminded him it was only 3 days from Columbus to Pittsford. "You remark in your letter that our cousin Frank's matrimonial speculation 'is not likely to add to his domestic comfort' - how so? - have you heard something against Miss Martha Tattershall? - or is it that you think matrimony never adds to any bodies domestic comfort?" He had evidently had a dream of his mother's health which frightened him, but she was well.

Letters of 1835 thank Shaw for writing so frequently during the winter. He evidently had said "the most respectable part of your (the) inhabitants (St. Louisans) belong to that persuasion (Catholic)" They had read in the papers that coal and lead mines had been discovered near St. Louis and concluded the people of St. Louis were making a great deal of money. Mr. Porter had been in St. Louis and seen Shaw in streets. She mentions Missouri becoming anti-slavery and asks what he would do with his black man. Uncle James eldest daughter had spent the winter in New York with the Hoole cousins. A Mr. Adam Clark who called on his way to the west was store keeper in Pittsford previously. A Mr. Sanderson

from Sheffield was there and remembered Shaw from Wilson's school where both of them received a severe flogging for going to look at the flooding river. They had found a house to lease in Rochester until May - She requested power of attorney to sell the old house and had rented it for \$20 until May. They were to move by the end of October. Everyone had railroad fever and costs were half again as high as previous and some even doubled. Mrs. Shaw was so well she was going into the city.

Letters of 1836 from Rochester - are about purchase of lot and building of the brick house Henry had earlier suggested. There was a problem over increased cost of lot after the agreement had been made because of a suit against previous owners. Several times Shaw's drafts to them for payments on building, rent on the house they were living in and for housekeeping were extremely late and caused them to borrow or be embarrassed with creditors. The house cost several hundred dollars over \$3000. The lot cost \$1100. The builder was a kind man named Loomis. Their rich friend Mr. Bushnell wanted to know if Shaw knew a Mr. Pettybone who had been a clerk of Mr. Guernsey but moved to St. Louis. They moved into the house in November 1836 and were again desperate for money when they received \$800 more, the first since July.

Letters of 1837 show H. Shaw planning to visit in early spring but at year end he had not, though he did go to New Orleans on business and sent them several packs of buffalo robes which arrived very late in Nov. They were moth eaten, and chewed by rats and in such shape they could hardly be sold. She still needed money to pay balance due to builder and were desperate for warm clothes. The old house in Pittsford was not selling and was becoming a liability for want of repair. Both Caroline and Mrs. Shaw were near death - Caroline for a great while and several times. They had paid the builder some with the sale of the mortgage of the lot. The banks were not paying in specie and hard cash was difficult to come by so they advised him to be careful of types of bank notes he accepted as some were not acceptable such as Indiana and Illinois which he had discussed with them.

Letters of 1838 from Rochester and Pittsford. They were a long time hearing from him and had not sold a single robe but did eventually sell nearly all, but for no profit. Mr. Lathrop did his best to sell at highest price. They managed to pay Mr. Loomis the balance on the house but needed money off and on during the year. They agreed to sell more robes again if Shaw got them to Rochester by October 1, but they were way layed again and he had to send their gift boxes overland since navigation was closed. He probably took a loss on the robes since they were not re-shipped. He was sending buffalo tongues & fabric for Christmas gifts. The money exchange for bills and notes was still difficult - some banks were refusing some.

Sarah Shaw Letters to Henry Shaw cont'd

Letters of 1839 from Rochester and Pittsford, Sarah sold Pittsford house to Mr. Parmely for which Shaw gave her power of attorney. Shaw had his portrait taken and sent to them. It was a poor likeness. Shaw was going to visit them, and caused joyous anticipation. There was talk of him closing business and of The Bank of State of Missouri. Mr. Delano advised him to send money to N. Y. and gain 12 or 15 percent on his money. They were having trouble with various bills of exchange which he had sent them. Some banks were refusing certain ones.

Letters of 1840 - Shaw had written that he was coming in July and they advised him not to bring his slave as it could cause a riot. Evidently Caroline went to London with Shaw and Sarah had travelled with them to New York. A woman friend said Shaw and Sarah looked alike. Lindell had written Sarah and asked her to keep him informed of Shaw's whereabouts.

Letters of 1841 from Rochester and Hastings to Shaw in Naples, Malta, Venice and Vienna. Sarah advised Shaw to write in French any information not meant for their father. Caroline was returning from London in July. Shaw sent gifts to family and friends of the family such as rugs, gloves, etc. Letter of Oct. 24, described the wedding of H. Hoole. Mr. Ellison, Shaw's agent sent family their money in Shaw's absence.

Letters of 1842 found no word of Shaw since Oct. 24 in Trieste. Mr. Lindell said Shaw's affairs were doing well and he was anxious to hear of Shaw who seemed to be a favorite of Lindell's according to Sarah. Mr. Kerr was to remit a semi-annual payment to Sarah from Boston where he had gone to sell some bills of exchange. Money matters were in a bad way in America. Shaw sent them some paintings- Carracci's Madonna, Pope of the Sabrianes, engraving of Isaac and Rebecca, in October Shaw had asked Caroline to go to St. Louis, and he gave them a carriage ordered from Mr. Saunders.

Letters of 1843 - Sarah expressed pleasure over his recovery of health. Caroline was still in St. Louis and Shaw was back in London. Money was plentiful and it was hard to find good mortgage investments. She had invested \$1200 of her house-keeping money at 7 percent. Mr. Shaw was 77 in Dec. 1843. Sarah commented on Shaw's having a laced coat and cocked hat to a court party. Mr. Sanford might have joined Shaw and Choteau in Europe.

Letters of 1844 - Shaw had written that he was sending a shawl for their mother. Mr. Shaw became gravely ill from jaundice and complications while Henry was in France. Mr. Delano helped Sarah with the funeral arrangements and burial the details of which are in her letter. The death occurred on April 30, 1844. He was buried at Mt. Hope. Sarah had received letters from Seville and Granada and Shaw and Choteau had parted company by the end of Aug. 1844. There had been a great flood in St. Louis in 1844. She put all of her father's dictionary in a box for Shaw as father had requested. Shaw was to winter in Egypt. They asked him to have a miniature done in Italy. Sarah said his "Barriere des Noyer" would be valuable if St. Louis became the capitol.

Sarah Shaw Letters to Henry Shaw cont'd

Letters of 1845 - It seems Caroline and Sarah copied letters from Shaw to send to each other while Shaw was abroad. Letter from him in Naples, Alexandria and Cairo says he was to return by May 1846. The Choteau's were among sufferers in the fire in New York and there had been attempt to blow up the Planters House in St. Louis. Mr. Delano died and Shaw was to visit the family on his return from Europe.

Letters of 1846 - Caroline had written with great satisfaction of her farming operations and wrote as though she did not expect to make Rochester her home again. Shaw claimed to be extremely happy. Sarah discussed Caroline's engagement to Julius Morisse with him. Mr. Saunders had accused Shaw of saying he had cheated them on the carriage. Caroline and Morisse gave up a fall wedding because of his uncle's disapproval. Miss Welch of St. Louis who corresponded with Caroline had her eyes on Shaw.

Letters of 1847 - Sarah wrote Dr. Carver from Pittsford was demanding \$90 for an old bill which he'd alledgedly not rendered because of their past difficulties. Reports had it Shaw would marry Miss Welch but Sarah didn't believe it. Caroline married Morisse. Sarah won an award in Rochester for the greatest variety of Roses. Mrs. Shaw was 75 on Jan. 8, 1847.

Letters of 1848 - There was small pox in the area. Shaw's "farming and coal banks do not answer your expectations." She mentioned revolt in Paris and hoped his "law suits will turn out favorably at last." She inquired of Mr. Lindell's health. Sarah and Mrs. Shaw were going to the sea shore in Connecticut - Sachem's Head. In Sept. Shaw had settled one law suit. Caroline joined Sarah and Mrs. Shaw at the beach and they judged Morisse's business to be doing well.

Letters of 1849 - Sarah told how pleased they were over Shaw's providing their mother with a new chair and mentioned his building plans. Sarah evidently had a green thumb as she mentioned the acclaim her trees, shrubs and house plants had received. She expressed sorrow over his great loss in the St. Louis fire and over the great outbreak of Cholera there. Their Aunt Cornthwaite had died. Shaw had written of moving from the Planters House until Cholera was over. She asked if he were planning to marry since he was building a "town and county house". She sent him some plants by the Morisse's who had been visiting her.

Letters of 1850 - Aunt Martha died and Shaw requested them to wear mourning though Sarah refused as she'd not worn mourning for her father. Robbery attempts were made on house in Rochester but they frightened the would be robber away. They heard Jenny Lind in New York and Sarah had her pocket picked in Rochester.

Letters of 1851 - Shaw invited Mrs. Shaw to St. Louis but her old age and "dislike of coloured folks was so great she wouldn't sleep in house with one."

Shaw had 2 mortgages in Rochester which Sarah was managing - Turner and Strong. Sarah asked Shaw if his invitation to Mrs. Shaw was for a visit or to live. They supposed they would see him in the spring on his way to Europe. Shaw was expected any day.

Caroline Shaw Letters

Letters from Pittsford, New York and Rochester.

Caroline reminded Shaw of installment due on house and that Mr. Stone was impatient for it. The Cornthwaite's had again contacted them for help and were complaining of indifference.

Letter of Aug. 13, 1826 tells that the family needs and problems were centered around Shaw's father who still had a bit of manufacturing and 2 employees, one of whom lived with them. Mr. Shaw had left to go to canal to sell and had given up business. They still owed Mr. Stone 214 dollars but had received Shaw's 50 dollars plus a gift for both girls. He advised them to sell cutlery from home but Caroline said it was impractical because cash in locale was scarce. They were soon to get the deed for the house. Shaw proposed to send them goods to sell but she doubted if father could dispose of them.

Letters of 1827 say her school began and she says papers say St. Louis merchants were getting rich. Their father had agreed to give up one-half of proceeds for his goods in Canada to Mr. Newbould but people to whom they were consigned went bankrupt with his money in hand. She blamed her father's procrastination. She sympathized with Shaw over loss of Mr. Eadon, his friend.

Letter of Jan. 18, 1828 tells of Mr. Jos. Shaw being engaged as an accountant in Rochester. She assumed H. Shaw and his friends were Jacksonians - politically and liberal Mr. Stone from whom they had purchase the house died. Caroline was still teaching and they had again received money from Shaw whose business was increasing. Shaw had written that Uncle Cornthwaite was doing better. Jos. Shaw had told Caroline sheshouldn't write him and that he would himself. He evidently never did though he had held out to Cornthwaite hopes of help. Neither had Joseph received any money from Kingston business because he failed to empower Mr. Newbould to settle it and his old work premises still had rent due though it was unused.

In the next letter she gives an accounting of their expenses from May 1st to Sept 8, 1828 as Shaw had requested. The expenses were 65 dollars which included clothing for their mother. They needed to repair the house in the fall.

In her letter of Feb. 9, 1829 Caroline describes father's peculiar behavior as an answer to Shaw's earlier one asking if father couldn't be used by him in Shaw's business. A letter from cousin Keturah mentioned Shaw's planned visit to England and asked if Shaw had succeeded in finding a lady for his fastidious friend. Caroline wrote of "his Jackson" and also his outdoor exercise which she takes to be horseback riding.

Letter of May, 28, 1831 tells of a Lt. Richardson from Jefferson Barracks who married a Miss Porter of Pittsford and who mentioned having met Shaw. His opinion was that Shaw and Caroline closely resembled one another. Caroline

addressed him as "Harry dear" and told him not to marry so they could all three be "old maids". Sarah was worse than ever and doctors seemed at a loss. Lt. Richardson was to bring Shaw a letter from Joseph saying he would go to St. Louis in fall to help Henry. She asked Shaw to try to locate a John Tillotson for his wife in Pittsford. A carpenter and boatbuilder, he had left to find more work and hadn't been heard from in too long a time. Caroline again offered to help Shaw in business. Joseph was busy with religious studies and writing and that all in the area had gone "mad" with religious meetings.

Letter of Feb. 22, 1832 thanked Shaw for Christmas box and expressed opinion he seemed as eager as ever to make money. She spoke of his heaps of iron and steel, and threatened to go to St. Louis with Mr. Porter when he visited his daughter. She asked if he belonged to the Lyceum and had he given a speech. They had bought a 25 dollar sofa for Sarah to be near the fireplace. She had had influenza and had a bad cough. They feared Cholera would reach there before year end.

In June she remarked of Shaw's saying they were indebted to Mr. Hutchinson and evidently Shaw had written to Hutchinson to thank him. He also sent news of Sheffield.

Letter of July 15, 1832 told of Cholera in New York and Albany and a few cases in Rochester. She thanked Shaw for money he had sent for them to go and take Sarah to Saratoga for curative waters, etc. It would cost about 140 dollars and she promised careful accounting to be sent him on their return. Father had still not written Cornthwaite's and she remembered their kind-heartedness when lending a helping hand to Joseph Shaw.

* This letter included a letter from Sarah.

Letter of July 8, 1834 finds Caroline wondering if long silence from Shaw meant he had Cholera. They were in desperate need of funds. They still had no house to suit but property in Rochester was supposedly cheaper. Sarah was having violent nervous headaches so she couldn't help Caroline with search. Their cousin Saunders was having great difficulties in business on Hudson river 22 miles from New York where he has use of water power.

Letter of Jan. 9, 1835 mentions Shaw's safe arrival at Columbus having lost no more than a fur hat. She wondered if since finding a house was so difficult they might be wise to build. Shaw had suggested they move to Philadelphia but she reckoned the weather was not that much better for Sarah and mother and it would mean leaving friends. She said Sarah's nervous system was deranged and her lungs were weak and she needed a warmer home. Their mother was 62 on Jan. 8, 1835.

Letter of March 3, 1835 tells of house Caroline had found in Rochester which was to be built soon and had an adequate though imperfect plan. She asked

Shaw's impression of Florida and hoped he had escaped influenza.

Letter of Jan. 11, 1837 apologized for not writing but that Sarah was better able to write letters of business nature which had been needed. She wished he could see the comfortable house he had provided for them. A Colonel Porter from Clarkson had brought the a buffalo robe from Shaw's fur store and a letter from him. The robe had Indian markings on it. Sarah had been unable to fulfill contract with Mr. Loomis and wanted Shaw to know it. She was thankful they had never failed to receive any of his letters even though post is unreliable. Mr. Delano had loaned them 50 dollars until they heard from Shaw. She thought it would be good for Sarah to visit him in St. Louis especially so he could get to know them better. He had proposed this at one time.

By July of 1838 Sarah was ill again. Aunt Martha had written of Henry with affection.

In Sept. 1838 cousin Ann Hoole arrived to stay until "close of navigation" probably in November. It had made Mrs. Shaw feel so much younger hearing of old friends and family in England. Shaw had said he would send a package of buffalo robes by the Ohio canal which was then not navigable because of low water. The drought had increased prices and thus their expenses. They needed new clothes for winter. Caroline's health was better but not perfect. Mr. Saunder's axle business was increasing.

Letter of April 12, 1839 says they were impressed he might be coming. The canal navigation would open on April 20th and Lakes have been open for sometime. She had been invited to visit by Saunders and she felt it be kind and she could go in fall to Niagra with Ann. She needed 30 dollars for travel expenses and a few extras. Shaw evidently answered promptly with funds because she writes thanking him for money and telling of her journey.

On Nov. 25, 1839 she thanked him for sending the beautiful painting. She requested seals for power of attorney he had earlier sent to Sarah but which needed to be sealed as required by N. Y. State. Deed could not be recorded until power of attorney was legal. She thought Sarah's last letter on subject was lost and wondered if stage driver in Illinois who had been detected in systematic robbery was culprit. She conjectured about business difficulties which could be caused by mail problems. They had hoped not to be a bother to Mr. Delano again. They needed winter clothing and thanked him again profusely for past kindnesses.

Letter of Sept. 9, 1841 to Shaw in Venice telling him of her safe journey back to Rochester from her trip to England, Shaw having proceeded on to continent for an extended tour. H. Hoole couldn't join him as Shaw had hoped because he had recently married in a regal wedding. Shaw had gone to Greece. He planned to give her a watch and she told him the sort she wanted.

Letter of August 14, 1846 is mainly a request for some sort of business subsidy which would enable Julius and Caroline to marry and enter business.

Henry Shaw Letters to Mrs. Sarah Shaw - Mother May 1820-Sept. 1823 6 mss

Letter of May 21st from Shaw in New Orleans. He arrived there in Jan. of 1820 and had spent most of spring in Natches(?). Funds had been left with Morgan Dorsey and Co. for a "good bill" to be sent to Sheffield. He had heard from a Mr. Wever in Nov. of 1819 but nothing from his father in Canada. His business in New Orleans was completed and was returning to St. Louis. He apologized for not being able to remit anything but was disappointed in his "arrangements" so was unable, the commerce had died away and market for produce of western states was almost unsaleable.

He elaborated on his affection and sense of responsibility to his mother. He volunteers to write and tell Caroline and Sarah all about country if they express interest. He said he made it a rule never to pass through a country without learning all he can of people and customs. The Creoles of Louisiana formed a contrast to remainder of country and because of likeness to West Indies render it the most valuable and wealthy part of the United States.

The yellow fever had not arrived, visitors had all gone and there had been many fires in the wooden houses. It had been so close to where he was he had moved his trunks to safety. Supposedly was the work of incendiaries or Negroes.

Missouri had been admitted to the Union as a slave state and he questioned whether slavery would be a benefit. (A Mr. Ground and family from Huddersston York, were planning to establish themselves near St. Louis. He doubted their ability to live in the wilds and prophesied their early return home as he did people in Illinois settlement of Mr. "Bukbuks"(sp.?)

Shaw planned to return to New Orleans again in Nov. of 1820 where he could be reached in care of Morgan Dorsey and Co.

Letter of July 11, 1820 from St. Louis finds Shaw telling her of contents of letter from his father in Canada. He did say of business in St. Louis that money was scarce and he seemed slightly skeptical of U. S. form of govt. Mr. Shaw had asked Shaw to go to Canada and then to England to settle his affairs for him. Even tho' Henry couldn't leave St. Louis because of his own affairs he did imply he might go from New Orleans to England in late fall or winter. He encouraged Mrs. Shaw and girls to consider move to Canada as a possible adventurous future and would be good if for no other reason than to escape tax collector. He had shipped bear skins to Liverpool.

Letter of Dec. 12, 1820 written from New Orleans. He was sending 50 pounds via Uncle James to Mrs. and girls. It took him 18 days to get to New Orleans by Steamboat. There was a great problem over mail he had sent and of mail not received, some containing 254 pounds. He wanted his father to send him some of his goods from Canada. His voyage up the Missouri 50 days there and back.

Henry Shaw Letters to Mrs. Shaw cont'd

Letter from New Orleans dated May 21, 1821 Shaw says he had been through Louisville and liked it better for his purposes than St. Louis. He was living in "adjoining chambers" with Sam Eaden a young man from Sheffield who works for Hodgson. The rooms belonged to old coloured creole ladies and he said he spoke tolerable Creole French but was in a hurry to finish his business before heat and mosquitoes became intolerable. He couldn't send anymore money because he needed to replenish his own funds. He says he was so concerned because he hadn't heard from them and wanted to assure her that her image was deterring him from the many evils and misconducts which befall young men.

Letter from New Orleans dated July 6, 1822 he was disturbed over his mother's unhappiness and wanted to assure her the future was brightening. He had partially paid Uncle James for goods and sent them 50 pounds and had reordered and expected to make a profit of about 400 pounds. He said father had sold brewery and farm in Prescott and was probably not writing because he wanted his whereabouts to remain unknown to creditors in England. He suggested his mother move to London and thanked sister "Sally" for letter.

*Included a letter to Martha Hoole his Aunt in which he thanked her for Mr. Miller's shirts as well as others and asked her for more clothes which should be charged to his account with Uncle James.

Letter from St. Louis written Sept. 5, 1823 having taken 14 days to travel from New Orleans. He fears his father will never do much more and tries to reassure his mother and remind her he had told her why he couldn't come home now. Since he does all his own business he had no one to rely on if he were away. He was selling very little at retail. He was sending more to Uncle James. After October 25, 1823 he would be addressed in care of W. Alderson, New Orleans. Could it be she has moved to Rochester, New York then.

Letter of July 27, 1819 from St. Louis is business and prospects. He had sold only half of goods at St. Louis and consignment in New Orleans is not much better. He seemed to be having some difficulty because of lack of communication with father. He sent him an order from a respectable store and told him from it he could see what could be done in the way of business there. He emphasized need for quality and accuracy. He requested goods for Indian trade as well, and it was mostly fabric. The other order was for hardware items. He discussed possibility of shipping furs.

Letter of October, 1819 from St. Charles saying he still has nothing from Joseph Shaw. This is a letter telling of possibilities of business there at Booneslick above St. Louis. He intends to open a store there in St. Louis, selling 10 or 15 percent under usual prices to country dealers who come in from Illinois. He also planned to use a retail auction and planned to buy furs. Speaks of sickness many have but gives no name to it. He is to be contacted care of Messrs. Wahrendorff and Co. of St. Louis. He gave a list of goods left with Mr. D and Co. to sell.

Letter of Dec. 1819 from New Orleans says he had 3 letters from Joseph. Yet he seems frustrated at confusion of letters and orders. He says either some misfortune has taken place which he has not been told of or else Mr. Wever is at fault. The yellow fever has ravaged New Orleans and Mobile. The steamboat he arrived on was the first from north that season.

Letter of July 1820 from St. Louis tells Mr. Shaw that prospects in U. S. are worse than those in Canada, and he was hard pressed for cash. He advised Mr. Shaw against leaving goods in hands of anyone. He planned to work as hard and fast as possible and dispose of all wares in his care and send money to Mr. Shaw and then be off to Cuba or Campeachy and make use of his study of Spanish. He said prospects in Missouri were indifferent. He discussed slavery, monetary policy and taxes of the U. S. He proposed doing some trade in beeswax. He planned to stay in St. Louis until Oct. and again be in New Orleans in Nov.

Letter of Aug. 1820 says he had been paid a note on the order from Sheffield and that people who extend credit are at great risk.

Letter of Oct. 1820 he is shocked that father has received no mail as he has written from New Orleans and St. Louis in care of H. Gates in Montreal. He was confined with rheumatic pains from night air on river boats. He seemed discouraged because of poor sales at poor prices. He is troubled by raw life and poor manners. Young Eadin had just arrived from Louisville and Bukbuk settlement on Wabash where Englishmen were in distress. The price of British goods had improved in New Orleans and a scarcity anticipated but the annual sickness has raged. This letter again mentions his going from New Orleans to Canada and thence to England.

Letter of Nov. 1, 1820 attaches to above and decided it wouldn't be to father's interest for Shaw to return to New Orleans. He said rather not leave any goods but would take those left wherever he went. He was on his way to visit Mr. Grounds in the Illinois and Mr. Eaden was going with him.

Letter of Nov. 9, 1820 .. expressed surprise that the remittance of 1100 dollars had not been received in Sheffield. He could not advise his father on land or brewery in Canada but felt prices in New Orleans for goods would rise in fall, this was on information from a young Scotsman there. He had sold all his beeswax. He thought perhaps they would be well served if father shipped some of his goods to Henry in New Orleans. He gave listing of those items which would sell well. He reminded his father to send a certificate from port of enbry along with goods.

Letter of Nov. 16, 1820 from St. Louis he gave Joseph practical suggestions on shipping, repacking, etc. He proposed buying buffalo robes for Canadian market. using sugar and coffee as barter. Robes were shipped at cost of \$6 per bale to Mackinac, \$9 to Montreal and New York for \$3. The letter is given completely to discussion of buffalo robe trade except for brief mention of concern for his mother's finances and told his father he hoped Joseph had sent some relief before then.

Letter of Dec. 1820 from New Orleans again expresses shock at having not heard from England that his remittance had reached there. Reminded his father it took one month to receive a letter from Canada and upon such rested his future determinations about business. It seems a great many young men from East were already in New Orleans plying their trades when Shaw arrived and therefore business was slow. He thought he would go to Havanna with a young German named Moller whose father was a merchant in Bremen. Evidently his Uncle James had a brother in New Orleans since Shaw told his father he could give no good account of him (Wm. Holiday) who was "under numerous examples" of folk who were gamblers and drinkers.

Letter of July-Aug. 1821 tells he had no word from father hoped Joseph had received his from Louisville. He determined money should not be sent by mail since father's last was torn open. He had gotten 30 percent more for cutlery in Louisville than in St. Louis. He had a Mr. Ormsby who was handling sales and was soon to remit balance of \$350. It seems he thought of staying out of St. Louis for a year since money was worthless except to pay taxes. Perhaps later goods would become scarce and he would also try Louisville and Nashville. He advised his father against a store business in Kingston, Canada with a Mr. Shaw. He told his father he would stay in America as long as he did but if Shaw returned to England Henry would too. He said he preferred to live in "the most distant and worse regulated colony England possesses than in these Free States."

Henry Shaw Letters to Joseph Shaw cont'd

Letter of Jan. 1822 from St. Louis said Shaw had just received father's letter from Oct. 1821 and in Mar. 1821 he had received one of May 1820. He also had an old one from James Hoole, who promised to help Mrs. Sarah Shaw. He felt strongly staying in New Orleans was better financially. He had a net gain of \$250 from \$1000. He asks father to pay added duties in order to keep his (Henry's) credit and name unblemished., since father had no use for his money. He had been sick for several months in St. Louis.

Letter undated with 1824 letters seems to show it is difficult to do business because of such varying types of goods demanded from merchants and at times it seems Mr. Shaw sent goods not ordered and which perhaps were inappropriate. Henry Shaw was anxious to increase export items to England such as wheat, beeswax, fur, deer pelts, Buffalo and horses. He became so exasperated with some goods his father sent, he threw them away-such as hoes and those "foolish large forks". He emphasized again to father he should send only that which Henry asked for.

Letter of Jan. 12, 1826 he tells of improved health and recovery from a stagecoach accident. He was involved in a judgment suit in Rochester for 50 dollars. Many wells were dry but theirs was 42 ft. and new in a spring. He was offered a job as manager of works at an iron foundry for 600 dollars per year and board. It might require purchase of shares. He felt it might be a good solution to his business dilemma especially as he now was 59 years of age and the shock of Mr. Jobson's deviousness in 1815 had left him incapable of being effective in the mercantile business again.

*Letter of May 1826 was not in folder and only noted in summary of 3 letters of 1826 and 1827.

Letter of Feb. 23, 1827 from Pittsford mentioned funds sent him by Shaw, which he used to pay Mr. Stone who was making out a title. He had been advised by his late gunsmith to "make a trial of the Brass Founder" this in connection with beer pumps. It seems his business affairs were getting more involved.

Letter of Aug. 1831 speaks of his going to St. Louis to keep Shaw's books which Shaw had requested years previous. Though he no longer worked on Seventh day he doubted it would inconvenience Shaw, if he worked on the first day or Sunday. He would prefer to travel by barge so he could bring some of Shaw's Latin and Greek books/ He reckoned he was being misused as a result of his own sin.

Letter of Aug. 28, 1840 from Rochester, Caroline had left to go to New York to meet Saunders' and also Shaw and Sarah. The mill Mr. Saunders had supervised was consumed by fire. He mentioned being deaf? He tells again of losses caused by Jobson and mourns the trouble now caused to Cornthwaite's because of their helping him to the tune of about 1200 pounds. He urged Shaw to help them even if it meant not sending him books he asked for and which are listed in letter. The letter was sent to Shaw in care of Mr. Joseph Ellison, Pine Street, New York.

Letter of Aug. 1838 from Rochester apologizes for not writing for nearly three years. He was busy researching scriptures. He feels sounder of mind. He was writing to tell Shaw of some land being offered for sale in Illinois by a man from Massachusetts and Rochester. He mentioned making his own ink for writing. It gives a description of land location in Putnam County, Illinois. He had spent 27 dollars on a set of commentaries and not bought a coat but some pantaloons and shoes. He had seen of death of a Mr. W. H. Shaw aged 25 who he felt must be his nephew and who was 35 and lived in New York.

Letter of Sept. 6, 1840 from Rochester to Shaw in New York at Mr. Ellison's on Pine Street. He tells of meeting in Liverpool a doctor from Tennessee, who was a Baptist like himself, and told him of bad treatment by Jobson in 1816 at Roscoe Place. The doctor gave Joseph a good money order and advised him to make consignments to New Orleans and Canada but which ended in disaster. It was here

Joseph Shaw Letters(cont'd)

that Cornthwaite had become involved by being Joseph's surety with the Banking house of Remington and Younges and Messrs. Parker, Shores and company for large amounts. Some of the books he mentioned in an earlier letter had been intended to aid Shaw in his travels through Europe, Asia and Egypt. He says had he not been a backslider, he couldn't have entered into partnership with Ridge or Boothby and partly caused by some conduct of his brother-in-law Wm. Hoole. He planned to leave a record of his connection at Green-lane and of Wm. Hoole's part. This letter was to be a part of an explanation of what happened.

Letter of May 1842 to Shaw in New York assured Shaw of prayers if not of letters. Mentions fact that Mr. Ellison of New York is Shaw's agent. He discussed at length papers of New York and Philadelphia. Shaw had urged him to get his manuscript Latin dictionary bound. He thanked Shaw for some books. He wanted to refute charges sent Mrs. Shaw by Wm. Hoole against himself. He said he hoped to soon see Shaw in Shaw's own house on Atkinson street in New York? He declares Shaw's Uncle James may have seemed remarkably kind toward him but actually he was obliged to be so "besides which he has had a considerable interest in ti". If his health holds out he promises to write a history of Green-lane concern and refute William Hoole's demands which are "vile calumnies", and instead of being a service to the concern "was in fact a cankerous incubus upon it".

Henry Hoole Letters

Nov. 16 - July 1, 1886

Letters from Sheffield, Southampton, Liverpool, Dundee, London, Rotherham and Bath. From Sheffield he wrote of going into business for self and evidently prospered well. Only 2 notations are of any business done between him and Shaw except as in late 1840's and 1850's he helped Shaw gather furnishings for his house. He mentions Barnett going there with drawings in regard to house. He also sent him wine in those years seemingly to stock his own cellars. Several letters indicate Henry had roving eye after marriage and in late years was dependent on help from others and especially from Shaw who afforded Henry's daughters a bit of schooling on the continent and his son Percy a visit to America as well as having Percy's cousin James invited, too. They were unable to travel together as Henry notes. To Paris and Liverpool letters were sent telling Shaw of "old flame" and encourages Shaw to mark letters to him "private". Thanks him for painting from Venice in 1842. This was during Shaw's tour of continent which covered a few years. Hoped to tour with him. Feels since Shaw was at Hotel Chatham, the young lady recommended by madam of Newman st. "was not an angel as you anticipated". To Shaw in Madrid he mentions succeeding well in counting house but stays away a good deal, and has many orders in Sheffield. Speaks of splendid time Shaw had at the Tuilleries. Assures Shaw he will probably have more enjoyment "rambling about the county and visiting places of interest with the delightful little warbling and interesting amiability you mention, - she appears to have been worth the risk of fighting for - the parting with her would be the worst part..." Asks how Chouteau gets on "whilst you are attending Mademoiselle?" Requests a sketch from Chouteau of something of interest in Madrid. Tells Shaw "not to fall in love with young queen"? Includes more gossip comments.

Writes Shaw in Paris, Liverpool, Paris, Madrid and Berlin.

Letters in 1847 and 1848 were mostly of schooling of H. Hoole's two daughters Eliza and Mary by Shaw on continent. He mentions that Uncle Henry Hoole's portrait nearly full length was exhibited at Fine Arts Exhibition. From time to time he mentioned business climate and in fact in Dec. 1847 tells of bankruptcy of William Hoole, brother of Frank and Henry who cousin Henry's counting house had loaned money. Expresses sorrow over Shaw's mother's infirmities increasing in 1848. Evidently Uncle James was commissioned to make payments to Hoole for daughters' education. Says in churches in Fall of 1848 prayers were said to avert evil threatening from two months of rain. Sister Amelia died in 1848. The Irish affairs sorely tried parliament and he was sending the "Economist" to Shaw in 1848.

Letter in June of 1849 speaks of calamity befallen St. Louis and of how pleased they are Shaw was not a "sufferer" and says how poor business is in London. It seems there was a sickness in July 1849 in St. Louis. Assumes it will take Shaw some time to complete rebuilding and sent him

some prices for plate glass. Hoole at that time was getting into financial straits. He helped Shaw get stained glass and iron to rebuild. Mentions death of publisher of Gardener magazine which closed.

Henry Hoole Letters cont'd

Shaw's mother was recovering from near death and St. Louis business activity was resuming after calamity. In 1880 expresses hope that Shaw could "enjoy his garden and walks and claims they are finest he had seen in any country" - he evidently paid Shaw a visit since he even remembers a terrible thunderstorm in June. The views Shaw gave him are hung in his library. Mr. Shaw probably wrote of having sciatica since Hoole wrote him a remedy.

Except for two letters thanking Shaw for accounts there is no mention of any business between the two cousins unless the favors done by Hoole for Shaw in purchasing items for furnishing his Tower Grove and/or town house were done on commission ?

Letter of April 7, 1882 mentions Shaw's sick holly. Hoole thanks him for money more than once and promises to make furniture over to Shaw as security for loan in July of 1886.

Letters from London mention impending visit and their goings and comings to operas, etc. They saw Shaw's new chairs, linens, vases, curtains, carpet, and china. Tells of Prince Albert's popularity and of coming exhibition. The Prince and Queen were in box below them at the French Opera.

Martha Hoole Letters

Nov. 15, 1822 - Aug. 14, 1838

Letters from Aunt Martha in Sheffield is evidently sister of Shaw's mother. Tells him of whereabouts of his sister and mother who in 1822 had reached New York safely and were on their way by steamer to join Joseph Shaw. Martha had sent him clothing he had requested. Says Shaw's letters to her would be forwarded by Uncle James if directed to his care. She praises James' graciousness and mentions Uncle Richard's returning from America destitute and Amelia was left in Quebec as a shop woman to a pastry cook. Uncle James was sending him Sheffield papers. Speaks of gloomy business climate in England as evidenced by price of merchandise to him (depression) and mentions amusement at Shaw's domestic concerns. Tells of seeing cousins Frank and Henry who had lost wives. Tells of Saunders' move to America and setting up as an engineer. Mentions Shaw's White House and of Cousin Frank's marriage and Jobson's death. Letter was forwarded in a case of guns to Shaw. Shaw had evidently shipped 6 tongues to her and she is staying at Uncle James house in Farnham Green. Mentions coronation in 1838.

Mary Hoole Letters

Writes of extreme affection expressed for her in Shaw's letter, of Shaw's mother's illness and of having seen Banvard's panorama of the Mississippi. Letter from Paris seem to indicate she is on a honeymoon. Feb. 26, ?
