ESP EXPERT TO SPEAK

David Hoy, an especially dynamic and brilliant orator, widely known for his lectures, national radio and television appearances, and his writings on the subject of extra-sensory perception and the field of parapsychology will speak at Asheville-Buncombe Technical Institute on Monday, February 4, at 1:00 a.m. in the gymnasium.

David Hoy also demonstrates ESP in lectures by performing controlled psychics using volunteers from the audience. His mental projection of ESP symbols to the audience is chillingly accurate. Hoy also presents the information necessary to start an ESP Roundtable Study Group and gives a outline of testing procedures. His amazing question and answer period is unusually stimulating, providing an opportunity for participants to further probe the fascinating mind of David Hoy. Hoy closes each lecture by giving, through "Time-Projected Empathy", accurate predictions of the future. He has given accurate a phenomenal 85% of the time.

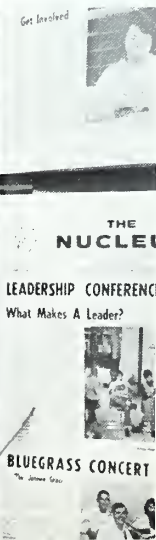
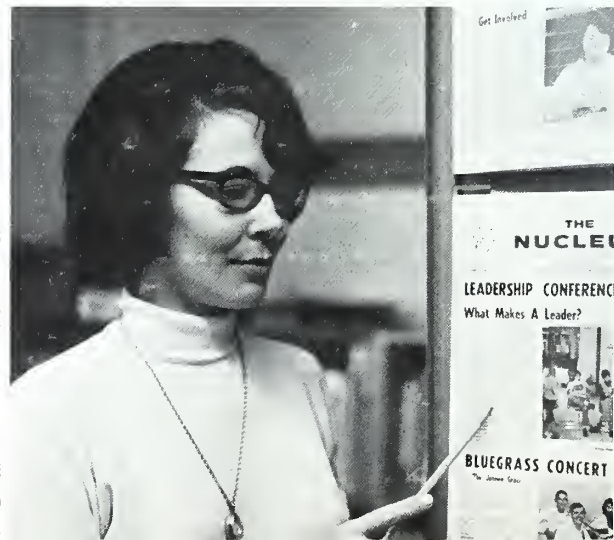
