We hope that in the future the girls of A-B Tech will appreciate and use this freedom and make a wise decision.









FACULTY ORGANIZATIONS

The purpose of the organization is to participate in the formation, implementation, and review of institute policy and to provide means for the faculty at act effectively on educational policies at A-B Technical Institute, especially those concerned with:

8. Faculty In-Service programs.

9. Other matters, not previously included, which directly or indirectly affect educational policy and activities.





The Academic Affairs Committee will serve as the coordinating body for curriculum objectives and other academic matters. This committee shall assume responsibility for implementation of general policy and specific academic details as determined by the governing body through the President of the Institute. This committee shall serve to insure that the scope and nature of the curriculums is related and defined in the overall stated purpose of the Institute and in keeping with available resources.

ACADEMIC AFFAIRS COMMITTEE

Membership:

1. One representative from each of the six educational divisions, elected by members of the division.

2. The President of the Student Body or his appointee.

- 3. Continuing membership will consist of:
- a. The Dean of Evening Programs
- b. The Librarian
- c. The Registrar

Non-Voting Membership:

1. The Dean of Instruction shall serve as permanent chairman.

- 2. Any faculty member.
- 3. Instructional Directors.
- 4. The Learning Lab Coordinator.





ADMISSIONS COMMITTEE

Purpose of Admissions Committee: 1. To consider for admissions those students whose credentials are borderline for placement into the curriculum of their choice.

2. Review all applications for readmission.

3. Review all applications and testing procedures.

4. Determine the criteria for placement within all curriculum areas. Membership is appointed by the Vice President of Student Services. Present voting membership:

1. The Vice President of Student Services

- 2. The Registrar
- 3. The Dean of Evening Programs
- 4. Four faculty members

5. One student-Recommended by the Student Senate

The Director of Counseling Services serves in a non-voting capacity.



IN-SERVICE EDUCATION

Purpose of In-Service Education: 1. To act as an educational agent effecting changes within staff and faculty

To serve as a liaison between the faculty's needs and those that can fill those needs.
 To promote thinking and working together among faculty and staff.

4. To investigate details involved in offering requested courses on campus.

5. To be of maximum service and assist members of the Institute in every way possible.

6. To meet the needs of faculty and staff with educational opportunities. Membership consists of:

 One elected faculty member from each division with an additional representative from the division providing the chairman.
 One member of the administrative staff.
 Vice-President of Instructional Services Term of membership: Three years.
 Vice-President of Instructional Services shall be a permanent member.







INSTITUTE FORUM



The purpose of the Institute Forum is to make recommendations to and advise the President on matters pertaining to the overall well being of the Institute faculty, staff, and students. The Forum serves as an overall coordinating body representing all Institute personnel and recommends action consistent with policy as established by the Board of Trustees, State Board of Education and the general statutes of North Carolina. The Forum is specifically concerned with:

- a. Faculty, staff, and student welfare
- b. Planning for Institute growth and development
- c. Professional enrichment of faculty and staff
- d. Considering matters and problems presented to the Forum by the President of the Institute
- e. Recommending action on any matter not specifically assigned to some other officially designated group or individual

LRC BUILDING COMMITTEE

The primary function of the LRC Building Committee was to define the needs of the instructional program in terms of a building program that would guide the architects in designing the new Learning Resources Center. This building program indicates the functional aspects of the building, showing spatial relationships, production and public service areas, projected seating capacity, volume capacity and staff requirements. The building program also outlines for the architects the long-range requirements, justification for the new LRC, and a projection of needs and priorities.

Each instructional division of the Institute was represented on this committee, a long with representatives from administrative areas and the Learning Lab. A wide scope of participation will help insure a new LRC building which meets the needs of the Institute and community.






GROWING
