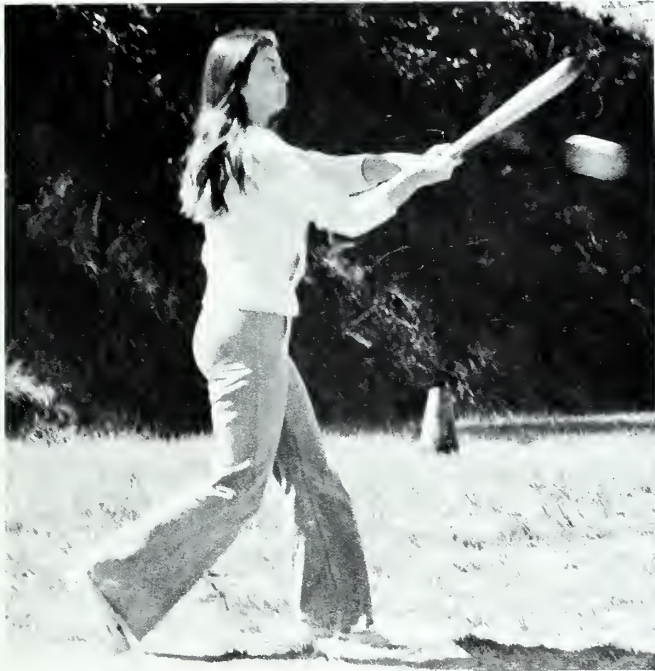
GIRLS BASKETBALL

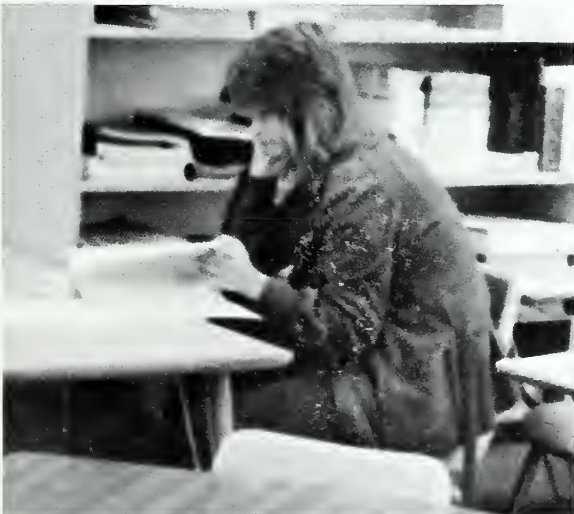


LEARNING RESOURCES CENTER
