

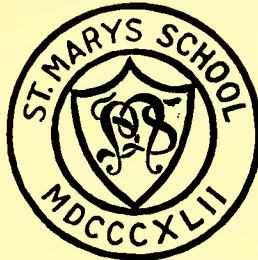

Some St. Mary's Dates to Remember

- 1832-35. The Main Building and Rock Houses erected for the use of the Episcopal School for boys.
1842. St. Mary's opened, May 12 .
1867. The Chapel built. The church services had been held previously in East Rock.
1877. Dr. Aldert Smedes died, April 25.
1879. The first class "graduated."
1897. The Church purchased the school.
1899. Dr. Bennett Smedes died, February 22.
1904. The Chapel remodeled by alumnae funds.
1909. The Clement Legacy available. Clement Hall and the Wings built.

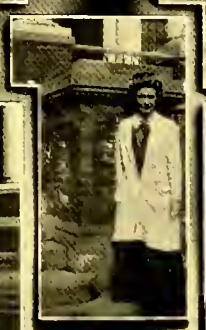

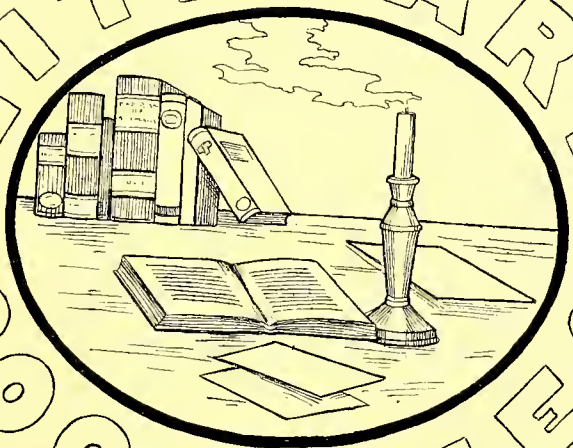

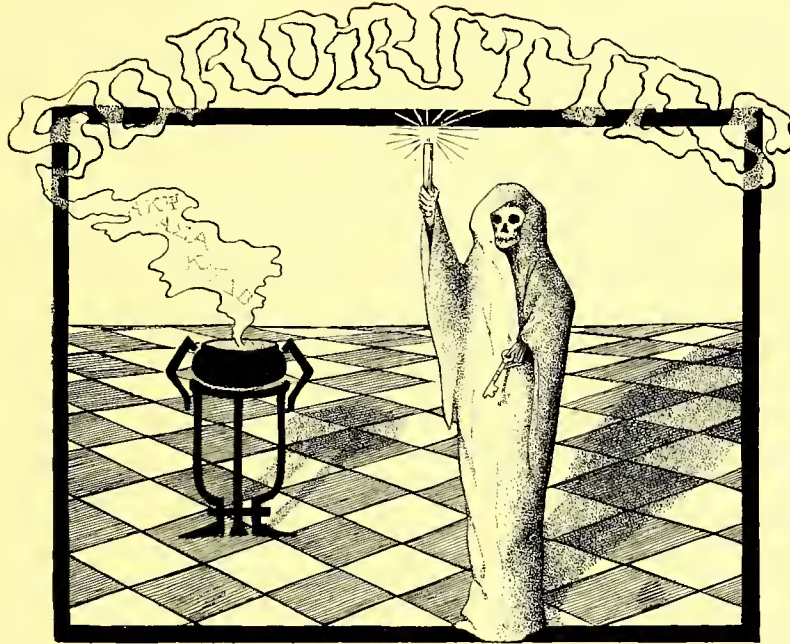
