

- 1832-35. The Main Building and Rock Houses erected for the use of the Episcopal School for boys.
- 1842. St. Mary's opened, May 12
- 1867. The Chapel built. The church services had been held previously in East Rock.
- 1877. Dr. Aldert Smedes died, April 25.
- 1879. The first class "graduated."
- 1897. The Church purchased the school.
- 1899. Dr. Bennett Smedes died, February 22.
- 1904. The Chapel remodeled by alumnæ funds.
- 1909. The Clement Legacy available. Clement Hall and the Wings built.

out, and you go in.


Pretty soon you find that you and the crowd around are the only ones that are left in the parlor. So the crowd rises slowly, yawns, and disperses.







(So far as I have been informed, they sit and ponder yet.)


The Muse Board sat and pondered on a multitude of themes.
