Dear Sir,

The Board, in May, 1898, had their attention called to the manner in which flowers gathered in the Town Gardens of Berlin were placed in the Upper Grade and Lower Grade Municipal Schools for the purpose of furthering the study of Botany.

The Board were of opinion that such a scheme would be the means of increasing the educational value of the instruction in their schools.

As Chairman of the School Management Committee, I accordingly had an interview with Colonel Wheatley, of Her Majesty's Office of Works, and as a consequence a fortnightly supply of flowers, leaves, cuttings, &c., are now being forwarded from the Royal Parks to selected schools for the purpose of teaching Botany and Drawing, and for Object Lessons.

The resources of the Royal Parks would be greatly strengthened if materials from the Royal Gardens at Kew



which would otherwise be thrown away such as the dead stems of endogens, fir-cones, bulbs, and discarded specimens from the museums, were available for the use of the Board.

In these circumstances I desire to bring the foregoing facts before you in the hope that you would be good enough to assist the Board in a scheme which shows every sign of becoming a great success, bringing as it does the children into direct contact with nature instead of with drawings and other representations from nature.

In the event of the Board being so fortunate as to secure your co-operation in the scheme, it is suggested that we should be allowed to place a box or boxes in Kew Gardens into which all such specimens, &c., as might be available for the use of schools could be placed, the box or boxes being periodically cleared by our representative.

It should be added that the Board's gardener and his assistant staff, who are also servants of H.M. Office of Works, have their head-quarters at the Store-yard, Hyde Park.

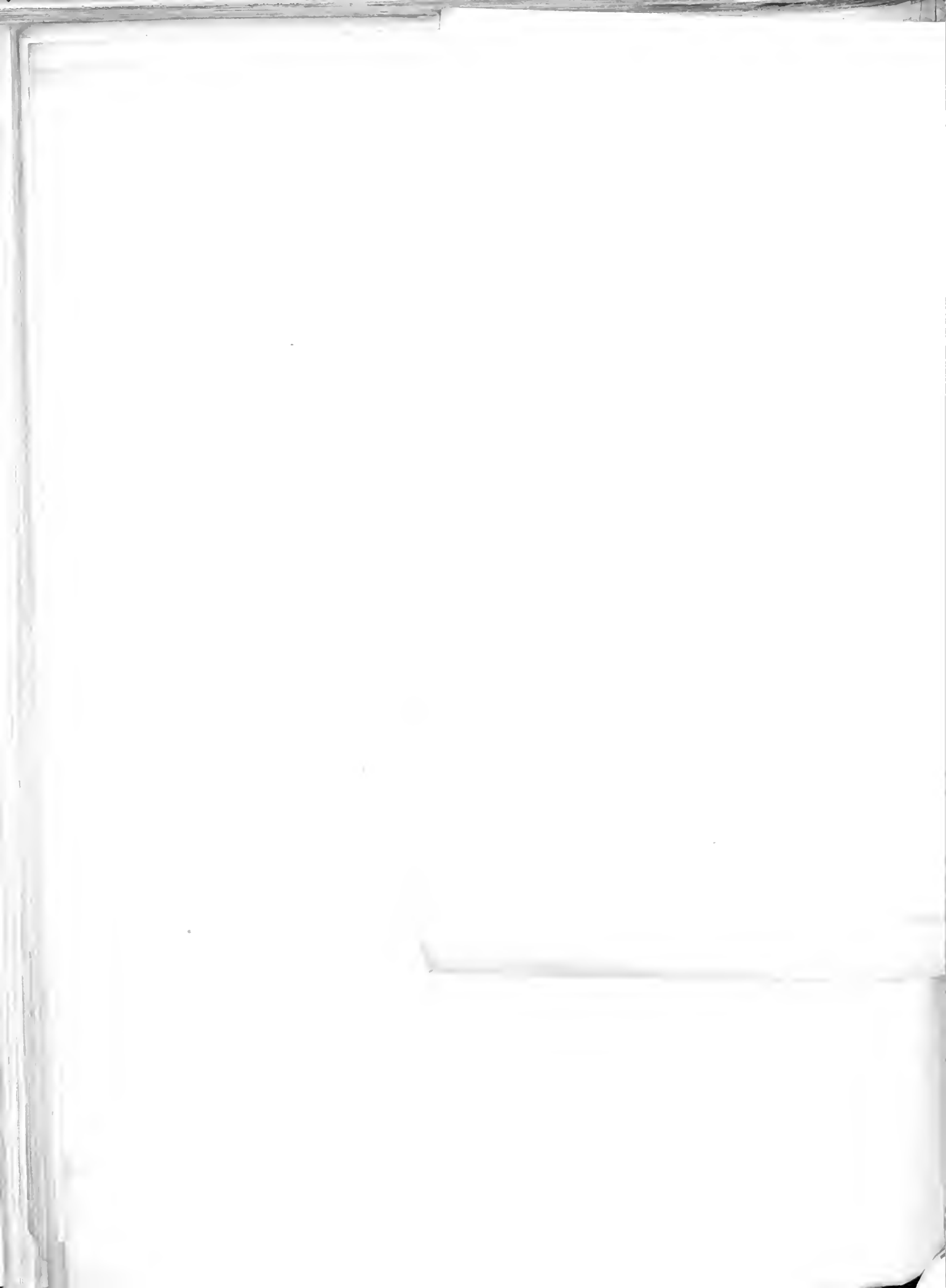

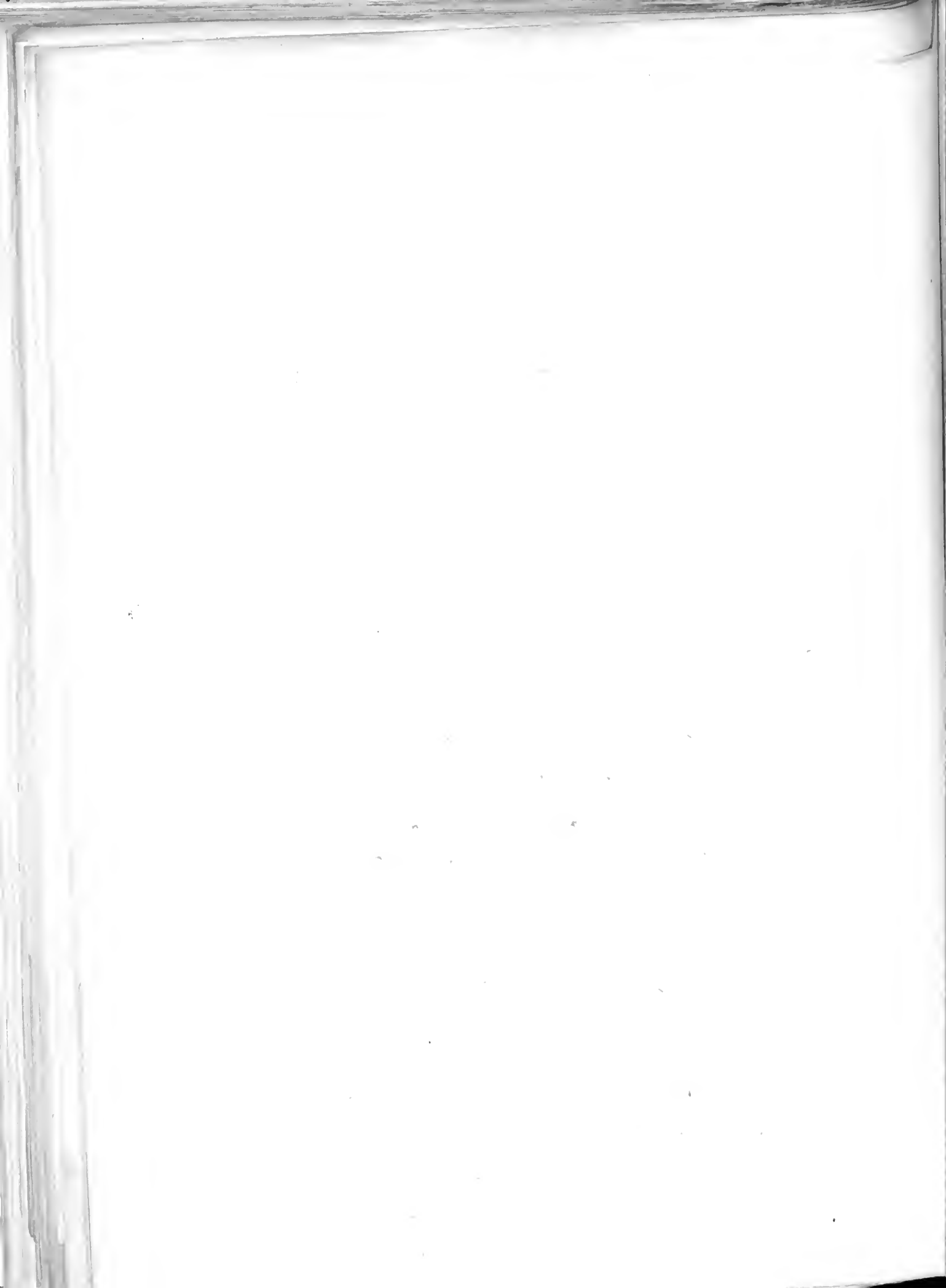

I have to acknowledge receipt of your letter of April 27, 1911, and of the interesting photographs showing your collections of 'Insects of the Empire'.

In reply to your request for specimens on loan I regret that it is not possible for us to help you as we do not have out our insect specimens on loan.

Until the reorganization of the London School Board arrangements for the distribution of duplicate specimens under special conditions have been made, specimens sent to the Education Office to be distributed should be sent to the schools which might make application for them.

I do not know whether in taking over other functions of the London School Board the Education Department of the L. C. C. has taken over the distribution of such duplicate specimens.
