COURTS.

Court-House in New Bedford, 148 County Street, corner of Court.

SUPREME JUDICIAL COURT.

The Supreme Court has exclusive cognizance of all capital crimes, and exclusive chancery jurisdiction and concurrent original jurisdiction of all civil cases when the amount in dispute exceeds \$300 in the Counties except Suffolk.

Law terms are held at Plymouth and Taunton alternately, on the 4th Tuesday next after the 4th Tuesday in September, for the Coun-

ties of Bristol, Plymouth, Barnstable and Dukes.

Nisi Prius terms for Bristol County are held at Taunton on the 7th Tuesday next after the 1st Tuesday in March, and in New Bedford on the 2d Tuesday in November.

COURT OF COMMON PLEAS.

The Court of Common Pleas is held for the trial of civil cases above \$20, and, except in Suffolk County, has criminal jurisdiction in all cases not capital.

It is held for Bristol County, at Taunton, on the 2d Mondays of March and September, and at New Bedford on the 2d Mondays of

June and December.

COURT OF PROBATE AND INSOLVENCY.

Under the law of 1858, there is but one Judge and one Register for both these Courts. The Judge is appointed by the Governor, and the Register chosen by the people of the County every five years.

POLICE COURT.

Office, Old Town Hall, Second Street, near Union. Robert C. Pitman, Justice; Alamson Borden, Special Justice; F. L. Porter, Clerk. The salary of the Justice is \$1200 per annum. He pays \$5 to the Special Justice who holds the Court in his place. The salary of the Clerk is \$400. The Police Court is held on the mornings of every day, Sundays, public days, holidays and election days excepted. Begular term days for the trial of civil cases, Mondays at 10 o'clock.

POLICE.

The Central Police Station is in the Old Town Hall, South Second street, near Union.

Station No. 2 is on South Water street, near the foot of Griffin.

Station No. 3 is on Willis street, near Purchase.

The Mayor is at the head of the Police. The regular Police force consists of a Marshal and six Assistant Marshals, who are also Constables of the city. Special Police Officers are appointed to perform specific duties. The members of the Protecting Society are Police Officers at fires and at alarms of fire.

NIGHT WATCH.

The Watchmen are appointed by the Mayor and Aldermen, and are thirty-one in number. Four Special Watchmen are appointed to take the places of absent Watchmen. The main Watch-House is in the Old Town Hall, but the Police Stations on Willis and South Water streets are also used for this purpose. The Night Watch are, while on duty, under the immediate charge of the Captain of the Watch, whose compensation is \$45 per month. The pay of the others is \$1.25 per night.

Market.

The only Public Market is in the basement of the City Hall. The stalls are leased and payment of the rent is required weekly. The Clerk of the Market has charge of the Market and of the Market Square.

Liquor Agency.

An Agency has been established by the city in accordance with the provision of law. The Agency is kept in Liberty Hall Building, No. 67 William Street.

Poor Department.

The office of the Overseers of the Poor is in the Library Building. The Alms-House is on Clark's Point. There are six Overseers, one from each Ward. The Mayor is ex officio Chairman of the Board. A magnetic telegraph between the office at the Library and the Alms-House, with a branch to the central Police Office, affords great facilities of communication between those having charge of this department.

Health Department.

The Mayor and Aldermen constitute the Board of Health.

QUARANTINE.

Quarantine Physician, Charles D. Stickney.

QUARANTINE GROUND.

The Quarantine Ground is bounded as follows:-Butler's Flats on the south, the east shore of Clark's Point on the west, the Eleven Foot Bank on the north, and the Egg Islands on the east.

Public Cemeteries.

There are three public cemeteries in the city.

The Rural Cemetery is in the south part of the city, on the west side of Dartmouth street, about one mile from the City Hall.

The Oak Grove Cemetery is in the west part of the city, on the north side of Smith street, about one mile north-west of the City Hall.

The Pine Grove Cemetery is situated on the road leading to Tar-

kiln Hill, near Acushnet Village.

In all these cemeteries, arrangements have been made for individuals to obtain and hold the exclusive occupancy of lots, while ample provision is made for the interments when no such arrangements are desired. No lots remain undisposed of in the Oak Grove Cemetery. All these grounds are under the care of the Superintendent of Burial-Grounds.

New Bedford Free Public Library.

This institution, the first one of the kind ever opened, was established by the city in 1852. The library is kept in the new building recently erected on William Street, and now contains 12,000 volumes. The Trustees are the Mayor, the President of the Common Council, the Chairman of the Committee on Public Instruction, and three chosen at large by the City Council.

Public Schools.

The names of the members of the School Committee and its erganization will be found under the head of City Government.

Regular meetings of the Committee are held at their room in the

Library Building.

The whole number of public schools is forty, connected with which

are ninety-seven teachers.

All the public schools are in operation the whole year excepting during the usual vacations. In the grammar schools the boys and girls are usually taught separately.

For the year ending March 1, 1858, the sum paid to the teachers was \$31,411.45. The whole expenditure for the School Department

for the same period was \$47,924.26.

HIGH SCHOOL.

This school is common to the whole city. No children are admitted under twelve years of age. The course of study contemplates a connection with the school of four years, and embraces such studies as are required for admission in the colleges of the State. Candidates are examined and admitted twice a year.

Fire Department.

The Fire Department was created by an Ordinance of the city, under the provisions of a special act of the Legislature. It consists of a Chief Engineer, four Assistant Engineers and ten Fire Companies. One of these Companies has charge of the Hooks and Ladders; the others are connected with the Engines. The number attached to each Company, and the annual compensation, are determined by the City Council. The appointments are made by the Mayor and Aldermen, and are annually revised. The Engineers are chosen annually in the month of January, by the City Council in convention. They are organized as a Board and have a Clerk who records the proceedings. A red staff is their distinguishing badge. They have all the power

of Firewards, on matters relating to the destruction of buildings by powder or otherwise. Their salaries are fixed by the Council, and are as follows: Chief, \$150; Assistants, \$50 each. The Clerk is allowed \$50. The Companies have each a Foreman, First and Second Assistant Foreman and Clerk, chosen annually by the members, subject to the approval of the Engineers.

Street Department.

The Mayor and Aldermen are Surveyors of Highways. By a vote of the Board the Mayor has the general oversight of the operations on the streets.

The Superintendent of Streets has charge of the repairs of highways and other operations upon the streets, subject to the direction of the Mayor and Aldermen.

List of Streets, Lanes, Alleys, Courts, Squares, &c.

The streets of New Bedford, with a very few exceptions, are laid out north and south and east and west, intersecting each other at right angles, or nearly so. Those running north and south are numbered commencing at Union Street and increasing each way, with the even numbers on the east and the odd numbers on the west side.

Those running east and west, are numbered commencing at the river and increasing westerly, with the even numbers on the south and the odd numbers on the north side. Any departure from this rule will be noted in the following list.

The letters enclosed by brackets, which follow the names of any street, signify the general bearing of such street from the City Hall;

Thus, School street, [S.] is south from the City Hall.

Acushnet Avenue, [N.] from the railread crossing at B. Rodman's

farm north to Acushnet Village.

Cypress street, [N. W.] third street west of County, and extends from Kempton to Smith street.

Dartmouth street, [S. W.] from Allen street south-westerly past

the Rural Cemetery. Numbers commence at Allen street.

Delano street, [S.] from Water street west to County, a short distance south of the Grove school-house.

Durfee street, [N. W.] west from Ashland street.

Eighth street, [W.] from Spring north to Elm.

Elm street, [N.] from N. Water west across County to Ash street. Emerson street, [S. W.] from Arnold street south to Hawthorn. Fair street, [S. W.] from Dartmouth street easterly.

Fifth street, [S.] from Union street south to Grinnell.

First street, [S. E.] from William street south to Coffin.

Forest street, [S. W.] next south of Allen street, extending west
from County to Bonney. The numbers are calculated to commence at Third street, with which it will hereafter most probably communicate.

Foster street, [N.] from Middle street north to Maxfield street. Numbers commence at Middle street.

Fourth street, [S.] from Union street south, now open from Union street nearly to Wing street.

Franklin street, [N.] third street north of Willis, and extends from Purchase street west to County street. Numbers commence at Purchase.

Granile street, [S. W.] from Orchard street west, south of Arnold.
Grape street, [S. W.] This street extends westerly from Oak street, and is situated a little north of the Rural Cemetery.

Griffin street, [S. E.] from Third street east.

Grinnell street, [S.] from the river west across County to Dartmouth street.

Grove street, [S. W.] between Bedford and Hawthorn, extending from Orchard street westerly.

Hall's Court, [E.] between N. Second and Purchase-opens on William.

Hamilton street, [E.] from North Water street east to Rotch's wharf, on the south side of the Merchants' Bank.

Harrison street, [S. W.] next west of Dartmouth street, and extends from Hickory street southerly to Oak street.

Hathaway Road, [N. W.] west from the North Road, near the house of Pardon B. Potter.

Hawthorn street, [S. W.] from County street west, opening opposite 104 County. Numbers commence at County.

Hickory street, [S. W.] from Dartmouth street west, and nearly

in line with Fair street.

High street, [N. E.] from Purchase street east to North Second, in line of Charles street, and thence east to North Water street, nearly in said line. Numbers commence at North Water street.

Morgan's Lane, [S. E.] from South Second street east to the river, and on the north side of the Common Burying-Ground. The numbers commence at present at South Water street.

Mount Pleasant street, [N. W.] from Linden, west of the Hill school-

house, north to the North Road at Hathaway's Corner.

Mount Vernon street, [N. W.] from Mount Pleasant street westerly. Nash Road, [N.] from Acushnet Avenue at the Nash farm west to the North Road.

New County Road, [N.] the road built by Jonathan Tobey, extending from Acushnet Viliage northerly along the Fairhaven line to the town of Freetown.

Noel Taber Road, [N. W.] the road running northerly from the Smith Mills Road at the Cannonville Meeting-House to the North Road at Haskins' Corner.

North street, [N.] from the river west across County street, open

from the River to Cedar street.

North Road, [N. W.] from "Smith Mills" in Dartmouth, past Haskins' Corner, across Mt. Pleasant street to Perry's Corner, and thence to Acushnet village.

North Front street, [E.] from Union street north to Middle street.

North Second street, [E.] from Union street north to Maxfield.

North Sixth street, [W.] from Union street north to Middle street. North Water street, [E.] from Union street north to Hillman street. Oak street, [S. W.] from Dartmouth street westerly, being the first street north of the Rural Cemetery.

Oak street North, [N. W.] from Pope to Franklin.
Orchard street, [S. W.] first street west of County, extending from

Arnold street south acro ss Allen.

Parker street, [N. W.] from County street west to Noel Taber Road. Pearl street, [N.] first street north of Willis, extending from Ray street west to County, passing in front of the railroad station.

Philip's Roal, a roal in the extreme north-westerly part of the city, running in a north-westerly direction from the New County Road. It takes its name from King Philip.

Pine street, [S. E.] from South Water street east to the river.

Pleasant street, [N.] from Kempton street north, crossing the Common, &c., to Merrimac. The numbers are calculated to commence somewhere south of Kempton street.

Pope street, [N.] second street north of Willis, extending from Pur-

chase west to County street, on the north side of the Common.

Prospect street, [S. E.] from South street northerly. This is the second street east of South Water street.

Purchase street, [N. E.] from Union street north to the Railroad

Ray street, [N. E.] from Kempton street north to Acushnet Ave-The numbers are calculated to commence at some place south of Kempton street.

Robeson street, [N. W.] from County street, at Robeson's Corner,

west to Ashland street.

Rodman street, [E.] from North Water street east to Front street. Rose alley, [E.] from North Water east to Front street.

Russell street, [S.] from Third west to County street. The numbers on this street are in continuation of the numbers on Cannon street. School street, [S.] from Front street west to County street.

Sears street, [S. W.] from Washington street south, and next west of Orchard street.

Sears' Court, [E.] between Union and William streets, opens opposite No. 24 Purchase street.

Seventh street, [S. W.] from Union south to Cherry street. Sherman street, [S. W.] next north of Grinnell street, extending from County street west to Bonney street. Numbers commence at County street.

Smith street, [N. W.] from County street west to the Oak Grove Cemetery. The numbers are calculated to commence at a point cast of County street, to which it is presumed it will be extended.

Smith street Court, [N. W.] opening from Smith street to the north between Nos. 63 and 65.

Smith Mills Road, [N. W.] the road leading from Kempton street to the village of "Smith Mills," in Dartmouth.

South street, [S.] from the river west to County street.

South Front street, [S. E.] from Union street south to Walnut street, and again from the easterly range of Howland street south to South street. Numbers commence at Union street.

South Second street, [S. E.] from Union street to South street.

Numbers commence on Union street.

South Sixth street, [S.] from Union street south to County street. South Water street, [S. E.] from Union street south, leading to " Clark's Point."

Spring street, [S.] from South Second west to County street.

Numbers commence at South Second street.

Spruce street, [N. W.] fourth street west of County, and extends from Kempton to Smith street. Numbers commence at Kempton st. State street, [N.] from Maxfield street north. The numbers are calculated to commence somewhere south of Kempton street.

Sullivan street, [N. W.] a court opening from Middle street nearly

opposite No. 228.

Summer street, [N. W.] first street west of County, extending north from Elm street, and passing on the east side of the High School The numbers are calculated to commence at Union street.

Sycamore street, [N. W.] west from Pleasant street to Cedar

Tarkiln Hill Road, [N.] road leading from Acushnet over Tarkiln Hill.

Third street, [S. E.] from Union street south.

Thomas street, [N. W.] from Hillman street north. The numbers are calculated to commence somewhere south of Hillman street.

Union street, [S.] from Front street west across County street to Orchard street.

Walden street, [N. W.] from Hillman street north. The numbers are calculated to commence some distance south of Hillman street.

Wall street, [N. E.] first street north of Pearl, extending from the river to Ray street.

Walnut street, [S.] from Front street west to County, nearly in a line with Clinton and Granite streets.

Washington street, [S. W.] from Fourth street west to Dartmouth street. The numbers are calculated to commence at Third street, with which Washington street may hereafter communicate.

William street, [N.] from North Water street west to County street, passing on the north side of the Custom House and City Hall, and on

the south side of Liberty Hall and the Public Library.

Willis street, [N.] from Ray street west to County, next south of Pearl street.

Wing street, [S.] from Third street west to County, and nearly in line with Howland street at the east, and Allen street at the west.

Ward Limits.

Whole number of inhabitants, July, 1857, 21,802.

WARD No. 1. This Ward embraces the north part of the city. The south line commences at the river, runs west through Willis street to Purchase, through Purchase to Pearl, through Pearl to County, through County to Smith, and through the latter to the Darjmouth line.

WARD No. 2. The south line of Ward One makes the north line of Ward Two. The south line of this ward commences at the river, runs through North street to Cypress, through Cypress to Kempton,

through Kempton to the Dartmouth line.

WARD No. 3. The south line of Ward Two makes the north line of Ward Three. The south line of this ward commences at the river, runs through Ark Lane to North Second street, through North Second to Elm, through Elm to County, through County to Middle, and

through Middle to the Dartmouth line.

WARD No. 4. The south line of Ward Three makes the north line of Ward Four. The south line of Ward Four begins at the river, runs through School street to Fourth, through Fourth to Spring, through Spring to County, through County to Arnold, through Arnold street to the Dartmouth line. Pope's Island and Fish Island are included in this ward.

WARD No. 5. The south line of Ward Four makes the north line of this ward. The south line of Ward Five begins at the river, runs through Griffin street to Third, through Third to Bedford, through Bedford to contemplated Green (west of the house of Samuel Bonney,) through Green to Allen, and through Allen to the Dartmouth line.

WARD No. 6. This Ward embraces all that part of the City south

of Ward Five.

Localities of Interest in and about the City.

Acushnet. This is a village usually known as the Head of the River, about three and a half miles in a northerly direction from the City Hall. The westerly part is in New Bedford and the easterly part in Fairhaven, divided by the Acushnet river. The parts are united by a stone bridge. In the New Bedford portion there is a public school-house, and No. 2 engine is stationed there. Pine Grove Cemetery is near the village.

Acushnet River. This makes the harbor of New Bedford, and separates the city from Fairhaven as far north as the stone bridge at

the Head of the River.

Acushnet Heights. That portion of our territory known by this name is in the north-west part of the city, commencing at the head of Willis street. Here are some of the most beautiful private residences of our city; and the view, which includes the river, the har-

bor, the bay, and adjoining shores, villages and islands, is one of the finest in the country.

Belville. This name was many years ago given to a spot on the bank of the Acushnet River, about one mile south of Acushnet Village. A public school-house is situated on Acushnet Avenue near this locality.

Cannonville. A portion of the westerly part of the city, in the neighborhood of the meeting-house on the Smith Mills road, is known by this name, thus called in honor of one of our citizens whose labors in behalf of the people there will long be remembered.

City Common. This beautiful spot is in the north part of the city,

and is bounded by County, Purchase, Pope and Pearl streets.

Clark's Point. This point forms the southerly part of the city. It has the waters of the river on the east and of Clark's Cove on the west. It length is about two miles. At its southern extremity is a large tract of land belonging to the United States, most of which has been recently purchased. On the river side, at the extremity of the point, is a light-house, west of which the government have it in contemplation to erect an extensive fortification. Around this point, a distance of about four and a half miles, is a road not surpassed, if equalled, by any public drive in this country. It commences at Cove street, near the Orphans' Home, and follows the shore from thence along the western, southern and eastern boundaries of the point, until it terminates in the street where it has its beginning. It is eighty feet wide, smooth and level, and in its course commands a series of views of surpassing loveliness and beauty. The cove, the bay and the river, the shores, the islands and ledges, the light-houses, steamers, and sailing craft of every description, the city on the one side, its sister town of Fairhaven on the other, the noble bridge between, and the forest-like show made by the shipping of both, constitute a series of pictures which renders a ride or a walk over this road most delightful and attractive.

Fish Island. This island, once but little more than a sand-bank, is now a place of a large business. The bridge from the city to Fair-haven passes over it. Several wharves, an exte sive coal-yard, an

oil-factory and a marine railway are connected with it.

Four Corners. The space formed by the intersection of Water and Union Streets. This has been a somewhat noted spot in our local history. Near this was erected the first village house, and it may still be regarded as a business centre. The Banks, Insurance Offices, Lawyers' Offices, &c., are nearly all in this vicinity. William A. Wall's picture of the Four Corners Fifty Years Ago is beautiful and correct.

Haskins' Corner is about one mile north of Cannonville on the

Noel Taber Road.

Pope's Island. This island derives its name from a family long known and respected among us, a member of which now resides upon it. The bridge between the city and Fairhaven passes over it. It lies nearly in the centre of the river.

Palmer's Island, upon which the United States government has a light-house, is at the mouth of the inner harbor. The main channel lies east of it. It affords a good protection from the high southerly winds. A house of entertainment is kept upon it.

Rotch's Square. Near the river on Front street. Hamilton and Rodman streets have their easterly termination in this Square.


