

Those on mud had a thick
calcareous(?) covering.

Jars. (1) Large, others small

Mar. 1. Sand crabs (about
twenty) obtained on
beach between Beacon
and St. Maurice.
They are very agile, & run
nimbly at the slightest
alarm. In lines they
are quick in the sand.
They form burrows from
1 to 2 deep, they are
more or less oblique, &
each have two entrances,
one at the top. They carry
sand to the surface
on their small legs.

St. Maurice
Berkeley
Beacon

and throw it away
with a sudden jerk.
I have seen them feeding
on eel grass.

Three *Crepidula fornicata*
cast on the Beach opposite
Ft Monroe adhering to
a dead *Crepidula*.

A small lizard (very
active) caught on the
sand flats opposite
Ft. Monroe.

No. 2. *Microcinea prolifera*
the "sponge", abundant
on oysters. Found cast
on beach opposite
Ft. Monroe. 4 numbers

No. 3. Three sand-fiddlers
(see above)
"Star-gazer" fish caught
in small net in
shallow water opposite
Ft. Monroe.
Small oysters obtained
at Berkeley (see above)
and in alcohol
about 6.

No. 4. Over twenty pairs
of little light, "red-
backed" crabs obtained
on the beach at Berkeley
at and above low
high water. Males have
one claw very large.
They carry sand out
in pellets and these are
scattered about.

A few *Gelasimus pugnax*
(from muddy flat)
obtained at Norfolk.
These are very abundant
on muddy flats.

No 5. *Littornia irroratus*
(see above)

Quinine bottles

No 6. *Palaeomonetes vulgaris*
obtained (by net) in
great numbers, swim-
ming about like
minnows, on the
mud-flat of Norfolk
as the tide was
coming in. — Many.

No 7. } Small "Hermit Crabs"
8 } abundant on the
mud-covered sand beach
on Little Bay, just
below low water & lower.

Ulyanassa obsoleta
very abundant at
and below low water
with the preceding.
(A piece was eroded.)

Massa vibex a few
found with preceding.

Crepidula plana?
found on oysters from
Little Bay.

No. 9. Young ~~Gastropoda~~ fiduciosa
obtained on beach by
dredging just below

low water; they
mattered quite
rapidly & were active,
over 20
Garis — about 12
cast on shore at
low water.

No. 10. Musculina from
Prof. Webster's garden.
Little whorl, crustacea
very abundant on
beach etc. Very active.

Stimok
Crepidula
Ulyanassa

Two boxes of mixed shells
from Ocean View Beach
containing *Siliqua*,
Propeleia pinnata etc.

Two boxes of *Stalampus*
bidentatus. very abundant
in mud on the beach left
by high tide in Norfolk
mud-flats.

One box of shells - and
Neolina picta from P. M. Miller.

One box Shark's eggs
from Virginia Beach (about 12)

One box containing a large
Shark's head cast ashore
at Ocean View in Dec. 11th
1881. Presented to me by James Hare,
U.S. Marshal at Cambridge
town with the *Stalampus*
mentioned in my article.

Box Turtle obtained
from J. H. Simms, Balt. Md.






