Daniel and Mrs. Carolyn Johnson Williams were our class advisors. To lead our many activities we elected Sidney Tucker as our class president; Priscilla Wilkinson, vice president; and Bobby Cope, secretary-treasurer. Shortly after the first six-weeks of school the new members were tapped into the Beta Club. They were: Susan Poston, Brenda Benton, Jerry Irvin, Jane Carriker, Jane Irvin, Priscilla Wilkinson, Linda Winecoff, Madalene Fisher, Joye Hudson, Louvina Barbee, Bobby Cope, Eddie Ballard, Patsy Floyd, Hope Hinson, and Susie Smith. For our junior play we chose "For Pete's Sake" with Mrs. Carolyn Williams directing. The cast consisted of 12 members. These were: Eddie Ballard, Monty Laney, Louvina Barbee, Brenda Benton, Billie Smith, Suzan Babb, Brad Patterson, Roy Kee, Susan Poston, Hope Hinson, Freddie Jordan, and Sidney Tucker. Eunice Miller represented the school as "Miss Odell Hi" in the Concord and Kannapolis Christmas Parades.

Nearing the close of school, the marshals were chosen. Joye Hudson and Priscilla Wilkinson shared the title of chief, with Eddie Ballard, Brenda Benton, Madalene Fisher, Linda Winecoff, Jane Carriker, and Susan Poston, assisting.

On May 2, the juniors said their farewells to the seniors with a memorable banquet in the school cafeteria. We chose "Oriental Gardens" as the theme and it was carried out through the entire evening.

Finally, after much hard work, our senior year arrived. Mrs. Louise Morrison and Mr. Carl Cathey were to be our class sponsors. This year Priscilla Wilkinson was elected president of the class; Billie Smith, vice president; Louvina Barbee, secretary; and Bobby Cope, treasurer.

Immediately, work was begun on the yearbook and the school newspaper. At the close of the previous school year, Joye Hudson and Bobby Cope were chosen as co-editors of the annual. Linda Winecoff and Monty Laney were business managers, and Brenda Benton and Madalene Fisher, circulation managers. Those chosen for the newspaper staff were: Priscilla Wilkinson, editor; Shirley Barbee, feature editor; and Sidney Tucker, business manager.

At our first class meeting the remainder of the two staffs were elected. Those chosen for the annual staff were: Freddie Jordan, snapshot editor; Louvina Barbee, Susan Poston, and Susie Smith, typists. The remainder of the newspaper staff consisted of Susan Poston, sports editor; Jane Irvin, stylist; Linda Winecoff, artist; and Louvina Barbee, mimeograph operator. Mrs. Louise Morrison was our sponsor for both the yearbook and the newspaper with Mrs. Augusta Stough, Mrs. Hansel Harry, and Mrs. Norma Bost assisting with the newspaper.

Throughout the year, special class meetings were called in preparation for graduation. For our mascots we chose Vicki Irvin and Kenneth Mesimer. The class night exercises were also planned. Jane Irvin was elected as class poet; Shirley Barbee, historian; Billie Smith, class prophet; Brenda Benton and Monty Laney, giftorians; Hope Hinson and Jerry Irvin, class lawyers; Sidney Tucker, class grumbler.

This year, Shirley Barbee was the only senior to be tapped into the Beta Club. Chosen as our "Miss Hi Miss" was Priscilla Wilkinson. Priscilla also was awarded the D.A.R. "Good Citizenship Award."


BETTY JEAN SCOTT won the 1979 title of "Homemaker of the Year." She is living now with her husband and three children in Oklahoma.
