PREFACE.

THE beginning of a Century is a mile-stone of Time. It is a point from which to measure in each direction. The retrospect of accomplished facts is set over against the prospect of deeds yet to be performed. It is therefore fitting to select such a point of time at which to review the history of such a power in the forces for good order and the public peace as the Boston Police Department. From its very humble and small beginnings as a "night watch" to the present completely developed and skilfully officered department of rising 1200 men, is a long step. Rather it has been a series of steps, each as distinctly marked as those left on the yielding sands by those of bygone ages, whose foot-prints are the wonder and study of learning and science of today.

This review of the steps of the gradual development of the Boston Police Department, is, of necessity, not so complete as might be desired. In such a work there is always lack of data felt to be necessary for the fullest expression of the facts it is desired to present. The incompleteness of early records, the reluctance some officials always feel to having their own share in public events even fairly stated, while others may have obtained undue prominence, and kindred reasons all combine to make such a volume lack the perfectness its designers intended and the public interest requires. But herein are contained the more essential facts of the origin, development and growth of the Department, so far as they could be found in the records available. Their presentation in this form may be the means of bringing together, at a later date, an even greater wealth of fact and detail, by which this history may be enlarged, corrected and improved.

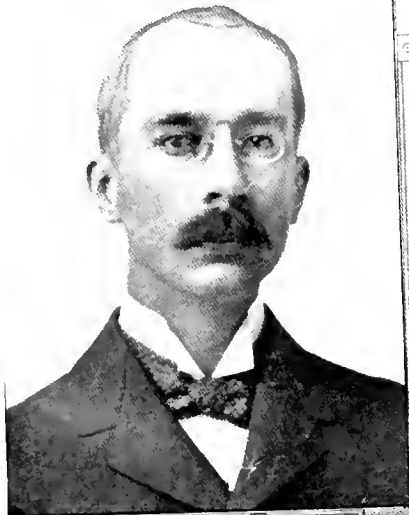
The publisher is under deep obligation to the officers and members of the Department for the very cordial and effective co-operation he has received at their hands in the preparation of this work, and without which such a publication would have been impossible. Pierce, and Mr. Thomas Ryan, Chief Clerk of the Department.

COMMISSIONERS, AND OFFICERS ATTACHED TO HEADQUARTERS.

ROBERT FARLEY CLARK was born in Boston, Mass., May 20, 1838; graduated from the Boston Latin School. When the War broke out in 1861, Mr. Clark went to the front as Captain of Co. F, Twenty-fourth Infantry, Mass. Vols. He participated in the famous Burnside Expedition. At the death of his father Mr. Clark was called home and honorably discharged, in 1864. After the War he entered the brokerage business, and became a member of the Boston Stock Exchange. As a young man he was a famous athlete, and a member of the peerless *Volant* crew in the early fifties. He was one of the founders, and the first president, of the Boston Athletic Association. Appointed Police Commissioner by the late Gov. Wm. E. Russell, May 1, 1893, and Chairman of the present board by the late Gov. Roger Wolcott on May 6, 1899.

CHARLES PELHAM CURTIS was born in Winchester, Mass., Sept. 7, 1860, and was graduated from Harvard College, Class of 1883. He is a lawyer by profession; appointed a member of the Police Commission, May 6, 1895, by the late Governor Greenhalge; reappointed by Governor Crane in 1900.

HARRY FRANKLIN ADAMS was born in Boston, Mass., Sept. 7, 1857, and educated in its public schools; appointed a member of the Police Commission by Governor Wolcott, May 3, 1899, previous to which he was Receiving Teller of the Massachusetts State Treasury, member of the Washington Lodge of Masons, Mt. Vernon Chapter, and Josephine Lodge, No. 100, Free and Accepted Masonry. His father, the late Samuel G. Adams, was at one time Superintendent of the Boston Police Force.

THOMAS RYAN was born in Ireland, Sept. 9, 1845; educated in the public schools of Roxbury, and Commercial College; appointed to police service, and assigned to Division 4; transferred to Division 9 in May, 1871; transferred to Division 10 in July, 1872; promoted to sergeant in July, 1876; in October, 1876 assigned to clerical service in the office of the Chief of Police; in 1883 he was appointed Clerk to the Superintendent of Police, and five years later was appointed Clerk to the Board, and Chief Clerk of the Department. He enlisted in 1861 in Co. E, Thirteenth Mass. Vol. Infantry, in which regiment he served two and a half years; was taken prisoner at Bull Run, and later released on parole. Mr. Ryan is Past President of the Mass. Irish Charitable Society, and for the past twenty years Treasurer of the Police Relief Association.

SUPERINTENDENT WILLIAM H. PIERCE was born in Boston (Roxbury), Mass., March 9, 1849; educated in the Dearborn (Roxbury) Grammar School, and Comer's Commercial College; appointed on the Police Force Oct. 23, 1876, and assigned to Division 10; promoted to Sergeant Dec. 24, 1880, and assigned to Division 1; promoted to Lieutenant April 16, 1887, and assigned to Division 6; promoted to Captain Jan. 5, 1893, and assigned to Police Headquarters; transferred to

Division 16, Feb. 6, 1893; transferred to Division 2, Aug. 26, 1893; promoted to Deputy Superintendent July 9, 1894, and assigned to Headquarters; June 1, 1901, made Superintendent. Such a record of rapid and steady promotion from the lowest position to the highest is as eloquent in its bare recital as more abundant words could be. On April 28, 1895, Superintendent Pierce was awarded the first and only gold medal ever bestowed by the Police Commissioners, and Chairman Martin of the Board, in making the presentation, dwelt especially on the fidelity to duty, and excellent record as a policeman, of the recipient.

DEPUTY SUPERINTENDENT BYRON F. BRAGDON was born in Boston, Mass., May 3, 1841; received his education in the public schools; was appointed Patrolman and assigned to Division 8, Sept. 19, 1867; promoted to Sergeant May 18, 1874; to Lieutenant Nov. 2, 1874; transferred to Division 1, Sept. 6, 1886; promoted to Captain and Harbor Master, and transferred back to Division 8, April 13, 1889; promoted to Deputy Superintendent Dec. 18, 1896.

DEPUTY SUPERINTENDENT JAMES M. COULTER was born in Ireland, Aug. 22, 1843, appointed patrolman and assigned to Division 4, May 24, 1874; promoted Sergeant Oct. 29, 1883, and Lieutenant Feb. 13, 1884; transferred to Division 6, Oct. 31, 1885; promoted to Captain, and transferred back to Division 4, Nov. 29, 1886; transferred to Division 6, July 12, 1888; transferred to Division 5, Dec. 9, 1890; promoted to Chief Inspector, and transferred to Headquarters Nov. 9, 1891; to Deputy Superintendent Oct. 25, 1894.

ORINTON M. HANSCOM was born in Oxford, Me., Jan. 19, 1846; appointed Deputy Superintendent, and assigned to Headquarters July 9, 1894.

EX-SUPERINTENDENT BENJAMIN P. ELDRIDGE was born in Truro, Mass., May 20, 1838; educated in public and private schools; appointed on the Police Force Sept. 25, 1875, and assigned to Division 11; promoted to Lieutenant, Oct. 21, 1878; transferred to Headquarters, July 30, 1885; promoted to Captain and transferred to Division 6, Oct. 31, 1885; promoted to Chief Inspector and transferred to Police Headquarters, July 12, 1888; promoted to Superintendent of Police, Nov. 9, 1891. Retired from active service, June 1, 1901. He is a member of several societies, including the Masons, and is a retired member of the Police Relief Association.

EX DEPUTY SUPERINTENDENT JOSEPH R. BURRILL was born in Newburyport, Mass., Feb. 17, 1833, and educated in the public schools of that city; appointed on the Police Force, May 29, 1872, and assigned to Division 5; promoted to Sergeant Dec. 15, 1873; promoted to Lieutenant Feb. 15, 1875, and transferred to Division 6; transferred to Division 12, Oct. 21, 1878; promoted to Captain, and transferred to Division 1, Jan. 29, 1881; promoted to Deputy Superintendent, and transferred to Police Headquarters Oct. 31, 1885; retired from active service, June 1, 1901, having served twenty-nine years on the Force. He is a retired member of the Police Relief Association.

CAPTAIN TIMOTHY ANDREW HURLEY was born in Boston, Mass., Aug. 11, 1838; educated in the Boylston School; appointed on the Police Force April 27, 1868, and assigned to Division 5; promoted to Sergeant Aug. 4, 1874 and assigned to Division 6; in February, 1875, transferred back to Division 5; in June, 1877, assigned to Liquor Commissioners' office; appointed Lieutenant in December, 1877, and transferred to City Prison as Assistant Keeper; in December, 1879, transferred to Division 3; Aug. 4, 1880, promoted to Captain, and assigned to Division 9; Sept. 1, 1885, transferred to Division 3; November, 1891, transferred back to Division 9; September, 1899, transferred to City Prison; Nov. 27, 1900, transferred to Division 13. Member of the Knights of Columbus, of the Charitable Irish and Catholic Union, and of the Police Relief Association; was the organizer of the Montgomery Light Guards in 1865; retired from active service Aug. 31, 1901.

CAPTAIN HENRY DAWSON was born in London, Eng., Feb. 13, 1843, and was educated there; appointed a Patrolman Dec. 30, 1875, and assigned to Division 6; promoted to a Sergeant Dec. 24, 1880, and assigned to Division 4; transferred from Division 4, April, 1882, to the Harbor Police, which was called Division 16; about the middle of July of that year the Harbor Police was consolidated with Division 8, and was transferred to Police Headquarters, and during that summer was sent to Divisions 6, 3, 7, 15, 13, and that fall was transferred to the Harbor Police, which was Division 8; promoted to Lieutenant Oct. 29, 1883, and transferred from Division 8 to Division 10; transferred to Division 3, Aug. 31, 1885; promoted to Captain Oct. 31, 1885, and transferred to Division 1; transferred to Division 4, July 14, 1887; transferred to Division 16, Feb. 25, 1889; transferred to Division 13, April 19, 1890; transferred to Division 10, Dec. 9, 1890; transferred to Division 5, Nov. 9, 1891; transferred to Police Headquarters Aug. 26, 1893. In 1894 was transferred to the Criminal Bureau of Investigation as Assistant Chief Inspector (transferred Oct. 16, 1894); transferred Sept. 28, 1895, to Division 11; transferred to Division 14, Dec. 24, 1895; transferred to Division 16, March 1, 1898; transferred to Division 10, Aug. 30, 1899; transferred to Division 12, Dec. 22, 1899; transferred to Police Headquarters Sept. 3, 1901.

CAPTAIN THOMAS C. EVANS was born in Boston, Mass., Dec. 29, 1856, and received his education in the public schools. He was appointed a Patrolman Dec. 21, 1882, and assigned to Division 4; promoted to Sergeant Nov. 14, 1887, and transferred to Division 15; transferred to Division 1, Sept. 13, 1888; promoted to Lieutenant, Aug. 23, 1890, and transferred to Division 11; transferred to Division 4, Oct. 17, 1892; promoted to Inspector June 24, 1893, and assigned to Headquarters. Transferred to Special Street Squad April 29, 1895; promoted to Captain May 6, 1895; transferred to Division 16, Aug. 30, 1899; transferred to Headquarters Sept. 3, 1901; a member of the Police Relief Association, and Gate of the Temple Lodge, A. F. and A. M.

CAPTAIN GEORGE E. SAVORY, Property Clerk at Headquarters, was born in Haverhill, Mass., Nov. 18, 1844, and received his education in the public schools. He was appointed a Patrolman April 28, 1873; promoted to Sergeant Feb. 18, 1879; promoted to Lieutenant May 6, 1895; promoted to Captain May 20, 1895. Captain Savory has always been connected with the Superintendent's office. He is a member of the Police Relief Association.

CAPTAIN WILLIAM H. BROWN was born in Hallowell, Me., July 17, 1841, and was educated in the public schools. He was appointed a Patrolman May 25, 1874, and assigned to Division 14. Promoted to Sergeant March 27, 1875; promoted to Lieutenant Oct. 21, 1878; promoted to Captain Nov. 29, 1886, and transferred to Division 10; transferred to Division 13, Dec. 9, 1890, and transferred to Police Headquarters Nov. 26, 1900; a member of the Police Relief Association.

CAPTAIN THOMAS H. BROWN was born in Boston, Aug. 31, 1847; educated in the Phillips Grammar School of that city; appointed on the Force May 25, 1874, and assigned to Division 8; promoted to Sergeant in 1882, and assigned to Division 14; transferred to Division 8 shortly after, and afterwards transferred to city Headquarters to be Assistant Medical Examiner, to investigate all deaths by violence, where an inquest was necessary; promoted to Lieutenant in 1883, and assigned to Division 11; transferred in 1885 to Division 12; in 1894 transferred to Division 15, and in July of the same year was transferred to Headquarters; in October, 1894, promoted to Captain, and assigned to special liquor duty at Headquarters; member of Police Relief Association.

CAPTAIN DENNIS DONOVAN was born in Ireland, Nov. 20, 1844; educated partly in Ireland, and partly in Boston; appointed on the Force June 20, 1877, and assigned to Station 15; promoted to Sergeant March 16, 1888, and assigned to Division 1; transferred to Headquarters Sept. 16, 1888; promoted to Lieutenant Jan. 5, 1893; promoted to Captain July 10, 1894, and assigned to Division 2; transferred to Division 6, March 1, 1898; transferred to Headquarters, Sept. 3, 1901.

CAPTAIN WILLIAM HERBERT DYER was born in Unity, Me., Jan. 22, 1848; educated in the public schools, and at Boston Commercial College. Came to Boston at the age of sixteen, and worked in various stores until he was appointed on the Force Jan. 3, 1873, and assigned to Division 9; transferred to Division 2, and appointed for special work under the old Board of License Commissioners; later detailed at the old "Reservoir" liquor storehouse, back of the State House; in 1877 the Police Claims Department was established, and Officer Dyer was put in charge; promoted to Inspector in 1883, and to Captain in 1895; has always had charge of this Department; at present is Inspector of Claims.

INSPECTOR WILLIAM TREADWELL LEGGETT was born in Boston, Mass., Oct. 21, 1840; educated in its public schools. Inspector Leggett has been a Police Officer since 1870, when he was appointed by Mayor Shurtleff. He first did duty as a Special Officer at Division 3 in the West End, and he recovered a lot of stolen property while doing that duty. Mayor Pierce, in 1878, made him Assistant Inspector of Pawnshops under William H. McCausland, one of the best known officers on the Boston Police Force. These two men were in charge of the supervision of pawnshops for the next ten years, doing very valuable work. Chastine Cox, a colored man, who murdered Mrs. Dr. Hull of New York was arrested by these officers through property pawned in a Merrimac Street pawnshop. Cox was later executed for the crime.

When the office was merged into the City Detective Bureau in 1888 Mr. McCausland was retired on account of injuries received in service, and Inspector Leggett was continued in charge of the pawnshops under the Chief Inspector of Police. In 1892 Mr. Leggett was made a regular Police Inspector and held the position until his present appointment as Superintendent of Intelligence Offices under Superintendent of Police B. P. Eldridge. He has therefore thirty years of uninterrupted service in the Police Department to his credit.

While supervising the pawnshops Inspector Leggett won the confidence and respect of the men engaged in that business and through information often gratuitously given he solved many very difficult cases of theft and burglary.

Previous to his appointment to the Police Force he was a registered Pharmacist, he is a life member of Mass. Lodge of Masons, the I. O. O. F. and Encampment, also Police Relief Association.

INSPECTOR CHARLES WALLEY BOYER was born in Cambridge, Mass., Jan. 29, 1848; educated in the Cambridge public schools and Bridgton (Me.) Academy. Served in the Civil War in the 23d Maine and 56th Mass. Vols., and afterwards served in the 17th and 35th U. S. Infantry Regulars in Texas, being postmaster at San Antonio, Texas, in 1868. Later came to Boston and entered the Marine Engineering Department at the Charlestown Navy Yard. On the 8th of May, 1875, was appointed on the Police Force and assigned to Division 2 as Special Officer in charge of all property loaned to the city of Boston, for decoration of points of historical interest, by the United States government for June 17 and July 4, for the Centennial Exposition held in Boston in that year; was also detailed as assistant keeper of the city prison while at Station 2. Detailed to the office of Inspector of Pawnbrokers in the City Hall in 1877; detailed March 21, 1880, as Third Division Liquor Officer, issuing from Headquarters. Promoted to Sergeant in 1881 and assigned to Division 5; transferred to Headquarters Oct. 29, 1883, and as Ranking Sergeant had charge of the Street Railway Squad until it was abolished; appointed Inspector of Street Railway Service and Police July 13, 1888; appointed Inspector of Special Street Squad May 1, 1895; appointed to his present responsible position of Inspector of Carriages Aug. 30, 1899. Member of Massachusetts Lodge of Masons, of the Knights and Ladies of Honor, also member of Police Relief Association; ex-member of Royal Society of Good Fellows and for twenty-three years a member of the Knights of Honor.

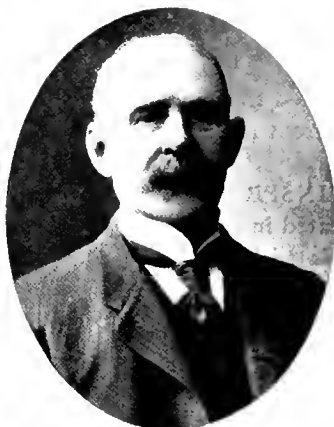

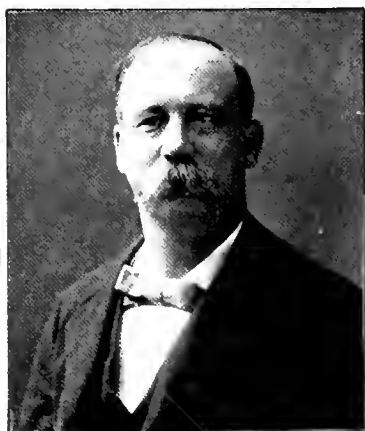

SERGEANT GEORGE EDWARD SAXTON was born in Halifax, Nova Scotia, Jan. 17, 1853. Educated in the public schools; came to Boston at the age of seventeen; appointed on the Force Nov. 27, 1878, and assigned to Division 1; for eleven years was Patrolman, and Liquor Officer for five years; transferred to Headquarters as Liquor Officer and promoted to Sergeant Oct. 28, 1894; when the liquor squad was abolished was transferred to department of Inspection of Carriages in August, 1900. Member of Police Relief Association.

LIEUTENANT WILLIAM LINCOLN DEVIFF was born in Wiscasset, Me., Feb. 8, 1854. Educated in the public schools; came to Boston at the age of seventeen; appointed on the Force May 20, 1880, and assigned to Division 11; transferred at his own request to Division 9, in Dec., 1880; detailed to Headquarters March 31, 1889, and assigned to the Claims Department; transferred to Headquarters to the Claims Department in 1893. Promoted to Sergeant Jan. 6, 1895; promoted to Lieutenant Sept. 3, 1901; acting as Assistant Inspector of Claims to Capt. Dyer. Member of Odd Fellows, a 32d degree Mason, and member of the Police Relief Association.

SERGEANT HORATIO JULIUS HOMER was born in Farmington, Conn., May 24, 1848, and educated in the public schools of Connecticut. Appointed on the Police Force Dec. 24, 1887, and assigned to Headquarters as Messenger; promoted to Sergeant in Sept., 1895, and has remained at Headquarters ever since. Previous to becoming Police Officer he was employed on Railroads and Steamboats. He is a member of the Police Relief Association.

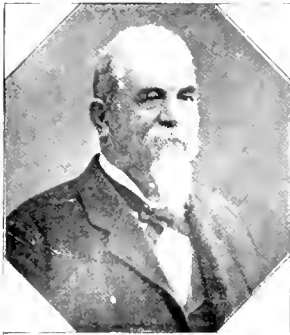
LIEUTENANT JAMES O'NEILL was born in Boston, Mass., March 4, 1846. Educated in its public schools. Appointed on the Force Jan. 10, 1881, and assigned to Division 11; transferred to Division 2, September, 1881; transferred to Headquarters September, 1885; promoted to Sergeant and then to Lieutenant in 1895. Member of Police Relief Association.

THOMAS FRANCIS GOODE was born in Boston, Mass., Dec. 22, 1869, and educated in its public schools. He was appointed a Reserve Officer on the Police Force Oct. 21, 1895, and assigned to Division 3; transferred to Division 10, Nov. 8, 1895; appointed Patrolman July 30, 1896, and detailed as Liquor Officer; appointed for special duty Jan. 16, 1901, and detailed to Headquarters in charge of itinerant musicians, having about three hundred licensed street musicians under his charge. He has been very successful in ridding the streets of vagrants and beggars, having made some two hundred arrests and convictions since the first of the year. While at Division 10 was commended on three occasions for meritorious conduct and bravery. A member of the A. O. U. W. and the Police Relief Association.

JOHN WILLIAM PYNE was born in Hingham, Mass., Aug. 10, 1867. Graduated from the Hingham High School and Boston Shorthand Bureau. Appointed April 11, 1895, and assigned to Division 16; transferred subsequently to Superintendent's office, where he is now stenographer. Before entering the Police Department he was employed as stenographer in the General Freight Office of the B. & A. R. R., and was afterwards engaged in newspaper work in this city. Member of Bunker Hill Council of Knights of Columbus.

JOHN WEIGEL was born at Munsterapel in Bavaria, Germany, Feb. 5, 1847. Educated in the Boston public schools. Appointed Aug. 20, 1888, as Inspector of Signal Service, and promoted to Director of Signal Service, March 6, 1895, with office at Headquarters. Commander of Washington Post No. 32, G. A. R., in 1898. Member of the York and Scottish Rites of Masons.

JACOB G. RUBY, born in Boston, Mass., Sept. 22, 1843, and educated in the public schools. Appointed a Patrolman, July 6, 1875, and assigned to Division 11. Transferred to Division 2, June 28, 1886; transferred to Headquarters, Dec. 6, 1895. A member of the Police Relief Association.

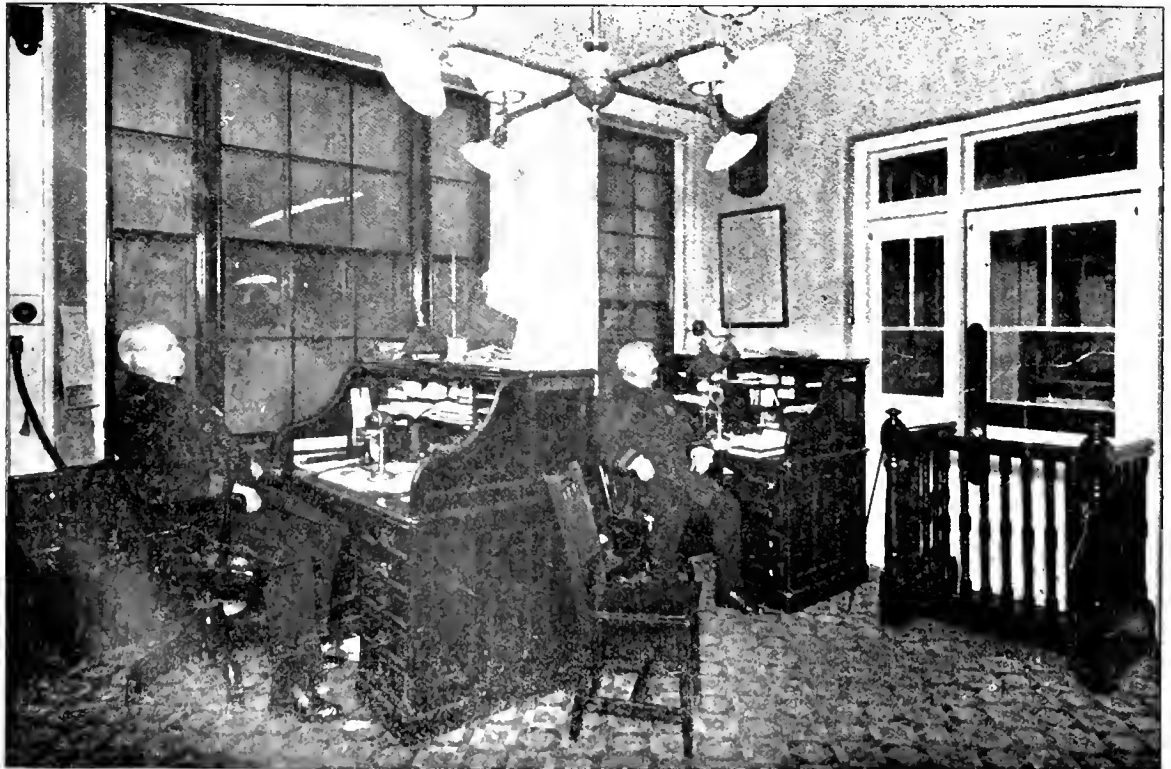

JAMES DANIEL CONBOY was born in Ireland, May 4, 1856, and educated in the national schools. Was seven years railroad officer for the New York & New England Railroad Company. Was appointed a Patrolman Dec. 14, 1885, and assigned to Division 4. Detailed on special duty from 1888 until Feb. 2, 1894; transferred to Division 10, May 30, 1894; transferred to Division 2, Sept. 10, 1898. Detailed to Intelligence Office Bureau, Oct. 16, 1900. Is D. G. K. in the Knights of Columbus, Roxbury Council No. 123; member of Irish Charitable Society, and of the Police Relief Association.

EDWIN W. ABBOTT was born in Andover, Me., June 12, 1848, receiving an education in the public schools. Appointed a Patrolman, April 20, 1875, and assigned to Division 5. Transferred to Headquarters, April 16, 1889. A member of the Police Relief Association.

CHARLES W. SEARLES was born in Kittery, Me., Jan. 5, 1865, receiving an education in the public schools. Appointed a Patrolman, Dec. 30, 1891, and assigned to Division 2. Detailed to Headquarters, August 21, 1894. Transferred to Headquarters, Dec. 6, 1895; transferred to Division 3, April 9, 1900; transferred to Headquarters, Nov. 25, 1900. A member of the Police Relief Association.

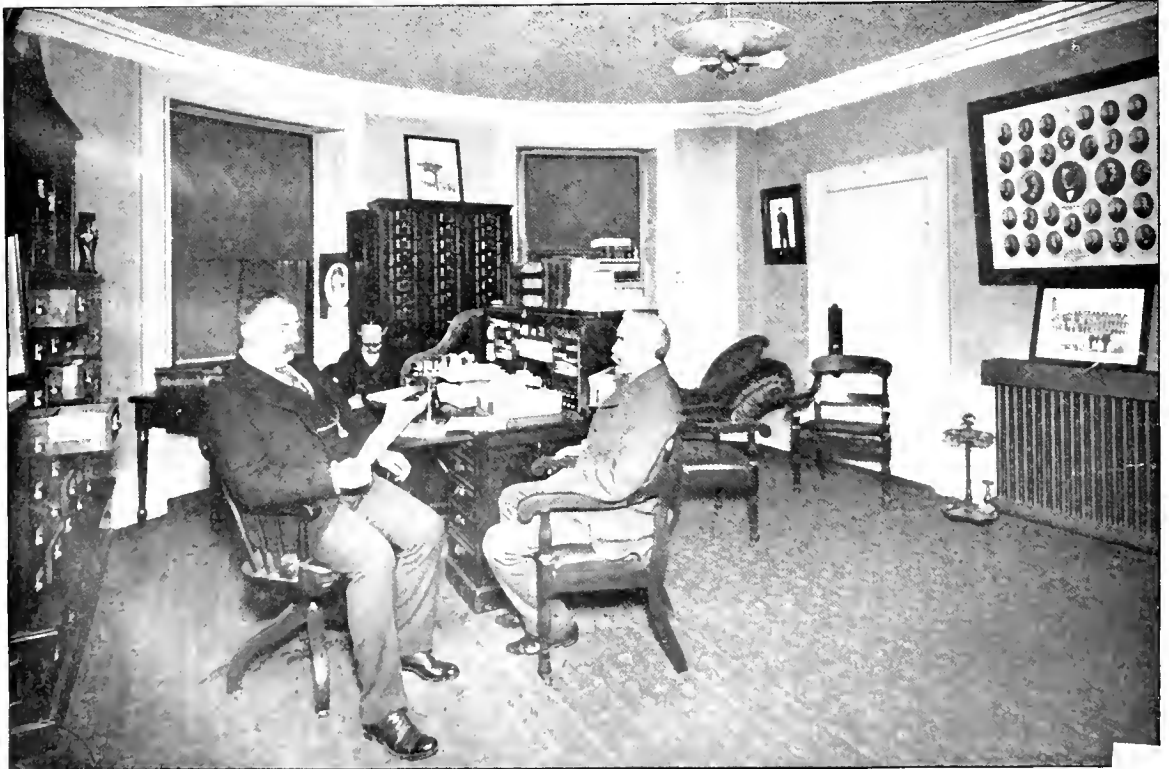

BUREAU OF CRIMINAL INVESTIGATION.

WILLIAM B. WATTS, Chief Inspector of the Bureau of Criminal Investigation, was born in Cambridge, Mass., June 19, 1852; was educated in the public schools of Boston, where he graduated. In December, 1877, he became a member of the Boston Police Department, and was attached to Division 10 of Roxbury, doing detective work on that division at times. His rise from Patrolman to Chief has been rapid and continuous. In 1880 he was transferred to the Inspector's Office, and on Dec. 25, 1884, was made an Inspector of Police. As an Inspector he worked on a great many cases that brought him fame and eventually promotion. On Nov. 9, 1891, Inspector Watts was promoted to the rank of Captain and sent to Division 3. But he was pleased to return to the office of the Bureau of Criminal Investigation, from which he had been away nearly three years. On his return to the Bureau he became Assistant to the Chief Inspector, and on Oct. 25, 1894, he was made Chief Inspector. Chief Watts is not only methodical in his work, and an efficient manager, but, as before stated, is thoroughly conversant with the detective business. He occasionally has been called to follow criminals himself. In 1899 he pursued the Italian murderer, Antonio di Blasi, to Italy, and although under the laws of that country he was not permitted to bring him back for trial, he placed the evidence there in such proper shape that the criminal was tried and convicted in the Italian courts, and punished by his own countrymen by being sent to prison on the Island of Sicily. Probably no member of the Police Department of the city has become more of a terror to evil-doers than has the Chief Inspector. His father, Wm. M. Watts, was a member of the Boston Police Department from Sept. 16, 1860, to April 11, 1891. He died Aug. 12, 1893.

CAPTAIN JOSEPH DUGAN was born in Boston, Mass., April 3, 1845. He was appointed on the Police Force April 27, 1868, and assigned to Division 1. Transferred to Bureau of Criminal Investigation Dec. 25, 1884; promoted to Inspector Aug. 23, 1888; promoted to Captain of the Bureau of Criminal Investigation Dec. 24, 1895. During his thirty-one years' service on the Force, Capt. Dugan's work has always been the best, especially in cases where a thorough knowledge of the law is necessary to a successful outcome in the courts. When seventeen years of age he enlisted in the 42d Mass. Regt.; leaving that regiment after a year's service, he re-enlisted in the U. S. Signal Corps. He was in the fight at Mobile Bay, and went there with Farragut as signal officer, and distinguished himself by his bravery on many occasions. Is a member of the G. A. R., Knights of Columbus, St. Vincent de Paul Society, and the Police Relief Association.

WALTER A. ABBOTT was born in Rumford, Me., Oct. 4, 1853, receiving his education in the public schools. Appointed a Patrolman June 15, 1882, and assigned to Division 3; promoted to Inspector and transferred to Headquarters May 25, 1895. Member of the Police Relief Association.

JOHN R. MCGARR was born in Cambridge, Mass., April 18, 1861, and was educated in the public schools. 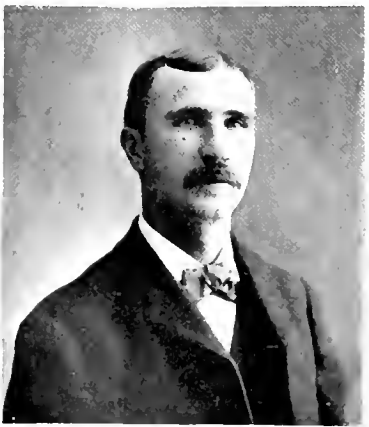

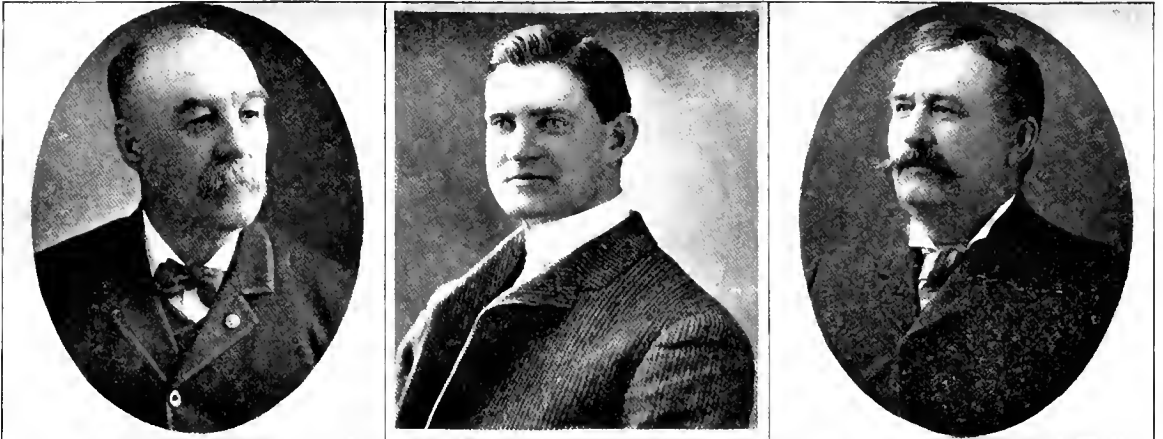

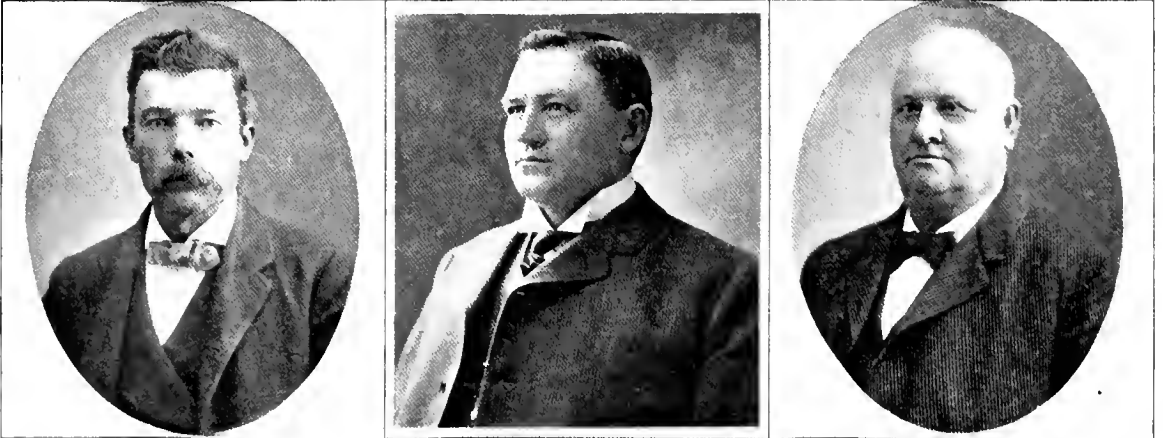

Such a record as Captain Hoffman's is rarely known, having been promoted from Patrolman to Captain within a period of seven years.

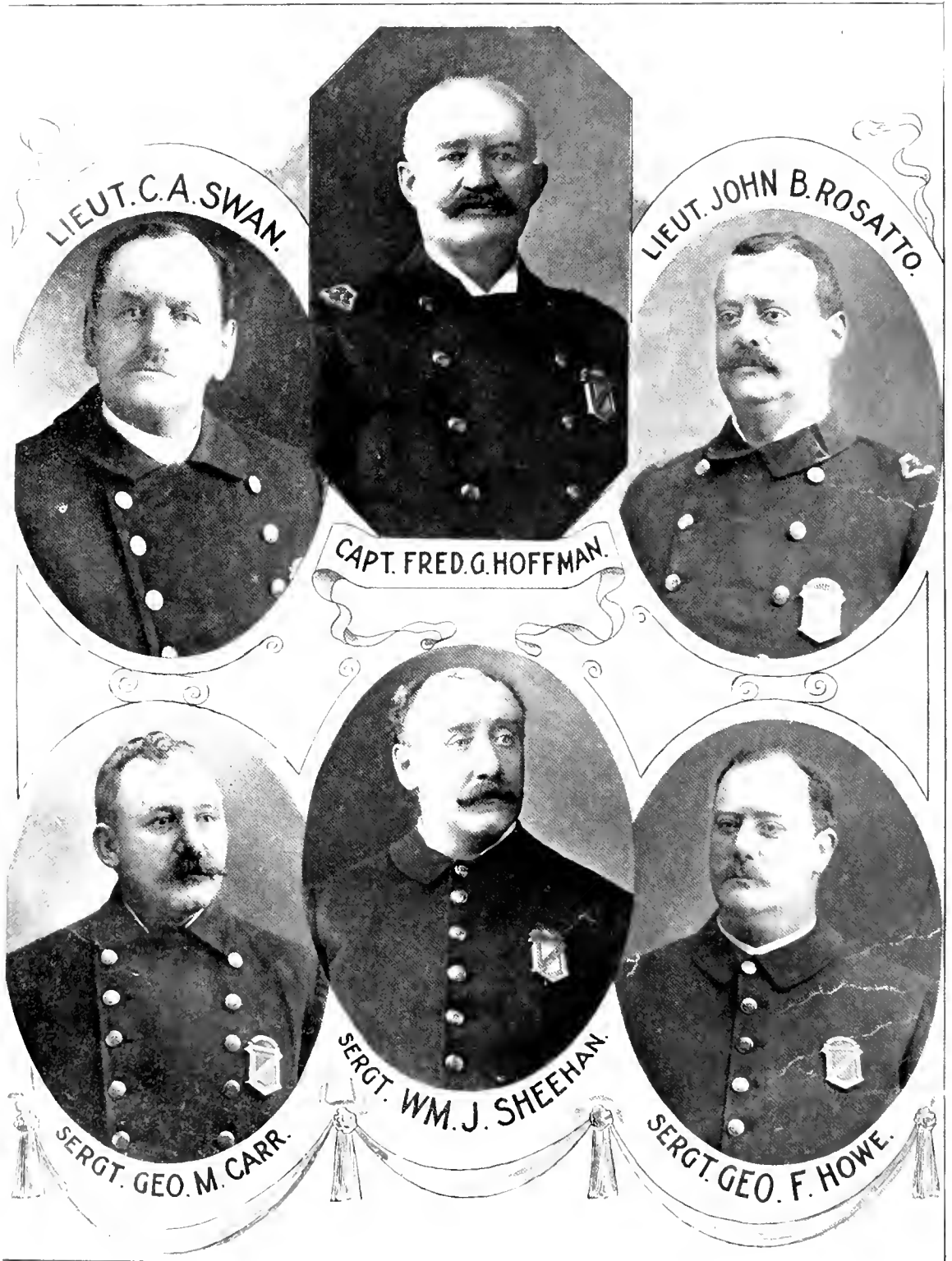

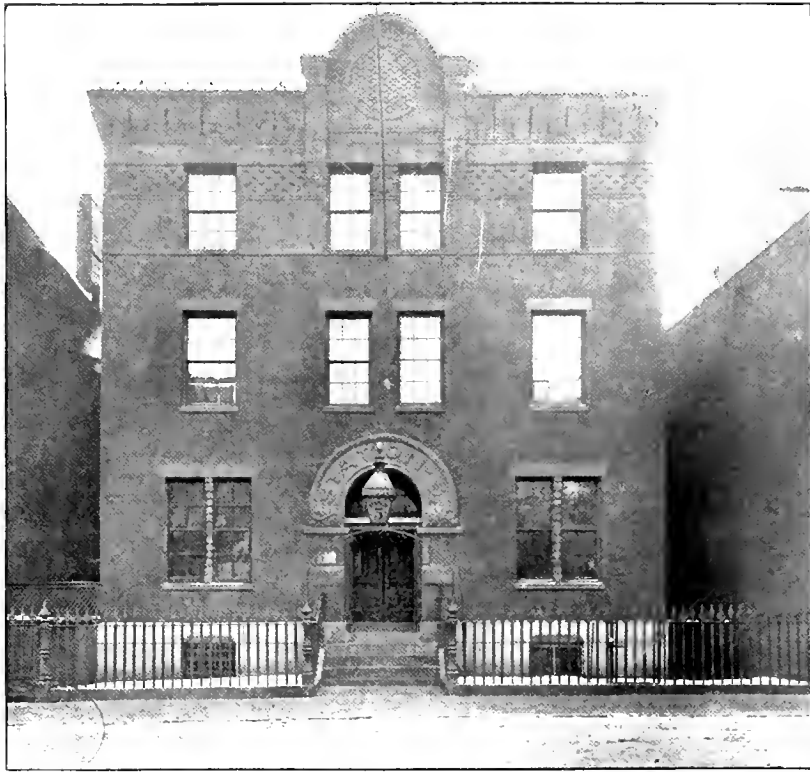

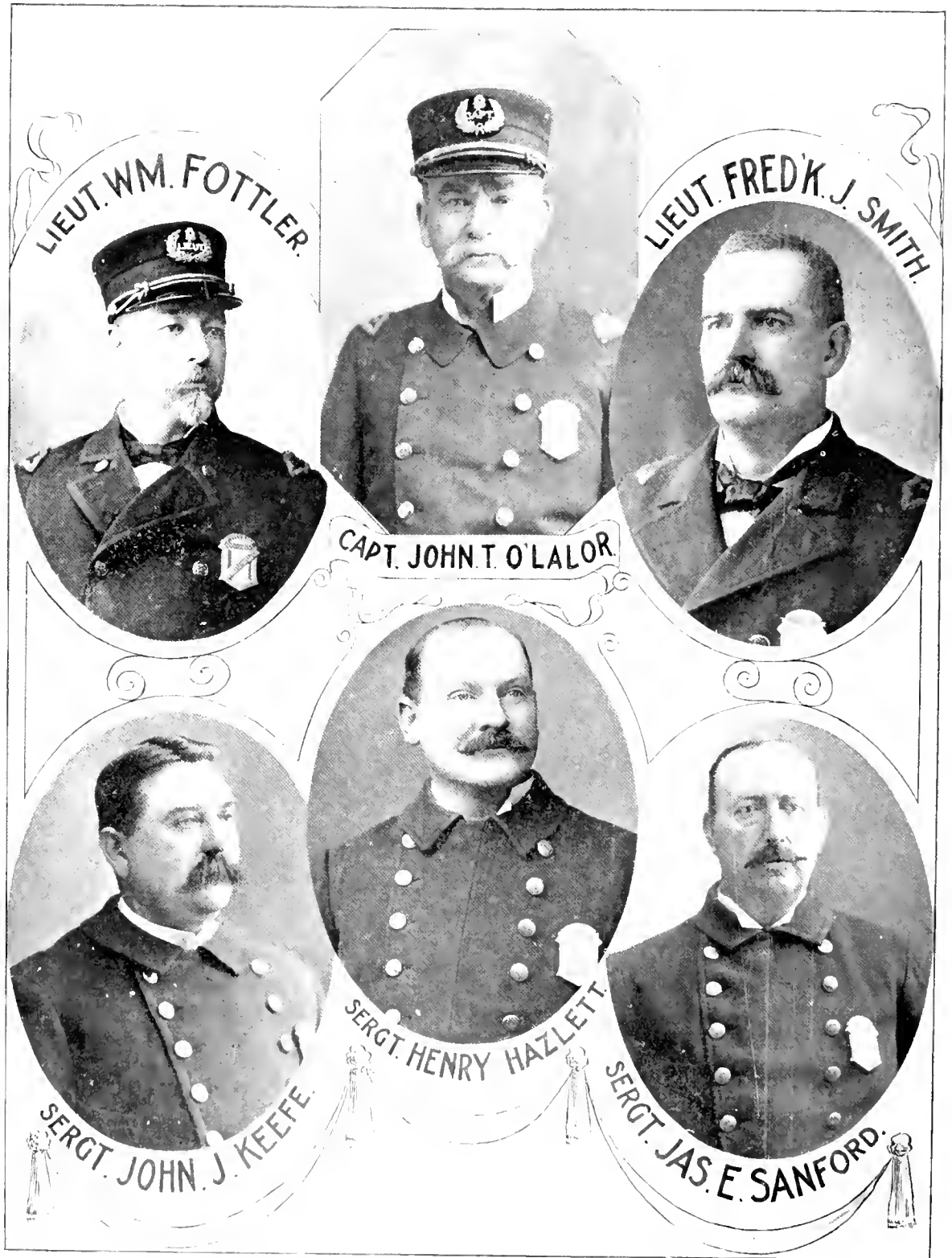

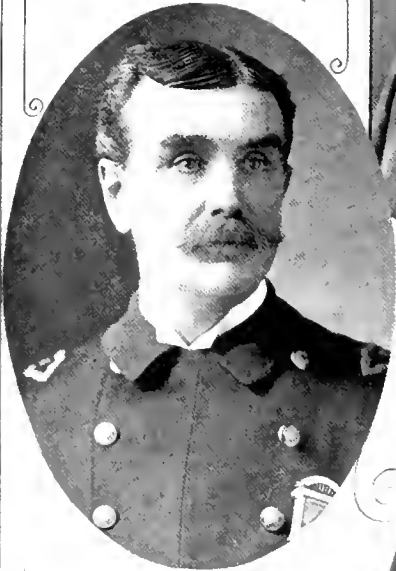

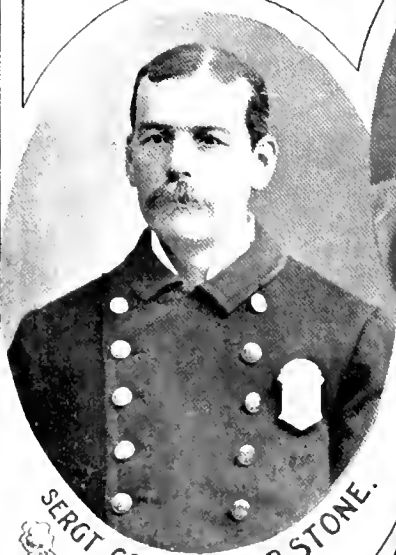

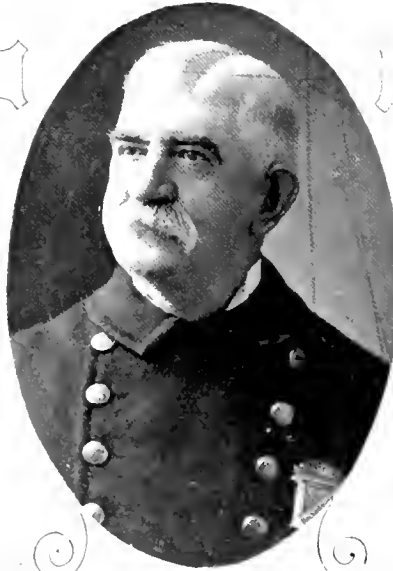

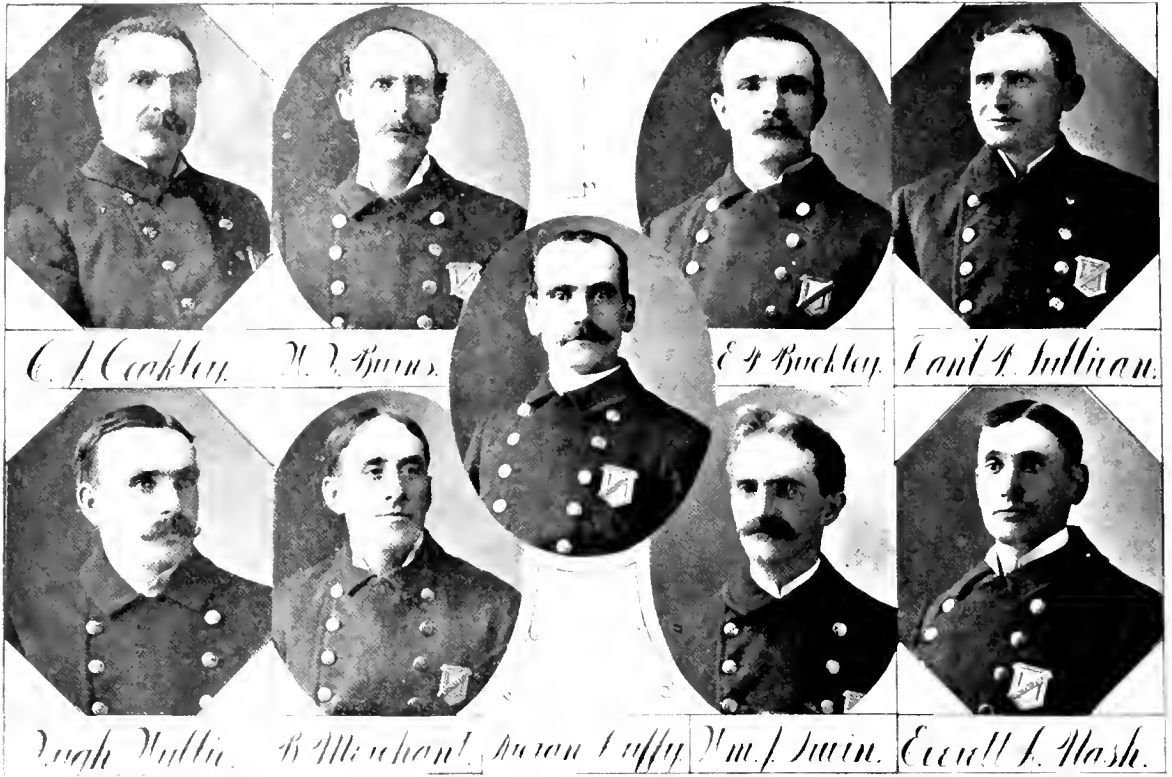

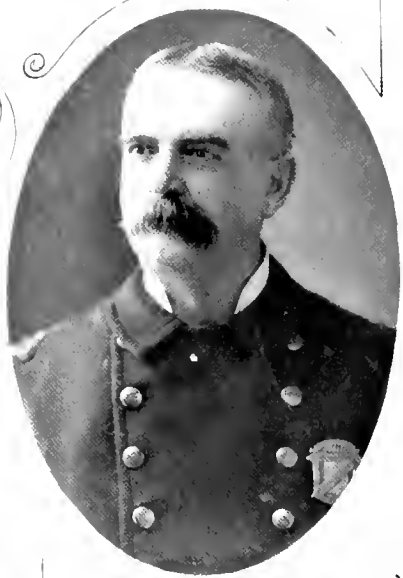

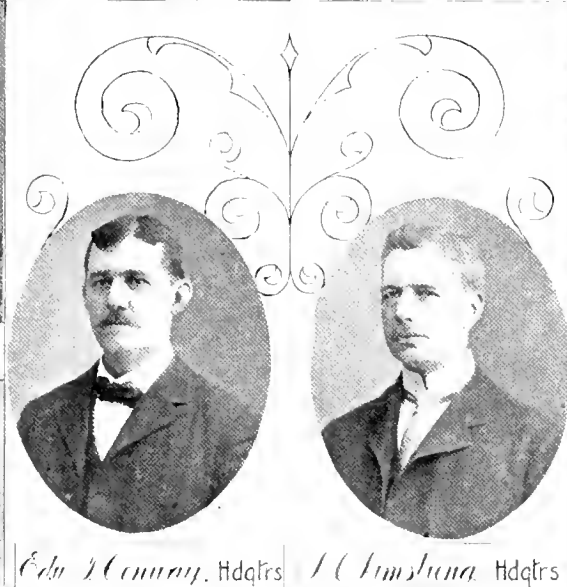

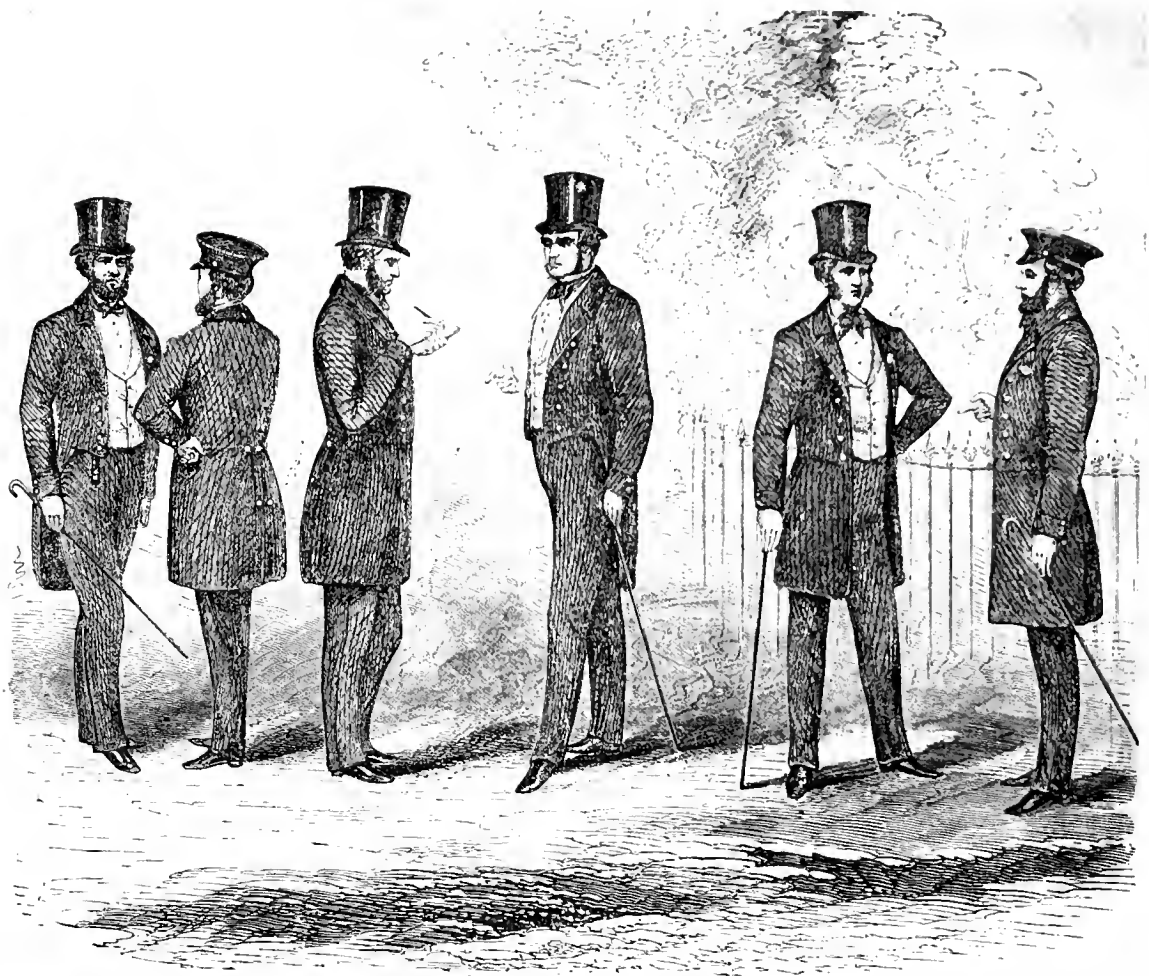

NEW UNIFORM OF THE BOSTON POLICE. 1858.

The above picture, taken from a publication of 1858, shows the difference between the uniforms of that day and this. The article accompanying the original of the above says: "There has been so much disputation in regard to uniforming the Boston Police, that we have been to some pains and expense to get up an engraving illustrating the result of the Board of Aldermen's action in the matter. The accompanying correct picture will show better than all the newspaper talk that has been spent on it, whether the police of Boston have any reason to be ashamed of the uniforms which have just come into use. If any of the members of that highly respectable body are too proud or too shy to like to be known as policemen, the sooner they resign the better. The dress will always be regarded as being quite as respectable as that of the army or navy, so long as the reputation of the corps who wear it is in good odor with the people." The article then describes the uniforms, as follows: Chief, blue dress coat, black pants, buff merino vest, black hat with gold star in rosette on the hat. Deputy Chief, blue frock coat, blue or black pants, and light buff vest, black hat with gold star or enameled leather on hat. Captains, blue dress coat, buff marseilles vest, black pants, black silk hat. Lieutenants and Patrolmen, double-breasted dark blue frock coat, dark blue pants, black silk or satin vests in spring or autumn, black cloth vests, single breasted, in winter. Officers for public occasions wear buff marseilles vests with police buttons. Summer dress, black mixed thin cloth frock coats, marseilles vests, light mixed cloth pants, light seasonable hat. Minor details from the above are more interesting than important.
