### THE SEASON

On Homecoming Day the Bobcats battled their ancient rivals, Mars Hill, to a 6-6 tie before a large crowd of visitors and the student body. Weddington scored for Lees-McRae in the first period.


Lees-McRae next downed the invading Wingate team 6-0, when Caton, tackle, blocked a punt and dashed over for L. M. C.'s score.

Campbell College and Lees-McRae clashed for the first time in three years on November 5. Campbell scored their lone touchdown in the last five minutes, making the final count 6-0 in their favor. A powerful Davidson "B" team defeated the Bobcats 32-0 at Davidson on Armistice Day. The season ended with a heart-breaking defeat, when the Bobcats were beaten 19-0 by Brevard—an exact reversal of the score the previous year.

Such players as Weddington, John Stevens, Captain Miller, Chilton Deans, Clyde Brooks, and Paul Thompson will be sorely missed next year. Most of the responsibility will fall on the shoulders of Ferebee, Caton, Barber, Legard, Davis, and Callahan. Eight games have been scheduled already for the coming year.
