The mountains have always stood for freedom. The line of distant hills has been a perpetual challenge to the adventurer, and a haven to the lovers of liberty. In the early days of our country the Pioneer found in the mountains a refuge from the unjust laws of tyranny. Here amid kindred ruggedness and strength he made his home in the freedom of the hills. While civilization flourished in the lowlands he wrestled with long winters and uncultivated lands. Soon he forgot the outside world. As the years passed the growing towns in the plains were unmindful of him, and the mountains that gave him individual freedom became a wall that shut him and his children in a world of their own. Free from man's tyranny, he became a bondsman of nature, and in the struggle to live he lost many of the privileges of his former life.



In the summer of 1896 a young Presbyterian ministerial student was sent to do summer work in the valley shadowed by the mighty Grandfather and Beech. Here in this land of independence he found bondage of spirit and mind. The summer's work became an inspiration for his life, and he returned to his studies in the fall with a dream of freedom for those who had penetrated these hills for freedom's sake.

After his graduation from the seminary, Reverend Edgar Tufts came back to the mountains. He built a small church which became a spiritual beacon to the mountain country. He made friends with old and young, especially the young. He found they were eager for knowledge, and he gathered a group around his fireside to study and learn.

Through the years there followed a school, a hospital, a home for children—freeing minds, bodies and lives.
