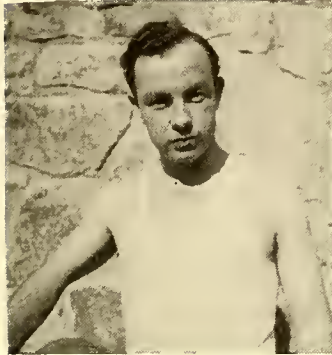
INTRAMURAL SPORTS

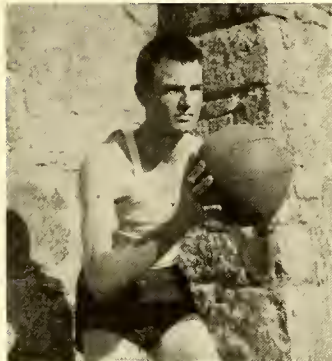
Through the planning and leadership of Coach John C. Mackorell, the boys had a very successful season. Football occupied the first half of the year and basketball was the main sport of the second semester.

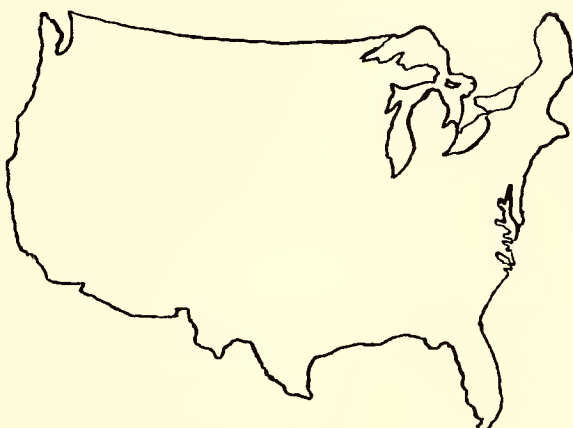
