LEES-MCRAES 1946 FOOTBALL SEASON

For the first time since 1939 Lees-McRae participated in intercollegiate football. The number of games won and lost is not a true index to the kind of ball the Bobcats played, for every game found them playing hard, with good spirit, and in the same clean, sportsmanlike way for which all Lees-McRae teams are known.

To Coach Fred Dickerson, who returned from the Navy last June to take up coaching again, we pay tribute for the fine coaching job that he has done and for the good spirit with which his teams have been characterized.

September 28, in the initial tilt of the season, the Bobcats and Gardner-Webb Bulldogs wound up in a 0-0 hard-fought battle. The highlight of the game was a 32-yard sprint by John E. Williams, who almost got off to a touchdown. For the first game of the season, without necessary scrimmage and with inexperienced and light men, the Bobcats showed a good defense and a shifty offense. It was a satisfactory try-out of the new athletic field, which was being used for the first time.

October 4, the Bobcats traveled to Davidson for a game with the "Wildkittens". The Kittens were just too strong for the Bobcats, as they pushed our gallant boys all over the field. Bill Campbell and John Williams were the individual stars of the game, which ended 32-0.

October 12, in a steady downpour of rain, the Brevard squad squeezed out a 6-0 victory over the Bobcats before a large Homecoming Day crowd. The Brevard eleven scored early in the second period, but Lees-McRae stopped their attempt at conversion. Lees-McRae lost their chance to score in the second period on a recovered fumble on Brevard's 21 yard line. Line play highlighted the remainder of the game, with both teams showing an excellent defense.

October 18, the Bobcats lost a well-played battle to Presbyterian Junior College 7-13 at Bennetts-ville, S. C. Clark Gardner got the Bobcats first score on a 54-yard spring through PJC. The try for extra point was good on Campbell's plunge. PJC came back to score on an 88-yard run on return of the kick-off. The Bobcats led 7-6 at the half. In the second half Baker broke loose for a 42-yard run, to score, and the attempt at conversion was good. The Bobcats threatened in the last minutes by driving to the two-yard, but lost the ball on downs.

October 26, the Bobcats lost another hard-fought game to Campbell Junior College. Harold Hailey and Clark Gardner were the star players for Lees-McRae. The score at the end of the first half was Campbell 26, Lees-McRae 0. The final score was 32-0 in favor of Campbell.


November 2, in a slow rain, LMC was defeated by a more experienced Belmont Abbey team by a score of 6-12. After a scoreless first half, Abbey scored. LMC, with Allen leading the way, drove 69 yards for a touchdown. However, the Bobcats could not hold the heavier Abbey line and the Catholic boys came back to score and put the game on ice. Allen and Gardner led the backfield play, while Eller and Page were superior in the line for Lees-McRae.

November 9, Lees-McRae met Mars Hill on our home field. Before the spectators could sit down, Mars Hill had scored and converted, on a beautiful 65-yard run. The Bobcats drove to Mars Hill's two-yard line, but Mars Hill held, and the Bobcats lost possession of the ball. In the second quarter, Sluder intercepted Lees-McRae's pass deep in his own territory and ran for another score, and the conversion was good. The second period was played on equal terms, with both teams having scoring opportunities, but the superb line play of each team held when the chips were down. The score ended, Lees-McRae 0, Mars Hill 14.

November 16, in the final contest of the season, the Bobcats and Blue Ridge School for Boys, played on even terms until a break in the final minutes decided the issue in favor of the visitors from Blue Ridge. The first half was scoreless. The third quarter proved the greatness of the lines. In the fourth period, Blue Ridge drove 60 yards to score first. The conversion was good. The Bobcats came back to score on a beautiful pass from Gardner to Eastridge. Campbell made a downfield block which enabled Eastridge to run the distance. The point after the touchdown was good. Blue Ridge, however, came back with a touchdown pass which sewed the game up, and again the conversion for Blue Ridge was good. Final score, Bobcats 7, Blue Ridge 14.

Our captains for the games were as follows: Gardner—Webb, Allen; Davidson—Campbell; Brevard — Pettigrew: Campbell — Eastridge; PJC — Hailey; Belmont Abbey — Gardner; Mars Hill — Clark; and Blue Ridge—Pettigrew and Campbell.

Again we congratulate our boys on their fine spirit of cooperation, their splendid blocking, their sportsmanship on the field, and their good fellowship with each other. Although the score was against them, the Bobcat team of 1946 was one to be proud of, and we are expecting great things from the men who will return next year.





