Lees=McRae 1947 Football Season

The smoll and very light Lees-McRae Bobcots had a fighting spirit which carried them through a nine game schedule with one win, two ties, and six losses. Despite the season record, the Bobcats had a hard driving, fast, and shifty football squad and always displayed a will to win despite the heavy adds. The Bobcots were a well drilled team under the copable leadership of Fred I. Dickerson. Cooch Dickerson took an inexperienced and light squad with only two returning lettermen and molded them into an efficient and experienced squad. This was proven in the latter part of the season when Lees-McRoe blanked its arch rivol, the Mors Hill Lions, by a score of 13-0.

September 20, in the initial tilt of the season, the Bobcats ond the Brevord Tornodoes fought to o hord-ployed, scoreless deadlock. The fast charging offense of the Tornodoes was stopped cold near our gool several times by the excellent defense, the outstanding kicking of Bill Eastridge marked the Lees-McRoe opening test.

September 27, the Bobcats traveled to Gardner-Webb for a gome with the "Bulldogs." Our boys lost o 7-0 heart-breoker on a wind swept field. The Bulldogs scored on a 50 yard runbock of o kick. The Bobcots, thinking the Bulldogs sofety man had stepped out of lines, made no attempt to tackle him; however, the officials ruled otherwise. Two scoring thrusts by LMC were stopped deep in Bulldog territory on the 9 and 12 yard lines respectively, by pass interceptions. Good defensive play featured the closely fought game.

October 4, the Asheville-Biltmore Bulldogs defeoted the Bobcots in Memorial Stadium by a score of 12-6. It was a hard fought bottle with two pass interference penalties, against the Bobcats, setting up the two Bulldog TD's. The game was featured by clean sportsmanship on both sides. Covington scored only Bobcot touchdown on a five yard drive.

October 11, Lees-McRoe ployed host to the Belmont Abbey Crusoders on Lees-McRoe field, in the onnual homecoming game. The game featured beautiful defensive playing, but our Bobcots rocked-up one first down to the Belmont squads four. The Bobcots could not get their offense started and were on the defensive during most of the game. Rosie Melton broke through the Crusader's line to tackle a Belmont bock behind his goal for a safety. A bod pass from center set up the first Abbey score when Bill Eostridge elected to run with the ball and was thrown for a loss. Minutes later, Abbey scored and the conversion was goad. A pass play set up the second score as Braun of Abbey took the ball some seventy-seven yards for the second touchdown. Melton, Brand, Eostridge, Akers, Ozment, and Church played outstanding ball for the day. Due credit should also be given to all those who participated in this hord fought game.

October 17, the Bobcats journeyed to Dovidson to clash with the Davidson "B" squad. The Bobcats began in the game as the underdogs ogainst the Wildcots who boasted a teom weighing 170 pounds in the line and backfield. Luck was with the LMC squad during the first half and fumbles were made constantly, yet the Bobcats were able to play in Dovidson territory most of the first half. With only a few minutes left to play in the first half, Lackhard, of the Dovidson team drove through center for the only score of the first half.

During the second half, the Wildcots switched to an oerial attack for two more TD's. The final score: Davidson 18—Lees-McRoe 0. Bill Eastridge, Don Roberts and Sotch Lyle ployed o swell game in the line with Ozment and Covington spork-plugging in the back field.

October 25, the Bobcats ployed host to the Compbell "Camels", one of the strongest Junior College eleven's in conference. The Camels got off to a fost stort in the first half ond scored 19 points before the half ended. However, the Bobcats came back strong and played inspired ball to remain on even terms with the Camels for the remainder of the gome. The Bobcats got underway in the second half and drove deep into Compbell territory on Ozment's posses, but were halted by a pass interception.

November 1, on a windy, rain-soaked gridiron, the highly fovored Bobcats were held to a scoreless tie by o hord fighting, underdog, the Blue Ridge Hilltopper eleven, at Hendersonville. It was in this tilt that the Bobcats sprang their hidden ball ploy on which right guard Lyle ran 43 yards before being stopped short of o touchdown.

November 8, P. J. C. of Maxton, N. C., won one of the toughest football games of their season, from the Bobcots. The Bobcats would not be denied their obility to stand their ground on the water-

soaked field of LMC. It was not until the last four minutes of the gome that the situation was altered. At that point, McPherson, not knowing he was an his own goal line, attempted to return a punt from the end zane but was trapped. This break for P. J. C. was the first and only one during the hard fought game. Throughout the earlier part of the game, both sides gave a brilliant show of defense. McPherson lugged the pigskin in true die-hard spirit while Satch Lyle, Don Roberts, Bill Eastridge, Rosie Meltan diverted many threatening attempts into harmless channels to stop P. J. C. cold.



Bill Eastridge and Fred Lyle gained canference recagnition by being nomed on the first All-Canference team.






