The Edgar Tufts Memorial Association is the incorporation at Banner Elk. The Board of Trustees of the Association is made up of seven men from Concord Presbytery, seven men from Holston Presbytery, and these fourteen elect seven at large. The Association operates Lees-McRae College, Grandfather Home, and Grace Hospital.

Lees-McRae occupies a 1200-acre campus and takes 300 students each year. Grace Hospital, a 90-bed hospital, serves a purely rural community of better than 15,000 people. Grandfather Home houses 93 children from Holston Presbytery.

The Association was formed in 1923 as a memorial to the Rev. Edgar Tufts, founder of the church's ministries at Banner Elk.


THIRD GAME — LEES-McRAE - MARS HILL
