## SUGGESTIONS FOR A MODEL ORCHARD

The best plan for planting an acre $210 \times 210$ in a Home Orchard for this section is as follows:

12 Paper Shell Pecan $60 \times 60$ Feet
33 Early to Late Peach $20 \times 20$ Feet
10 Early to Late Pear $60 \times 60$ Feet
22 Early to Late Plum $20 \times 20$ Feet
22 Early to Late Plum-Cherry $20 \times 20$ Feet
6 Fig $20 \times 20$
12 Grape Vines. Assorted $20 \times 20$
50 Blackberries, Assorted 3 feet in row
50 Dewberries, Assorted 3 feet in row
This can be used as a unit and doubled as many times as required. Apples are not as successful as other fruits, but farmers living near the River and other favorable portions of this State can grow apples successfully. The same may be said of strawberries.

The above proposed planting is furnished by The John S. Kerr Nursery Company of Sherman. Texas. We will be glad to furnish the farmers with detailed information as to preparation of the soil, selection of orchard site, best varieties to plant and proper pruning and planting methods.

Our 55 years experience shows that most of the successful farmers have a good orchard and garden.

Draw plan on scale of 40 feet to one inch. Start with pecan tree on row one and continue to plant as follows:

Row 1. First pecan, 2nd and 3rd peach, 4th pecan, 5 and 6 peach, 7 pecan, 8 and 9 peach, 10 pecan, 11 peach ( 4 pecan, 7 peach).
Row 2. All peach $20 \times 20$. ( 11 trees).
Row 3. 1 and 2 peach, 3 pear, 4 and 5 peach, 6 pear, 7 and 8 peach, 9 pear, 10 and 11 peach. (3 pear, 8 peach).
Row 4. Same as row 1.
Row 5. All plum $20 \times 20$. ( 11 trees).
Row 6.1 and 2 plum, 3 pear, 4 and 5 plum, 6 pear, 7 and 8 plum, 9 pear, 10 and 11 plum. ( 3 pear and 8 plum).
Row 7. 1 pecan, 2 and 3 plum, 4 pecan, 5 plum, 6 plum-cherry, 7 pecan, 8 and 9 plum-cherry, 10 pecan, 11 plum-cherry ( 4 pecan, 3 plum, 4 plumcherry).
Row 8. All plum-cherry. ( 11 trees).
Row 9. 1 and 2 plum-cherry, 3 pear, 4 and 5 plumcherry, 6 pear, 7 and 8 plum-cherry, 9 pear, 10 plum-cherry, 11 grape. (7 plum-cherry, 3 pear, 1 grape).
Row 10. 1 pecan, 2 and 3 fig, 4 pecan, 5 and 6 fig, 7 pecan, 8 and 9 fig, 10 pecan, 11 grape. ( 4 pecan, 6 fig, 1 grape).
Row 11. 1 to 5 grape, 6 pear, 7 to 11 grape. ( 10 grape, 1 pear).

Blackberries and dewberries in middle of rows 10 and 11 between fig and grape plants.

## SUGGESTIONS FOR A MODEL ORCHARD

The best plan for planting an acre $210 \times 210$ in a Home Orchard for this section is as follows:

12 Paper Shell Pecan \(60 \times 60\) Feet
33 Early to Late Peach \(20 \times 20\) Feet
10 Early to Late Pear \(60 \times 60\) Feet
22 Early to Late Plum \(20 \times 20\) Feet
22 Early to Late Plum-Cherry \(20 \times 20\) Feet
6 Fig \(20 \times 20\)
12 Grape Vines, Assorted \(20 \times 20\)
50 Blackberries, Assorted 3 feet in row
50 Dewberries, Assorted 3 feet in row
```

This can be used as a unit and doubled as many times as required. Apples are not as successful as other fruits, but farmers living near the River and other favorable portions of this State can grow apples successfully. The same may be said of strawberries.

Draw plan on scale of 40 feet to one inch. Start with pecan tree on row one and continue to plant as follows:

Row 1. First pecan, 2nd and 3rd peach, 4th pecan, 5 and 6 peach, 7 pecan, 8 and 9 peach, 10 pecan, 11 peach ( 4 pecan, 7 peach).
Row 2. All peach $20 \times 20$. ( 11 trees).
Row 3. 1 and 2 peach, 3 pear, 4 and 5 peach, 6 pear, 7 and 8 peach, 9 pear, 10 and 11 peach. (3 pear, 8 peach).
Row 4. Same as row 1.
Row 5. All plum $20 \times 20$. ( 11 trees).
Row 6. 1 and 2 plum, 3 pear, 4 and 5 plum, 6 pear, 7 and 8 plum, 9 pear, 10 and 11 plum. ( 3 pear and 8 plum).
Row 7.1 pecan, 2 and 3 plum, 4 pecan, 5 plum. 6 plum-cherry, 7 pecan, 8 and 9 plum-cherry, 10 pecan, 11 plum-cherry ( 4 pecan, 3 plum, 4 plumcherry).
Row 8. All plum-cherry. ( 11 trees).
Row 9.1 and 2 plum-cherry, 3 pear, 4 and 5 plumcherry, 6 pear, 7 and 8 plum-cherry, 9 pear, 10 plum-cherry, 11 grape. ( 7 plum-cherry, 3 pear, 1 grape).
Row 10. 1 pecan, 2 and 3 fig, 4 pecan, 5 and 6 fig, 7 pecan, 8 and 9 fig, 10 pecan, 11 grape. ( 4 pecan, 6 fig, 1 grape).
Row 11. 1 to 5 grape, 6 pear, 7 to 11 grape. ( 10 grape, 1 pear).
Blackberries and dewberries in middle of rows 10 and 11 between fig and grape plants.
