

ENGLISH



Because Mathematics has such an important role in today's world, every effort is being made at Rosman to arrange the courses offered in this department to meet, as nearly as possible the learning needs of the students.

Mathematics is at the center of the exciting developments in science and the teachers in this department, MRS. COMNENA REID and MISS MARGARET BYRD strive to create and maintain, in each student, an interest in mathematics, in order that he will be prepared to take his place in the world of the future.

Miss Margaret Byrd, a new addition to our school this year, teaches General Mathematics and Business Arithmetic.



SOCIAL STUDIES

The social studies include Civics, World History, American History, Geography, Economics, and Sociology. This covers the study of government, and world problems of the past and present.

MRS. THELMA BRYSON AND RAY SIMPSON, teachers in this department, strive to instill in the students an understanding of the physical and political world in which they live. They also help to make the student aware of his responsibilities and privileges as a citizen of his school, community, state, and nation. Making each student realize his responsibility in maintaining world peace through the United Nations is one of the main objectives of the department.

HOME ECONOMICS

A three-year course in home-economics is offered in Rosman High School. This course benefits the high school girl because it includes these seven divisions: Child Development, Clothing, Family Economics,

Family Relations, Foods, Health, and Housing. The girls learn the tricks of the trade from Mrs. Dorothy Vaniman, home-economics teacher and FTA sponsor.

AGRICULTURE

A four year course in Vocational Agriculture is offered in our high school. The course is primarily designed to give farm boys experience in the various fields of agriculture such as crop production, beef cattle, swine and dairy production as well as farm and home improvement and self sufficient agriculture.

BUSINESS



DWIGHT D. HOWELL, as head of the business department tries to give his students a well-rounded background in business courses. In the typing classes speed and accuracy are stressed, along with instruction on personal typing. Office Practice class offers advanced instruction in

typing, filing, and business correspondence, as well as work on the mimeograph machine, electric adding machine and electric typewriter. Each student is required to do a certain amount of actual office work.

First year bookkeeping is set up to introduce bookkeeping and accounting to the students who might further their education in the business field, and it is also designed to train the student to keep the records of a small or medium sized business establishment. Students are taught how to keep family records on income, budgeting, and income taxes.

SECRETARY


