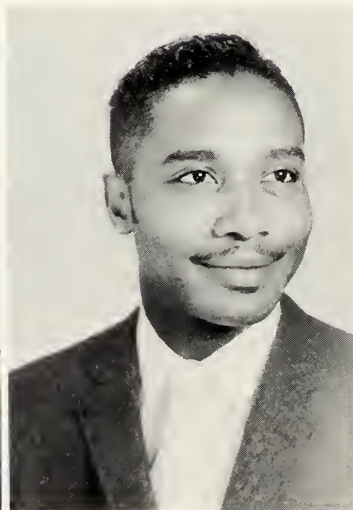

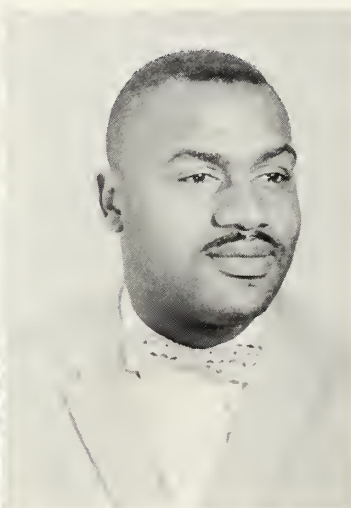

## TIME

I have seen eleven senior classes march to the rostrum at graduation with bright eyes and eager minds, to go to various colleges to spread good tidings; I have seen others with only one thing on their minds-time for a diploma-time to exit from the campus; I have seen others with tears in their eyes for the intellectual, recreational, and spiritual acumen they had received from their teachers and founder. What will I see when you march through "the sacred Halls of Palmer?"

Have you heard the slogan "The flight of time is urged on by the spur of the moment"?

But for those who love, Time is Eternity.

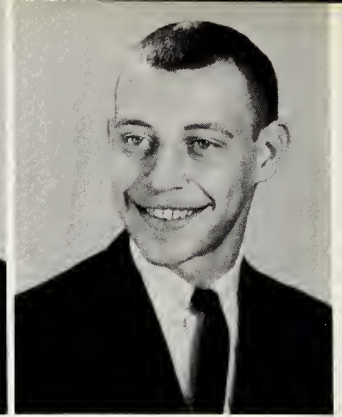
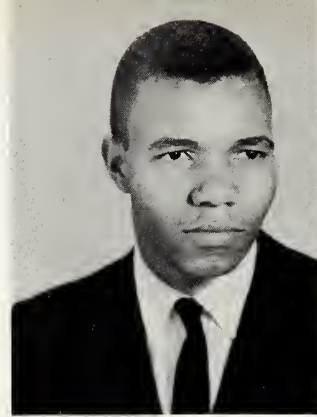

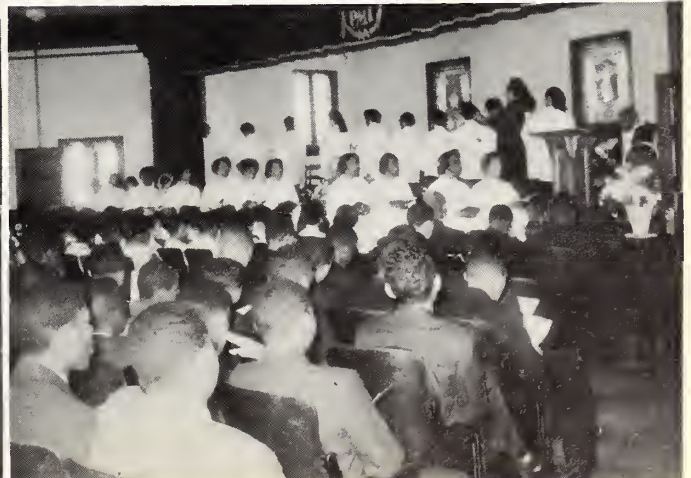
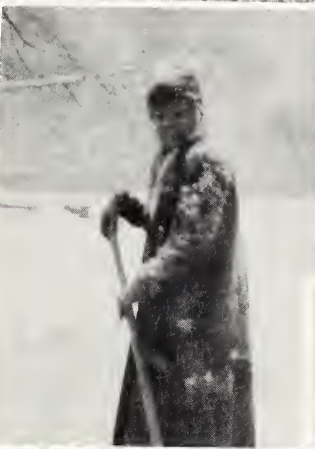


## MESSAGE OF APPRECIATION

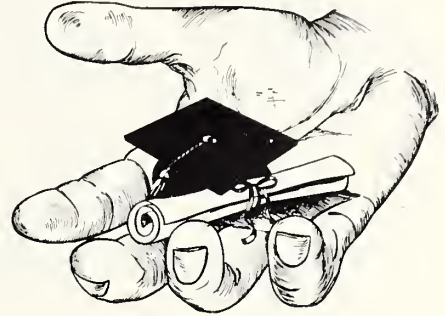
