Everyone seemed to enjoy the gala occasion so we felt that it was a success. Jeanette Orrell, Martha Kate Husser, Jimmy Jones, and Brack Bailey served as Junior Marshalls. The year ended with much excitement and thoughts of the coming Senior year.

Fall, 1955, found us once more Mrs. J.D.Parker, Jr. in school. with Brack Bailey, Martha Kate Husser, Nancy Grey Hartman, and Cleo Carter were class leaders. Our first great event of the year was the Halloween Court. We elected Shirley Potts, queen, John Foster, king, and Dorothy Byerly, attendant. We worked very determinedly and for the first time in our four years of high school our queen and king were crowned. We have found putting out the school paper and publishing the annual hard work. Wilma Lou Riley made the basketball team. At this point we are looking forward to our Senior play and Senior trip. We never knew we could work so hard and have so much fun in the process. As our school days draw near to an end we stop to think, and remember with a touch of sorrow how wonderful they have been. Then we turn with hopeful hearts toward the future.
