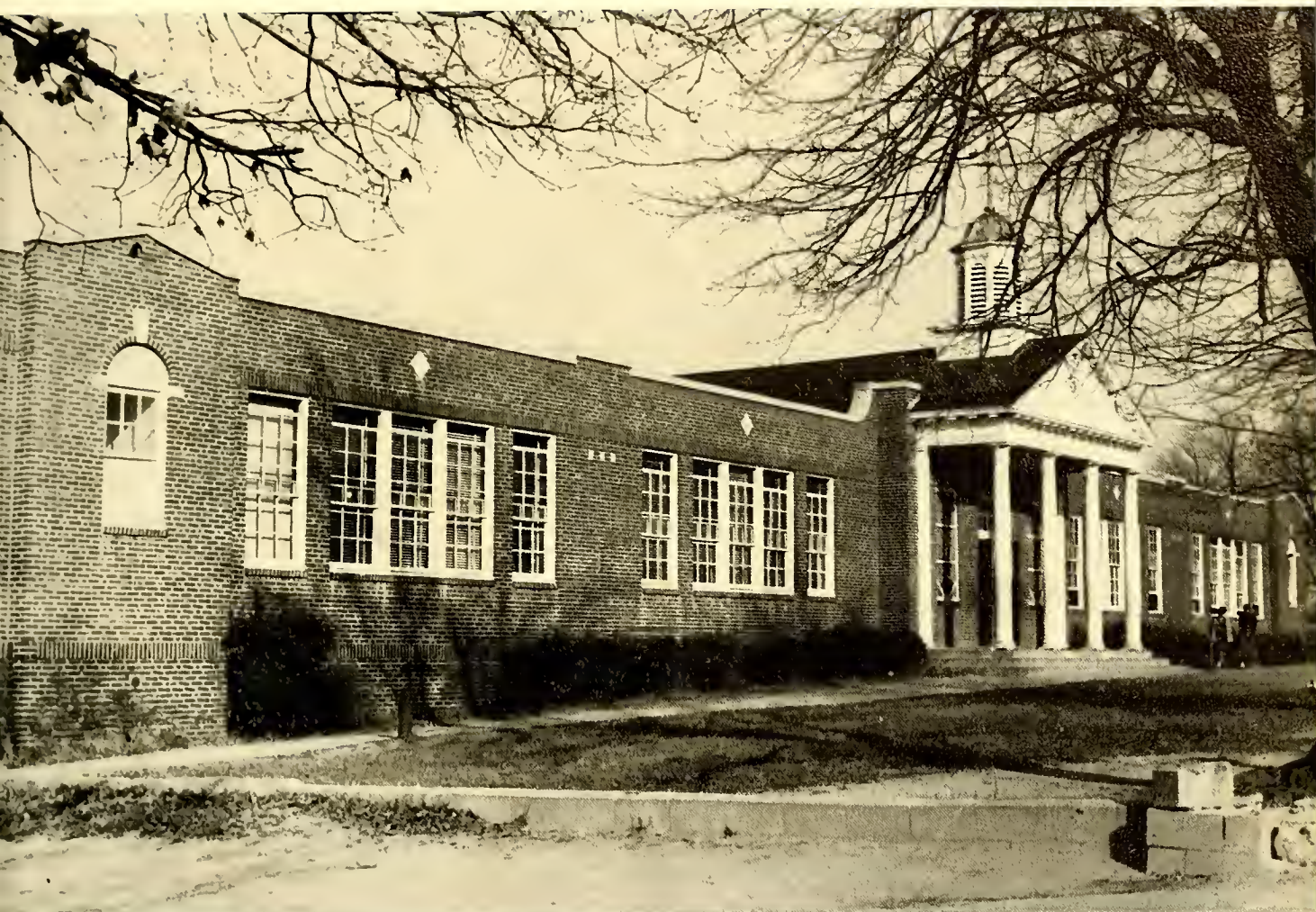

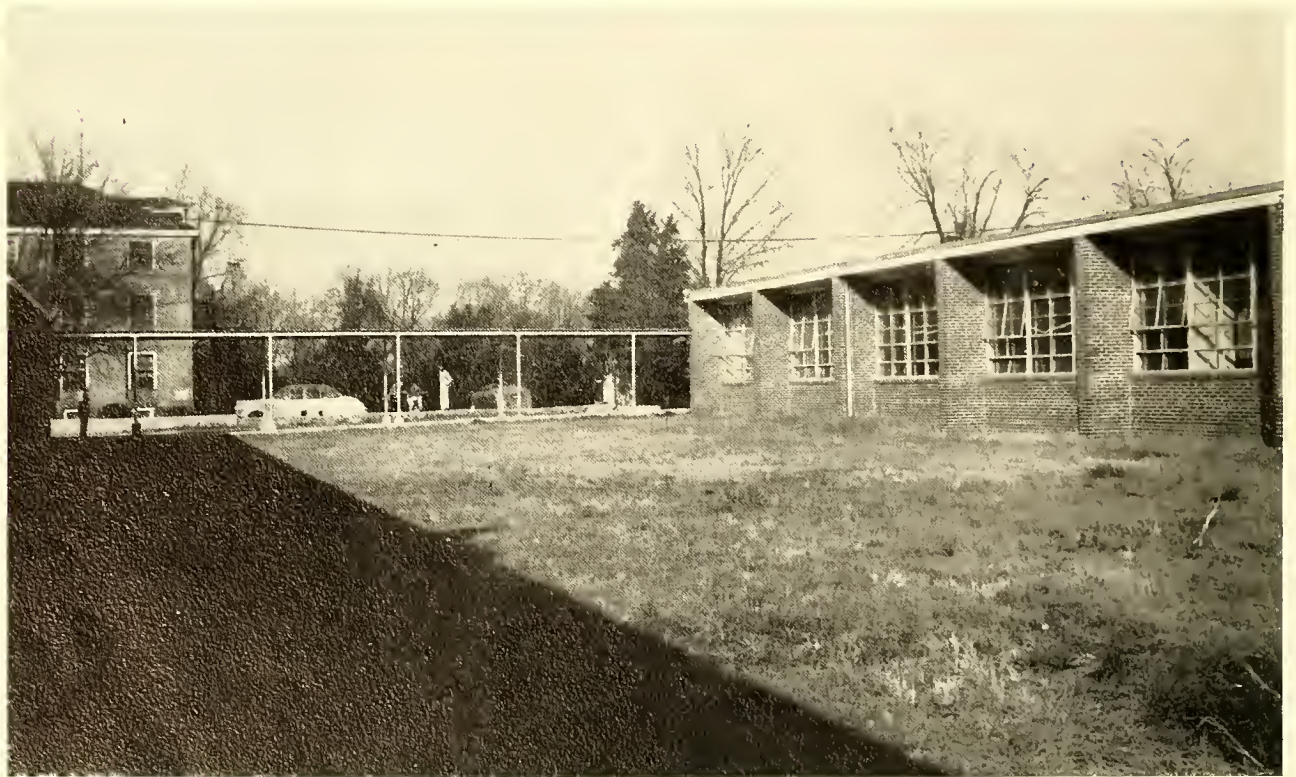
We must say that these four years have not been our best ones, but they certainly have been happy ones.

I, Vivian Vaughan, a Superintendent of Nurses at Bellevue Hospital in New York City, am happily married and residing here with my husband.

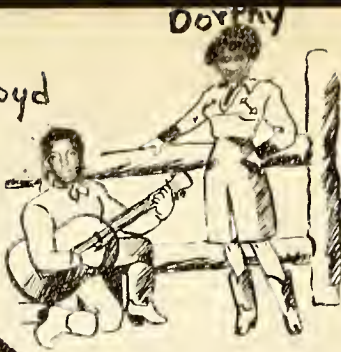

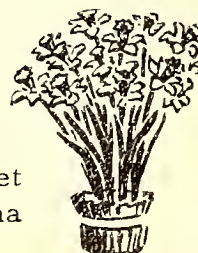
