This department administers to the general needs of a rural-urban society and to the special needs of those who desire and benefit from instruction in agriculture, and home economics.

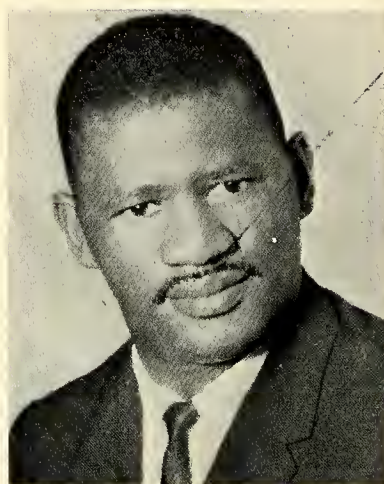

## *Baseball*

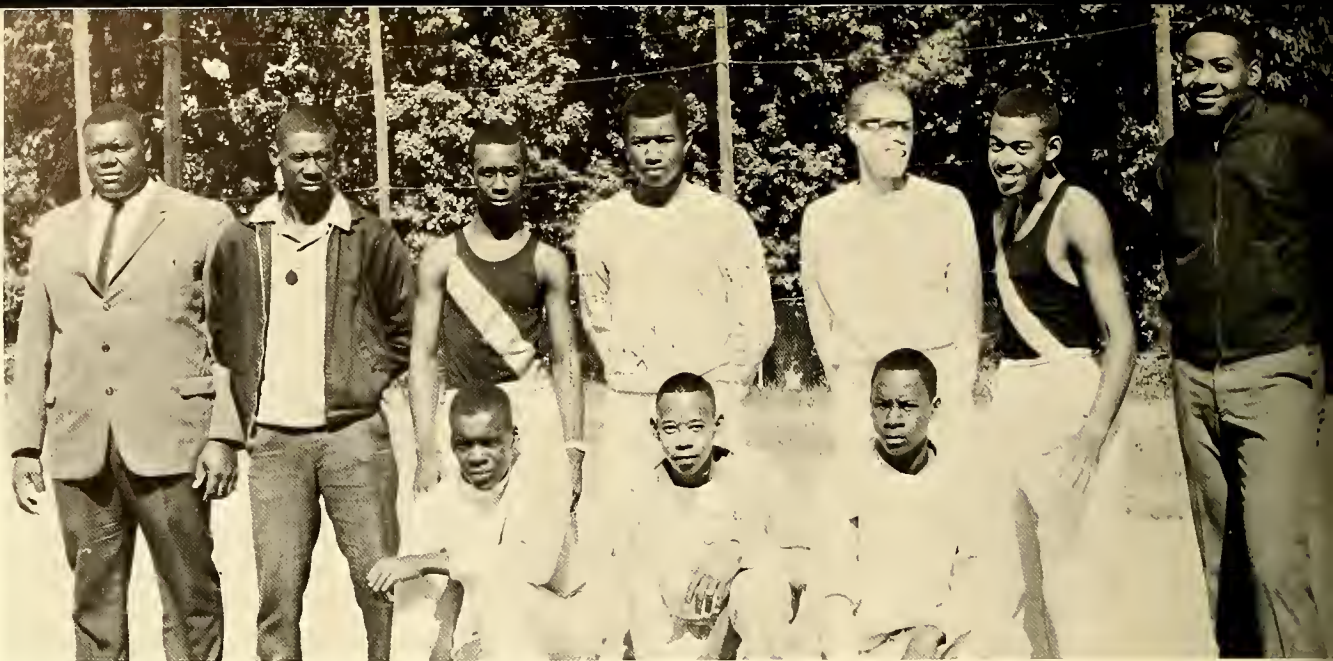
