

The purpose of Distributive Education is to offer a co-operative part-time training program for students interested in distributive work. It offers the opportunity to train junior executives so that they may hold responsible positions in their chosen field. D.E. is open to juniors and seniors sixteen years of age and over. They must have qualifications that are generally accepted for this type of work, and a sincere interest in distribution. All of the 37 students have parttime jobs. They work under the supervision of the store managers and of the co-ordinator. A special effort is made to relate schoolwork with problems on the job. The class takes up all phases of technical and professional development. Buyers, store managers, service managers, advertising executives, and other management positions—these are the types of jobs for which D.E. trains students.




