Each year the enrollment in the French classes increases. Not only are there French I and II classes, but a few energetic students are enrolled in a French III class. These students center their study on the translation of French history into English.

The study of Latin is another course that gives the students a chance to increase his knowledge of early history. First year Latin students learn grammar and vocabulary while the second year students center their interest on translation.

Social studies teaches them the significance of historical events and how they are the means by which we build our civilization today. ## Concentration and thought

The math courses prepare students for college or for the business profession they are seeking. Algebra, geometry, and trigonometry are for the college-minded students. General math and business arithmetic are preparations for the future business leaders.

This year there is no second year Algebra
class. Instead, plane geometry is being offered to students during their Sophomore year so that they may be more prepared for Algebra II during their Junior year. To accommodate all the Juniors who have already had Algebra II, plus the Sophomores who are taking geometry this year, eight classes of plane geometry have been set up.

## are required for Math and Science

The science courses offered at Henderson High enable the students to consider the possibility of science as a career. Freshmen receive basic information of science by taking general science. Sophomores take biology to learn of the complicated systems of plant and animal life. They see for themselves the internal structure of earthworms, crayfish, and starfish. Juniors and seniors with the desire to learn about the changes of the composition of matter take chemistry. Seniors wishing to learn

In bookkeeping students learn to keep a

systematic record of business transactions. They also learn important facts about accurate accounting and comprehension figures. Classes in shorthand enable students to take dictation quicker and more efficiently by using symbols for words.
