PARTICULARLY SUCH AS HAVE NOT BEFORE DEALT WITH US, WE WOULD SUGGEST READING THE FOLLOWING BEFORE MAKING OUT THEIR ORDERS:

First. That the advantage of purchasers being able to get everything wanted from *one establishment* has been well shown in the immense increase in our business since we began this system. We endeavor to supply every want of the *Florist or Market Gardener*, whether it be in *Plants, Bulbs, Flower Seeds, or Garden Requisites*.

Flower Seeds.—A most complete assortment, both for Green-house and the Flower Garden, is given in this list, embracing the most useful kinds for cut flowers or for other decorative purposes.

Requisites for Florists. Instead of issuing a special catalogue of these goods, as in previous years, we now embody in this wholesale list, which we think a more convenient arrangement. Our list of everything in this line will be found full and complete.

Plants, Requisites and Seeds may be sent in the same package when desired, thereby saving additional express charges, but orders should be made on the separate order sheets (one of each, for seeds and plants, will be found in this list). The order sheets should always be used, as it is much easier to fill orders when the order is written on them, than when mixed through the body of a letter, which should never be done.

Our Plant Department this season (1884) covers nearly *four and a half acres in glass*, probably double in extent that of any other establishment on this Continent. Our Green-houses being arranged so that they can be graded to any temperature, the most perfect health and vigor possible is given to the Plants, and with these advantages we are also able to compete with any in the matter of prices.

Our Employes, for the most part, are trained florists and seedsmen, many of whom have been with us from ten to fifteen years. We will, this season, employ an average of *eighty hands* throughout the entire season.

Conditions of Sale of Plants.

The Plants named are offered at the rates quoted, *provided, that not less than FIVE of each class or variety is taken. No order will be filled from Plant list in less amounts than six dollars.*

The varieties must be our own selection of sorts *unless otherwise offered*; for example, if twelve different kinds of Roses or Geraniums are ordered, we send twelve distinct sorts, but cannot afford the time (at these low rates) to select special kinds, named by the buyer. Any one wanting varieties of special kinds, can order from our Descriptive Catalogue, but at retail rates, from which we allow a discount of one-third. However, in ordering from this wholesale list, we give the buyer the privilege of naming sorts, he *don't* want us to send.

Plants may be safely shipped to all parts of the country,

At all Seasons of the Year,

as our system of packing is so complete that, although we send out thousands of packages during the coldest days in winter, we rarely have a case injured, when sent by express.

All goods are sent by express, unless specially ordered otherwise.

To places where there are no express offices, we will send all Plants, named in this list *by mail*, at an advance of one-third on the prices named; thus, if 100 plants, costing \$6, are wanted, we will send them for \$8, prepaid, by mail; but again advise, that whenever it is possible, to have plants sent by express, as it is the best mode, and our light system of packing makes the charges comparatively low.

No Charge for Boxes, Baskets or Packing.

ABOUT FORWARDING AND REMITTING.

Every order is executed at once on its receipt, or a reason given why it has not been sent, so that parties ordering may know that if goods are not received in proper time, it is almost certain that the letter has not been received by us. Remittances should be made either in the form of a Money Order, Bank Draft, Express Order, or Registered Letter. Remittances in any other way are entirely at the sender's risk. In regard to Postal Notes, which are likely to be largely used, we are obliged to say that, as they afford no security, and are readily negotiable into whomsoever's hands they may fall, we cannot hold ourselves responsible for letters lost in transit that may contain them.

The "Sunset Rose" originated with us in the winter of 1880, being a shoot from a plant of *Perle des Jardins*. We only secured one cutting, which, fortunately, has held its distinctive character without a variation for four years. It is now for the first time offered for sale, not a plant having been sold previous to January 1st, 1884. It will, no doubt, be hailed with delight by every one interested in roses, as it is identical in every respect with that hitherto unequalled Rose, *Perle des Jardins*, except that its color, instead of being a canary yellow, as in that variety, is of the rich tawny shade of saffron and orange, similar but deeper than the coloring of *Safrano* or *Md. Falcot*. In size, vigor, and productiveness it is in all respects the same as the variety from which it sprung, except that the color of the young foliage is of a much deeper crimson, which contrasts beautifully with the orange-tinted saffron flowers.

As a new color for winter forcing it will be as largely grown as *Perle des Jardins*, if not more so, as the peculiar richness of shade is much prized. The few buds we have had to offer this

winter, sold at just double the prize of "Perle." It will be equally valuable as a summer-blooming Rose out doors. Any one that has seen the rich tints of the old *Safrano* Rose buds, when grown out doors, can form some conception of what "Sunset" must be which is perfectly double, of fine form, richer tinted, and twice the size of *Safrano*. "Sunset," from its being full and double, gives excellent buds, even in the hottest weather, when semi-double Roses, such as *Safrano*, *Bon Silene*, etc., are nearly worthless.

NEW ALTERNANTHERA AUREA NANA.

When the Golden *Alternanthera aurea* was sent out a few years ago, it was believed that it would supersede everything else for a yellow line in "massing" or "ribbon bedding," but experience has shown that it is lacking in two important points. In many localities it does not attain its yellow color until late in the summer, which is a vital objection. Then, again, its straggling habit of growth is undesirable. In this new variety we have a plant which grows compact and upright to a height of only four inches, and which becomes bright golden yellow at once after being planted out, and retains its color right through the season. The foliage is narrower than the old variety, and the whole plant distinct and superior in every respect. We predict for this new variety a popularity equal to that of the crimson Parychoides major.

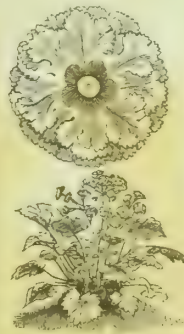

As Moles pass through some runs at regular intervals, say about 12 o'clock, M., and again at 6 P. M., it is an easy matter to tell which "runs" are used, by examining the depressions and noting those that have been raised. Full directions for setting sent with each trap.
