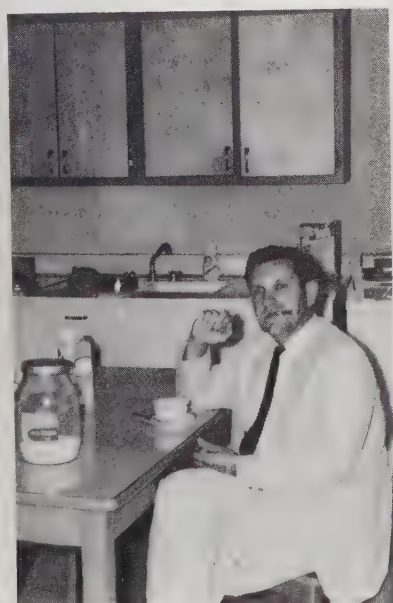


Probably nowhere can a more proper application of the term "unsung heroes" be made than in describing the administration of an American high school.

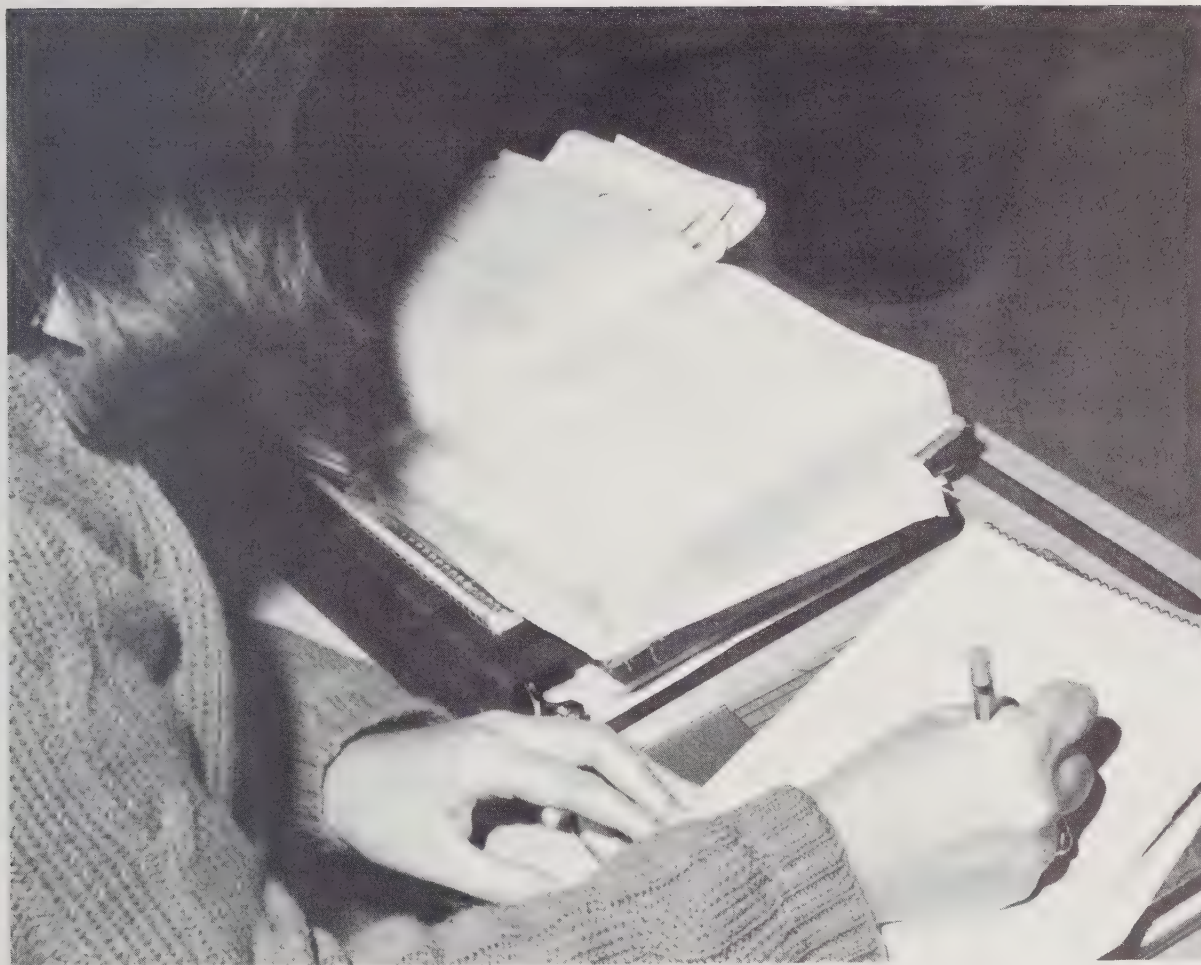
## English

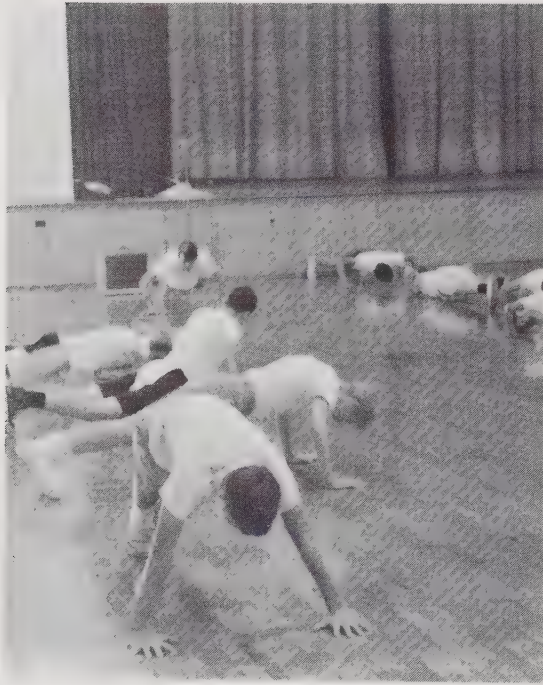
## SOCIAL STUDIES

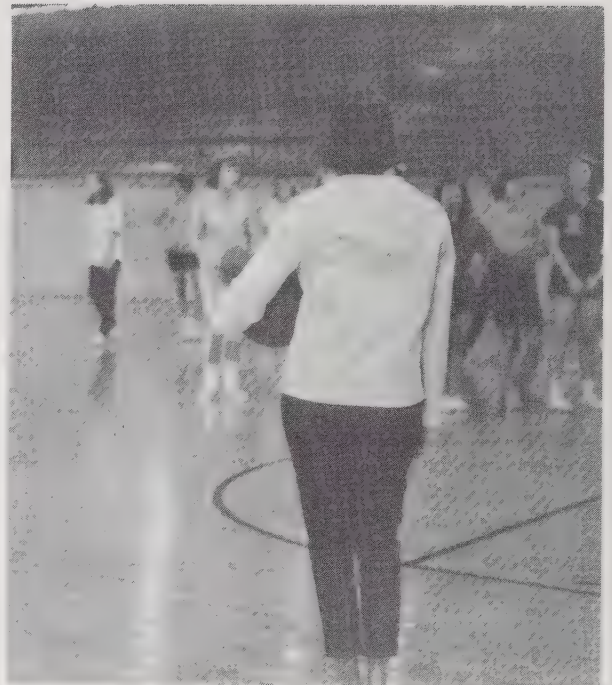

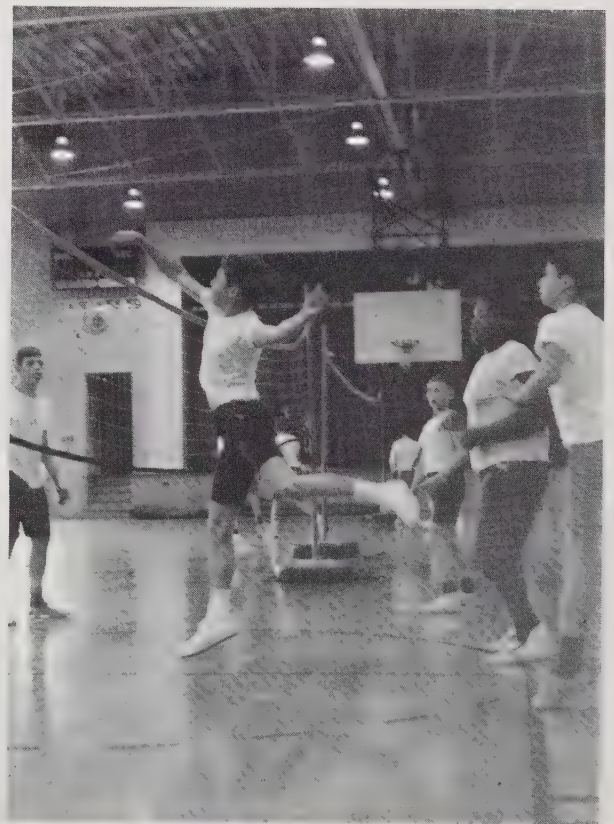

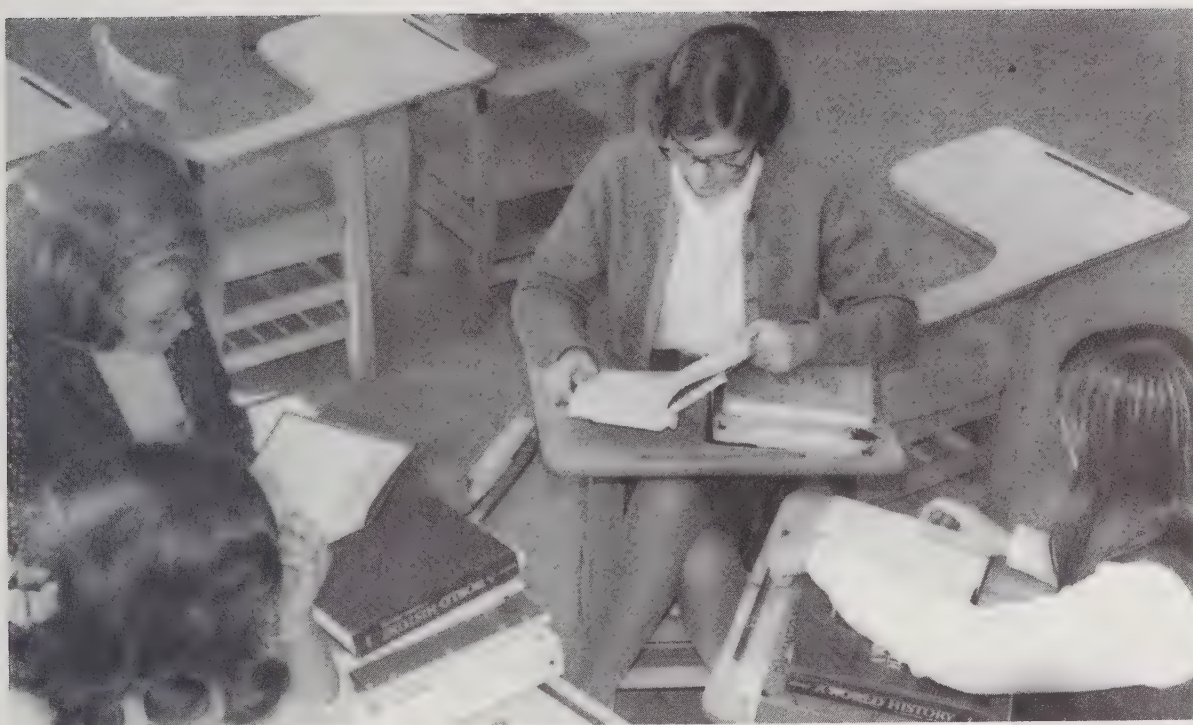
## Physical Education

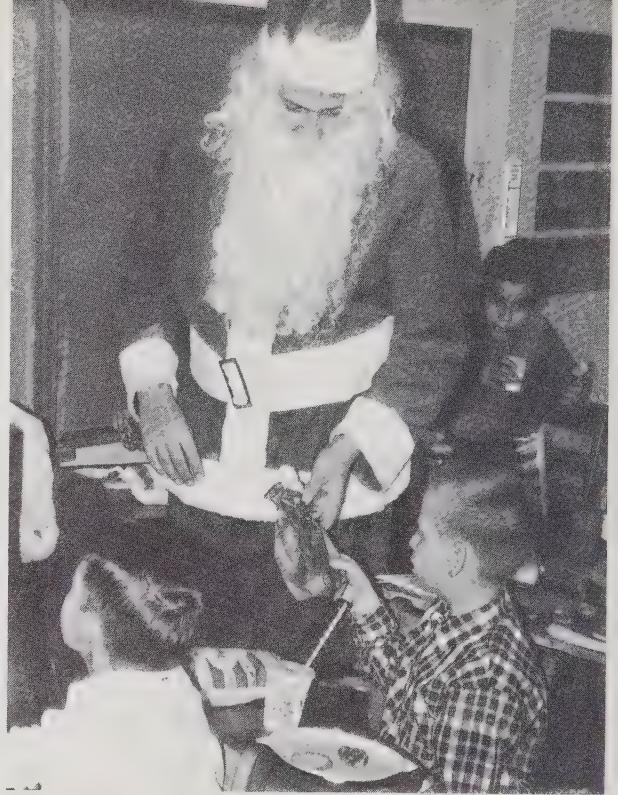






# Student Council

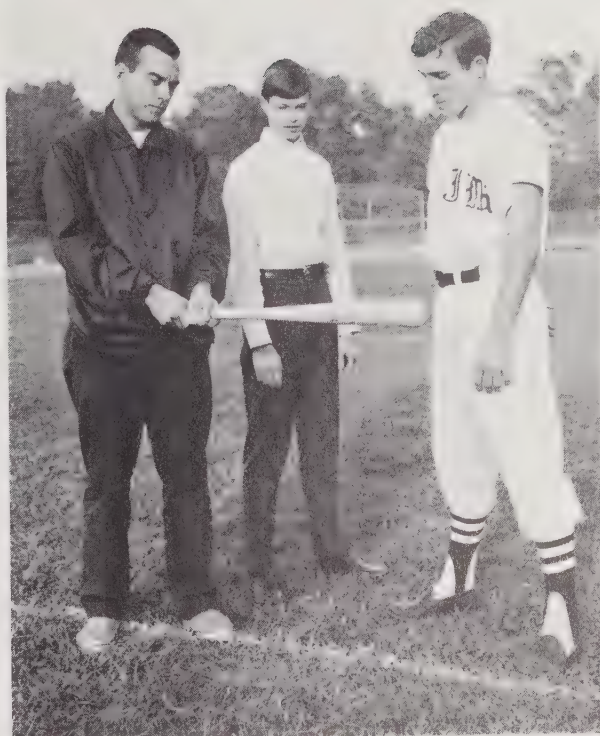

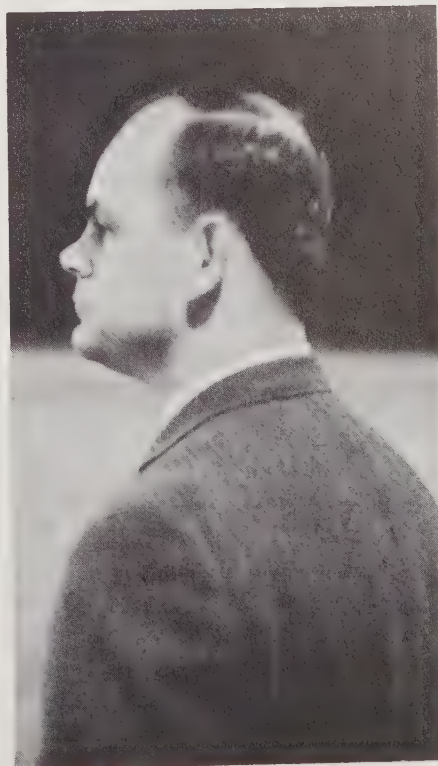
