## WAVE MAKING

-for better

At Bell Telephone Laboratories, radio scientists devised their latest microwave lens by copying the molecular action of optical lenses in focusing light. The result was a radically new type of lens - the array of metal strips shown in the illustration. Giant metal strip lenses are used in the new microwave link for telephone and television between New York and Chicago.

The scientists went on to discover that the

Waves from the sound source at left are focused by the lens at center. In front of the lens, a moving arm (not shown) scans the wave field with a tiny microphone and neon lamp. The microphone picks up sound energy and sends it through amplifiers to the lamp. The lamp glows brightly where sound level is high, dims where it is low. This new technique pictures accurately the focusing effect of the lens. Similar lenses efficiently focus microwaves in radio relay transmission.

## Flagged Down

Sir:
As a rural mail carrier, I have a boner to pick with your mostly excellent magazine. That's your suggestion under "Keeping the Home Shipshape" in November, page 170, for making a mailbox flag automatic.

Your scheme is against Post Office Dept. regulations, under which the signal flag is supposed to be in lowered position except when the patron has placed mail in the box for the carrier to collect. The carrier puts it down when he picks up the mail-whether or not he delivers any.

Your doctored-up flag, working backwards, would cause us carriers a lot of trouble, since it would indicate there was mail in the box to be collected when actu-

ally the patron had only failed to pick up the mail we'd left the day before. Now if you could figure out a flag that would go down automatically after the patron had set it up, then you would really earn the thanks of all rural carriers!

Seriously, I wish patrons on rural mail routes, instead of forever trying to fancy up their mail boxes, would spend half the energy lobbying for better country roads and in fixing up turnouts so that we letter carriers could serve their boxes without getting stuck in the mud or hit by passing traffic.

"The Postal Regulations provide that rural carriers shall open and examine mailboxes of patrons only when signals are displayed to indicate that the boxes contain mail for dispatch. When the mail is collected from the box, the carrier shall lower

As soon as the saw is in its new location, the handle is released and returned to its original position by the weight of the machine. When the handle then is locked up, the machine cannot be moved.

The National Production Authority issues a weekly "Consolidated Synopsis of Contract Awards," listing prime contracts awarded by the Government, names and addresses of the contractors, and materials contracted for. This list is not available to individuals by mail but may be seen by a personal visit to field offices of the Department of Commerce and such public places as banks, libraries, Chambers of Commerce.

A small workshop operator, on examining this list, has to use his own imagination in figuring out what part of a contractor's work he might be able to produce. He must then get in touch with the contractor directly to make any proposal for a sub-contract; the Government does not enter into this negotiation.

REPORT FROM THE


DRIVER'S SEAT . . .

EVERY so often an automobile manufacturer puts something in a car that makes people say, "Why didn't they think of that before?" Plymouth for 1951 has done just that. This car has a new kind of shock absorbers that take most of the jounce out of bad roads.

I had my reservations about what could be done with shock absorbers when Plymouth offered to send me a spanking new car from Detroit to the Indianapolis Speedway last December. They sent not one car, by the way, but two-the second one was a '50 for comparison.

In the racing business we have experi-

The principle involved in the Oriflow shock absorber is shown in this diagram. When car wheels hit bumps, the fluid-filled cylinders of the shocks move up and down over stationary pistons. This forces the fluid to circulate back and forth through passages in the piston. These passages restrict the flow and damp the car's springs. In conventional shocks these passages are holes in a thin plate. It's a characteristic of such plates that their resistance to fluid flow builds up fast as fluid velocity increases-as in a hard jounce on the road. So, through a relief valve in the shock's base, the flow-resistance is compromised to take bumps averaged between mild and severe ones. In Oriflow, the passages are long and tubular. Their resistance to fluid flow builds up more gradually. So they cushion a car against both kinds of bumps.
mented with all sorts of shock absorbers. The best of them relieved the drivers of only a part of the punishment inflicted by hours of pounding driving on the race track. When a race ends a driver feels as though somebody has beaten him from head to foot with a baseball bat. In a long race the shock absorbers get so hot that they crackle if you drop a little water on them.

First let's straighten out some possible misconceptions about shock absorbers. As the Chrysler Corporation itself points out, the name shock absorber is an inaccurate description. The real shock absorber in a car is the spring. It squeezes up when a wheel hits a bump. It takes the impact.

What we know as the shock absorber could be called more truthfully a spring damper. It isn't the bump in the road that gives you a rough ride. The springs take care of the bump. It's the unflexing and flexing of the spring following the bump. The bump jounces the wheel and the wheel flies up to squeeze the spring together. That stores energy in the spring.

The energy has to go somewhere. It's taken out as the spring alternately compresses and extends itself, with shorter and shorter oscillations, until finally it stops.

The "shock absorber," so called, performs the simple function of helping damp out the spring's stored energy. It shortens the time of oscillation, bringing the spring to rest faster. The shock does this by converting the spring's energy into heat and then radiating the heat to the air.

in almost any shock I've ever seen the manufacturer has had to compromise on riding qualities. If a shock is set-or calibrated, as they say-for hard bumps, it doesn't do so well on little ones, and vice versa. So shocks are set at an in-between point. That gives a car owner maximum spring damping right at that in-between point and nowhere else.

To establish the comparison between the old and new shocks, I first drove the '50 Plymouth around the Speedway and then into a rough section of the infield. The track had three inches of snow on it. Here's some of the playback from my tape recorder:

The track's slippery . . I I can feel a little skittishness in my front wheels . . . but like all Plymouths, this car has "good road-keeping quality and fine directional stability.

The infield, which is rough, jounced me around. I had to grip the steering wheel tight to keep my seat. There's a fairly deep drainage ditch along one of the infield roads.
"How about it?" I asked Dick Steding of Chrysler Engineering, who had come down to shepherd his cars. "Shall I try the ditch?"

He nodded.
"It's your car, remember," I warned him.
I took the ditch at 15 miles an hour.

## Double Whammy in the Ditch

I wouldn't want to do this for a living. It's rough. . . . Now we'll try it at 20 . . . wham! . . . And now 25 . . . double whammy! That's too much punishment. On that last run the spring rebound almost sent me through the roof. I almost lost control.

I had had enough of that. I drove back to the main grandstand section of the track where we had parked the ' 51 Plymouth, and changed mounts. This was a sedan, one of ten models in the line. I took another turn around the track.

The front end's restyled. A lower hood line gives you much more road visibility. There's a bigger rear window . . . the ignition switch also energizes the starter-turn the key past "on" and you're in business.

There are no drastic changes in this car from 1950. The instrument panel is like an airplane's . . . it's assembled in sections for accessibility . . . the seats are soft.

Plymouth, by the way, has coil-spring inserts for the seats to accommodate extraheavy owners. They can be had for free.

This car has an electric windshield wiper. It replaces the vacuum type . . . the entire Chysler Corporation line now has electric wipers. The only fault I've got to find with


Let's not overlook other improvements in the '51 Plymouth. Here's another. A rigid yoke ties the entire front end of the car together for better roadability and fewer rattles.

Another thing I liked about the car was the 10 -piece grille arrangement. The parts are individually replaceable. If you bang up your front end, it will cost less to get it fixed.

The instrument panel, shown here with me behind the wheel, is new too. The sectional parts detach easily for accessibility. The rear view mirror is a full two inches wider.

electric wipers is that often they don't have enough speed . . . they don't sweep the windshield often enough in a heavy rain.

I don't think the sound level is as good as in the '50. There's too much travel in the gearshift-lever action, but Plymouth always has had that fault. The brakes, though . . . nobody could find fault with them.

Or the engine. Give Plymouth credit . . . they've always made an engine-and a car, for that matter-as dependable as my grandfather's old dappled gray mare. The car's fast . . . a Plymouth won a 500-mile stock car race at Darlington, S. C. . . . The shelf above the instrument panel is glossy-finshed . . . it reflects too much light.

But most of the attributes of this car are ... Ind say this car represents, most of all, dependable transportation.

People are going to wonder why Plymouth isn't offering an optional automatic transmission for '51 . . . like Ford and Chevrolet . . . I understand they decided against it because the extra cost would shove Plymouth up toward Dodge in price. . . .

It was time for me to play cowboy with the shocks. I hit the bumps on the infield.

She rides better . . . no doubt about that . . . but I still get jounce . . . Ill need some more convincing . . . one thing . . . there is little or no wheel-hop. I've always got contron. . . .

## Mines Are Dirty Tricks

of thinking up new ways to make the target trigger the bang. Others are in what is politely called "countermeasures," meaning going out in little ships and sweeping up the other guy's dirty tricks. And some of the countermeasure men are the talent scouts who catch and cut open the live enemy mines to see what makes them tick.

Mine men are trappers, and trap-snappers, rather than hunters. They seldom get a huntsman's personal satisfaction, and they collect no "hazardous duty" pay. But the men in the super-silent service have a pride in performance rivaling that of the submariners or Rangers.

Quietly and competently ferocious, minewarfare men claim that mines have sunk more ships per dollar than any other weapon. But, so secret and unspectacular is their work, they never get enough to do the job right-in anybody's navy.

## Hitler Missed a Chance

No nation in history, says Momsen, has ever used enough mines of the right kind, despite their deadly relative efficiency. Hitler could have bottled up Britain tighter than a quart of champagne if enough magnetic mines had been sown while they were still new, and very dirty, tricks. And there is the latest lesson of Korea, where Red mine fields halted a fleet for days. Five sweepers were lost, three of them U. S. Navy ships, but our mine people remark that the Reds thus provided a fine school for countermeasures. And, they add, once again there were neither enough mines nor enough variety in triggering.
"If we had faced a mixed bag of enemy mines," one Navy mine expert told me, "we could have lost a lot more ships."

By "mixed bag" he meant a calculated mixture of different kinds of mines. For mines are much more complicated mechanisms than the original moored contact mine. This was the Model-T kind found in numbers off Korea. It consists of a big metal ball loaded with high explosive, with an anchor to keep it at the right depth in the right place, and a number of projecting "horns" that make it go off when touched.

The catch is that it's been around for so long that the minesweepers know how to handle it. Sweeping moored mines is like

cutting hay. Cable-cutting sweeps are dragged through suspected waters. Once the mooring cable has been snipped, the mine bobs to the surface where it can be detonated or sunk with gunfire. The sweepers move either in a wedge formation or in protective echelon, working from swept into unswept areas, like a man with a scythe.

Mine-warfare men speak a private lan-
guage. They talk of mined waters as "polluted." When you put out mines you are "infesting the area." Mines can be laid by surface ships, even little ones, or submarines. But only aircraft can maintain "contamination" of enemy waters by replenishing swept areas-a surface ship or submarine dares not go back into polluted waters.

In this deadly game of poker-for-keeps, you have two hole cards-new mines that the enemy can neither detect nor neutralize; and new countermeasures that make his most prized and deadly gadgets harmless.

Thus the comparatively simple contact mine led to mines you didn't have to hit at all. You merely had to come close. These are so-called influence mines that lie ominously on the bottom until their particular magnetic, or acoustic, or pressure trigger is tripped.

## Silent Sentries of the Sea

These ground (as opposed to moored) mines are the truly "silent sentries of the sea." Their firing systems can be scrambled into an intricate series of actions, one complementing, or booby-trapping, or backstopping another. Detection is almost impossible, and sweeping such ground mines is ticklish. There are several types:

The magnetic mine is triggered by the magnetic field of a ship. When the normal lines of force of terrestrial magnetism are distorted by a ship, the mine explodes.

The acoustic mine has an ear, a simple hydrophone, cocked for ship noises from propellers or engines. When these noises reach a certain volume, a switch closes and "Boom!"-you've had it.

The pressure mine is even more ingenious. A variation in water pressure on a sensitive diaghragm, caused by a ship overhead, closes the circuit and fires the mine.

These make tough work for the countermeasure man. Sweeping ceases to be the comparatively simple matter of cutting mooring cables. You first have to get a sample, take it apart, see what makes it tick.

In the case of the magnetic mine, first used by the Germans in World War II, luck and Nazi stupidity combined to give the British the key. Instead of sowing them in large numbers, and letting a sinking ship give the first warning, the Germans dropped them in driblets from night-flying planes. One fell intact on a mudbank in the Thames.

That gave the British scientists who handle countermeasures their chance. An
officer went out on the beach by himselfto minimize possible casualties-took a long look and with a prayer and a guess unscrewed the activating mechanism. It didn't go off and the magnetic mine was conquered. That kind of lonely heroism is needed to neutralize and study every new type of mine.

The countermeasures were comparatively simple. Ships were "degaussed"-girdled with an electric cable that neutralized their
magnetic fields. And wooden sweepers, fitted with trailing lengths of magnetic cables, were able to detonate the magnetic mines at a safe distance from their hulls.

This points up the sweeper's problem in a field of influence mines. If you can't find them, you can let them find you. So you simulate a target to set them off. Take the acoustic mine. Since noise exploded it, sweepers went out with noisemakers-in some cases they used ordinary air hammers

whanging on steel plates to fire them off.
The pressure mine is still a nuisance. In World War II, several sweeping methods were tried. Like wave making by squadrons of speedy small boats, and towing of big, expendable "targets." Sometimes a good storm will do the sweeping-exploding pressure mines by the natural motion of the sea. It saved lives off the Normandy beachhead.

But even more devilish are the imaginative variations on these three themes. Hitch an acoustic trigger to a magnetic mine. Ship noise cocks the trigger, and magnetic disturbance pulls it. A light, shallow-draft, magnetic-type sweeper, if not equipped with a noisemaker, can sweep all day through a field of such mines without making a safe path for heavy, noisy vessels.

Or reverse the order-an acoustic sweep will pass over unknowingly, leaving the mine cocked for a magnetic target. Then there are combinations comprising all three types in various orders.

## Mines that Count Ships

Another tickler is the ship-counter-a speedometer-like mechanism that clicks off passing ships up to a predetermined number, then pulls the rug out. It doesn't do a convoy's morale any good to lose a ship from a mine after half the formation has passed by safely. The possibilities are endless, challenging the countermeasure men.

Mines are laid in three main ways; each has its own advantages and disadvantages:

Surface ships can carry the biggest load. But you have to use them in your own waters, and they can't replenish a field. They ordinarily lay moored mines.

The airplane is the only minelayer that can replenish a field. And it's better for surreptitious laying than a surface ship. The ground mine is made to order for it. But even aircraft can be spotted, by eye and by radar. And a plane shot down while carrying secret mines may tip your hand.

The sub is closest to the ideal minelayer. It can deposit its deadly eggs secretly , defying detection even in enemy waters. Any sub can handle mines, dropping them through its torpedo tubes.

Our own mines are cooked up by "BuOrd," the Navy's Bureau of Ordnance, in it Naval Ordnance Lab at White Oak, Md. To help the scientists see the problems, a large-scale "environmental" lab has been set up at NOL, where mines can be tested under actual conditions of climate and
water pressure without taking them to sea.
Countermeasures are a job for "BuShips," which operates a test station at Panama City, Fla. Crews for mineplanters and sweepers are trained at the Mine Warfare School at Yorktown, Va. Here security even forbids mention of the number of graduates. Mothballed minelayers and minesweepers are going back into service. And Admiral Momsen keeps a weather eye on the whole business. He sees a big part of his job as promoting public understanding of our special vulnerability to mine warfare.

The Air Force is a valued ally in the mining job. It was the Air Force that sealed off Jap ports during the last war, and polluted inland lakes and rivers-like the very effective mining of the Danube.

## Where to Strike Red Threat

The Reds' accumulation of German mine knowledge and their big submarine fleet complicate the picture, since there are only three places at which to strike:

On their doorstep.
In their area of operations.
While moving from one to the other.
You can write off the last as offering the least chance of success. With the development of improved influence mines laid by subs or aircraft, it would seem logical to knock off enemy snorks, before they can get out to do their dirty work, by countermining the entrances and exits of sub pens. Defensively we'll mine our own vital ports to keep enemy subs out. And all the while we must worry about the safety of our own surface shipping, which can be lost just as surely from a friendly mine as one laid by the enemy.

The very threat of mining has indirect effects on a nation's war effort. A few mines scattered in a sensitive area, though they might not sink a single ship, can tie up vital cargo and force constant sweeping. And mines can be used to divert convoys to areas where subs can strike more easily.

Meanwhile, our own dirty-tricks department labors mightily in its double duty:

To develop undersea weapons that can contain or limit enemy mine operations.

To develop the gear and know-how to detect and destroy enemy mines along our sea routes-and perhaps in our harbors.

These are tough chores about which minewarfare men have no illusions. But if they didn't like tough chores and knotty problems, they'd be in another business. END


## World's Coldest "Deep Freeze"

Engineers at M.I.T. have built this cylindrical "deep freeze," believed to be the largest and coldest apparatus of its kind, to study the effects of extreme cold on materials lowered into it. The tank-called a cryostat-is 30 in . in diameter, three ft. deep. It is cooled to $452^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$. below zero, only $7 \frac{112}{\circ}^{\circ}$ above absolute zero, by a series of five "engines" driven by compressed helium. In successive stages the gas cools by expansion, then is recompressed, cooled by a heat exchanger, and allowed to expand again. The tank has a window in its lid for watching experiments.


Probe Measures Moisture Underground
To measure moisture in soil, a radioactive probe, encircled by the protective cage above, is inserted in the ground. Formerly, moisture readings were taken by the slower process of digging up and analyzing soil samples. The new method, developed by Cornell University under C.A.A. sponsorship, works by measuring the scattering effect of hydrogen atoms on neutrons. It is expected to aid engineers in designing airports by enabling them to study the changes in soil moisture under the pavements of present airfield runways.

## Tiny, Prop-Driven Model Plane Actually Flies

It would take over 40 of these insectlike planes to weigh even an ounce. Shown at left below as it takes off on a test flight, the $21 / 2$-inch-long miniature has a reed frame, balsa wheels and propeller, paper skin, and a wire propeller shaft. A single-strand rub-
ber band propels it. Called the "Stubenfliege," or housefly, the plane was built by Wilhelm-Hubert Friese, of Berlin, Germany, who constructs very small propeller-driven planes. Alongside the tiny model, below at right, are other aircraft of Friese's.



By taking over duties of heart and lungs, a life-saving mechanical marvel makes a doctors' dream come true.

THE "Iron Heart" has joined the "iron lung" and other mechanical substitutes for flesh-and-blood organs.

The doctors have called in the plumbers to make a pipe dream come true. The result is a machine that takes over the heart's duty of pumping blood through the body. It stands ready for an emergency at Hahnemann Hospital in Philadelphia.

Its invention means that surgeons can now disconnect an ailing heart from the body, make the needed repairs to put it in good working order, and connect it up again. Meanwhile, the Iron Heart maintains normal circulation.

The heart is the one organ of the body that never gets a rest, aside from the brief interval between the beats of this great pump. It is no wonder that heart disease is the No. 1 killer of man.

Suppose a person's heart needs surgery to repair a flaw-say a ventricle valve that is leaking and permitting blood to flow in the wrong direction. As a result of rheumatic fever, heart damage like this is a common ailment.

There's been little the doctors could do about it-though daring surgeons have tried their best, working "in the dark" and "around corners" while the heart keeps on

pumping away. They have dreamed of being able to put the heart to rest, cut it open, drain it of blood, and see what they are doing while they repair it. The Iron Heart permits them to do just that.

Its use will open fields of medicine and surgery never before explored. Quite possibly a person knocked out and apparently dead of shock in an accident can be revived with the Iron Heart. Doctors say it will be invaluable, too, in heart attacks such as angina and coronary thrombosis. Frequently, a victim of the serious heart

condition called coronary thrombosis may be kept flat on his back for as long as two months while nature heals the damage done by the thrombosis or clotting of blood. The Iron Heart would permit doctors to repair it themselves.

One of its most dramatic applications will be its first one, for which it was standing by 24 hours a day in the Philadelphia hospital as this was written. This was to be an attempt to resuscitate a patient whose heart had stopped beating during an operation, and who would be clinically "dead," after all present methods, such as heart massage, had failed. For although the doctors are certain the Iron Heart will work as well on human patients as it has on test animals, the inevitable risk of the initial trial must be justified by a dire emergency.

The Iron Heart is a compact mobile apparatus, no larger than a small console radio, housed in a transparent cabinet. It consists of two principal parts. One is a unique noncontaminating pump for circulating blood that contains no valves, gaskets, or stuffing glands. The pump is made of transparent plastic and is so designed as to cause no damage to blood cells. The other is an oxygenator, a device that supplies oxygen to blood circulating through it and simultaneously removes carbon dioxide. Blood flows in turn through oxygenator and pump, and the Iron Heart actually relieves the human lungs as well as the heart of their duties.

This extends the machine's usefulness to surgical cases where the lungs need to be put to rest rather than the heart. It may save the life of a patient choking to death with an asthmatic attack, or suffering from an extremely serious case of pneumonia.

## How Iron Heart Is Used

To treat a patient with the Iron Heart, surgeons will open a main artery, after the machine has been primed with blood of the patient's type. A plastic tube leading from the apparatus is inserted in the artery and temporarily clamped. Another, Y-shaped tube leading to the machine is inserted in two main veins.

Then the surgeons set the Iron Heart in action. Blood is permitted to flow into the arterial system as blood from the veins travels through the oxygenator, pump, and gently back into the body. All blood is diverted from heart and lungs, except for the

coronary flow that leaves the heart muscles by way of the right auricle. The heart becomes virtually a "bloodless organ." Thus a delicate operation may be completed under the most favorable conditions.

In trials on dogs, the heart continues to beat slowly but regularly. It can be stopped
and started again without difficulty, while the Iron Lung is operating. The animals have been kept alive with the machine for more than an hour, and have then made complete recoveries.

The Iron Heart has the rhythm and "beat" sound of a human heart. It can circulate up to eight quarts of blood per minute, a comfortable 100 percent over normal human circulation of four quarts a minute.

For years, engineers and skilled craftsmen have been working toward such a machine. Major problems were designing a pump that would not damage the fragile cells of the blood; and an artificial lung able to remove carbon dioxide, and supply oyxgen, without forming bubbles in the blood. The chemical industry supplied the answers to both of these problems. It furnished an adaptable design in the Vanton Flex-i-Liner Pump, which gently pushes a liquid along. And a successful oxygenator or "lung" was devised by allowing blood to drip, in a cylindrical chamber, through 200 layers of stainless-steel screen mesh of a
commercial type known as Stedman Packing. This exposes the blood to pure oxygen fed from the bottom of the device. The blood cells surrender their carbon dioxide to the atmosphere and absorb the oxygen. The mesh also avoids the air bubbles that could block the arterial flow-a hazard that has hindered other attempts to build artificial lungs.

Makers of the Vanton pump, J. J. Ashton \& Company of New York, built the Iron Heart in a joint project with Drexel Institute of Technology and Hahnemann Medical College and Hospital.in Philadelphia.

Other designs of machines for the purpose are currently under development at Yale University; at Jefferson Medical College, Philadelphia; and at Fels Institute of Antioch College, Yellow Springs, Ohio. Experimenters of the latter institution have just announced a simple, inexpensive type with enough pumping capacity for treatment of a child; future models may, like the Hahnemann Hospital machine, have the capacity required for adult patients. END

The washable screen, made by Firestone Plastics Co., is perforated (below) with $10,000,000$ tiny holes to let the sound through.

## Hollywood Cuts Cost of Make-Believe Worlds

THE gadgetry and gimmickery that produce the true-to-life illusions you see on movie screens have gone on an economy budget. To cut costs while creating even more realistic make-believe worlds, eight Hollywood studios have formed the Motion Picture Research Council.

The miniature set above, depicting an impending shipwreck, made of wood and plastic, is the result of one project. In others, branches cut from trees and shrubs are
"embalmed" to withstand the hot rays of studio lamps and to retain their freshness for six months; a paste enables wallpaper to be peeled off for quick scene changes.

The Council's laboratories, with nine engineers, are spending more than $\$ 100,000$ a year to produce more realistic stage props with which to deceive the eyes and ears of movie-goers, streamline studio transportation, and improve photo techniques. On the opposite page are a few examples.

All parts of the ship, including crew quarters, are airconditioned. In an emergency, the liner can be converted to carry 5,000 troops. END

## Navy Brain Answers <br> with Pictures

COMPLEX problems can now be reduced to three-dimensional, easy-to-understand answers by "Typhoon," the latest thing in electronic brains. Built by the RCA Laboratories for the Navy Bureau of Aeronautics, the new computer is showing naval experts just how theoretical guided missiles will react in actual flight.

Up until the completion of the new $\$ 1,400,000$ calculator a few months ago, the men whose job it is to create new and better guided missiles had to spend thousands of hours at complicated computations and many months at building full-size $\$ 100$,000 test models. And when they were finished, there was no guarantee that the new missile would perform as expected.

Now, they can simply dial the design characteristics of any proposed guided-missile system into Typhoon and actually see in drawings and in three-dimensional models just how the missile will function. What's even more valuable, the design characteris-

Computer also can be used to test airplane designs.

As the model receives the control signals, or instructions, from the computer, describing how best to hit the target plane without wasting time or fuel, its tiny control fins react as they would on actual missile and the model adjusts its position accordingly.

tics can be altered by twisting dials until the computer shows that the theoretical missile will track airplanes and score hits. And all this before a penny has been spent on costly missile construction.

## Typhoon Tackles a Problem

Most electronic brains buzz out answers that are mere figures. Not Typhoon. It actually demonstrates its answers in terms that even the layman can understand. When I first saw Typhoon operate recently at the RCA Laboratories in Princeton, N. J., the brain was set up to check the accuracy of a proposed radar-guided, rocket-propelled missile with a take-off speed of $720 \mathrm{~m} . \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{h}$. against a bomber flying $360 \mathrm{~m} . \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{h}$. at an altitude of 25,000 feet. Previously, 100 dials had been adjusted and some 6,000 plug-in connections had been made to feed the complicated problem into the brain.

When A. W. Vance, who developed the project, touched a red master switch on

the long control console, the big brain went to work. As pilot lights flashed and relays clicked, two pens on each of two plotting boards-one board for the plan view, the other for elevation-began tracing out the flight paths of both the target airplane and the missile.

At the same time, two plastic balls suspended in a glass-walled booth and glowing under the illumination from ultraviolet lights, duplicated the movements of plane and missile in three dimensions. Nearby, a small-scale missile model, 12 inches long, $3 \frac{1 / 2}{}$ inches in diameter, and complete with operating control fins, went through all the motions, gyrations, and spins that the actual missile-if there were one-would go through on a flight to the target. In 60 seconds, the entire flight, which ended in a direct hit, had been simulated and recorded.

In one minute, the new computer, largest of its kind ever built, had made 250 additions, 67 multiplications, 30 integrations, and had solved 20 aerodynamic equations. All were carried on simultaneously with continuously varying factors-a chore that would have taken two mathematicians at least five years. Besides that, the brain had provided the answer in visual, understandable form as well as on records.

How would this same guided missile perform if the plane tried to avoid the missile by diving, zooming, and turning? To find out, evasive tactics were dialed into the portion of the brain that did the thinking for the plane. As I watched the two balls and the pens on the plotting boards, the theoretical "dog fight" came to life. I could see the zigzagging target plane being hunted by the guided projectile. I witnessed the actual hit.

## A Check on New Theories

With Typhoon, any guided missile problem can be run through over and over again. New theories can be tried and checked. The design of a missile can be varied for each run until the desired results are obtained. Thus, by avoiding the high cost of actual trial-and-error launching tests, the new brain can inform scientists how a missile will act under any set of conditions. It can help them to remove all the possible bugs long before the design leaves the drawing board.

Most electronic brains are either analogue computers (comparable to a slide rule) or digital computers (similar to an adding machine). Typhoon, however, is a combination of both and, by blending the two techniques in more complex forms, it achieves

a flexibility and accuracy unattainable by either system alone. It is exact to better than one part in 25,000 .

Typhoon's nerve center consists of some 4,000 electron tubes, 600 supersensitive relays, several miles of intricate wiring, and thousands of condensers, resistors, and other components. Basically, it consists of five major sections-one for the missile, one for the system for guiding the missile, one for the target plane, one for calculating the results, and one for recording those results. It takes a staff of nine engineers and mathematicians plus six technical assistants to operate and maintain the computer. Also, since it seems that an electronic brain can get a cold in the head and not operate efficiently, the room in which the computer is housed is kept at a constant temperature of $75^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$. and at a relative humidity of not more than 50 percent.

When solving a problem, the various varying factors enter the brain as voltages. These are then fed in the proper order to the components set up to add, subtract, multiply, and divide in the right sequence to provide a constantly changing answer. As a result, at any moment during a solution such things as the missile's speed, yaw, pitch, roll, and fuel supply can be read from
a bank of recorders. It is possible, for example, to determine the exact positions of each of the missile's control fins at any instant.

Although the new computer, after it is installed in the Naval Research Laboratories at Johnsville, Pa., will be used principally to solve guided-missile problems, its abilities are by no means limited to that one function. Fed the characteristics of a new supersonic airplane design, the brain can tell you if the plane will fly as expected, and if not, why not. It can be used to pretest the hull designs for new surface ships and submarines or the streamlined shapes of bullets, bombs, and torpedoes.

## Bigger Brain May Plot Defense

And, unless its designers and users miss their guess, it will serve as a model for an even larger master calculator that will solve all the riddles connected with the successful defense of our cities and our coastlines against any possible enemy attack. The super-electronic brain they contemplate would be capable of duplicating all the possibilities of a combined land, sea, and air attack and illustrate in three dimensions the best possible methods of sure-fire defense!

## Link Trainer Now Looks Like Plane

Newfest version of the Link trainer, shown below, now looks less like a crateful of electronic gadgets and more like the plane whose operations it duplicates, the SNJ-5 basic Navy training plane. Built for the Navy Special Devices Center, the trainer now has twin cockpits, each with a full set of controls. The instructor actually "flies" with the student, and he can produce a variety of plane troubles for the student to overcome, by pushing any of 20 specialeffects switches (PS, Feb. '50, p. 123).

Realistic flying conditions are presented by reproducing the noises made by a plane starting up and getting into the air. Looking through the double glass window, the pilot even sees cloud formations, rainstorms, and lightning flashes.



Safety Suit Protects Rocket Fuelmen

## Robot Automatically Takes Refrigerator's Temperature

How cold is it inside a refrigerator? Westinghouse engineers wanted to know-without wasting all day taking the box's temperature. So they invented a machine that automatically types out the temperature at 150 different places inside the refrigerator, mak ing 1,320 readings an hour. It can run day and night all week, or start and stop at preset times. The tabulations come out of the typewriter in sheets all ready to paste in the test book.

The robot recorder is made up of a bunch

of thermocouples, a potentiometer, a cabinet full of relays, and an electric typewriter. A camshaft (in cabinet at right) connects the couples-which are scattered throughout the refrigerator (left)-one after the other to the potentiometer. At the same time, another set of switches "reads" the potentiometer indication for each couple. These switches operate solenoids that work the typewriter keys, typing the temperatures. The engineers can also use the typewriter manually to write in other information when they wish.

Heart of the set is a heavy wire armature, which is bent to any desired shape or pose. Clay is then added to this skeleton in layers, and shaped with tools included in the set. Sculpkit retails for $\$ 3.95$.

This unusual combination, developed by the Acru Electric Tool Manufacturing Co., of Manchester, England, is both a worklight and an exhaust hood. ## U.S. Opens Atom.Furnace Secrets

NOW you can see what an atomic furnace really looks like. The pictures on this and the following pages are the first ever to show the works of an atomic pile.

Many long-secret details are now revealed on six Anglo-American piles. One (above) is only a foot across and contains less than 14 pounds of uranium. However, this tiny ball must be encased in a concrete block 16 feet square and $10 \frac{1}{2}$ feet high. Another, a rebuilt version of the first pile ever made, has 100,000 pounds of uranium.

Even more significant are the scientific data also released. Things like the "thermalneutron cross section for fission" (the probability that a neutron 'will split an atom)for mixed natural uranium it's 3.9 barns (a barn is an area measurement, $10^{-24} \mathrm{sq} . \mathrm{cm}$. per nucleus), but for pure uranium 235 it's 545 barns.

With the new information, you could build your own private atomic furnace, as North Carolina State College is now doing. But it won't help you make bombs.

"Zeep," Canada's pile at Chalk River, Ontario, is the big smokestack-like structure above. All around it, radiating out like spokes from a wheel,
are instruments using neutrons from the pile for research. Zeep produces the most concentrated beam of neutrons of any pile known.


How a pile's uranium (small pipes above) is arranged-long a major secret-is shown in this photo of furnace at Argonne National Labora-
tory. It, like Zeep, uses heavy water instead of graphite to slow down neutrons. "Thimble" lowers materials inside pile for experiments.


Only photo made during construction of world's first atomic pile-built under University of Chicago stadium-shows 18th and 19th layers of graphite bricks. Even-numbered layers had holes for uranium, odd layers were solid graphite. This pile was torn down, rebuilt outside city


Original Chicago pile was reassembled at Argonne, using same material but slightly different arrangement. Photo above shows outside of five-foot-thick concrete shield and controlrod supports. On top of pile is small laboratory for research with neutrons generated by pile.

are simply blocks of graphite that can be removed for insertion of test materials into active section deep inside the pile.


HITLER'S Volkswagen (People's Car) has turned up in new dress. More noted for its efficiency than beauty (PS, Oct. '50, p. 162), the rugged utility car now comes in a slicked-up version that looks like a luxury sports car and doubles as a pretty fair racer-good enough to win the 1949 International Austrian Alpine race.

The transformation is the handiwork of Wolfgang Denzel, prewar Austrian speed
driver. The engine is the same air-cooled, four-cylinder opposed type, but its horsepower has been boosted from 25 to 36 . Some other innovations: dual carburetion, hydraulic brakes, heavier shock absorbers.

The car will hit $85 \mathrm{~m} . \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{h}$. and gets 30 miles to the gallon. Its flashy body unbolts for easy removal-that's so you can quickly put back the conventional one when the old folks come calling or winter sets in.



## Çadillac Has Warning Lights on Dash

Pictured here are three spanking new cars with fresh styling and mechanical improvements to entice the buyer.

In addition to minor changes in appearance, the Cadillac, above, has something
new in the instrument group. Automatic signal lights indicate low oil pressure and generator discharge. Another warns if the car is started with the hand brake on.

## De Soto's Power Is Boosted

THEY took an airplane engine apart the other day in a Connecticut factory, and when they put it back together again it was a whole 1,000 horsepower stronger. Yet essentially it was the same piston engine. The 1,000 horses had been gained merely by changing some of its insides.

With that much added power in each of four engines, long-range commercial airplanes could fly five more tons of passengers and cargo from San Francisco to Honolulu. They could fly nonstop between London and New York, eliminating two refueling points. In fact, the changes give the piston engine a new and substantial lease on life in this day when jets and turboprops threatened them with obsolescence.

The changes centered in the supercharger. For years high-horsepower aircraft engines have been equipped with a
mechanically whirled supercharger inside the engine, or with a turbosupercharger turned by exhaust gases outside the engine, or with both. Superchargers are necessary to high-performance aircraft engines because the cylinders need more air than the pistons can suck in. Superchargers supply that additional air by compression. They help cram more air into the cylinders on take-off; and they delay a fall-off in power as an airplane climbs higher into thinner air. In addition, an internal supercharger acts as a sort of sub-carburetor, ramming the mixture into all cylinders as equally as possible.

## Fuel Injectuon Replaces Larburetor

In that Connecticut factory the designers performed a fairly simple surgical operation on an engine equipped with both an internal supercharger and a turbosupercharger. They took sut the internal supercharger and the regular carburetor. They added a fuel-injection system and a bigger turbosupercharger.

That put all the responsibility for super-

charging on the new turbo. The result is dramatic.

The turbo, developed by General Electric, can deliver 350 lb . of air per minute -so much that excess compressed air can be bled off to pressurize the passenger compartment. It boosts a Pratt \& Whitney 3,250-hp. engine, used in the transoceanic Boeing Stratocruiser, to $4,250-\mathrm{hp}$. for takeoff. It reduces fuel consumption by a fifth. The saving in gasoline means 1,480 fewer gallons for four engines in winging from New York to London. That's 3 $1 \frac{1}{2}$ tons-a spectacular payoff in weight alone.

Such savings can be put into longer nonstop flights or additional cargo and passengers. Neither the jet nor the gas turbine turning a propeller can touch the piston

engine, with its new turbo, in economy. And while its still not nearly as fast as a jet, it's faster than it was. On flights of 1,000 miles or so, the turbos let a pilot fly 40 miles farther each hour.

Where'd this power gain come from? That involves a little background on highperformance aircraft engines. Such power plants have almost always used carburetors. This means they have also had to have internal, mechanical superchargers-which have been needed not only to compress the charge, but also to mix it thoroughly and distribute it to each cylinder as evenly as possible. Even so, the top cylinders on radial engines have tended to run lean and the bottom ones to get an over-rich mixture. Both conditions shorten the life of cylinders, valves, and spark plugs.

## Internal 'Chargers Hog Power

Mechanical superchargers have brought mechanical problems, too. Speeded up by gear trains to the high r.p.m.'s necessary, they have been susceptible to a "crack-thewhip" effect during changes in engine speed. This has called for special clutches and even fluid couplings to save gear teeth from the high loads that would otherwise be imposed. It has also been accepted as a necessary evil that the mechanical supercharger is a power thief that robs an engine of the type used in the Stratocruiser of some 500 hp . It takes that much energy to turn it-energy stolen from the shaft, not from the waste exhaust gases.

An additional problem has been heat. On a conventional engine, an "intercooler" brought down the temperature of the air after the turbo had compressed (and thereby heated) it. But that internal super-
charger heated it up again by further compression. The mixture was hot when it entered the cylinders. You can't cram as much hot air as you can cold into a container. Thus superchargers have in a way partly defeated their own purpose. Another drawback to this heat has been that it encouraged detonation-"pinging." This means that compression ratios, although high, have still had to be kept below the point of maximum efficiency.

## Higher Compression Possible

In the new set-up, fuel injection has removed the need for a carburetor, and for the mixing and distributing functions of the internal supercharger. It has made it possible to put the complete load of compressing air onto a turbosupercharger. With heat absorbed by an "aftercooler," air from the new turbo enters the cylinders at a much lower temperature. The engine can take higher compression, and deliver more power. Careful design has licked a past drawback of big turbos: a tendency to build up back pressure in the exhaust to the point where the exhaust valves are overheated and warp or burn.

GE is not alone in working for more power from piston engines. Wright Aeronautical, like Pratt \& Whitney a major pis-ton-engine manufacturer, has developed a "compound" engine (PS, Dec. '48, p. 128). In this one, exhaust energy drives a turbo that feeds power back to the crankshaft.

Better propellers are coming along to go with the new power plants. Experimental props, still on the secret list, are now good for $550 \mathrm{~m} . \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{h}$. That's more speed than is claimed for the world's fastest jet transport, the British Comet.

# What You Should Know About "RW" 

"Death sand" and "radioactive clouds" are novel atomic weapons that may be introduced in radiological warfare.

EDITOR'S NOTE: Best defense against a possible terror weapon is knowing just what it can. and can't do. So here are the facts about " $R W$," latest in atomic warfare.

UNITED STATES ARMY commanders have been alerted against an eerie new kind of atomic warfare. At any moment it may ęmerge from the laboratory, and make its debut in combat.

It's called "RW"-short for radiological warfare. It uses atomic weapons other than the A-bomb, such as "death sand" and "radioactive elouds."

A 12-page Department of the Army study, "Radiological Warfare," briefs commanding officers on how it may be used. Recently printed in Officers' Call, an official Army publication issued monthly for their
information, it's the most detailed report on RW made public to date. Here are its highlights, plus some from other sources.

Name the countries that have atomic piles, and you've listed those that could wage RW-the U. S., Canada, England, France, and Russia. For any pile will furnish the needed radioactive materials, or RW agents. Just as tracers are made for research, common materials like chalk and washing soda may be put in a pile and made radioactive for use as RW agents. Also suitable are radioactive fission products, the "ashes" recovered from a pile's spent fuel rods.

The radioactive materials come from the pile both as red, white, and black powders in aluminum cans; and as bottlefuls of solutions. They are so radioactive that a large amount would melt a metal container.

Likeliest way of using these materials in war, the Army study foresees, is to sow the ground with radioactivity. They could be loosed over an enemy target from planes, in the form of a dust or liquid spray. Settling

Defenders' planes attack invaders with "death sand." It would force withdrawal of men exposed to its radioactivity, thus preventing build-up of forces to break out of beachhead.


"Here are two possible types of RW weapons. "Death sand" coats ground, and its radioactivity takes effect on victims externally. It requires material emitting penetrating gamma rays.
on the earth, an invisible radioactive film would imperil all who walked over it with penetrating gamma rays from an RW agent like radiocobalt, a radium substitute.

To spread it, Prof. Hans Thirring of Vienna proposes drying a solution of the RW agent upon sand, or metal powder. Naming the preparation "death sand," he calls it "the lightest and most transportable of all weapons of mass destruction."

Airplanes for "death-sand" attacks could resemble those used for crop dusting and spreading fertilizer from the air. A British

plane for the latter purpose has dropped five tons of chemicals in a single experimental flight (PS, Jan. '51, p. 130).

To protect occupants from the cargo's radioactivity a death-sand plane would need heavy shielding. (After calculating jits weight, one scientist suggested dropping the shielding instead of the RW agent on the enemy!) But shielding could be omitted if crewless planes, under radio control from accompanying aircraft, laid the sand.

Troops in an area sprinkled with death sand will have no choice but to get out.

Those who remain will receive a fatal dose in anywhere from a few hours to several weeks, depending on the intensity of the radioactivity. Like victims of A-bomb radiation, they will suffer nausea, loss of hair, anemia, and hemorrhages. But those who flee at once will suffer no ill effects.

RW has novel military possibilities. An invader could be forced by a death-sand attack to withdraw exposed troops from a beachhead, for example, and prevented from building up his forces to break out of defenders' encircling lines.

In a stalemate on a battlefront, RW could compel enemy troops to abandon a key position, permitting a breakthrough. Attackers advancing rapidly across the contaminated area would not be harmed by its radioactivity. (Conversely, a radioactive belt that could be crossed swiftly would be useless defensively.)

RW attacks on war-production and transportation centers could make an enemy evacuate factories, railroad yards, ports, and adjacent living areas, without demolishing them-and, the Army study declares, "with

results comparable to strategic bombing."
Radioactivity of RW agents will die out after a time, depending on the particular one used. By choosing one of suitable half life, an attacker could make an area uninhabitable for whatever period suited his purpose-only briefly, if he expected to capture and occupy it himself.

What quantities of RW agents would be needed? An Army example assumes 430 pounds would cover an area like New York City's. Compared to the 10 pounds of pile products shipped yearly from Oak Ridge, the figure is huge, but not fantastic.
"Radioactive clouds" are a wholly different RW possibility. A low-level A-bomb burst is known to leave a deadly cloud of ray-emitting particles floating in the air. Could RW apparatus, too, create lethal airborne clouds in the open? If so, they would act as "a particularly vicious form of poison gas"-the phrase is taken from the famous Smyth Report-and serve similar purposes in close-range combat.

Casualties would result from inhaling the particles in the air. Lodging in the lungs, they would get in their lethal work at close range, and hence could emit only short-range alpha or beta rays. Some materials that do this, such as plutonium and radioactive calcium and yttrium, are among the most dangerous that can get into the body. Gas masks for protection would need filters able to strain out the particles. Otherwise the air couldn't be breathed and oxygen-fed respirators would be needed.

How to produce radioactive clouds can be described. For they've actually been
made in the laboratory, in non-military and therefore non-secret experiments.

Rats were exposed to miniature radioactive clouds to explore health hazards of inhaling the particles, by Dr. Richard Abrams and his associates at the Argonne National Laboratory. Novel ways they devised to make the clouds are described in a report awaiting publication ${ }^{\circ}$, of which this writer has been permitted an advance view.

They contrived mechanical gadgets, resembling insect guns and perfume atomizers, that sprayed clouds of radioactive dusts and solutions. They exploded thin foil of radioactive metals, such as plutonium, with powerful electric currents. But their most interesting method was an explosion of chemicals.

The experimenters removed the glass shell from a midget photo flash bulb, and used a radioactive solution to impregnate its combustible charge, consisting of zirconium metal and potassium chlorate and perchlorate. Ignited in a closed chamber, this filled the air with floating radioactive particles, which took effect on rats nearby.

## Atomic Artillery a Possibility

Can similar chemicals serve as a filling for RW shells, bombs, and rockets? Gen. J. Lawton Collins, U.S. Army Chief of Staff, recently cited the possibility of "an artillery piece that would fire an atomic weapon." Some took it that he meant shooting an A-bomb from a gun-but "atomic artillery" for RW seems more plausible.

Those are the possible arms and methods of RW. Its military value remains a big question mark until it is tried.

RW has glaring military drawbacks, like its delayed-action casualty effect. Even a lethal dose doesn't knock out radiation victims at once. At Hiroshima, several Japanese soldiers fatally exposed to A-bomb rays marched 20 miles with full packs the next day, although all were dead six weeks later. So a soldier who has "had it" from RW may still be a dangerous customer.

But RW's unique characteristics could give it a place in warfare. And it could be used especially effectively against those unaware of its limitations, as a psychological terror weapon. As the Army study puts it, "Radiological warfare, once a favorite subject for writers of science fiction, has passed into the realm of sober possibility." END

## Diesel-Electric Tractor Has Motor in Each Wheel

Y CROSSBREEDING Gramp's batterydriven automobile with today's Dieselelectric locomotive, engineers have hatched a husky rubber-tired tractor that has no clutch, transmission, drive shaft, or differential.

Two generators hooked directly to a 186hp. Diesel engine grind out juice that is distributed separately to a motor in each of its four wheels, to two more for front and rear steering, and to a seventh that turns a towing winch.

Fuel to the Diesel is throttled by a hand lever that seldom needs regulating after starting. A rotating controller, like a street-
car's, governs speed of the driving motors, forward and backward movement, and power braking. It's steered by push buttons.
R. G. LeTourneau, Inc., of Peoria, Ill., designed the 11-ton prime mover, called the Tournatow, for handling big airplanes on the ground. It can also be used as a switch engine in railway yards, and is being modified for heavy earth-moving equipment.

Outstanding performance characteristics claimed for the new Diesel-electric tractor are smooth starting and stopping, precise control at all speeds up to 25 m.p.h., infinite adjustment of torque to load, and a turning radius of less than its length.


On-the-job power units eliminate usual mechanical, hydraulic, or pneumatic linkages between engine and wheels. Two generators-DC for main driving motors and brakes, AC for
steering and winch-are mounted in line with Diesel engine, and power is distributed direct to point of application through cables. Engine also runs an air compressor for accessories.

11-ton prime mover drives like a streetcar, turns like a fire engine, and can tow 16 times its weight in airplanes.

Tournatow shows, at left, how it can be used to spot railroad cars in a switch yard. Less than 6 ft . high, the tractor was built low for work around and under large aircraft on the ground. In recent demonstration for Air Force it casily maneuvered a 200 -ton plane about runways at Wright Field. Tires are standard aircraft 56 -inchers; wheels are identical.

In each drive unit (below) pinion on armature shaft meshes with reduction gears, which rotate ring gear bolted to wheel.

## Water Can Be Dynamite



## Even a 30-gal. storage tank can let go like a TNT blast unless protected against excess heat as well as pressure.

THAT harmless-looking hot-water tank down in the basement can become a live bomb quicker than you may think.

Its job is to furnish household water at around $150^{\circ}$ F.-safely below the boiling point, yet plenty hot enough to handle dirty clothes and greasy dishes. The trouble comes when the setup doesn't have properly functioning brakes. Since water has to be under some pressure in order to flow from plumbing fixtures, it can be heated past its normal boiling point-without boiling. That's when even a modest 30 -gallon tank can let go with more explosive energy than a charge of TNT.

It can happen with an apartment house boiler as quickly as with a cheap little hod-a-day pot stove or side-arm coil supplying a storage tank. The chief difference is that a cast-iron boiler flies apart like shrapnel while a steel tank is apt to soar like a rocket.

But such blasts can't happen when proper equipment is properly installed and maintained. In every case, the explosive material is what one engineer calls "water gone crazy with the heat." It's the flash into steam after pressure ruptures a tank or boiler that causes trouble. Sometimes, the pressure has been built up too high; other times-if the tank is old and weakened-even normal operating pressure is too great.

In either case, pressure sets the stage. The real villain is superheated water. Every

drop is waiting ominously for its chance to flash into normal steam. A break in the tank gives it that chance.

When blast experts are able to find enough pieces in the wreckage, they can almost always assign one of three causes to the accident.

1. The setup was a manual one. This isn't bad in itself, but whoever lit the heater fire forgot to turn it off. Like the family in a lastminute hurry to get started on a trip, or the careless baby-sitter.
2. The installation had automatic controls -but too much faith was placed in them.
 condition that can siphon water from heater. $C$ is tempering valve that guards against scalding water reaching faucets. $D$ is standard tem-perature-pressure relief valve described earlier.


Mechanical robots are fine, but need periodic checking.
3. Or it might have just been what engineers of the Hartford Steam Boiler Inspection and Insurance Company-oldest company of its kind in the country-call a plain "goofy" setup. Like installing a check valve between the tank and its relief valve. Or plugging the relief valve to stop its leaking. Such tinkering, obviously, makes a safety valve a useless ornament.

## "Hot-Water" Earthquake

There's the case of the policeman who phoned headquarters that there had just been an earthquake. The shock came from a hot-water blast four blocks away, which caused $\$ 10,000$ damage to neighboring buildings. It all started with a dripping hotwater faucet in a hamburger stand. To save water, when he locked up at night the proprietor shut off the cold-water line to the automatic gas heater serving a 20 -gallon tank. That was blunder No. 1.

No. 2 was the fact that the setup had no safety valve. And as pressure of the heating water increased, it couldn't get relief by bucking up into that closed cold-water line.

To be sure, the heater had an automatic fuel control. It should have shut off the gas when the water got too hot. But this thermo-
stat happened to be gummed up. So the fire kept on going, and the tank finally burst.

For every blast, there must be the two ingredients-failure of the tank under pressure, and explosive energy built up when the water gets too hot. It's usual to think only in terms of pressure. By itself, excess pressure will damage a tank and cause a watery mess in the basement. But for a real hot-water blast, the water has to be past its atmospheric boiling point.

To prove this, a dozen ordinary hot-water heating tanks were blown to bits in a hayfield near Doylestown, Pa., while a couple of hundred plumbing experts and boiler inspectors watched from a safe distance.

High spot of the bombing came with the eruption of a typical 30 -gallon steel tank inside a small house. Its pressure just before the blast was 80 pounds, which is a normal safety-valve setting for a good flow of water from upstairs faucets. But the water had built up to $290^{\circ}-78^{\circ}$ above its normal boiling point.

## Tanks Are Urged to Explode

To highlight the lesson, cooler water in two similar tanks was safely built up to 200pound pressure. When nothing happened, each was urged to explode by giving it a water-hammer effect-an abrupt jolt of pressure. A rifle bullet was shot into one. With the other, an engineer just stepped up and split the tank with a sledge.

Neither tank exploded-just a gush of water rushed out through the breaks.

The Doylestown tests were staged by the Watts Regulator Company, a Massachusetts firm pioneering in safety devices, to prove that ordinary pressure-relief valves-though still a must-should be backed up by a tem-perature-sensitive safety device in case the pressure valve can't handle the situation.

What's needed is a combined tempera-ture-pressure relief valve. The Watts patent on such "T-P" valves has now expired and many firms make them. Some have a fusible plug that lets go when water gets too hot. Latest types work on the thermostatic principle to open the valve.

After a dime-store blast 20 years ago that injured 50 persons and killed five, Washington, D. C., became the nation's first municipality to insert a temperature-control requirement in its building code. A number of other states and cities. aware of water's dynamite power, have followed suit.

The ordinary home-owner can take a les-

son from industrial plants, which regularly inspect high-pressure equipment. Actually, say engineers, there's too much false security with "low-pressure" hot-water systems in residences. "Low-pressure" means simply that that's all they're built to stand. Fourfifths of the claims paid by a typical insurance company result from accidents with low-pressure equipment.

Every setup has its own pressure limit. Fifteen pounds may not be too much for a hot-water heater tested at 250 pounds and intended to operate at around 50, but it's the recommended limit for the usual low-pressure steam boiler made of cast iron. And when the low pressure becomes high-if a valve sticks, or aquastat fails, or water gauge goes haywire-something has to let go. Pressure below the rated limit may still be excessive for a particular tank-old, corroded, or weakened by past overheating.

Anything that relieves excess pressure is to the good. That's why an open systemlike water gravity-fed from a spring-is generally safe because water can back up the line. But it isn't foolproof. Sediment or freezing might block the line.

Some explosions have been innocently caused by a town's desire to protect meters from overheated water backing up into them. Check valves to protect the meters also block the escape of overheated water.

## Best Protection Is Good Equipment

The best protection is making sure you have good equipment installed by a plumber who knows what he's doing-and by checking it every few months. You can't just walk away and leave it. A reliable heater comes with an operating manual. If you follow instructions, you can put the heater through its paces to check.

That thermostatic valve is going on and off many times a day. By contrast, a pres-sure-relief valve just sits on the line waiting month after month for an emergency. To keep in trim, this robot needs exercise. Long idleness, sediment, or corrosion may cause it to get stuck. That's why its test lever should be operated every few months. If your valve is an older type, the spring can be pushed back with a knife to imitate excess pressure. If it squirts, it's okay.

The last warning-if you're lucky-comes when you turn on the hot water and get boiling water or steam. Better get the situation cured in a hurry, because you're playing with dynamite.


## What Is It-Plane or Truck?

The strange-looking contraption shown above is a mobile unit for testing airplane engines and props before installation aboard transports of the Trans-Canada Air Lines. A steel frame built on a threeton truck holds the engine, which is controlled from the truck cab. The unit is prevented from moving forward by chains running to tie-down rings in the ground. Hydraulic spider legs absorb torque and stabilize truck during tests.

## Oversize Bandage Covers Big Burns



Developed by the Army Medical Corps, these new oversized dressings are for burns and wounds covering large skin areas. A layer of highly absorbent gauze protects the injury, while a nonabsorbent outer layer prevents the entry of bacteria. Dressings may be worn as long as two weeks instead of requiring frequent changes. To prevent contamination, bandage is packed in a sealed plastic bag.

## How Your Glassware Is Made

By George H. Waltz, Jr.

TWO opposite extremes in manufacturing -meticulous handwork by skilled craftsmen and high-speed mass production performed by automatic machines-provide the wide variety of household glassware we use each day.

Up until 1903, all types of table glassware, ranging from tumblers to vases, were either hand-pressed or hand-blown by master artisans. Then came what is considered to be the greatest single advance in the 5,000 year history of glassmaking-the perfection of an automatic glass-blowing machine that put glassmaking on the production line.

As early as 1889, the idea for a mechanical glass blower began to form in the mind


3 Periodic reheating in a small furnace called the "glory hole" is necessary to keep the glass at just the right temperature for working. The base of the vase, with its decorative ribs of glass, is now complete.

of Michael Owens, a master blower at a glass works operated by Edward Libbey in Toledo, Ohio. One day while Owens was struggling with a particularly inept crew of apprentice glassmakers, he wondered if it wouldn't be possible to devise a machine to take their places. Secretly, he designed and built a wooden working model of such a machine. When he showed it to Libbey, the boss was so impressed that he agreed to set up a company to carry on the experimental work with Owens as general manager.

## Machine Works like Bicycle Pump

Owens' first full-size machines were simple and ingenious-and they worked. They operated on the principle of the bicycle pump. When a piston was withdrawn, molten glass was sucked up into a metal mold from a supply pot. When the piston was pushed in, the compressed air forced the molten glass against the sides of the mold to form the desired shape. It was as simple as that, and the same basic principle is still used today in the modern machines that produce the major portion of our lowcost household glassware.

Automatic machines, however, have by no means completely replaced the master glass craftsman. Expensive glassware is still created by the same so-called "offhand" blowing methods that have been followed for centuries. At glass works like those main-
tained by Steuben Glass, Inc., at Corning, N. Y., skilled glassmakers still use the ancient processes and the crude tools of their craft to turn out decorative tableware and other glass art objects.

They still stick to the old "shop" method of glassmaking in which a master blower, known as a "gaffer," supervises five assistants. Directly under the gaffer is his "serviter" who blows the glass into its basic form. Then in order come the "gatherer" who gathers or picks up a glob of molten glass from the glass furnace on the end of a blowing rod and gives it to the serviter, the

"bit gatherer" whose job it is to gather up on a long stick called a pontil (pronounced "punty") the small amounts of additional molten glass needed for decorations, stems, etc., the "stick boy" who holds the gathers, and finally the "carry-in boy" who carries the finished piece to the oven, called a "lehr," where the glass is annealed.

The six men work as a team, with the gaffer calling the signals. He is the artist, the master, who carefully shapes the molten glass (or "metal" as the glassmakers call it) into its final form. His skill comes from long experience.


2Working like a tire pump, the machine sucks a glob of molten glass up from a revolving supply pot in its base and then forces it against the sides of a two-part metal mold.

Glassware made by pressing, rather than blowing, is another traditional type that is still produced, but it too for the most part is now turned out on automatic machines. Many items such as heatproof ovenware, some types of lenses, and decorative ornaments are made in modern, automatic glass presses.

By blending handwork with machines, the glassmakers are making everything from cheap but attractive dime-store tumblers to expensive crystal works of art that enliven our dining tables for festive occasions and decorate our homes.

## New Two-in-One Foot Control Stops Car or Speeds It Up

Now you can step on the gas or put on the brakes with the same foot pedal. Press forward with your toe, and the car speeds up; press backward with your heel, and it slows down. Called Accela-Brake, it is controlled by a pedal that bolts to the car floor over the conventional accelerator and is pivoted so it can rock forward and back. Pushed forward, it presses down the accelerator. Tipped backward, it pulls a control rod that actuates a special brake mechanism installed between the master brake cylinder and the wheels.

When the rod is pulled, it opens a valve that applies vacuum from the car manifold
to a rubber diaphragm inside an air chamber. This collapses the diaphragm, driving a piston into a cylinder filled with brake fluid. The piston forces the fluid out of the cylinder and into the wheel brakes, slowing or stopping the car depending upon how far the pedal is pushed backward.

The auxiliary brake does not interfere with the operation of the conventional brake, and a lock-out control on the dash disconnects it at any time. In addition to speeding up braking time, it is also said to eliminate roll-back on hills and foot fatigue in traffic. Made by the Accela-Brake Sales Co., of Hollywood, it sells for about $\$ 66$.

## Navy Flying Boat Makes Tight Turn

This Martin flying boat can't quite turn on a dime, but with its hydroflaps - twin underwater rudders it can turn in a radius one and a half times its wingspan - three times sharper than with engines alone. Designed for maneuvering in tight waters, the rudders can also be used as a brake.


## Light Proved Even Faster than Previously Determined

The speed of light, the magic number that affects nearly all laws of physics, is even faster than scientists thought. New experiments at Stanford University place it at 186,280 miles per second-eight miles per second higher than the old value. Even this

## Keeping the Home Shipshape



If it's raining or snowing when you leave for the market, carry along a plastic shoulder protector from your closet. It will fit over the shopping bag and keep your groceries dry.


Cup hooks screwed into the wooden rail in a closet, or to the door, will hold those belts that clutter up a drawer. They'll hold suspenders and extra shoelaces as well.


You can protect your hands from abrasion when grating cheese, carrots, and other foods by wearing the heavy rubber fingers used in offices. Cover thumb and first finger.


Wood from crates and apple boxes makes fine stock for craftwork. A home made tool like this mallet will enable you to knock them apart without damaging the wood.


Separated joints in the asbestos on your heating pipes can be covered with tin cans with top and bottom removed. Slit them lengthwise and clamp them on with pipe-covering bands.

## Keeping the Home Shipshape



If you don't cover your porcelain-topped or stainless-steel sink with rubber pads, protect the shiny surface by putting a dishcloth under pots and pans when scouring them.


A plywood board, dividing your hamper into two sections, saves you time on washday. Keep white wash on one side and colored wash on the other, and sorting is eliminated.


You can add water to an aquarium without disturbing plants and sand if you float a board about $z_{4}^{\prime \prime}$ thick on the surface of the water. Pour the water lightly onto the board.

## Dummy Bombs Test B-36 Accuracy

Dropped from a B- 36 bomber, these con-crete-filled, 12,000 -pound, dummy bombs help tell Convair engineers just how real bombs will behave. When the bombs are re-
leased-some from as high as eight miles up -an electrical impulse sent to the ground automatically starts cameras that track the missiles, recording drop path and rotation. Depth of ground penetration is measured to tell what the explosive pattern would be.

## "Hot Stick" Takes Tank Temperature

When U.S. tanks roar into battle on hot desert sands, their rubber treads must withstand scorching ground heat that often gets $34^{\circ}$ to $39^{\circ}$ hotter than the air above it. To take the temperature of the sand and the treads, corpsmen jab them with this special needle-nosed pyrometer that registers minute amounts of current generated by heat on a dial calibrated in degrees. Repeated jabbings show the rubber treads can withstand up to $180^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$. without damage.


## "Floating Table" Licks Vibrations

Delicate balance scales, placed on top of this "floating table," are unaffected by the poundings of a nearby giant drop forge in the Westinghouse plant at Pittsburgh. Suspended from heavy coil springs and cushioned by large blocks of foam rubber (arrows), the table absorbs all vibrations before they reach the sensitive apparatus. Steel plates, bolted to the bottom, preload the table so objects placed on top do not throw the delicate balance out of equilibrium.


Paper-hulled Shoshiman has spent two seasons in rougher streams than the Passaic (above),

THAT canoe in the picture above is made of paper. Its hull is plain, ordinary, brown wrapping paper, the kind the hardware merchant packs your nails in. Yet it is as sturdy and seaworthy as a commercial job.

If you can operate a hammer, saw, scissors, and glue brush, you can make one like it in a couple of weeks' spare time. So reports John B. Ehrhardt, suburban-weekly editor of Madison, N. J., who resurrected the lost art of paper-boat making to build Shoshiman, the canoe shown on these pages. He adapted the technique used in the 1870's by Elisha Waters \& Son, of Troy, N. Y., who made paper boats and also paper domes for astronomical observatories (the one at West Point, installed in 1881, is still good as new).

The paper boats have no seams and little framing. You can build your own frame, or use the frame from a stock kayak kit. Besides the frame, you'll need about seven quarts of waterproof glue (Ehrhardt used

Cascophen), a dozen $18^{\prime \prime}$ by $24^{\prime \prime}$ sheets of No. 70 newsboard (a type of cardboard), 10 yards of 44 -thread muslin, and lots of brown wrapping paper.

Cover the frame with one layer of newsboard, fastening it with glue and tacks. Butt the joints. Next apply two layers of paper, coating both surfaces with glue. It's easier if you cut the paper into $12^{\prime \prime}$ by $18^{\prime \prime}$ sheets and dilute the glue with about 20 percent water. The paper joints should be lapped and staggered, with wide laps around stems and keel. A layer of muslin, laid in bands from gunwale to gunwale, with the cloth doubled and the joints butted at the selvages, follows. Glue the same way as the paper. Finish with two layers of paper.

Let the glue cure for two days, then waterproof the boat inside and out with another coat of diluted glue. Wait 48 hours, and then sand and paint the hull, treating it like wood. Now you're ready to launch.


One man easily handles the paper canoe, which weighs approximately 50 pounds, similar to commercial aluminum or plastic boats. Materials cost $\$ 45$ (not including ready-made frame).

Spring a leak? Paper and glue fix that, as Ehrhardt demonstrates above. His boat, used two years, sprang its only leak when hung up on rock. That one was too minor to bother patching.


Electric Hamper Dries Clothes. A fan in the bottom of this aluminum hamper sends a blast of air warmed by a heating element upward to hasten the drying of lingerie, towels, or diapers hung inside it. In summer the appliance can be used as a bathroom air conditioner simply by hanging damp towels inside and switching on the fan to circulate cool air. Hamper-Dri has a 110- to 120 -volt AC motor. Argyle Mfg. Co., of Colchester, Ill., sells it for $\$ 29.95$.


Barbecue for Indoors or Outdoors. Interchangeable posts on this grill let it be installed indoors in a fireplace or outdoors in a pienic area. A handle on the grill moves it over the fire for cooking, out to a magnesium tray for removing food. Placed on the wire grid, the tray becomes a griddle. It is sold by Lyncraft Products Co., Lake Orion, Mich., for $\$ 19.95$.


Labels Are Easy to Mark. For identifying frozen foods and other packages, a new self-sticking tape adheres to metal, glass, or plastic. It has a blue border and white writing surface that can be lettered with any pointed instrument. Lettering comes out blue. Sold with dispenser by the Labelon Tape Co., of Rochester, N. Y., it is priced at about $50 \phi$.


Rack Keeps Tools Handy. Mounted on a garage or basement wall, the rack above has room for storing six long- and five short-handled gardening or household tools. It is made by the Inland Steel Products Co., of Milwaukee, Wis. The toolholder comes with screws and bolts for easy installation.


Resins Purify Water. Distilled water for steam irons and storage batteries can be drawn from the kitchen faucet if this refillable Filtr-Ion tube of resins is attached. Resins, blue-black at the start, turn yellow when exhausted. La Motte Chemical Products Co., Baltimore, makes it.


Knife-Tongs Prevents Crumbling. To cut and serve cake portions with one hand, spread this flexible, Vshaped cutter to the desired slice size, press its sharp edge into cake, then lift up with cake held firmly in the blade. Krag Steel Products Inc., Chicago, sells the cutter for $\$ 2$.


Tool Kit Fits Pocket. Besides having a blade, this steel knife boasts a ${ }^{3 / 4}$ inch monkey wrench, a hammer, drill bit, awl, and file with screwdriver tip. Imported from Germany, the knife is $4 \frac{1}{4}$ inches long. Hoffritz for Cutlery, New York City, prices it at \$9.95.


Rollers Move Quietly. Designed for hospitals, these plastic curtain rollers with stainless-steel hooks are said to eliminate noise when slid along a metal track. Made by Grant Pulley \& Hardware Co., Woodside, N. Y., the curtain assembly can be mounted on a ceiling, or built flush with it.

## Plastic Helps Prevent Runs



$A^{\mathrm{N}}$N AIR FORCE mechanic (we'll get to the legs in a minute) was spraying a protective dope on fabric airplane wings when he got an idea: Maybe a similar coating would protect women's fragile stockings.

As a result, you can get a clear-plastic coating, called Nylonger, that you can spray on silk and nylon stockings in a few minutes. Packed in the new self-dispensing spray cans (PS, Dec. '50, p. 102), it coats each thread with a thin, invisible plastic film that adds strength and reduces wear. Where threads cross, the plastic "spot-welds" them together so they are less likely to unravel and cause runs if snagged.

Said to increase stocking life from two to nine times, the plastic sells for $\$ 1.98$ a can, enough for about 70 sprayings.

Magnified views of same stocking mesh show how threads look before treatment, below, and after treatment, at right. Photos show microscopically small threads enlarged about 50 times.


Here's what happens when untreated stocking is snagged. Broken threads start run that ruins entire stocking. If treated, the threads are less likely to unravel, and snag is kept small.


## The liside Story of our Expansion Attic

How a young couple converted an empty attic into three extra bedrooms, and showed a cash profit on their spare-time work.

WHEN my husband and I decided we would like to expand our "expansion attic" into three rooms and bath, we called in a contractor for an estimate. Then we looked at our bank account, and it didn't take a certified accountant to see that we'd have to do the work ourselves. We're glad
we did. The job was fun, and it paid off.
What we saved. The contractor gave us an estimate of $\$ 2,450$ for putting in three bedrooms, without the bathroom. As I total up our own costs, I find we spent $\$ 378$ for outside labor and $\$ 520$ for materials. So we saved almost $\$ 1,500$, in exchange for 300 hours of our spare time. As amateurs, we consider $\$ 2.50$ per hour for each of us pretty good pay. And we now have a sound


There was plenty of room in our attic. Now we have three
 aided by an elementary text on using hand tools. We have no power tools, and managed nicely without them at first. Later, Popular Science lent us an electric drill and an $8^{\prime \prime}$ bench saw to speed up the cabinet work. Both were a help, but we could have done the job without them.

Although it seemed big to us, this was strictly a spare-time project, done evenings and week ends. We averaged three or four sessions a week, and never put in more than three hours in any one day.

How we began. When we bought the house, our attic was an echoing emptiness $25^{\prime}$ wide by $40^{\prime}$ long, under a low-pitched gable roof, with two small dormer windows. There was rock wool between the floor

joists right over the ceiling lath, but no floor except for catwalks to the windows.

We broke down the entire job into these divisions: flooring, heating, plumbing, extra windows, insulation, partition walls, wiring, storage space, and doors. Immediately we decided that the bathroom would have to wait another year, since the plumbing was no job for amateurs (and forbidden by local codes), and the best estimate we would get was $\$ 881$. Although called an expansion attic, ours had none of the necessary piping. This had to go in before the flooring, so we contracted with a plumber to install it.

Fortunately our present boiler (we have hot-water heat) was large enough to handle the increased load. Otherwise we would

have installed electric space heaters in each room. But these are costly to operate, and might have required new feed wires, so we were lucky to have an adequate heating plant.

Throughout our planning we sought to minimize or postpone expenses in order to lighten the load on an already tight family budget. For instance, when the heating
pipes were installed, we had them capped. Thus we didn't have to buy radiators for six months, when we celebrated our grand opening by moving our little boy, Steve, into the north room. But while the plumber had the garage wall open to put in heating lines for the bathroom above, we had him install the hot- and cold-water pipes too, so that the wall won't have to be broken open


There wasn't much up there except space, to begin with. The steep roof pitch limited headroom, and rooms had to be planned to utilize what there was to the utmost. Only half the collar beams were in; we had to install the rest.


The dealer showed us how to stack flooring (which we brought in through a window) with scrap pieces between to let air circulate. This also kept the stuff from underfoot. If you walk on tongue-and-groove, edges break and the boards are then difficult to lay.


Catwalks laid to the dormers had to be torn up. The architect pointed out areas around windows and chimney where we had to set in two-by-four nailing members to support flooring adequately.
again next year when the fixtures go in.
With the pipes in, we were ready to start our own work. We planned to do everything except putting in extra windows and wiring. The windows could go in later, and the wiring had to wait until the studding was up. Before we tackled the job, we spent some time wandering through halfbuilt houses and noting at firsthand how things were done.

Flooring was first. Our year-old son enjoyed crawling in the rock wool between the floor joists, and the lath ceiling beneath supported his weight nicely. Not so an adult's, as we found out when a friend stepped through it. Flooring was obviously first. We planned to put down a subfloor of $1^{\prime \prime}$ tongue-and-groove and finish it with asphalt tile.

To avoid tightrope walking along or across the joists, we got several broad planks that we could lay around our working area. Then we started ripping up the catwalks, an onerous job because the stuff was toenailed through the tongue. It took six hours. But we saved the pieces, and later used them elsewhere.

When we were ready to buy our first $1^{\prime \prime}$ by 6 " tongue-and-groove pine, we told the owner of the local lumber yard about our project. He was most helpful and agreed to give us a quantity price even if we took delivery of only a little footage at a time. We bought nearly 1,000 linear feet before we were done, but we didn't want to stack (or pay for) such an amount all at once. It took us over two months of spare evenings to lay the subfloor. This was the most monotonous part of the job, but luckily it came first, while we were fresh.

Nevertheless, we made our first mistake right there. Instead of ordering flooring, we should have gone to the lumber yard and selected the boards. Taking what was sent cost us many hours of extra labor to force warped boards into shape, and we had to cull out and set aside a needlessly large amount of split or warped footage. (Ironically, the best lot was the last, so the flooring under the eaves was the neatest we laid.)

We laid it straight. The experts and the books will tell you subflooring should be laid diagonally. Ours isn't. We found that diagonal subflooring is supposed to strengthen the house, but our house was hanging together nicely with no attic flooring at all, so we figured it would keep on doing so. Laying those boards diagonally

would have been a tough job for us, and would have cost us extra lumber.

Another departure was in our nailing method. There are those who can sink a nail cleanly into the tongue and get a faultless fit over it with the groove of the next piece, but it didn't work that way for us. We kept splitting the tongues. Finally we switched to $2 k k^{\prime \prime \prime}$ cut nails, driven straight through the face of the flooring, two to each joist. These sank themselves without setting.

We started flooring under the front eaves with the old lumber we'd ripped from the catwalks. This area was planned to be storage space, which would not be covered with asphalt tile, and we preferred to use the better lumber as we worked out into the rooms proper.

The dealer from whom we bought the nails taught us our first trick. To force tongue-and-groove stock together, we used a scrap piece cut in the shape of a wedge. This was driven between the flooring and a piece nailed to the joist, the groove on the wedge fitting the tongue on the board.

We could lay two or three boards at a time this way if they were not badly warped, and could force almost any single board into place no matter how badly warped. Since time meant less to us than money, we saved short ends and knotted pieces for use under some of the eaves, so we wasted hardly any. Although it was easier to lay long boards, we sometimes cut them to minimize the warp. We tried to avoid making two adjacent joints on the
same joist, as we were told this would tend to let the floor creak.

By using ${ }_{8}^{5 \prime \prime}$ plywood instead of pine boards, we could have had a superb subfloor much faster, with an ideal surface for laying the asphalt tile. But our budget said "no," because plywood would have cost us almost twice as much.
Enter the architect. It was while we were having our flooring troubles that Popular Science became interested in our project and offered to furnish us an architect, a luxury we hadn't dreamed of.

This took the shape of J. Conrad Breiby, Jr., six-feet-three of rising young architect, who told us we didn't have to lay the flooring right up to the plate. He suggested we leave an inch all around to allow for expansion. He also pointed out areas around

the dormers and chimney where the joists were not placed properly to support the flooring, and at his suggestion we set in two-by-four nailing members there.

By the time we had finished the flooring, Mr. Breiby presented us with two sets of drawings. One showed us how the attic would look as we had planned to lay out the rooms, together with many niceties we might have overlooked. The other outlined a more ideal use of the space, but called for a twenty-foot shed dormer along the back wall. We didn't feel up to building that ourselves, and it would have cost more than $\$ 500$ to have it done.

Let there be light. While sticking to our original plans, we nevertheless had to admit things looked dark away from the dormers. The best answer within our means seemed two ordinary windows in the ends of the attic-one in the bathroom-to-be, the other in the largest bedroom.

There was quite a debate about the installation of these windows, Mr. Breiby and the editors believing we could put them in ourselves, and we feeling that we probably could-but what if they leaked? Because of our misgivings, we finally hired a skilled carpenter, Walter Brandmeier, of Rye, N. Y. He not only put in the windows but gave us invaluable advice on other matters.

The helpfulness we encountered everywhere was perhaps our outstanding pleasure during the whole job. Everyone with whom we came in contact shared his knowledge,
and many of the suggestions offered saved us hours and-more important-dollars.

For additional light, Mr. Breiby's plans show a good idea we haven't yet been able to afford-two tiny second-story windows of the hopper type similar to those used in cellars, placed in the end walls of the central portion where the garage and north wing are set back. These would admit a little light and afford cross ventilation. We plan to have these installed at some future date.

The architect also pointed out that there is room for a $24^{\prime \prime}$ attic fan under the ridge peak at the south end of the house. Such a fan would boost air circulation on sultry days. We haven't bought the fan yet (and won't until summer) but we did leave a trap door through which it can be installed. A future article will describe the grilles we set into the ceiling of each attic room.

## Kitchen Detergents Clean Brushes

When I finish a paint job, I use this method of speedily and easily cleaning the brush. Put the brush in a clean jar or can. Place a heaping teaspoonful of a household detergent in the can. Add warm water to cover the bristles. Slosh the brush around in this mixture. Repeat with more detergent, if necessary. In a few minutes you'll have a clean brush.-Robert W. Bradford, Syracuse, N.Y.

## PLYWOOD REPAIRS



When smoothing the surface of plywood is the only repair, clean the cavity, pack with plastic composition wood or similar filler, and sand level after drying. Two or three applications are best in deep holes.

If a saw can be used and there is opportunity to put in a backing block, saw out a piece and plug with a patch having tapered edges, as shown
in Fig. 1. In many cases nails and screws can be used to reinforce the glue. Scratches can be routed and filled with wedge-shaped strips glued in and sanded flush.

Figure 2 shows a veneer patch suitable for bright finishes. Select a face veneer from plywood with a grain matching the work as closely as possible. Undercut the edges. Trace around it on the work, rout a little shallower than the veneer, and glue in the patch, scraping and sanding level when dry.

A shiplap patch for heavy plywood that can be chiseled out in steps is shown in Fig. 3. Also in Fig. 3 is a puncture patch made by boring through and inserting a plug made with a circle cutter or lathe.

When large areas are damaged, saw out the section and replace it, as in Fig. 4, reinforcing the beveled edge joints with battens behind.


## Should Be Built

RAINWATER rushing from roofs will 1 damage many lawns and dampen many basements this spring-because no place has been provided for it to go. One way to dispose of it is to put in a dry well like this as soon as the ground thaws.

If there's a storm sewer in front of your house, you can of course run drain tiles to it and your problem's over. But otherwise, a dry well is the only practical solution.

Digging the hole may put some strain on your back-but aside from that the job isn't difficult. Plan a separate well for each down-

Dig the hole to a depth a little below house footing. Also make it deep enough to allow for at least $12^{\prime \prime}$ of soil above the well cover.


Lay up the blocks in tongue and groove style, giving well a slight conical shape. Fill the space around the outside of well with sand.


Cement the tile joints, using mortar made of one part cement to three of fine sand. Pack oakum into bell before working in the mortar.
spout, and locate each eight or twelve feet from the house.

Line the hole with brick or cesspool block, laid up without cement. Water will then seep through the sides as well as the bottom. Cover the well with a slab of concrete or a cesspool cover.

Use terra-cotta drain tiles to carry water from the downspout, pitching them down about $1^{\prime \prime}$ in each foot so the water will flow smoothly. If it's necessary to cut a tile, fill it with sand and cut with a cold chisel. The sand will keep the tile from cracking.

Before filling in the earth above the drain, try it out by letting water run through. If you find a low spot, raise the tiles there by wedging small stones under both sides. Put a wire cage at the top of the downspout to catch leaves.

For a less permanent type of well, see the drawing below. Sink the barrel into the ground about six feet, fill with gravel, connect the drain, put on a wire mesh or other cover, and shovel back the topsoil. This kind of well does a good job at first, but it eventually will clog up with leaves and other debris and become useless.

It's a good idea to connect the drainage of an automatic washer to a dry well. Thus you reduce the load placed on a regular cesspool or septic tank. Water from the roof, incidentally, never should be carried to a cesspool or septic tank. If filled with rain water, such containers can't take care of household sewage.

## Level in Extension Does Double Duty



You can save the expense of two levels by nesting one in an extension frame. The photos show a $2^{\prime}$ level in a $4^{\prime}$ frame. I used a redwood two-by-four, making the lengthwise inside cuts on a circular saw and the cross cuts with a coping saw. Pieces of $1 /{ }^{\prime \prime \prime}$ plywood glued to the back of the frame at each end and two screw-fastened metal strips on the front keep the level in place.W. G. SAwing a wide piece of plywood or composition board is a lot easier if you'll use a small C clamp. After you make the saw cut deep enough to attach the clamp as shown at right, you can complete the cut without binding.-Joel Miles, Denver.


## Rubber Kit Checks Vibrations

Much of the noise and shock produced by machinery can be muffled with a rubber mounting kit sold by the B. F. Goodrich Co., of Akron, Ohio. The kit includes a $12^{\prime \prime}$ by $12^{\prime \prime}$ rubber pad, rubber tubes, and washershaped rubber snubbers. Pieces of the pad are cut to size and sandwiched between $1 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ steel plates. Pieces of the rubber tube are cut to fit around the machine's hold-down bolts. The snubber goes over the top of the bolt and is followed by a washer and nut.



# What You Should Know About Paint Removers 



Flow remover on with fully loaded brush, using flat of brush (left). Brush in one direction only, not back and forth. A couple of applications may be needed to remove all the old paint. Work only a small area at a time since remover dries fairly fast. When paint surface is soft or 186 popular science
wrinkled (center), scrape it up with a dull putty knife, being careful not to scar the wood. Pour on more remover after paint has been removed and rub surface with No. 0 steel wool (right). This leaves the surface satiny smooth. Then wipe surface with rag and turpentine.


Stand leg of furniture (left) in bucket to catch excess remover and prevent runs onto floor. Semi-paste removers are better for vertical surfaces than liquid removers.

Wear goggles to protect your eyes when using remover on overhead work (right). Also wear them when brushing softened paint out of carvings. Brushing may splatter remover.


Scrape softened paint out of grooves or carvings with old toothbrush (below). Other tools that help in tight spots are a stiff-bristled brush, pointed sticks, and cotton waste.


Fast acting removers-based on powerful chemical solvents-are especially designed for their jobs.

TAKING the old finish off furniture or woodwork needn't be a messy job-if you go about it right with the right remover.

Before the manufacture of solvent-base removers, the only kinds available were the alkaline types. These still are used in industry, but the commercially prepared removers are better for the handyman. They are easy to handle and they won't attack flesh and clothing like the corrosive, alkali types.

## Kinds of Removers

Today's removers can be divided into two major types-those that contain wax and those that don't. The non-wax type is available in both flammable and nonflammable removers. The wax type can be obtained as either a liquid or a semi-paste.

Use new, special remover (below) to take wax, varnish, or shellac off floors and stairs. Flow it on, scrub with No. 3 steel wool, and scrape up dissolved finish with squeegee.


The liquid removers are best suited for use on horizontal surfaces such as table and desk tops. The creamy, semi-paste removers work better on vertical and overhead surfaces like door frames since they are not as likely to run and streak as are the liquid removers.

## Removing Waxy Residue

Removers that contain paraffin to slow up evaporation of the solvent leave a waxy residue that must be taken off after you've finished removing the paint. A new finish will not dry and properly adhere to a waxy surface. Wiping the surface with a rag soaked in benzene or alcohol will remove the wax.

Removers that don't leave a waxy residue usually contain such chemicals as cellulose acetate or ethyl cellulose to retard evaporation instead of wax. Generally speaking, these are more expensive and slower acting than the wax type.

Nonflammable removers also are slower acting than the flammable type, but their safety characteristics make them less danger-
ous for use in a cellar shop. If you use a flammable type, be sure to keep far away from any open flame. A typical flammable remover is made up of three parts of paraffin dissolved in 50 parts of benzol to which is added 25 parts of denatured alcohol and 25 parts of acetone. Don't take chances!

Don't forget, too, that the commercially prepared removers of any type can be dangerous in a poorly ventilated shop. Their vapors may make you extremely ill. Work outdoors if you can. If you must work indoors, watch the ventilation.

## Special Removers for Floors

When you want to remove wax, varnish, or shellac from a floor, use one of the new solvents made especially for this purpose. They are not very effective on paint, but they act fast on clear finishes.

These removers leave the floor bare and clean. No after-rinse is required, and you don't have to use a filler on the floor before refinishing. Just let the floor dry and it's ready for the new finish.

This kind of remover also is excellent for cleaning accumulations of wax and dirt from inlaid linoleum.

## Applying Paint Remover

Removing paint takes a little more work. After you brush on the remover (use an old brush), let it stand until the paint is soft. Don't be impatient. Give the remover time to work. When the paint is soft, scrape it off with steel wool or a putty knife.

You might run into a tough layer of old paint that doesn't soften up with the first coat of paint remover. In such a case, just continue to apply remover. Sooner or later the remover will soften even the hardest paint.

If you use a dull putty knife (as shown in a photo on the first page of this article), scrape carefully with the grain. The U.S. Bureau of Standards recommends using a sharp putty knife held vertically and scraped across the grain.

## Heat Removes Old Paint

Painters frequently remove old, scaled, and cracked paint from the exterior of a wooden house by burning the paint with a blowtorch. The flame softens the paint so it can be scraped off. If you use this method, be careful. A fire hazard exists.

A small electric burner that softens and peels paint away is on the market. This tool
is slow, and it works best on flat surfaces.
A 250 -watt infrared lamp will also soften paint so it can be scraped off. Hold the lamp three or four inches from the surface until the old paint is soft.

## Corrosive Removers

These are sodium compounds-such as caustic soda, soda ash, washing soda, or trisodium phosphate-dissolved in water. They are used boiling hot and are good on iron or steel, particularly where the work can be dunked in the solution. They should not be used on nonferrous metals such as aluminum, zinc, or brass.

## Corrosive Removers Harm Wood

Alkaline removers will take the paint off wood, but they darken most woods. Also, all trace of these solutions must be cleaned off the work after the paint has been removed. Any remover left on the work is likely to destroy the new finish.

These corrosive solutions are extremely dangerous. They attack skin and clothing viciously. When using them, rubber gloves should be worn.

LAZY Susans are recovering some of the popularity they enjoyed a hundred years ago. Here's one you can make quickly.

For the rollers, remove the wheels from four or six awning pulleys. These wheels are turned true, have a diameter of about $1 / 2 \prime$, and have a center hole a little larger than $1 /{ }^{\prime \prime \prime}$. Attach them to the center disk with roundhead wood screws. Drill holes in the edges of the disk for the screws.

Cement or tack a sheet-metal track around the outer edge of the base and under the top deck for the rollers. Sheet aluminum will give quiet operation.

Apply a sealer and two coats of enamel, sanding between coats. After putting on your decorations, spray a coat of transparent plastic on the top deck. This protects the surface from heat and liquids.-Harold Mcllvaine, Moscow, Idaho.

# Homemade Tools from Old Auto Valves 

## Garages have these to give away. Take home a handful, and you'll find plenty of uses for them.

$\mathrm{Y}^{\mathrm{o}}$OU'D find it hard to buy steel as good as you can get free in old auto valves. Most garages will give them to you.

Test the stem and the head with a fine file. Valves vary in hardness. You may get some the file will cut, but most are glass hard. Unless you plan to shape them entirely by grinding, these have to be annealed.

Heat the valve cherry red and immediately bury it in ashes to let it cool slowly. Some alloys don't respond readily to annealing, but since the valves cost nothing, you
can discard stubborn ones or grind them.
The stems make good shafts or pins. By grinding, or turning and filing, you can shape them into punches, countersinks, and other tools. Reharden annealed metal by heating it to bright redness and quenching in oil. Then polish with emery cloth and reheat to temper the steel, judging hardness by the flow of colors.

Valves are almost made to order for drill-press accessories, though you may want to cut the shank off to convenient chuck-


ing length, or get rid of a flared stem end.
Surface planer. Mark off equal spaces and grind four cutting edges as shown in the drawing. Finish by mounting in the drill press and lowering the head gently against a flat oil stone to lap all edges true.

Disk sander. Drill two holes $180^{\circ}$ apart and file them counterclockwise (as seen from the stem side) to keyhole slots. Saw a $3^{\prime \prime}$ disk out of plywood. Turn in two wood screws so they catch firmly in slots.

Hole saw. A large valve from a truck,


airplane, or boat engine is probably best. After annealing, chuck the valve in a lathe and drill a center hole into which a phonograph needle will just fit. Turn the head to diameter, with a shoulder as shown. Drill and tap three or four radial holes.

Break off the ends of old hacksaw blades (the end teeth will still be sharp). Mount them with bolts and washers. Insert the phonograph needle to align the saw with a mark on the work. Clamp work on the drill press, remove needle, and make the hole.

Circle cutter. Drill a $3 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ hole in a valve head at a $45^{\circ}$ angle, at the radius of the circle to be cut. Drill and tap a hole for a setscrew, preferably the hollow-head kind. Use a phonograph needle to center the cutter or, better still, set in a small drill held with a second setscrew under the head. The bit can be ground from $3 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ drill rod. Clamp the work firmly on wood backing.

Dado and milling cutters. Turn the flare under the head to leave the edge the desired thickness. Index for teeth and drill a hole at the bottom of each. File or grind, reharden, and draw to a deep straw.

Star drills and reamers. The flare at either end can be used to advantage. Teeth can be ground with a wheel in a flexible shaft or hand grinder, if you don't wish to anneal the stock. For accuracy, reamers should be turned to shape and rehardened afterward.-S. Palestrant, The Bronx, N.Y.


White Paint Shows Brace Slot. In the dark it's often difficult to prop up your hood with a swinging brace because you can't see the slot. Applying a little white paint around the slot will make it stand out prominently even in poor light.


Altered Pliers Clean Battery Post. To make this handy tool, cut the handles from an old pair of pliers, drill two holes, and braze in a spring-steel handle. Slip the jaws over the post, rotate a few times, and the post will be thoroughly cleaned.


Swinging Reflectors Escape Damage. If you should back your truck into an obstacle, flexibly mounted reflectors will swing under the truck bed without damage. Bolt each reflector to a piece of canvas belting about $12^{\prime \prime}$ long and attach the other end of the canvas to the truck bed with nails or selftapping metal screws.


Choke Handle Is Spring Tool. Here's an easily made tool that Marion L. Rhodes finds handy around his shop in Knightstown, Ind. It's just the thing to hook on or off the small springs in a current and voltage regulator. Carburetor and generator springs are other possible uses. The wire is stiff enough to retain its hook shape.


Glass Magnifies Map Details. A large reading glass mounted under the dash like this will help you see fine print on a highway map. Supported on a pivot, the glass swings into a pocket lined with foam rubber while not in use. This protects the lens
and keeps it clean. A truck clearance lamp clamped to the swinging arm throws light on the map. A lead can be run to the hot side of the ignition switch. For some cars you'll have to vary the setup to suit a different kind of instrument panel.


Reel Stores Extension Cord. House trailers are often equipped with 115 -volt electric wiring circuits, but to bring current into the trailer a long and unwieldy extension cord is required. To simplify handling the cord, A. V. Malone, of Los Angeles, designed this carrier. Wind the cord as shown, each revolution forming a figure eight. The $1^{\prime \prime}$ slots at each end are for hooking the plugs to the carrier.


Did You Know This? A $\frac{17}{4 \prime \prime}$ dash stamped after an engine number means that all the cylinder bores were finished $.010^{\prime \prime}$ oversize at the factory and are equipped with $.010^{\prime \prime}$ oversize pistons and rings. You must take this into account in overhauling such an engine. Motor makers commonly finish all bores this much oversize if one is too large for finishing to nominal size. However, such engines are not considered special.


Here's a working model of electric horn. Photos below show how it was built. Cone projects sound like trumpet on real horn.

THE makers of auto horns have come as far from their early baa-DOO-gah! days as have their brother engine designers. So if the horn on your new car both sounds better and carries farther, it's no accident.
Some horn developments have been purely technical, but others have turned upon the physics of sound. Designers have found, for instance, that pitch is more important than loudness (amplitude) in achieving carrying power, and that loud sounds aren't so unpleasant if they have a musical tone.

Next to fire-engine sirens, the most powerful horns today are the air-blown trumpets used on cross-country trucks and busses and

## How Auto Horns Work

## What happens when you press the button? You'll see quickly if you make these simple working models.

as custom accessories for passenger cars. They work like trumpets in a band, with vibrating reeds or diaphragms taking the place of players' lips.

Magnetically actuated, vibrating-diaphragm electric horns are standard on most passenger cars. They work like household buzzers. The vibrating part is connected by a rod to a thin metal diaphragm.

Horn makers also produce whistles that operate from the exhaust, and air and electric horns on which you can play tunes.

You can see how the various kinds of horns work by performing the experiments below and on the next two pages.

ELECTRIC HORN You can make a working model like the one above in a few minutes. Its magnet is a bolt wound with insulated copper wire. Mount this on an angle bracket.

The L-shaped armature is bent from a strip of tin. The diaphragm is a disk of stiff paper glued at the edge over a smaller hole cut in a piece of corrugated cardboard. Link the diaphragm and armature by a matchstick secured at each end with a drop of sealing wax. The current-breaking contact is formed by the bare tip of one end of the magnet wire that just touches the far side of the armature when the battery is off.

When you connect the free end of the magnet winding to one pole of your battery and the base of the armature to the other, current flows through the coil. The coil becomes magnetized and pulls the armature toward it. This breaks the circuit between armature and contact point, causing the armature to spring back again-only to be once more attracted. The sound of the vibrating armature is increased by the paper diaphragm attached to it. Tone and intensity can be adjusted slightly by changing the pressure on the contact wire. A cardboard cone held against the diaphragm will make the sound louder.



AR HORN $\begin{gathered}\text { This variety } \\ \text { produces }\end{gathered}$
sound in much the same way that a tin horn or your vocal cords do. The old honk-honking horns depended upon a thin metal reed that vibrated strongly when you squeezed the bulb. Some present-day musical horns work on the same principle. More powerful air horns depend upon the vibration of a diaphragm against the end of a trumpet.

You can make a workable vi-brating-reed horn from a soda straw. Flatten one end and cut about 䶂" from each corner as shown in the diagram. Put about $2^{\prime \prime}$ of this end into your mouth. Then blow. Shorten the straw and you will raise the pitch. Add funnels of different sizes and shapes over the end of the straw and you will change and magnify the sound just as trumpets do on a real horn.

KLAXONHorns of this famous type make their OOgah sound when a studded wheel rotates against a projection on the back of a diaphragm. The wheel is turned by an electric motor or by hand through a train of gears. Pitch is changed by varying the wheel speed. You can make a model by cementing a thumbtack to the center of the bottom of an empty salt box, and rubbing a file over the point.


WHSTLE Whistle-type horns work like an organ pipe. A blast of air passes over a sharp edge near one end of a metal pipe. The turbulent air at the edge starts the air in the pipe vibrating at its own natural frequency, determined by the length of the pipe. You can test this principle with soda straws and bottles, as below. Combination tones can be produced by blowing over several bottles of different sizes at once.



SIRENNow often restricted to fire engines, ambulances, police cars, and air-raid warnings, a siren produces its characteristic scream by intermittent puffs of air issuing through holes in a revolving drum or disk. A simple model will show how it works.

Punch a circle of equally spaced holes near the edge of a coffee-can cover. Mount the cover on the shaft of a small grindstone
or fasten it in the chuck of a hand drill. Blow through the holes with a straw, flattened at the nozzle end, as you turn the disk. The harder you blow, the louder; the faster you turn, the higher the pitch.

Commercial sirens usually consist of a metal drum with slots in the periphery. This revolves inside a slotted stationary drum. A fan attached to the rotating drum sucks in air at the axis and hurls it out the slots.

How sound waves are intensified by the use of a trumpet can be shown visually with a candle and a tin can. Remove the top from the can, hold the top a little more than the can's length from the candle, and snap
the top with your finger. The candle doesn't flicker. Now hold the mouth of the empty can near the candle, and snap the bottom of it. This time the sound waves, aimed by the can, disturb the candle flame noticeably. END

## Why struggle with them any longer? They will swing freely and last longer if you mend them now.

By Harry Walton

GARAGE doors fall roughly into three categories: those you can open easily, those you can drag open with a small tractor, and those you have to blast.

If you have type two or three, you won't need to be convinced that repairs are in order. Were they just beginning to drag last fall? Then the chances are a winter of scraping them over ice and snow hasn't improved their condition or your temper.

The earliest good outdoor-working weather is none too soon to fix ailing doors and to protect them against further damage from spring rains.

Where's the trouble? The first thing to determine is whether it's actually the

doors that are sagging, or whether they drag because frost has caused the concrete apron to heave until it scrapes the bottoms of the doors. If the door joints are sound, the frames square, and the hinges securely attached, the apron is probably at fault. The obvious cure is to cut half an inch off the bottom edges of the doors. You can do that without taking the doors down, at the cost of considerable elbow grease and back bending.

More often, the trouble is in the doors themselves. Hinge screws rust and pull loose. Joints rot through and open, particularly at the top of the frames, allowing the outer stiles to drop until the whole frame gets out of square and drags.

Prop it up first. As soon as you've determined where the trouble is, decide whether the door should be wedged up or braced to realign displaced members. It's of little use to tighten a hinge permanently in the same position that allows the door to drag. Don't depend on the hinge screws to lift heavy doors back into place. Give them an assist with wedges or props, as shown in the photos.

Tightening the hinges. If hinge screws have pulled loose from the jamb or rusted out, slightly heavier ones may find anchorage in the old holes. It's better, though, to plug the holes with pieces of dowel, glued in . Or, if the inner face of the jamb is exposed, you can forget about wood screws. Drill right through the old holes and insert flathead bolts, with washers and nuts on the inside of the jamb.

A badly split or rotten jamb will have to be replaced, but where the damage is only under the hinge leaf, you may be able


To lift sagging bottom corner, drive in wedges like this. If open top joint doesn't draw together, close the door and drive wedges again.

the bottom. Then holes were bored, and hardwood dowels, coated with glue, were driven in.



Dowel-repaired joint was reinforced with a batten. Paint was scraped off the door to give glue a good grip, batten was clamped in position, and holes were drilled through. Batten was bolted below rail edge to clear door stop.
to move the hinge up or down into sound territory. If this isn't practical, consider bridging the bad section with a long piece set against the inner face of the jamb. You'll need bolts long enough to go through the jamb and the new piece.

Hinge screws are even more likely to pull loose on the door, which is more exposed to weather than the jamb. Here again you can drill the holes clear through, and use bolts instead of wood screws. Be sure to put washers under the nuts.

Sometimes the wood around screw holes is soft with rot, and even washers and nuts find no solid anchorage. Short of moving the hinge (which is sometimes impossible because the top rail isn't wide enough) your best bet is to drill new holes in other parts of the hinge leaf, away from the old ones.

Pulling joints together. Garage doors stand open so much that rain eventually enters the joints between the stiles. Even paint offers only short-term protection here. Eventually the water-soaked wood rots and the joint disintegrates. It pays, therefore, to make repairs before this happens.

If the tenon is loose in its socket but the wood is still sound, glue and dowels may suffice to hold it together. Work water-

resistant glue well into the joint with a knife blade or spatula. Then wedge the bottom of the door or put a prop against it from the farther jamb, watching the joint to see whether it closes. Bore holes across the joint (from the front to the back of the door) and drive in dowels smeared with glue.

The wood may be so rotten that the tenon has broken off the rail. The photos show several ways of repairing such a joint. Dowels driven in from the end will align the faces, but can't be relied on to hold the joint together by themselves. Add wooden or metal mending plates.

Hold that shape. It's well to give weakened joints some support by tying the bottom outer corner to the top of the hinge stile with a brace of some kind. It may be the conventional turnbuckle support shown in the photos, or a batten fastened on diagonally. Use husky wood screws, preferably brass, galvanized, or cadmium plated, to hold on a batten.

A very substantial brace consists of a panel of plywood screwed (not nailed) to the door below the window area. You can get two pieces (enough for both doors) from a standard 4 by 8 panel. Buy the $3_{8 \prime \prime}^{\prime \prime}$ sheathing grade instead of the more costly


That old standby, the turnbuckle stay, will help pull doors back into shape. If you already haye stays, they may merely need tightening. In putting on new ones, remember to match the left- and right-hand threads on rods and eye.


Plywood bracing panel can be attached with $14^{\prime \prime \prime}$ wood screws $6^{\prime \prime}$ apart. Glue applied to inner face all around edge adds strength and resists entrance of water. Paint plywood promptly after installation, especially along edges.
kind. Paint it well, and keep it painted.
Rainproofing the doors. Any wooden structure must be kept painted to withstand the weather. It pays to repaint garage doors promptly when they need it, and to use a top-quality outdoor paint. Cracks can be filled with putty or weatherproof glue.

The vulnerable top edges of the doors
need special attention. The best protection is a copper or galvanized sheet-metal cap, that you can bend up from a strip or have made at any tinsmith shop. Coat the inside of the cap and the top of the door liberally with roofing cement. Drive nails in through the down-bent sides only, not in the top, to hold the cap on.

END

Water caps are worth installing, even on old doors. Installed on new doors, they'll save you lots of headaches. End grain on stiles takes paint poorly and consequently soaks up water that leads to rotting. Cap can be bent from
sheet metal. Smear thick layer of roofing cement on top of door and then put on cap. Drive nails through sides of cap, not through top. Bend out edge of cap, if necessary, to divert water from mending batten.

 early to get outdoors? The home workshop is the ideal place to spend these long winter evenings. While you're about it, why not try something different? These two projects may take you down a new road, if you've never tried metalworking or wood carving before. They're absorbing to make and nice to have -or to receive as gifts.


Barrow frame is bent into V shape. Legs, formed from one length of square brass, are held on with black iron wire for soldering.


Twisted edging is made by clamping one end of annealed square brass in a vise and locking the other in a T-handled tap wrench. Turn to a tight spiral. Cut off and discard ends.

Wheelbarrow Planter. Brass is the ideal material, but if you paint the piece even tin plate will serve. Bessemer rod is a fair substitute for the $1 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ rod, and radio bus bar for the decorative twist.

Bend a $20^{\prime \prime}$ length of $1 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ rod into a V , and a $10^{\prime \prime}$ length into a pair of legs joined by a crosspiece. Bevel the ends to fit the frame, wire on, and solder.

Drill a No. 44 hole through the frame near the front. Cut a plastic wheel with a $3 / 32^{\prime \prime}$ hole in it. File points on a piece of $1 / 8$ round rod, heat to about soldering temperature, and carefully push it halfway through the disk. Hold it perfectly square until it's cool.

Form the tire from a ${ }_{4 / 4 \prime \prime}^{\prime \prime}$ wide strip of


A dapping die and punch rapidly turn out domes for the decorative pattern. The 26-gauge copper must be annealed at least twice. Wood block and round punch will also make domes.


20 -gauge brass, soldering the joint. Spring apart the frame enough to slip the axle in.

Lay out the body blank and decorative strip on 20 -gauge sheet brass. Hammer the bends to a good fit over a wooden block. Lay bits of solder inside and heat until it flows into the joints.

Centerpunch and drill the $1 /{ }^{\prime \prime \prime}$ holes in the decorative strip, cut and file the scallops to shape, and flatten the strip. File notches at the front corners so that the hidden edge may be bent to match the slope of the front.

Bevel one end of the twisted strip, file notches almost through at the corner bends, and shape it to the body. Bevel the second end to fit the first, and solder it on.

Scour with kitchen cleanser. Then buff to

a high luster. Tin the frame and body, and sweat-solder them together.

For the decorative domes, anneal a strip of 26 -gauge sheet copper. Shape on a die as shown, or over a depression in a wooden block, using a ball-tipped punch. Anneal again before forming to full depth, or the metal will crack. Cut out the domes and file the edges flat.

File a bar of solder to obtain granules you can lay alongside these pieces after placing them on the body. Then apply a torch to flow the solder under them.

Wash the barrow in hot soap water, dry, and wipe with lacquer thinner. Apply clear lacquer to preserve the polish-Bill Luther, Los Angeles.

Seagoing Book Ends. Glance up at these from a sea story, and you'll almost hear the wind whistling in the rigging. What's more suitable for your adventure and hobby books?

Cut ${ }_{4}^{3 / \prime \prime}$ stock for bases and uprights, bevel or shape the edges, and hollow the bases. Mount fishing sinkers or sheet lead inside with countersunk screws. Cover the underside with felt or blotter material.

Use dark wood like mahogany or walnut for the hull, white stock such as maple or poplar for the sails. Jigsaw these parts to outline, and glue a thin piece of white wood to the hull as a deck. Shape roughly with a rasp, or on a sander. Then work with knife, files, and sandpaper. Taper a bit of dowel for a mast, flattening one side. Glue the carving on, stain and fill as required, and varnish.-W. Freeman, Baldwin, N.Y.


You can dye the webbing any color you want. The leg arches are laminated for strength.


To apply webbing, clamp frame in vertical position, turn under ends of strips about $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, and fasten with upholstery nails, two to each strip. After tacking all strips on one side . . .

Clamp frame flat, pull strips tight one at a time, and tack temporarily in wide part of frame. Then clamp frame vertically, drive upholstery nails on inside, and remove tacks.

INDOORS or out, this webbed chair fills a definite need. During the winter, it's just the thing beside a TV set. When warm weather comes, you can take it out to the lawn or terrace, for weather won't harm it if you apply a protective finish. Materials to build it cost less than $\$ 12$.

Poplar was chosen for the legs and arms because it is easily worked, strong, and has a natural whiteness that requires no bleaching for that up-to-date finish. The seat and back frames are hardwood.

Making the frames. The seat and back frames are identical squares. Corners are joined by mortises and tenons, glued up and clamped. Outer edges should be chamfered so the webbing will wrap smoothly.

The structural frame holds the legs together and supports the seat frame. It is also square, but $1 /{ }^{\prime \prime \prime}$ larger than the seat frame to allow for the thickness of the webbing. It is put together with lap joints, glued, and reinforced with screws.

Legs are laminated. The accompanying drawing will guide you in laying out the legs. They are laminated in two layers. Each layer is $78^{\prime \prime}$ thick ( $3_{4}^{\prime \prime \prime}$ would be all right, too) and there are five pieces in each leg. The outer pieces join at the top and are cut with the grain running lengthwise. The inner layer has a top segment that crosses from side to side, with the grain running that

Cross-webbing is done same way except that the strips are woven in and out of first ones. Be sure to space strips evenly. Here upholstery nails are being driven before removal of tacks.

way; and two lower segments with the grain running vertically.

Assemble them with a phenolic-resin glue and keep clamped tightly for 12 hours. After removing the clamps, sand all edges smooth. In cutting the two arms, notice that the notches into which the back frame fits are inclined backward at a $12^{\circ}$ angle.

You can dye the webbing. For the webbing use $2^{\prime \prime}$ heavy white canvas strap with selvaged edges. This canvas can be dyed any desired color with inexpensive dye available in dime stores. You'll need about 66 feet of webbing. Cut it into 28 strips $28^{\prime \prime}$ long.

To facilitate the webbing work, make a cardboard rule the same length as the inside of the frame and mark it into seven divisions $2^{\prime \prime}$ wide, starting at the end. This can be held next to the frame when the webbing is being attached, assuring accurate spacing.

What finish? This is up to you, but remember to apply the final finish to the side and back frames before putting on the webbing. For outdoor use, a spar varnish or enamel does well. For indoors and a really modern job, clear lacquer and wax is the thing.

Final assembly. Do this after all units are complete. The seat frame is attached to the top of the structural frame with six $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ No. 8 wood screws driven from underneath and countersunk; two in front, two in back, and one on each side.

Next the arms go on, held by three screws into the tops of the legs. These screws are also countersunk and plugged with wood plugs matching the arm material. They are later sanded down and the top of each arm given another finish coat. The back is slid down into its arm notches until it rests on

## Flooring Makes a Fine Talle

T'HERE'S plenty of space on this mansized table. You can lay out a fourhanded card game without crowding and still have room for drinks and ash trays. It's $364^{\prime \prime}$ square-about 400 sq. in. more top

area than the average card table provides.
The handsome top is built of scrap strips of hardwood flooring. The table is big enough and heavy enough to be used in a breakfast room, a dining area, or as a typing table.

Construction is simple. Start it with the top. Cut out a $36^{\prime \prime}$ square of $3_{4}^{\prime \prime \prime}$ plywood for the bottom layer. Miter the ends of the four strips of flooring that form the border of the top. Rip the tongue off the edges of these four pieces. Screw and glue three of these border pieces to the plywood square to form a U .

Fit strips of flooring into the U , nailing them to the plywood as shown in a photo on the opposite page. Screw and glue the fourth border piece in place. Miter the ends of some oak drawer slides and nail them around the top.

Use dressed two-by-twos for the legs, sawing them so the top of the table will be $29^{\prime \prime}$ from the floor. Nail and glue oak drawer slides to the sides of the legs. This gives them a fluted appearance and matches the oak of the top and the slides around the edges of the top. Fasten the legs to the top


Disk sander is handy for truing mitered pieces. Top of legs also should be squared up before you dowel and glue them to the table top.


Drive nails at angle through tongue of flooring. That way the next strip of flooring will hide nailheads in preceding strip.


Counterbored holes for screws that hold border should be at regular intervals. Then plugs that hide screwheads will form a pattern.
with $1 /{ }^{\prime \prime}$ " dowels and glue. Add metal angles to strengthen the legs where they meet the top.

Sanding the top may be troublesome because two of the border pieces are at right angles to the other strips of flooring. Masking tape along these edges will aid in preventing cross-grain scratches.

IF YOU are somewhat beyond the "normal" TV range and your pictures are weak... If one station that you especially want comes in poorly . . .

If you are near a transmitter but can't have a roof-top antenna . . .
. . . You should try a television booster.
It may strengthen the faint signals plucked out of the air by your antenna. A booster can be attached to your set in a jiffy. The only tool you need is a screwdriver.

If the booster decidedly improves your
pictures, you are in luck. If the images are still pale and snowy, you're not entirely out of luck; you can try boosters of other makes and possibly find a better one.

There is no way to be sure that a booster will help-except to try one with your receiver in your home. Recognizing this, many dealers will let you have one on trial. The best boosters cost only about $\$ 30$, and a satisfactory one may prove much cheaper than a new set or an elaborate antenna.

Boosters may be roughly classified according to the number of controls that have to be operated. Tunable models require the most adjustment, semi-tunable boosters need somewhat less attention, and the non-tunable need no attention at all. Most nontunable ones and some of the others have

automatic switches that turn them on or off when the receiver is operated. In most of the automatic models the regular on-off switch is linked with an aerial change-over device that cuts the lead-in directly over to the receiver when the booster is turned off.

Generally speaking, the tunable boosters

Simplest kind of booster uses only one miniature tube. Others have up to four tubes. Larger models usually contain two separate amplifiers, one for low and one for high band.



Tunable boosters like this generally give most amplification but must be tuned to match set.


Semi-tunable type has switch for high or low band operation plus a fine-tuning adjustment.


Non-tunable booster requires no adjustment. Automatic switch makes it easiest type to use.

## Color Need a Boost?

If you need a booster now, you'll need one at least as much to receive colorcasts. In the CBS method, the illusion of color is created by means of a revolving disk composed of red, blue, and green filters. These filters hold back part of the light, so the image on the picture tube has to be pretty bright before the filters are brought into play. A booster may make the difference between gloomy shades and bright color.
boosters are better on the low bands than on the high. The same is true, for that matter, of TV receivers.

A booster also may improve your neighbor's reception by eliminating interference that is generated in your set and radiated by your aerial. A booster, connected between an offending receiver and its antenna, acts as a buffer and prevents the energy from getting out to bother others.

A factor that limits the amount of useful amplification you can squeeze out of boosters is "noise" due to electronic agitation in tubes and to other obscure sources. This shows up on the screen as irregular splotches and may spoil the "boosted" picture.

One non-tunable booster is unusual in that it is designed for mounting on the roof, close to the aerial itself. It is being used even in strong-signal areas where the down lead from the antenna unavoidably passes close to electrical devices that cause interference.

If a booster is placed near the receiver, it amplifies both the video signals and interference. But when placed between the top of the lead-in and the antenna, it amplifies the video signals but not the interference picked up by the lead-in.

The "best" booster is the one that gives results with your set.

If one booster amplifies signals to a certain degree, will two boosters in tandem work twice as well? A man in Pennsylvania is using this unorthodox combination with a classy antenna atop a 75 -foot mast. He enjoys fairly regular reception on ten channels, including five stations that are more than 1,000 miles away!

Then the surface is wiped with a cloth, leaving a tinned area to which solder will adhere. The paint, sold by Swiss Laboratory, Cleveland, Ohio, also can be used to tin welds. A 1-lb. can sells for $\$ 1.75$.

## Rolling Out the Screen Wire

A pair of roller skates bolted to a counter bottom side up makes it easy to roll out screen wire for measurement at the C. J. Harris Lumber Company, Washington, Mo. You just lay the roll on the skates and pull.


## Rubber on Hammer Saves Woodwork

When you're working in close quarters, the hammer's claw sometimes mars nearby woodwork. You can prevent this by padding the claw with a piece of sponge rub-
 ber. Hold the rubber in place with a rubber band.-Bess Ritter, Yonkers, N.Y.

## Magnet Replaces Spring in Valve

## How You Can the Fights

Like a ringside cameraman, you must anticipate the action. For best results, shoot at $1 / 50 \mathrm{sec}$.-and overdevelop.

N
EXT time you watch a prize fight on TV, keep one eye on the edge of the ring, and you'll occasionally see a newspaper photographer push his camera under the ropes to snap a picture.

What these men do at ringside, you now can try at home-on TV. The pictures you get may not have all the zing of ringside shots but they'll be surprisingly good.

Shooting fights is a little more tricky than other types of TV photography. For one thing, you must try to beat the fighters to the punch with your shutter finger-just as news photographers do.

Listen to an expert's opinion: "You can't wait until you see a fighter land a blow," says Mathew Zimmerman, an Associated Press photographer who has shot many standout photos during his dozen years as a ringside specialist. "You've got to outfigure the fighter. You must shoot your pictures in that split second when the action is in the windup stage, so you'll record it when it happens."

You may have seen Matty during fights telecast from Madison Square Garden. At

ringside he always has the same positionthe left corner opposite the TV camera.
"The experienced photographer knows his fighters, and their style of fighting," Zimmerman adds. "He knows pretty well when to expect the jabs, hooks, crosses, and uppercuts. He has to know if he is to get good action pictures."

At ringside, a press photographer shoots with overhead speed lights focused on the ring. When he trips the shutter, these throw a brilliant flash lasting only about $1 / 5,000$ of a second. It is this flash, and not the shutter, that "freezes" the action of the fastmoving fighters.

TV requires slow speeds. As you sit before your TV set, with your camera rigidly supported on a tripod, you can't, of course, resort to such superspeeds. The nature of the television image itself limits your shutter speeds to the lower brackets. But to stop the action, you obviously want to shoot as fast as possible.

Ever since television came along, photographers have been advised not to shoot faster than $1 / 25$ second. The reason? It takes $1 / 30$ second for each image to develop fully. Hence, at any shutter speed faster than $1 / 30$ second your photo would show an image that lacks some scanning lines.

But shooting at $1 / 25$ second did not satisfy Bill Morris, chief photographer of

## How images are produced on your television set.



Each $1 / 60$ second the scanning beam, a pin point of light, moves in slanting zigzag lines from top to bottom of tube. This produces a "field." As it moves, the beam momentarily records an image made up of tones ranging from black to white. In a single field, your eye could see a recognizable image, but with spaces between lines picture would be incomplete.


A second scanning, also taking $1 / 60$ second, is needed to give a full image. This is called the "interlace." Scanning beam moves back and forth over spaces not covered first time. Consequently, the interlace lets you see parts of image you didn't see in first field. Sketches are exaggerated. Actually, there are at least 250 scanning lines in one field.


Complete TV image consists of two fields, one interlaced with the other. This is called a "frame." A new one is produced each $1 / 30$ second. A succession of frames, one following the other without measurable delay, creates action you see. In effect, each frame is a still picture. Actually, there may be slight movement of image from one field to next.

Popular Science. At that speed he found it next to impossible to get satisfactory TV photos of fights, dancing, and other fast action. So he set out to experiment with faster speeds-specifically $1 / 50$ and $1 / 100$ second.

And here are the results. Eventually he found that $1 / 50$ second at $f / 3.5$ gave him what he wanted-a good image with little or no movement. To compensate for the underexposure that results at these settings, even with Super XX and other film of equal speed, he overdevelops all his shots. Using D-76 developer, he gives his film 45 or 60 minutes of development instead of the customary 15. This formula causes no chemical fog in prolonged development, and in moderate enlargements his $2^{1 / 4^{\prime \prime}}$ by $2 \frac{1 / 41 "}{}{ }^{\prime \prime}$ negatives give no trouble from grain.

Turn brightness above normal. For all his TV shots Bill uses a $2^{1 / 4^{\prime \prime}}$ by $2^{1 / 44^{\prime \prime}}$ reflex fitted with a portrait attachment and moved in close to a $10^{\prime \prime}$ screen. While shooting, he turns the brightness a little above normalbut not enough to wash detail out of the highlights. He shoots with the lens open wide at $\mathrm{f} / 3.5$.

If your camera has an $f / 4.5$ lens, you still can probably get good fight photos by developing your film longer, say to 75 or 90 minutes. Should you be using sheet film, you can of course buy film that is far faster than the Super XX type. This will not require such long development.

Sketches show what happens. Why $1 / 50$ second shutter speed is the most practical for stopping TV action is shown in the accompanying sketches. First, study how a TV image is formed. Then see what happens at different shutter speeds.
(This explanation refers only to between-the-lens shutters. Focal-plane shutters are sometimes used for TV shooting, but most photographers do not favor them because of their different action-a slit sweeping across the film.)

Even though some scanning lines are missing at $1 / 50$ second, this makes very little difference. In moderate blow-ups, you'll never notice they aren't there. Best of all, the one scanning field and part of another enables you to get many shots without the blurs that come from fast action.

What about $1 / 30$ second? In theory, a shutter opening of $1 / 30$ second might be considered ideal, especially if the shutter could be synchronized to open and close with the beginning and completion of in-
dividual TV frames. But modern between-the-lens shutters, except for one or two unreliable ones, don't offer $1 / 30$ second.

Actually, if you had that choice you still would be better off shooting at $1 / 50$. At the
slower speed, your shutter opening could very easily straddle parts of three different TV fields-in each of which the subject may have moved slightly. At $1 / 50$, you stay within two fields.

END

## What happens when you shoot at different speeds.



First point to remember is that it's a moving pin point of light, the scanning beam, that produces an image on film in your camera. Because of the rapidity with which the beam moves you may tend to think of a TV image as similar to your Uncle George-always there. But it's not. It just seems to be. Photographing a TV image is like opening the shutter of your camera in an absolutely dark room and then moving the beam of a spotlight back and forth across stockstill Uncle George, starting at his head. There's one difference, however. With Uncle G., you'd get a complete photo in one spotlight scanning from head to toe. On TV it takes two trips to fill in the picture.


At $1 / 50$ second you have the best chance of taking action TV photos without blurring. At this speed you give scanning beam time to produce a complete field and a good part of another. The amount you get of the second will depend on how accurately your shutter is working. If it is actually slower than $1 / 50$ second, as many shutters are, you'll get just that much more of the second field.


At $1 / 100$ second your camera shutter doesn't give the TV scanning beam time to form even a single $1 / 60$ second field. Consequently, an unexposed strip shows up across negative. Where strip falls depends on what point scanning beam had reached when shutter opens. The same unexposed strip would result while you are spot scanning Uncle George if you closed shutter as the beam reached his knees. You'd get no photo of his feet because they were not yet illuminated. In a $1 / 100$-second TV photo, unexposed strip may show some detail because the scanning beams continue to glow for about $1 / 1,000$ second after beam has passed. If there's no strip, your shutter is probably slow.


At $1 / 10$ second you must catch your subject absolutely still to get a shot without movement. During that interval, the TV scene has been scanned six times. This means you have a combination picture of six different fields, in each of which subject may have moved slightly. You'll probably have blurred result above. At $1 / 25$ second, or better still $1 / 50$, you reduce chance of motion.

Sheet Glass Is Stored Safely Between Pages of Book

FIIVE cents worth of hardware is enough to make a pickproof magnetic lock for any wooden door or drawer. It will baffle anyone unless he has a magnet and knows just what to do with it.



The drawer is locked when either steel ball is wedged between a vane and a side of the groove. Using two balls and grooves rather


A thin brass or aluminum cover plate holds the lock parts together and provides a bearing for the bolt. The latch should engage a striker plate in the frame. Fit a decorative knob to the outside end of the bolt so you can turn the latch.

## Metal Strips Copy Contours

If the front of the door or drawer you want to lock is less than $3_{4}^{3 \prime \prime}$ thick, glue a block to the back. If there are grooves or mortises left by removal of an ordinary lock, glue in blocks of wood to fill them. Some cut-and-try fitting is usually necessary to get all parts to work smoothly. Inside tracks of the routed grooves should be reasonably smooth and there should be no places where a ball can become jammed. Oil each ball lightly to retard rusting.

Most magnets have well polished faces. If you find that sliding a magnet over the surface of the wood tends to scratch the finish, however, cover the magnet faces with cellulose tape.

## This Amplifier Sounds Big but Is Only $4^{\prime \prime}$ by $4^{\prime \prime}$

TS SPACE precious in your house?
1 Here's an amplifier for a record player or radio tuner that matches or surpasses the performance of most full-sized sound reproducers, but takes up less space than a cup of coffee. With it, you can tuck a radio-phonograph into a bookcase or end table.

Miniature parts make it possible to put such an amplifier on a $4^{\prime \prime}$ by $4^{\prime \prime}$ chassis. All told, it shouldn't cost you more than $\$ 15$ and an evening's time to build this unit. The design takes full advantage of five miniature tubes to give you smooth, undistorted amplification, and enough

Miniature parts make it possible to squeeze a radiophonograph combination into a small bookcase. Details of radio tuner, center, will be given next month.


After you've drilled all chassis holes, mount the tube sockets, input strip, and controls. Wire the tube filaments in series, and connect the 6AQ6 cathodes (pins 2) together. Do the same with the 35B5 cathodes (pins 2) and screen grids (pins 6). Wire up the input terminals and volume control (R1) with shielded wire and ground the braid. Install the small resistors and condensers shown.
sound volume to fill a room. Among its features are push-pull pentode output, a phase inverter, and separate volume and tone controls.

The secret of keeping this or any other


Your completed high-fidelity amplifier looks like this. You can use it with almost any perma-nent-magnet loudspeaker if you select the right voice-coil taps on the universal output transformer. For the input you may use a record player, microphone, or an FM or AM radio tuner. Any two of these may be connected at the same time, for as you turn volume up on one you automatically turn it down on the other.


Bring the line cord through a hole in the back of the chassis, protecting it with a grommet at the point of entry. Wire one side of the cord to the switch, the other to pins 3 and 5 of the 35 W 4 rectifier. You can now install and wire the remaining large parts, such as the output transformer (T1) and socket, the dual-electrolytic filter condenser (C5, C6) and the remaining resistor and condenser.
electronic unit compact is to lay it out carefully and wire the parts systematically. Before you remove the miniature tubes from the cartons, stand the boxes on the chassis to determine the approximate spacing. Four of the tubes-two 6AQ6's and two 35B5'sfit in a straight line parallel to and about $1^{\prime \prime}$ from the rear edge of the chassis. The fifth tube, a 35 W 4 rectifier, is directly forward of the last tube in this line.

To seat the tube sockets, you have to drill, punch, or ream out holes $5_{8 \prime \prime}$ in diameter. Some types of sockets can be locked in with clips; other types require additional holes for hold-down screws or rivets. On the back of the chassis make the necessary holes and cutouts for a 3 -terminal binding post, a 2 -prong output socket, and a rubber grommet to protect the line cord.

On the front, two $3_{8 \prime \prime}^{\prime \prime \prime}$ holes-for the volume and tone controls-are needed. Mounting holes for the output transformer complete the drilling.

To conserve space and ease your work, proceed with the wiring in an orderly sequence. When you've finished, take a couple of minutes to recheck all the wiring. Trace the filament and line-cord connections. And look for blobs of solder that may cause shorts between the closely spaced contacts on the miniature-tube sockets.

If the assembly passes this inspection, insert the tubes in their sockets, plug the amplifier into a 115 -volt AC or DC outlet and connect a loudspeaker to the output socket. If the amplifier doesn't work on DC, reverse the line plug in its socket.

You can link the amplifier to a phono-
graph pickup, a radio tuner, or both. If both are used, connect one to terminals 1 and 2 and the other to 1 and 3 of the input strip. The center-tapped volume control favors one pair of terminals when it's turned to the left and the other pair when it is moved to the right.

## PAPERING PLYWOOD



Good papering can be done over plywood only when the sheets have been well-installed and separated from studs by furring strips to insulate them from frame movement. Joints should be tightly butted or filled with solidly glued splines. Fill all nail holes, hammer marks, and other blemishes with Swedish putty or a good commercial water putty, using a small trowel or wide putty knife. When dry, sand flush.

Coat the plywood with a wheat-flour paste fortified with a gelatin glue size. Put a coating of the paste on smooth building felt and apply it to the plywood, butting the joints and rolling smooth. For the very best results use a canvas or muslin sheeting instead of felt. Hang paper over either in the usual manner, using wheat-flour paste.

Lathe faces front. Panel has been turned $180^{\circ}$ and motor moved. Outboard turning is possible.

MY SHOP is small. Space is always at a premium. Here was my problem:
I had to mount a jigsaw and a woodworking lathe.

One solution was to build separate stands for them. But stands would take up floor space. Another solution was to mount them on top of my workbench. That meant giving up valuable working space.

What I needed was a way to mount the tools so they would be rigid enough to use; make use of the same motor; and yet be easily movable so they could be stowed away when not needed.

The answer was a portable, two-faced bench top that I secure on my regular bench. With one face toward the front, the jigsaw is ready to use. Turn the top around and the lathe is in position.

Two pairs of loose-pin hinges bolted to the bench top locate the motor. One set of hinge leaves is bolted to the motor base. By pulling the pins I can turn the motor to drive either tool. Or I can remove the motor for other jobs.

When I don't need the jigsaw or lathe, I slip the bench top under my permanent bench.-D. B. Neagley, Merced, Calif.

## How to Build a



Few sports give you the sheer thrill of speed that outboard racing does. Even a motor with low horsepower will send this hull skimming across the water.

HOW can I get started in outboard racing? How much will it cost?
What kind of a hull do I need?
What kind of a motor do I need?
Put these questions to any 10 drivers of

The Flying Saucer, shown below at rest, got its name from its disklike look when seen head on.

racing outboards and you'll probably get 10 different answers.

But here's one answer-one that you can do something about without laying out your life's savings for a racing outfit.

I built this racing hull-I call it the Flying Saucer-for about $\$ 45$, including the steering wheel and aluminum fin. With a $7 \frac{112}{2}-\mathrm{hp}$. Mercury motor, I can hit $30 \mathrm{~m} . \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{h}$.

Building the hull is simple. I made every effort to avoid difficult construction operations. As you can see from the photos, the deck beams and frames were drilled to make them lighter. This is not necessary, but if you do drill them, don't get the hull's weight below the $75-\mathrm{lb}$. minimum required by the American Power Boat Association for Class M (midget) outboard hydroplanes.

## Accessories You'll Need

The photos and drawings on the next six pages give detailed, step-by-step construction plans. Besides the lumber, you'll need a steering wheel, a fin, and a throttle.

I bought an aluminum fin for about $\$ 2$.

## Flying Saucer

Full throttle sends the Flying Saucer skipping over the water. The boat looks like a professional racing hull but doesn't have a step bottom. Absence of step qualifies it for stock-boat racing. Profile and plan drawings below.


A $4^{\prime \prime}$ by $8^{\prime \prime}$ fin is the right size for this hull. The steering wheel cost $\$ 10$ and the automatic, or crash-type, throttle cost about $\$ 6$.

Screw the fin in the exact center of the keel batten. Locate it so the front of the fin is $36^{\prime \prime}$ forward of the transom.

## Painting the Hull

I gave the hull-except the deck-three coats of spar varnish. For the deck, I used white and flame-red auto enamel. This enamel has a high gloss and is not harmed by water, sun, oil, or gasoline. It may be waxed just like your car and sheds water like a duck. I used two coats each of red and white to give the deck a two-color job. Sand lightly between coats.

## Lumber You'll Need

Frames: 1 piece, 1 "x8"x8' fir.
Deck Beams: 1 piece, $1^{\prime \prime} \times 8^{\prime \prime} \times 88^{\prime}$ fir.
Transom: 1 piece, $1^{\prime \prime} \times 10^{\prime \prime} \times 6^{\prime}$ fir.
Bow block: 1 piece, $1^{\prime \prime} \times 10^{\prime \prime} \times 8^{\prime}$ fir.
Keel batten, lower chine battens, deck
battens: 1 piece, 1 "x6"x8' fir.
Outer chine battens: 1 piece, $1^{\prime \prime} \times 22^{\prime \prime} x 8^{\prime}$ fir.
Bottom planking: 1 panel, $1 / 4_{4}^{\prime \prime} \times 4^{\prime} \times 8^{\prime}$ marine plywood.
Deck planking: 1 piece, $1 /{ }^{\prime \prime \prime} \times 4^{\prime} \times 8^{\prime}$ marine plywood.
Brass screws: 2 gross $1^{\prime \prime}$ No. 6; 2 gross 3/" No. 5; 4 doz. $1^{1 / 2 \prime \prime}$ No. 8.
Waterproof glue. Marine glue.


Frames and deck beams. The drawings with the squares give you the shape and dimensions of both frames and beams. Note that frame No. 1 measures $1 / z^{\prime \prime}$ at its ends. The other frames measure $2^{\prime \prime}$ at the ends. This is because the outer chine battens are tapered from frame No. 2 toward the bow. After you have the frames and beams cut out, trace the location of all notches for the battens on one frame and one beam. Then transfer the locations to the other frames and beams, as shown above. That way all notches will match. Frames and beams are bolted together in one of last steps of hull assembly.


FRAME No. 1

$1 / 2 \times 3 / 4$ NOTCH FOR


Transom. Lay out this stern piece from the drawing below. You have both plan and profile views. The profile shows you the $102^{\circ}$ angle at which the battens meet the transom. Cut the angles carefully so the planking will be a smooth, tight fit. In the photo at right, the angle of the top of the transom is being checked. Notches for battens and chines have not been cut, but the $3_{4}^{\prime \prime \prime}$ by $1 \frac{1 / 2 "}{\prime \prime}$ strip to strengthen base of transom has been added with glue and screws. Bottom of this piece must be beveled to match angle of transom's bottom. Attach the motor board with waterproof glue and $1 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ brass bolts, $2 / 1^{\prime \prime \prime}$ long. Then build up the back of upper part of motor board with ${ }_{3}^{\prime \prime}$ " fir as shown, attaching the pieces with glue and bolts.



Bow block. This part is laminated from two thicknesses of $3_{4}^{\prime \prime \prime}$ fir. Five pieces, as shown above, make up the block. The drawing at right gives you the shapes and dimensions of the parts. The two main pieces can be cut from the $10^{\prime \prime}$ by $6^{\prime}$ fir plank. The other parts can be cut from leftover material. Use waterproof glue and clamp the pieces together to form the block. Let the glue set overnight. The profile drawing of the frame shows how the thickness of the bow block tapers from $1 \frac{1 / 2 \prime \prime}{\prime \prime}$ at frame No. 1 to $1^{\prime \prime}$ at the very front of the bow Lay the block on a bench and taper it with a jack plane. Taper only one side. The side you taper will be the bottom of the bow block.



Framing jig. This is made from a two-byfour, $8^{\prime}$ long. Select a straight two-by-four and lay out the notches as shown in the drawing below. The squares on the drawing show you the shape of the curve that begins at frame No. 2 and continues to the bow. Mark this curve on the two-by-four and saw it to shape. Then nail legs to the jig so it looks like the photo at left. Add the strips to support the bow block and the transom-as shown in the drawing below-and the jig is completed. Be sure the jig is level and solidly built.



Keel-batten assembly. After ripping the keel batten to size, cut one end of it to a $10^{\circ}$ angle where it meets the bow block. Lay the bow block on the floor, bottom up, as shown above. Support the keel batten and attach it to the bow block with waterproof glue and two 1 " No. 6 and two $1^{1 / 2 "}$ No. 8 screws. Then place the frames in their notches on the jig. Clamp the transom to the support that you have nailed to the stern end of the jig.


Bow-block and keel-batten assembly. Pick up the assembled bow block and keel batten and place the block on the framing jig. Clamp the bow block in position. Apply the marine glue to the center notch in each frame. Bend the keel batten down into the notches and clamp it. Then fasten the keel batten with two 11/2" No. 8 screws into each frame. Attach the bow block to frame No. 1-as shown above-with waterproof glue and $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " No. 8 screws.


Outer chine-batten assembly. Mark the exact location of each frame on the outerchine battens. Then when they are attached, the frames will be correctly placed. Excess material may be left on the stern end of the battens and sawed off after assembly. Taper the outer chine battens from 2" at frame No. 2 to $1 \frac{112 \prime \prime}{}$ at frame No. 1. Do the tapering on the bottom of these battens. The deck side remains perfectly straight. These battens extend $6^{\prime \prime}$ in front of frame No. 1, and are faired into the bow block. Attach the outer chine battens to the transom and to each frame, as shown in the photo at left, with marine glue and two $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ No. 8 screws. Add two $1^{\prime \prime}$ No. 6 screws where the battens meet the bow block.

Lower chine-batten assembly. One end of these battens must be beveled $10^{\circ}$ to fit the bow block. Apply marine glue there and clamp the beveled ends to the bow block. Then anchor the ends to the block with three $1^{\prime \prime}$ No. 6 screws, as shown in the photo at right. Use glue and $1 \nless /{ }^{\prime \prime}$ No. 8 screws to fasten these battens to their notches in the frames and to the transom. Put one screw into each notch.


Finishing the frame assembly. The final step before applying the bottom planking is beveling and trimming the outer and lower chines but not the keel batten. Then the bottom planking will fit evenly. Go over the members with a
plane-as shown below-to make sure the planking will fit snugly. Center photo shows you a bow view of the completed frame assembly, while the photo at right shows a stern view. Note holes in frames to lighten hull.


Beveled planking. The three parts of the bottom planking are cut from one $4^{\prime}$ by $8^{\prime}$ panel of $1 /{ }^{\prime \prime \prime}$ marine plywood. Be very careful in ripping this panel; it makes the bottom planking with very little waste. Rip two strips $64^{\prime \prime \prime}$ wide off the panel. These narrow pieces are attached to the frames, chines, and transom, as shown at right. Apply a liberal coat of marine glue to frames and chines. Then clamp the plywood in place. Attach to all frames, chines, and transom with $1^{\prime \prime}$ No. 6 screws. Space the screws $2^{\prime \prime}$ apart.


Trimming beveled planking. After all screws have been driven into the two narrow pieces of beveled planking, saw off the excess material at the ends of the strips flush with the back of the transom and around the curve of the bow. Hold a plane so its bottom is parallel with the side of the outer chine batten and trim off the edges of each strip until it is flush with the outside of the outer chine batten. Follow the same procedure where the plywood is attached to the lower chine batten, planing it flush as shown in the photo at left.

Bottom planking. This is what remains of your $4^{\prime} \times 8^{\prime}$ panel of ${ }^{1 / 4 \prime \prime}$ marine plywood. Apply marine glue to the transom, battens, and frames. Place the bottom in position and clamp it to the bow block. Use $1^{\prime \prime}$ No. 6 brass screws $2^{\prime \prime}$ apart to attach the bottom. Drive screws along the keel batten first. Then drive screws along the lower chine battens, as shown in the photo at right. Saw off the excess material at the transom and bow. Do not bevel the outside edges of this piece of plywood. Leave it square. Finally, sand the entire bottom. Start with No. 1 paper and finish with $1 / 2$ and $1 / 0$ paper. Brush a coat of spar varnish over the bottom, outer chines, and transom. This first coat should be thinned with turpentine.


Deck beams and battens. With the bottom finished, turn the boat over. Bolt the deck beams to the frame with $1 /{ }^{1 / \prime \prime}$ by $2 \frac{1}{4 \prime \prime}$ brass carriage bolts. Use $34^{\prime \prime}$ No. 5 screws and glue to attach the vertical supports to beams No. 2, 3, and 4. You can see these supports in the photos below. Two deck battens run the length of the boat.

The center batten runs from deck beam No. 2 to the bow. Fit all three in their notches with glue and attach them with $1^{\prime \prime}$ No. 6 screws. The ends of the battens are beveled where they meet the bow block. Use a plane and sandpaper to see that battens fit flush with beams. Coat inside of hull and beams with spar varnish.



Deck planking. This is $1 / 81$ marine plywood and it is put on in four pieces. One piece goes on each side of cockpit (above) between transom and the center of deck beam No. 2. The other two pieces fit between beam No. 2 and the bow. The two forward pieces meet in the center of the center batten. Lay the plywood on the deck frame, reach under and mark the shape. Cut out with a sharp knife; sawing tends to splinter the thin veneer. Attach the plywood to beams and battens with marine glue and $3_{4}^{\prime \prime}$ No. 5 screws. Place screws $2^{\prime \prime}$ apart. Leave about $1 / 2 \prime \prime$ of extra plywood around the outside edges when you cut out the deck pieces. Trim off excess after plywood has been screwed in place. On the forward planking, screw it to deck beam No. 1 first, then to center deck batten, to bow block, and to other deck batten.

Cockpit. The sides of the cockpit are made of $1 / 4$ " marine plywood. Apply glue to the edges of the transom and to the deck battens where those parts meet the cockpit sides. Attach the sides with $1^{\prime \prime}$ No. 6 screws, placed $2^{\prime \prime}$ apart, as shown in the photo below. To give yourself a comfortable place to crouch when you race the hull, nail floor boards of $1 / 4 / 1$ plywood over the frames on the bottom of the cockpit. You can make a duckboard for the cockpit bottom instead of the permanent floor boards. The bow end of the cockpit sides are notched to fit over frame No. 2. Paint the sides of the cockpit white to match rear of deck.


## Support Keeps Framing Square Steady

When you square long boards with a framing square, the square has a tendency to rock. This can be prevented by supporting the body of the square on the board with a small metal guide mounted as shown. - William B. Eagan, Louisville, Ky.


## Two Circles Square End of Board



Here's an easy, accurate way to square the end of a board when a steel square is not available. Use a paint can-or any cylindrical object - and draw two circles that touch the edge of the board. Draw a line through the two points where the circles intersect. You'll have a line at right angles to the edge of the board. -Hugh Lineback, Stillwater, Okla.

## Two-Speed Chuck.

You can lock work in place faster with this chuck. Insert the wrench in one of the six holes on the outside diameter of the scroll and rotate the scroll by lever action-by pulling on the wrench. That rapidly closes the jaws on the work. Then, to tighten the jaws, insert the wrench in one of the six other holes on a shoulder of the chuck and turn it. The maker is Westcott Chuck Co., Oneida, N. Y.


Vertical Milling Attachment. This miller clamps on the ways and is driven by the lathe spindle through a V belt. The lathe's longitudinal feed and cross feed advance the work, which is clamped in a vise on the cross-feed slide. The attachment, made by Montgomery \& Co., Inc., New York City, will make a cut $8^{\prime \prime}$ long and half the distance of the cross feed. The down feed, graduated in thousandths, has $3 \frac{1 / 4}{\prime \prime \prime}$ vertical travel. A T-slot table, $8^{\prime \prime}$ long, is available as an accessory.


Threading Attachment. This tool is especially useful in threading work that has a shoulder. Pulling back on the lever lifts a latch out of the keyway, releasing the die so it is free to turn with the work. Then it won't jam against the shoulder and strip the threads. Mather and Robb, of Louisville, Ky., manufacture the Threadmaster in three sizes.


Live Center for Centerless Shafts. This tool comes in two sizes with top work capacities of $34_{4}^{\prime \prime}$ and $1^{\prime \prime}$. The $60^{\circ}$ cups of both sizes take work diameters down to $5 / 16^{\prime \prime}$. A ball bearing carries both radial and thrust loads, and a rear pilot bearing eliminates center-shaft whip. The maker is the South Bend Lathe Works.

Carriage Spacer and Stop. Clamped to the ways, this accessory is a time saver on repeat work. Set it before starting operations and you don't have to stop to put a scale on the work. It's adjustable from zero to 6 " and it will hold a tolerance to $.001^{\prime \prime}$. Ellwood Products Co., of Detroit, is the maker.



# Sumless Garten Hastens Spring 

## By building this treasure chest for growing plants indoors, you can have a head start on your neighbors.

IN THE darkest, coldest room in our city home stands a box $16^{\prime \prime}$ high and $25^{\prime \prime}$ square, shaped somewhat like a pirate's treasure chest. Inside it, many seedlings and cuttings are receiving their nourishment from chemical nutrients and their life-giving light and heat from a 20 -watt fluorescent "sun."

Out of this box have come many potted plants for window gardens and rooted cuttings of perennials for outdoor gardens.

How box was built. Our completely closed propagating unit was built after we had read reports of experimental work done by the Department of Agriculture. We used $3_{8}^{\prime \prime \prime}$ oak plywood throughout. Cedar or redwood is preferable, but more expensive. Butt joints were made with waterproof glue and fine nails. The shape of the top was

All kinds of seedlings can be grown to transplanting stage. Seeds are germinated in pans.
designed to insure the greatest possible uniformity of light intensity on the growing surface. Two coats of spar varnish were applied to the inside of the unit, and the top was given, in addition, a coat of white gloss enamel and a finish coat of spar.

White lamp gives best results. The fluorescent unit consists of a 20 -watt channel with a $3,500^{\circ}$ white lamp. Pink lamps produce very soft growth. With a daylight lamp, growth is slower-but sturdier. The lamp is installed $5^{\prime \prime}$ or $6^{\prime \prime}$ above the growing surface, with sufficient air space between the channel and the unit lid to prevent overheating of the transformer. Because the highest intensity of light is at the center of the tube, plants in that area grow most rapidly. But they can easily be moved around so that growth is uniform. To root cuttings, light of 500 foot-candles intensity is needed; to grow seedlings, about 750.

What to use for growing medium. The growing medium can be regular garden soil, sand, or gravel, but we found vermiculite to be ideal. Vermiculite is mica that has been subjected to high temperatures and pressures, forming exploded particles that are extremely porous and light. It contains no toxic material, no vegetable matter, and consequently is a sterile medium. This

eliminates all worries as to weeds and disease. Because of the small particle size and light weight of the material, removal or transplanting of small plants is very easy and safe. One trade name for horticultural vermiculite is Terra-Lite. You can also use the kind that is sold for wall insulation.

Since this medium contains no plant food in itself, it is necessary to supply nutrients. Application of any good, commercial plant food every other week is sufficient. We

Leader for Wire Recorders


Spoiled roll film can be turned to good use as leaders for recording wire. For standard wire-recorder spools, mark the film in strips exactly $1 / 1^{\prime \prime}$ wide. Use a metal-edged ruler and a pin to scribe the lines. With a paper punch, make a series of holes along each line, then scissor out the strips. Punch four holes in a row in the center near one end of the leader, feed the wire through, and fasten it with cellulose tape.-Karl L. Martin, Cleveland.
have used a solution made by dissolving Plantabbs in tap water. The vermiculite is thoroughly soaked before plantings are made. The application of the food solution, plus occasional light sprayings of the foliage, will then supply all the moisture needed at the roots and to keep the atmosphere humid. Opening of the unit for these operations provides sufficient ventilation.

You can pack in the plants. Because of the nature of vermiculite, plants may be grown much closer than would be possible in soil. For $2^{\prime \prime}$ or $3^{\prime \prime}$ seedlings or cuttings, $1^{1 / 2 \prime \prime}$ to $2^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}}$ spacing is sufficient. You can germinate seed either in the unit (preferably in seed pans so each kind can be kept separate and easy to find) or outside.

The vermiculite can be piled in the bottom of the unit, or it can be put into regular growing flats. Addition of drainage material is not necessary because of the high absorptive capacity of vermiculite. For best results, operate the fluorescent lamp 24 hours a day.

As the above chart shows, you can use the box throughout the year.

## Tray for the Draftsman



This combination tray and rack for drawing instruments holds everything within a $10^{\prime \prime}$ by $5^{\prime \prime}$ by $2^{\prime \prime}$ space. A wooden block of these dimensions is drilled to hold pencils, pens, knife, and compass, and grooved at one end to receive half-circles, triangles, and the slide rule. A deep tray is hollowed out to store erasers, pen nibs, and other small items. All equipment is kept neatly arranged, ready for use, easy to carry.-Wolfgang Wagner, U.S. Zone, Germany.

## Individual Salt and Pepper Shakers Are Easily Made

Tiny salt and pepper shakers for school or work lunch boxes are quickly made from the plastic caps on ready-whipped cream containers. Drill a pattern of $1 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ diameter holes for salt and 3/64" diameter holes for pepper. Fill the shakers from the bottom and plug with a piece of cork $3_{81 \prime \prime}^{\prime \prime \prime}$ thick. Each shaker holds about a teaspoonful. Leave a bit of the cork projecting for easy removal.-Jack Wilson, San Pedro, Calif.

## This Scrap Pad Won't Get Lost

A roll of adding-machine paper fixed to a cabinet with a long screw and a washer provides scrap paper in kitchen or workshop. Or drill a hole in the cabinet to hold a long dowel, slip the roll over the dowel and cap with a washer and screw. Then you need remove only the end screw to replace the roll of paper.-H. Leeper, Canton, Ohio.


They're steel workers. An alligator is a type of shears for cutting up scrap iron. In this case steel rails were sent to the alligator to be cut down to four or five foot lengths for use in open hearth furnaces.


## Bookrest Bent from Wire Hanger

You can make a bookrest out of a wire coat hanger by bending it with your hands. Break off the hook and file the jagged tip smooth. Place the hanger on the edge of a table with about a third of its length projecting. Bend the projecting end down at a $90^{\circ}$ angle. Bend a $90^{\circ}$ angle at the opposite end, making the form shown in Fig. 1.

With thumbs at points X , bend down sides A with both hands until sides B lie almost flat on the table, as in Fig. 2. With a book on the stand, adjust side C until the book lies at a $45^{\circ}$ angle, Fig. 3. The tip steadies the stand, which can be adjusted to hold almost any size of book.-D. L. Johnson, Columbia, Mo.


## New Shop Ideas

Drilling Radial
Holes. Your lathe can be used to index holes on a circumference and drill them on a true radius. Just mount a hand or breast drill on the compound rest as shown. With a different mounting you could also use an electric drill.

Disassemble the drill and mount its
 frame between centers on the hole through which the spindle fits. Then turn the outside of the spindle housing


Stretching Out Spaces. To mark off equal spaces automatically on layouts or work, you need only stretch the required number of points on this tool over the length to be divided. The tool can be made with as many legs as you wish. Cut these from steel or aluminum strip and join with tubular rivets. Drill the rivet holes to a close pivoting fit, and be sure to align accurately all holes and points on each leg.-R. J. De Cristoforo, The Bronx, N.Y.

true. The drill holder consists of two blocks of cold-rolled steel, the lower one exactly as tall as the distance between the top of the compound and lathe center height.

Clamp the blocks on the compound with a shoe in the T slot. Lock the compound parallel to the ways. With a drill in the lathe chuck, make a hole a clamp-tight fit for the turned drill frame. If the drill chuck hits the holder before the jaws fully close, counterbore the blocks with a boring bar or fly cutter. Should the drill handle hit the holder, remove it and mount a knob directly on the gear.-Joseph Tracy, Manhattan, N. Y.

Telling Drills Apart. It's sometimes important to know whether a drill is carbon or high-speed steel, but they do get mixed and chuck wear often renders shank markings illegible. My solution for this is to grind the ends of all carbon drills flat, leaving those of high-speed drills pointed. This doesn't
 affect them in any way, and I can tell immediately by sight or feel which is which.Jack W. Bessman, Augusta, Ga.

Restoring Threads. Running a nut onto a bolt before you saw it short can save time and temper. As the nut is unscrewed, it reshapes marred threads. If you want to file the end, do that too before removing the nut.

Powered Auger Bit. Common auger bits are dangerous to use on a drill press, for the pilot screw drags them in too fast. But if the threads are filed off,
 the bit is no longer much use in a brace. To convert it temporarily, turn a piece of copper tubing tight on the pilot. Make holes the size of the tubing with an ordinary drill where the bored holes are to be centered. The copper tubing is easily removed without harm to the pilot threads.-John J. McGuckin, Ridgewood, N. J.

Spotting Hidden Holes. Sheet metal, composition board, and other thin materials have to be clamped between pieces of wood if clean holes are to be drilled in them. But this makes it hard to spot holes precisely. The answer is to centerpunch the work where the hole is wanted, clamp wood to the back, and drill through both parts with an undersize drill. The drill or a piece of wire the same diameter is then pushed through to align these two pieces while another piece of wood is clamped to the front. Then drill to size through the pilot hole from the back.-Paul Woodruff, Chicago.


Reducing Mandrel Chatter. Sometimes good-sized work has only a small center hole, and so must be mounted on a small mandrel for which it is proportionately oversized. When the setup is turned between centers, considerable chatter may result.

The cure is to hold one end of the mandrel, as close to the work as possible, in a collet, and support the outer end with the tailstock center. The slight mandrel taper does no harm to the collet. Surprisingly big work can be turned on the smallest mandrels this way.-John C. Martin, King's Point, N.Y.


Four-Way Die Stock. Just pick this up and you have your most commonly needed dies ready to use. It's a good addition to a serviceman's tool kit, too, for this unit takes the place of five easily misplaced or forgotten pieces.

In a piece of steel of a thickness and width to suit the dies, drill the through holes to any convenient size. If you have a counterbore of the die diameter, drill holes to suit the pilot of the counterbore, which can then be used to form die seats.

Lacking a counterbore, you can clamp the stock to a faceplate, using a thin button to center each hole in turn, and bore the seats. Saw and file the notches, chamfer all edges, and tap holes for the setscrews.Floyd McGuckin, Ridgewood, N.J.

Deburrer and Countersink. Until you have one, you can't guess how handy this tool can be. It deserves a place on any bench and in any repairman's tool kit. Grind a flat like that of a screwdriver on the shank end of an ordinary countersink. In an old plastic screwdriver handle, drill an undersized hole not quite to shank depth. Heat the handle by immersing it for a few minutes in boiling water, and drive the shank in.

## Simple Wall Rack Holds Scissors

A holder to keep four pairs of scissors handy but still out of reach of small children can be made
 from two empty cel-lulose-tape dispensers. Open the sides and, with pliers, bend out the serrated cutting edges. Flatten each piece with a hammer. Drill a bolt hole in one piece close to the cutting edge. Place the two pieces of metal together, as shown, over a small angle bracket and bolt through the drilled piece, gripping the other between the bracket and a $3 /{ }_{4}^{\prime \prime}$ washer. Attach the bracket to the wall.

If a lathe is not available, you can make a bolt with a shouldered end in this way. Lock a file in a vise. Put washers on the bolt and chuck it in an electric drill. Hold the bolt on the file and start the drill. The file will quickly cut the threads away, leaving a shoulder on the bolt. Then hacksaw off the part of the bolt that was chucked in the drill.-Charles H. Hardy, Los Angeles.


In my work as a millwright I often have to cut holes through concrete floors and walls. In so doing, I usually run into a steel reinforcing rod. Most of the openings I make are too small to admit a hacksaw and the rods used to give me a lot of trouble. But not any more. How do you think I get by them now?

I use an electric hand drill. I first use. a small drill to put a hole through the rod where I want to break it. Then I ream it out with larger and larger drills until only a thin shell remains. A sharp tap with a hammer and cold chisel finishes the job.Carl Barkham, North East, Pa.

## HOW OFTEN TO CHANGE OIL?

Within the past year there have been many conflicting recommendations on how often to change oil. One magazine article suggested that every 4000 miles is often enough under normal conditions. The point most often missed is that the average car owner does most of his driving between home and work. The engine does not have time to warm up enough. Sludge forms.

This sludge is potentially dangerous to your engine, no matter how efficient your oil filter. The best insurance against such danger is to change oil every 1000 miles.

## WHAT ABOUT TIRE PRESSURE?

Many drivers are confused by conflicting advice on the new low-pressure tires. If you were told to keep this pressure at 24 pounds, remember that that means 24 pounds in a cold tire. A tire with a cold pressure of 24 pounds may have 29 pounds when hot. If you have tires checked while hot, and have the 29 pounds pressure reduced to 24 , you will be running on underinflated tires, and will notice rapid tire wear or uneven wear. If you have your low-pressure tires inflated while hot, inflate them to 29 pounds. They will have only 24 pounds when they cool off.

new one that provides for a cushion made of resilient rubber on the base portion next to the rim. Claim is it eliminates the bouncing caused when the water-fill is used alone.

■ University of Georgia announces a hybrid cotton that may have the vigor, yield, and other valuable characteristics of hybrid corn. Large-scale commercial production is not expected at the moment.

- Pentachlorophenol, a fence-post spray well known to farmers, has a new use: hastening ripening of soybeans. The chemical knocks leaves off plants, permits light and air in, dries beans out faster, speeds up harvest two weeks. University of Illinois, where usage was developed, says the new method will provide earlier marketing and better prices, and allow time to plant a winter cover crop to cut down erosion.
- An out-of-sight steering wheel-behind and under a hood--is offered by Oliver in a new tractor model for use in orchards. Nothing protrudes to catch and injure the trees.
- Stonecliff Farm Dairy, Bradford, Vt., announces they sell milk that not only is not touched by human hands, but isn't even exposed to open air. The milk is taken from each cow by a vacuum milker, goes through pipes to a strainer unit, and down to a stainless-steel collector tank under 300 pounds pressure. After passing through a pasteurizing steam jacket, it is cooled by ice water, and the tank swung to a bottling machine. It is claimed the milk has the same flavor as if fresh from the teat.
- When industry doesn't provide new tools, farmers make their own. Howard Morgan, young Oregon rancher, was shocked at the price of $\$ 1$ per unit for a fence post on-the-site. So he built a derrick that could be mounted on his tractor, added a 400lb. pile-driver hammer. Cost--\$225. Powered by the extra drum of a bulldozer control, the rig set 650 regulation seven-foot posts, two feet deep in clay soil, in first week. With an outlay of $\$ 40$ for hired labor and $\$ 10$ for tractor fuel, the machine paid for itself in one week.

Self-Timer Set Off By Fuse
You can get into all the group pictures you take of your friends if you equip your camera with a simple self-timer like the one shown. A homemade fuse sets it off.

Make your timer
 out of a spring-type clothespin and a piece of clothes-hanger wire. Bend the wire to a spring shape as shown in the photos and form two eyes for screwing it into the clothespin. The spring trips the camera shutter when a fuse burns through heavy thread looped around it.

You can make fuses by soaking twine in a saturated solution of saltpeter (potassium nitrate) and letting it dry. Prepare thread loops by tying them around a cardboard template. The timer can be adapted to many types of cameras.-Louis Hochman, Sherman Oaks, Calif.

## Half a Drill Set Saves Money

It's always handy to own a set of drills from 0 to 60, but a full set is expensive. A money-saving wrinkle is to buy just half a set comprising every other size from 1 to 59. I find that this selection fills the bill in practically every case. When tapping a small hole, for instance, the next larger drill size will still give good threads. If you can't buy half a set, buy a full set with a friend and split it up.-Lauren McCready, West Redding, Conn.

## Last minute news $\underline{\&}$ notes...

DEADLIEST DRIVING in the world is done in Bombay, India, according to a world traffic survey made by the Danish Government. The annual fatality rate there is 769.66 per 100,000 cars and trucks. In Los Angeles (which has more cars per family than any other city in the world), the annual death rate in traffic accidents is only 27.86 per 100,000 cars; and in Milwaukee (the safest city in this respect) it is only 22.06 per 100,000 cars.

SYNTHETIC FROST can now be produced --another triumph of science over the weather. It is a chemical that has been developed in the Shell Oil Company's big agricultural research laboratory in California to aid cotton growers. If leaves get into cotton picked by machinery, they tend to discolor it. Jack Frost doesn't always nip them off in time. But growers no longer have to worry about them. They can apply this chemical to the plants now, and know that it will dispose of the leaves.

THE BIG BEVATRON being built at Berkeley, Calif., is half finished. It will be about 16 times as energetic as the most powerful cyclotron now running--Columbia's University's 380,000,000-volt proton accelerator. Protons shot out of the bevatron will travel almost as fast as light. Its builders hope to have it ready to be warmed up next year, but fear that the shortage of essential equipment will delay them.

EXHAUST GAS from an auto engine can now be made harmless. A catalytic device developed by Eugene J. Houdry, the petroleum scientist, takes both the poison and the odor out of the gases from engine to which it has been attached. It is being used already on fork-lift trucks in several large plants.

TELEVISION is being used to combat forest fires in South Africa. Pictures are broadcast from a plane
flying over the flames. Officers directing the battle against the fire thus can see what's happening and rush men where needed.

ENGINEERING is one of the nation's fastest-growing occupations, and will probably remain so, says the U.S. Department of Labor. More young engineers will be needed in the next few years than now seem likely to be graduated.

AUTO MAKERS concerned about cold stalling have found it hard to prevent mechanically. This tendency of an engine to die repeatedly after being started in cool, humid weather is caused by ice in the carburetor. So Esso has added a water-soluble substance to its gas that works like antifreeze in a radiator. Results thus far are reported to be good.

A NEW X-RAY CAMERA with an optical system such as is used in giant telescopes has been developed by the Fairchild Corp. It can be used to take pictures of the thicker parts of the body six times as fast as was previously possible. And the new camera makes possible, its makers say, quick, convenient, and cheap checks for cancer of the gastric tract, similar to the mass tuberculosis surveys now made.

ACTH, the new miracle hormone that has aided sufferers from arthritis and other ailments, also has been used successfully now to counteract the poison of the black-widow spider and the copperhead snake. And Columbia University researchers are about to begin a three-year investigation of the chemical nature and method of attack of poison ivy.

HYDRAGUIDE, a system that draws on the engine to help you steer a car, will be introduced on some of the 1951 Chryslers, its makers report.
