## Reader Adds Own Tools

Sir:
I wonder if any home handyman agrees with the Government experts' list of the 36 basic tools a householder should have as given in your January 1951 number.

It seems to me that the most serious omissions were:

1. Hand drill and drills
2. Vise
3. Faucet seat dresser
4. Try square

To keep the list at 36 , four of the following could be omitted, which although sometimes useful, are not used enough to make them considered basic: drawknife, gimlet, glass cutter, framing square, bucket, wash tub, funnel.

1. I use my hand drill more than any other tool except hammer, screwdriver, and pliers. The single gimlet listed is no feasible substitute.
2. A vise is surely a basic tool. If a bench vise is not convenient, a small vise that can be clamped to table or chair will serve most purposes.
3. Many faucets that need new washers have their seats roughened or nicked and unless smoothed will soon ruin the washer. Although seat dressers with several cutters can be purchased, many plumbers prefer to make their own out of a round emery sharpener for carving knives. They say they work better than the boughten kind. I have both kinds and use the cutter first and then the emery. To make the dresser, break the emery away from the center of the knife sharpener and cut the exposed center wire. This makes two dressers of different size which can be rotated by the hand drill.
4. A try square is more often used than a framing square.

Carbon acts as a resistance on both the antenna and its connections and weakens reception. . . .

Moisture and other chemicals in the air cause corrosion that worries TV installers even more. However, Mr. Wynn is correct in stating that soot is a problem. Carl Quirk, technical chief of Du Mont's Teleset Service division reports:
"Certain precautions should be observed in making chimney installations, particularly in weak-signal areas. If soot and grime are deposited at the point where the transmission line joins the antenna, it is possible that signal strength may be reduced because of poor electrical contact. This can be prevented by coating the contacts with a rubber-base sealer. Wherever possible the contact strip should be turned so it is not directly over the chimney opening.
"It's also a good idea to clean the contacts in the spring."

## Sounds Fishy, but True

We feel there is an oversight made in your article. The board should be well cured in water for at least three months before using. New wood is definitely poison to tropical fish. Wood may be artificially cured in a few days by slaking a large piece of lime in water and soaking the board in it for five days. Rinse well and the board is ready for use.

## A Warning on Sodium Valves

Sir:
Your February 1951 issue contains an article titled "Homemade Tools from Old Auto Valves" (page 193).

Under "Hole Saw" the author suggests using a valve from an airplane or boat. If someone were to get a valve from an airplane engine, he might get a sodium-filled exhaust valve, and according to instructions I received while in our Army Air Force during the last war, cutting into these valves is extremely hazardous, due to the sodium contained in them.

PS should have cautioned readers against cutting into sodium-cooled valves, which are widely used in aircraft engines, and to a lesser but increasing extent in large truck engines. Such valves, usually identifiable by an " S " stamped on the top, contain pure sodium that ignites on contact with air. The stem should not be sawed, and cracked sodium valves should be buried for safety.

# "Little Cars"?

 DRUER'S SEAT...

DISING prices and bigR ger tax bites out of the American pocketbook are making "little" cars look more attractive these days to a lot of buyers.

They're priced lower. They use a lot less gas. They go farther on a set of tires. They're easier to park and maneuver. They're ideal for daily shopping. Most of them are simpler than the big cars and therefore easier and less costly to keep in repair.

So let's take a ride in three of these short-wheelbase jobs on the Indianapolis Motor Speedway and see how they perform.

Only two small cars-distinguishable from midget cars-are now made in this country. When the war ended, two of the "big three"

We sped the three little cars around the track together, led by the Austin and followed by the Rambler and the Henry J in that order.

manufacturers were fiddling with plans for producing little cars. But they never reached the market.

The two small U.S.-made cars that have finally made their appearance were brought out within the last 18 months by manufacturers who hope to annex a bigger share of the market for their products. One is Kaiser-Frazer's Henry J. The other is the Nash Rambler. The first is a sedan, the second a convertible. Nash also makes a Rambler station wagon.

The cars are on the Speedway's northwest turn. The Austin is chugging to keep ahead. Driving the Rambler is Tommy Milton, the famous rac-



These cars aren't the first small jobs ever made in the U.S. My memory goes back to a lot of little cars of yesteryear-the Ambler, the Scripps-Booth, the Arrow Cyclecar, the Brush, the Saxon, and the Monroe among them.

But they weren't really small cars in those days. They'd be considered small today only because the average car is a lot heavier, longer, wider, and roomier than its ancestors.

For comparison, in driving the two lat-ter-day revivals of the American small car, I chose a British-made Austin-which is not small by British standards. I chose it because the Austin is the most popular foreign car sold in this country.

This is the start of the playback of my tape-recorded comments on the Austin:

the front seat of this car. There's entrance room and headroom. The over-all height is greater than in the Henry J and the Rambler. That may affect its roll in a turn . . . we'll see.

The pull-type starter switch on the dash . . . may confuse the beginner in this job . . . the starting motor makes too much racket ...

## Foot Pedals Confusing

Wups! I'm confusing the brake with the clutch pedal. The positioning of the two on the floor is bad . . . first gear is really low . . . first gear on the Austin is the reverse gear on our cars . . . this little engine races its heart out in first . . . the transmission is pretty noisy in the first three gears.

The two long straightaways and four turns on the speedway gave me a chance to see what the car would do upwind, downwind, and crosswind, though the wind was fairly light.

I do get some roll on the turns . . . as I anticipated . . . despite the fact that the track is banked . . . and there's some windwander in a crosswind . . . she doesn't want to keep her wheels straight . . . there's also some pitching on the bricks.

The brick-surfaced portion of the speedway in front of the main grandstands, a part of the original track that is kept for
sentimental reasons, is fairly rough. The pitching, of course, was due to the short wheelbase.

I was curious as to what the Austin would do with the accelerator on the floorboard as a key to the best cruising speed. But first, I decided to see how fast that 40-horse engine would take the Austin to an indicated 60 miles an hour. A couple of times around the $2 \frac{1}{2}$-mile track on the stopwatch established a speedometer error of two miles an hour on the high side at an indicated 60 .

I tried slow shifting and fast shifting on the acceleration, using all four forward gears, and the best I could do for 60 indicated was 34 seconds. That was pretty slow-on this side of the Atlantic. Then I opened her up. She edged up to 71 and stopped.

## U. S. Standards Different

In running my eye back over what I've said about the Austin, I find that it doesn't actually reflect my opinion of the car. The Austin is a good car. It's just hard to evaluate by U.S. standards. In England, it's a pretty good-looking automobile. Over here, it's dumpy, almost dowdy, ranged alongside our cars.

Yet, it's sturdy. It has a solid feel, like a bigger car. Its sheet metal is of a heavier gauge than that in most U.S. cars. It has little refinements-like a center armrest in the rear seat and foam-rubber cushionsunknown to low-priced U.S. cars. Its great virtue-high gas mileage-comes right from its great fault (by our standards)-a tiny, low-horsepower engine.

I climbed from the Austin into the Henry J, the only U.S. car not in the midget class that can compete with the Austin in price. The Henry J I had chosen to drive was the four-cylinder. Kaiser also makes an $80-\mathrm{hp}$. six under this name. It was a stripped-down-not a de luxe-version.

## You Get What You Pay For

Let's not kid ourselves about low-priced cars . . you get what you pay for, and no more. I'd say this is America's austerity car . . . and with the times what they are . . . we may need a lot of this kind of vehicle.

I'm bothered by the shift lever . . . it's hard to get it into neutral by feel.

I had been equally bothered by the Austin lever because it was mounted on the transmission box, as it was years ago in


I looked over all three engines. The $40-\mathrm{hp}$. Austin's probably lacks the oomph demanded by the bulk of U. S. motorists. Yet I felt that this car offered most for the invested dollar.


The Rambler has big-car zip and luxury. Its engine gives it a weight per horsepower of only 29.6 pounds, compared with 33.8 for the 4 -cylinder Henry J and 56.2 for the Austin.

The Henry J has zip too, but it needs a silencer for its air cleaner. The engine is so short that a shroud is put around the fan to direct the air backward for proper cooling.

For its size, the Austin had a surprising amount of room in it. Controls are not as well centered as in American cars. That shelf under the panel is for small packages.


The Rambler has everything-radio, heater, electric clock, and directional signals. And it should have-for the price. Of the three little cars, the Henry J costs the least.


Devon Francis tried out the driver's entrance room in all three cars, with the adjustable seat full forward. The Austin's proved to be the best-more than 42 inches high by 26 wide.


You have to duck your head to get into the Rambler. Entrance room is only 39 by $23 \frac{1}{2}$. All three cars have a gas economy of about 35 m.p.g., the U. S. cars when using overdrive.


With the seats still full forward, we measured back-seat leg room with a model 5 feet, 8 inches tall. They turned out to be approximately the same-between 4 and 5 inches.

At the left is the Austin's, above is the Rambler's, at the right is the Henry J's. With the front seats full back, the model's knees had no spare room in any of the three vehicles.


The Henry J's front compartment was the most spacious of the three. This photo is of the stripped-down, low-cost job. The pictures directly below are of the de luxe version.


The Henry J's entrance room was a bit better than the Rambler's-4011 by 27. Both had the disadvantage found in all two-door sedansa tight squeeze getting into the back seat.


All three cars' rear seats take only two persons comfortably. Inside the Henry J's door jamb you will see a rod used to lock the back of the rear seat down for added luggage room.

American cars, instead of on the steering column.

I get very little roll on the turns . . . remarkably little pitch on the bricks, too . . . but there is no solid feel . . . I don't get any feeling of solidity in this car . . . it feels light, which of course it is . . . yet it seems to behave in the wind.

That was hard to believe because the car felt so light under me. So I made several more crosswind runs to make sure. The results were the same. I got no tendency to wind-wander.

This engine is rough . . . all fours are relatively rough . . . so was the Austin's. Your vibration level goes up as your cylinder count goes down.

A calibration showed the speedometer to be four miles off on the high side at an indicated 60 , as nearly as I could judge from a jiggling needle. The speedometer reached that reading in an average of 18 seconds in four tries. The car had plenty of scat for its horsepower.

That same jiggling needle gave me an indicated top speed of between 82 and 84 miles an hour. But the vibration was so pronounced that the rear vision mirror offered only a shaky image of the track behind me.

I would say that the brakes are good . . . there is no tendency to fade in a stop from high speed . . . they're better than the Austin's . . . the Austin's were too soft. The vision from this car is well-nigh perfect . . . there's plenty of glass area.

The Henry J proved to be about what I had anticipated, no more, no less. The Henry J's chief virtue is inexpensive transportation and roominess. It will hold five people. More than four can't ride comfortably in either the Austin or the Rambler.

My last mount was the little Nash convertible. It belongs in the class of the Henry J and the Austin only as to size. It's not an inexpensive automobile. While it's the cheapest U.S. convertible, there's nothing cheap about it. It costs several hundred dollars more than either the Austin or the Henry J.

I've put more than 500 miles on one of these . . . and it's a surprise . . . it was a surprise package from the start. It's got scat . . . it has lines . . it's pretty.

The reason for its performance is obvious -it has 82 horsepower in six cylinders for only 2,400 pounds of car.

She gets away . . . gets right away . . .


A tape measure across the driving compartment from sill to sill was the payoff on space. The Austin's measured 49 inches. The divided front seats, by the way, are both adjustable.


The Rambler measured 54ㅍ⒉ Like the Henry J's, the Rambler's front seat was of one-piece design. I found that the emergency brake on the Rambler wasn't as handy as it could be.


The Henry J's was 57 inches. This car comes in both 4- and 6 -cylinder versions, with window vents, deck lid, special upholstery, armrests, and a vacuum-boost fuel pump as extras.

I'm on a turn at 65, with no roll . . . there's not the slightest tendency toward roll . . . that's on account of the fabric top and low center of gravity . . .

There's no wind-wander . . . there's no pitch . . . well, perhaps a trifle, on this short wheelbase . . . but nothing to bother you . . it rides good.

The speedometer was on the button with the Austin's-an error of two miles an hour at 60 . With the overdrive locked out, Devon Francis, of the Popular Science editorial staff, clocked me on acceleration. We indicated 60 in 21 seconds. That was slower than I had thought it would be.

There's a decided drop-off in acceleration after 65. She's going on up . . . against a headwind . . . to 74.

Runs with and against a brisk wind that suddenly had sprung up on the speedway gave me an average of 79 miles an hour. The one I drove earlier this year was faster than this one. The rear-axle ratio is 4.375:1 with overdrive.

## All This and Lights, Too

You can dive into a turn with this job without getting any tire squeal . . . that's about the best recommendation I know of . . . that's a good indication of the handling qualities and the stability of a chassis . . .

You can't have everything, though. The fabric in the top flutters . . . it does make quite a noise when you get up speed. The brakes I would rate as excellent compared with good for the Henry J and soft for the Austin. The Rambler and Henry J have something else on the Austin, too . . . these lights . . . there are red lights on your panel . . . in both cars . . . to flash you signals when your oil is low or your battery is on discharge . . .

This car is as solid as a rock . . . it feels good . . . the noise level is low . . . so is the vibration level. My only real quarrel is with the rear vision . . . a fault of all convertibles. An outside rear-vision mirror on the Rambler is a must.

In aesthetics, ride, and interior appointments, the Rambler, obviously, was the class of the three little cars. It was also priced at the top, by a considerable margin. It had the convertible's traditional drawback of little or no protection for the passengers in a roll-over accident, though permanent side rails holding the top gave it more rigidity than other convertibles [PS, May '50, p. 110].


Little cars don't have much luggage space. Rambler's (center) was the smallest, Austin's


This is a sample of the quality built into the Austin-foam rubber in the seats. This car has pleasant little gimmicks such as a chain on the gas-tank cap so you can't lose it.

As for a choice among them, the buyer has to ask himself what he wants in an automobile-a high cruising speed, luxury, looks, price, trade-in value, economy, ease of handling, or a combination of only some of these and perhaps other factors?

With prices at the gas pumps on the rise, does he actually want better mileage at a sacrifice of room, or would he rather get his economy by cutting down on his driving and own a full-sized car? If he wants economy, any one of these three little cars-together with a number of other little European cars on the U.S. market-most certainly will give it to him. He can get up to 25 to 35 miles to the gallon.

Cars, like meat, sell by the pound. Manufacturers are always trying to reduce their cost-per-pound of car. The cost-per-pound of little cars is considerably beyond that of

## 50-Foot Radio Telescope to Study Static from the Stars

World's largest pipeline eliminates 3,200 -mile tanker trip once needed to ship Arabian oil to

Europe. Pipeline delivers 300,000 barrels a day -enough to run all cars in New York state.

## American engineers built the world's largest pipeline to carry oil across desert country that even the camels avoid.

OIL men call it Tapline. To build it, in the face of colossal difficulties, took 1,600 Americans, 15,000 Arabs, \$225,000,000 , and 270,000 tons of steel-hauled half way around the world from California.

Now this 1,068 -mile pipe across the blazing Arabian desert is delivering 300,000 barrels of oil a day from rich fields on the Persian Gulf to the eastern shore of the Mediterranean. To carry as much by the old 3,200 -mile sea route through the Suez Canal would keep 62 large tankships busy steadily.

Tapline (which includes two sections: a distribution network owned by ArabianAmerican Oil Co. and a main line owned by Trans-Arabian Pipeline Co.) runs from Bahrein, in Saudi Arabia, to Sidon, in Lebanon. From there tankers take the oil to U.S.owned refineries in Europe. Construction was done by International Bechtel, Inc., and Williams Brothers Corp.


Flow of Arabian oil, vital to European defense, cannot be stopped now by bombing of Suez Canal. But pipeline itself is vulnerable, being located in Middle East not far from Russia.


In the middle of the vast desert, welders join together the long sections of pipe that make up

Tapline. Pipeline extends 1,068 miles across varied types of terrain-almost all bad.

Arab workers operate machine that pulls length of $30-\mathrm{in}$. pipe from inside one of $31-\mathrm{in}$. size. Pipe was made in two sizes and shipped nested at à saving of $\$ 3,000,000$ for cargo space.

## Greenhouse Plants Grown and Transplanted in Plastic Bags

Bags of Vinylite plastic film hold the rose plants at right, growing in a greenhouse during the off season. Bag and all, they are transplanted in summer to the outdoors and later in the year are taken in before killing frosts.

The plastic bags replace bulky and breakable pots for planting seedlings and seed, in a system originally developed for raising tomato plants by Frederick W. Stanton, Holland, Mich., grower. Successfully used both with vegetables and flowering plants, it is said to double the number of tomato plants that can be grown in a given space and increase the yield per plant.

Filled with mica, the bags are set in a long, narrow wooden trench in the greenhouse. Through openings in the bottoms of the bags, the plants absorb chemical nourishment and water pumped into the trench.



## Postcards Ride Sea Currents

Several thousand postcards will be dropped into the Gulf of Mexico this year by Navy aircraft. Sealed in plastic (left), the "drift cards" will float with the currents and be cast up on beaches. Finders are asked to mail them to the Gulf States Marine Fisheries Commission at New Orleans. Thus scientists will be able to trace sea currents important to the fishing industry. Floating bottles, in which cards have been put before, are affected too much by wind.

## Motors in Wheels Drive Gas-Electric "Car with a View"

Four electric motors built into its wheels drive a gasoline-electric car called the Symétric, introduced in Paris. A generator driven by a four-cylinder Simca motor supplies current for the transmissionless drive
and for braking, eliminating brake drums and lining. Unusual window area gives allaround view. Windows slide into the top, and doors into the floor, as below, to provide unobstructed access.



## Big Pictures on Color TV Made Possible by Drum Filter

Color TV pictures as big as you want are now possible with the Columbia Broadcasting System's color method. Previously picture size had been restricted to about 12 inches, a limitation severely criticized by CBS opponents. Using a drum instead of a disk for the color filter turned the trick.

The picture tube fits inside the horizontal, varicolored drum, which spins around it to create the illusion of full color. The drum need be only slightly larger than the tube itself-a drum 20 inches in diameter accommodates a 17 -inch tube. A disk for a tube that big would be a yard across.

## 300-Ton Tank for Refinery so Big It Rides Three Flatcars

It took three railroad flatcars to handle this tank-the heaviest piece of oil refinery equipment ever sent by rail. The tank, called a "49-tray depropanizer," is 13 feet in
diameter, 120 feet long, and weighs more than 300 tons. Bridges on the route from Houston north had to be checked in advance for strength and clearances.




## to End New York Subway Jam

CARS riding an endless belt could carry more than 500 people a minute across the world's biggest city. Plans for them have been submitted to officials struggling with New York City's traffic congestion.

This new kind of subway train would never stop nor end. Passengers would enter its cars from a sidewalk moving a mile and a half an hour, which is slower than many moving stairways. The cars would speed up to 15 miles an hour for the trip. At the end they would slow down and be turned around by a constantly turning horizontal wheel.

Although small, this train's many little cars could carry nearly twice as many people about a third faster than the crowds transported now by shuttle trains under 42 nd St. between Grand Central and Times Square.

This shuttle is one of the worst bottlenecks in New York subways, and the mov-
ing-belt system was developed specifically for use there. Its designers, Goodyear Tire \& Rubber Co. and Stevens-Adamson Manufacturing Co., say, however, that it could be applied to other subways.

## How They Make Plastic Figures

EVERY morning thousands of youngsters watch popeyed as their mothers open boxes of their favorite breakfast cereal. What makes it their favorite is not calories, vitamins, or crunchy-goodness-but the realistic plastic miniatures of cowboys, Indians, buffaloes, prize fighters, and skaters that come tumbling out.

These pictures tell the story behind those sales-boosting premiums: a story of skilled craftsmanship teamed up with mass-production methods.

The photos were taken in the plant of Monroe Plastics, Rochester, N. Y., a major producer in this new industry. The company is headed by a young engineer, Irwin E. Copland, who designed most of its machinery. It turns out millions of the miniatures a year in almost a hundred varied models carefully chosen by a vote of advertising and merchandising experts for their appeal to small-fry collectors.


Duplicating machine follows the wood pattern (right) in routing out image one-fourth size in tool steel. Size is important, since all figures must fit later in packaging machine.


Polisher uses diamond-burnishing compound to remove any flaws or impurities from cavities just before they go to the molding machine. Care here avoids production stoppages later.


Engraver tools minute details, such as horse's mane, into steel pattern. Tool points are specially ground for many miniatures. Finished pattern, called a "hob," is then hardened.


Under pressure of 100 to 300 tons, the hob is squeezed into soft steel blank (lower block). This reverse image, called a "cavity," is used as mold of figure into which plastic is injected.


Plastic figures come out of molding machine in a group known as a "shot." They are cut apart, trimmed, and fed into a packaging machine that seals each separately in cellophane.


Samples of final product are checked by Irwin Copland, company head. In this group are cowboys, hunters, kangaroos, buffalo, ice skaters, football players, deer, farm tractor.

# Cop Scores Motorists

FOR years experts in traffic safety have been trying to invent a machine that would produce a clear test of a person's driving ability. Last month just such a machine was announced.

Exhibited at the annual exposition of the Greater New York Safety Council, it has a "mechanical brain" that tots up a score for -and against-a motorist driving through a series of emergencies. Yet the driver never budges from the testing room.

The machine, called the Aetna Roadometer, was introduced by the Aetna Casualty and Surety Co., of Hartford, Conn., which collaborated with the Automagraph Co., of New York, in developing the device.

It differs from previous driving-test machines in that the driver isn't merely rated right or wrong in his reaction to an emergency. If he's wrong, it tells him just how
wrong he was-and prints the result automatically on a score card.

It tells him how well he steers, whether he goes too fast, how quickly he hits the brake pedal, whether he remembers to blow his horn at an unwary pedestrian, and penalizes him if he fails to signal.

He sits in a simulated driving compartment and "drives" along a street pictured on a screen before him by a movie projector. The illusion of a car is complete, even to a hood ornament. A box falls off a truck in his path, and he has to brake to a stop. A pedestrian pops out from between two parked cars into his way. Two cars crowd him on a curve.

The use of movie films in driver-testing is not new. Tests of judgment and steering proficiency, however, are new. So is the automatic scoring. That's done by a complex series of relays, selsyn motors, solenoid counters, and selector switches. The Roadometer can be "driven" from 16 to 40 miles an hour,

but it imposes harsh penalties for speeding by allowing the driver less time to meet an emergency.

The heart of this driving tester is the series of solenoid counters, or accumulators, that record, "remember," and deliver to a miniature printing plant the degree of error committed by the motorist.

Here's what happens within the machine to record a score when a "driver" meets an emergency: A transparent spot on the side of the film lets light strike a photoelectric cell. This advances a multi-channel selector switch to the particular contact set up for this emergency. The switch closes a series of relays, giving life to the circuits that will record what the driver does. One of two timing motors starts ticking off the interval allowed the driver to react.

The motor runs until the driver hits the brake. Now a second timing motor, together with a scoring arm on an accumulator, counts the time-in tenths of a second-ticked off by the first timing motor. This records the amount of time it took the driver to stop. Another spot on the film sets off a relay that feeds the score to a counting head, starts the printer, and clears the accumulator so that it is ready to rate the driver on the next emergency.


Under floorboard are accelerator, brake, steering, and horn assemblies. Resistors sense accelerator position. When brake is pressed, contact points start timing motors. Nylon rope on friction disk turned by steering wheel gives driver "feel" of turn. Machine, weighing almost half a ton, draws 10 to 15 amperes, plugs into any 115 -volt outlet.

## Dual Fuels Give New Crosley Highest Compression Engine

Crosley Motors, the people who make the vest-pocket cars, have announced an engine with the highest compression ratio among stock U. S. cars-10:1. Oddly enough, the engine, installed in Crosley's Super Sports model, uses regular gas.

Crosley avoided premium fuel by fitting its new engine with a dual-fuel system. Under ordinary loads, the engine operates on regular fuel. When detonation-"pinging"is about to occur, a mixture of alcohol,
water, and tetraethyl lead from a second fuel tank is automatically fed to the carburetor to be mixed with the regular fuel. This provides a non-detonating charge that insures more complete combustion and saves power waste.

With the dual-fuel system (PS, Sept. '48, p. 98), the company claims greater horsepower, better hill-climbing ability, higher speed under loads and greater economy for its four-cylinder engine.


## Aluminum Scaffold Is Strong, Light

The old wooden-plank scaffold, long used by painters and carpenters, has given way to a stronger one made of aluminum channels with plywood in truss-type construction.

The new plank (upper one at left) supports three men with less sag than a conventional plank with only two men. A 24 -foot length weighs only 70 pounds, compared to 230 for a solid-wood plank.

The new plank is made by the Stinson Mfg. Co., of Spokane, Wash.

## 'Cannon' to Hurl Billion Volts

THE mightiest of "cannon" is being assembled in the microwave laboratory of Stanford University, where trials of it are already under way. The longer it grows, the more powerful it becomes. So far it has reached a length of 80 feet. Eventually it will measure 220 feet long.

This biggest piece of "ordnance" is a linear accelerator for studying atoms. It fires the smallest of projectiles-electrons, tiniest known particles of matter. When it attains full size, probably early next year, it will hurl them at a target with an energy of more than a billion electron volts.

Only three atom smashers in the world, all still under construction at this writing, will match this power.

The Stanford cannon differs from these in its comparatively simple and economical design. Instead of whirling particles in a circle or spiral as synchrotrons and cyclotrons do, it propels them in a beeline, to boost them to fantastic speed and energy.

## How the Big Cannon Works

A slender copper vacuum tube, of about six-inch over-all diameter, forms the barrel of the cannon. The "bore" is the 0.8 -inch diameter of a central passage through goldrimmed copper disks, fitted inside the tube. Electrons fed into the "breech" from a cathode tube are sped along the barrel by successive kicks from a series of Klystron tubes, which are called the most powerful vacuum tubes ever built. Speeding unhindered through an aluminum-foil window at the barrel end, the particles emerge with a "muzzle velocity" approaching the speed of light. The Stanford cannon is said to be the only electron accelerator of more than $10,000,000$ volts that gets the particles out in the open where they can be conveniently counted, measured, and studied.

Scientists will use the particles to bombard experimental targets placed in their path, and will measure their energy by deflecting them around a curve with a magnet.

Although invisible, the emerging beam fogs film and registers on scintillation counters that can be used, with oscillograph recordings, to clock the electrons' speed. This may permit the first direct measurements of electrons' mass, hitherto determined by roundabout calculations, and lead to discovery of new subatomic particles forming the mysterious "glue" that holds matter together.

THE tiniest of racing cars are roaring around fifth-of-a-mile outdoor tracks in California. This summer, the motorized baby buggies will move indoors.

They're called "three-quarter midgets" and have wheelbases about three quarters the length of present-day midget racers. Though small, they thrill spectators with the same wheel-to-wheel jockeying. They make dusty skids on banked turns, and hit

45 m.p.h. on abbreviated straightaways. Some can do 90 on a long straight dash.

Their predecessors, the midgets, first came upon the scene in 1932. Promoters of bigger racing cars were then moving to longer tracks, some $2 \frac{1 / 2}{2}$ miles long, taking much of the action too far from the spectators. Midgets raced at first on tracks $1 / 5$ mile and $1 / 6$ mile long. Then midgets in turn went to longer tracks, some a mile long, and grew
in wheelbase, body length, and tread. Too far from the spectators, again.

To put the show back in the crowd's lap, a new group of promotors has come up with the "three-quarter midget" idea. The "threequarter" corresponds to the original midgets in general specifications, but with newer engines instead of the old Saxons and Hendersons.

Most of the three-quarter midgets are home-built with small garage lathes and welding outfits. A handsome blue homemade job built for $\$ 350$ by Curly McLain, of San Diego, stood third in the 1950 championship class. Tops for parts cost of a homemade three-quarter midget is about $\$ 800$, and excellent ones may be bought ready-made at prices from $\$ 800$ to $\$ 2,000$. One slick $\$ 2,000$ job is powered by a $34-\mathrm{hp}$. English twin-cylinder Triumph motorcycle engine, souped-up to develop 40 hp . at 7,000 r.p.m. It weighs 460 lb . empty, is seven feet long with a $60-\mathrm{in}$. wheelbase.

Some cars use single-cylinder J.A.P. motorcycle engines of $30.50-\mathrm{cu}$.-in. piston displacement. Other owners choose the flathead, twin-cylinder Harley-Davidson 45, the Indian twin, or the four-cylinder in-line Crosley single overhead-cam engine, sleeved down to meet specifications of the Three Quarter Midget Racing Association. Compression ratios range from $7-1$ to $15-1$.

In back yards and small garages around Los Angeles, ingenious mechanics try a hatful of dodges to build greater speed and safety into their cars. One engine burns methanol fuel, another alcohol. Racing heads soup up an engine. Plastic shock absorbers smooth out bumps.

The cars have no self-starters, and only one gear. A nudge from a truck to start them, and they're off. Curves are slightly banked to help the cars negotiate them. At that, the wooden walls are scarred by hub caps, and cars have jumped the wall.

To keep the sport from becoming only a rich man's hobby, the T.Q.M.R.A. runs the events as claiming races-but at a fixed price of $\$ 2,000$. No one is likely to pay that for a car he can buy off the track or make himself for much less. And the owners, knowing that is the most they can get for their tiny mounts, are not likely to put a lot of money into them. So both ways it helps hold down the cost of the cars.

To keep the spectators happy, the T.Q.M.R.A. is shooting for a $1 / 6$-mile track -to bring the show to the customer. End

# How Chemists Can Cut Liquids With a Knife 

IT TAKES all of those four tons of ox liver above to make the few crystals of valuable vitamin $\mathrm{B}_{12}$ in the test tube held by this British chemist. But thanks to a chemical process called chromatography, such a fantastic extraction job becomes almost routine.

Chromatography, discovered back in 1906 by a young Russian botanist named Michael Tswett, practically lets you cut up liquids with a knife. It depends on the fact that certain materials will adsorb (pick up on their surface) other materials from solution. And the speed of adsorption depends on the particular materials involved.

Thus, when a solution containing only a tiny fraction of the stuff you want ( $\mathrm{B}_{12}$, for example) mixed up with lots of other stuff
is poured through a tube containing the right adsorbent, the $\mathrm{B}_{12}$ will all be trapped in one section of the tube. The unwanted materials in the solution will be trapped in other parts of the tube-the faster adsorbing materials above $B_{12}$ and the slower adsorbing materials below.

Then all the chemist has to do is push out the column of adsorbent and cut out the section that has Bı. Usually he can find the stuff he wants by its color (hence the name, chromatography), but other identification methods can be used.

Chromatography has become increasingly important recently in much biochemical research, not just in $\mathrm{B}_{12}$ extraction. In this country, vitamin $\mathrm{B}_{12}$ is usually made by a fermentation process, like penicillin.


Crude liver extract is poured through big adsorption columns. Because different compounds
are adsorbed at different rates, $\mathrm{B}_{12}$ fraction will collect in one small section of a column.

After adsorbing material is pushed out of tube, desired fraction, now concentrated in one
place, is simply cut out with knife. It can then be dissolved and crystallized in pure form.



## Model Fans Plan Their Dream Railroad

MOUNTAIN snow swirled outside the cabin. Inside, around a friendly, crackling fire, sat a group of men, their minds far from the weather, the place-and reality. They were dreaming the great American dream: what they would do with lots of money to throw around.

This time the dream wasn't push-button houses or sleek sports cars. It was the Great American Plaything. Electric trains. Anyone who ever says that he has lost interest in model trains is a liar. Everybody knows that.

What these men sitting around the fire did was simply to concoct the most tremendous and incredible model electric railroad ever. It was no static, regimented railroad that
just keeps cars moving past miniature stations and through papier-mâché tunnels. This model-railroader's heaven would be an unpredictable world. There would be wrecks and landslides; rain and snow; sunlight, darkness, and dawn.

And yet it was a very real railroad-in the sense that it could be built. Every detail is within present technical know-how.

Once the money is collected, the rest of the dream could become reality.

Here's how it would look:
The railroad is housed in a gigantic han-gar-like building about the size of a city block, and three or four stories high. Seven feet above the floor an immense table, covering the entire area of the building, has been constructed. Mountains, valleys, plains, and deserts are built on this platform. Trap doors, strategically placed and camouflaged, give access to the surface of the table.

The huge room beneath the platform contains shops for the building and maintenance of the dream world above. A network of wires connects sections of track, control panels, switches, light systems, automatic uncoupling ramps.

Through the mountains and valleys of this miniature world run miles of tiny rails-in long straightaways and easy curves, or climbing in tortuous switchbacks across the mountains. The entire layout is built to what model railroaders call HO gauge
(tracks 5 inch wide), which is based on a scale of approximately $1 / 8$ inch to the foot. Men and women in such a world are about $3_{4}$ inches tall. A 3,000-foot mountain towers 30 feet. Boxcars are six inches long.

Over the rails of this Lilliputian land roll dozens of electric trains. These vary in length from five to 50 cars. There are sleek streamliners, standard Pullmans, long freights, strings of coal and tank cars.

Streams and rivers flow gently beside the tracks or foam down mountain gorges. Across them tiny rails are supported on the spans of miniature bridges. The water supply is piped beneath the table.

The entire railroad is divided into blocks, or sections of track. There is a station for each of these blocks. Some of these stations are located in miniature cities, others in desolate mountain hamlets. Near every station is a tower reaching almost to the roof of the shed. These towers have two glassedin compartments, one above the other.

In the lower compartment sits the switchman for that particular block of track. In front of him a complicated panel controls any switch in his block. The switchmen wear headphones and transmitters so that they can keep in constant communication with the engineers, repair crews, yardmen, and, of course, the dispatcher.

The top compartment of each tower houses one or more engineers. Each engineer controls one train operating on the layout. With a system technically known as "cab control," he has almost complete control of his train at any point along the miles of track in the huge shed.

Each engineer uses two controls, a throt-

tle for adjusting speed and a reversing lever. Through binoculars he peers across the landscape, trying to keep his train in view. Often the mountains, forests, or tunnels hide it. Sometimes it enters a curtain of rain or falling snow. Then he must run his train blind, under dispatcher's orders.

The key man in the whole layout is the dispatcher-but he never sees the dream world at all. He sits in an air-conditioned, windowless cubbyhole. On his desk is the day's operating schedule and dispatching sheet. Lights flashing on a map of the entire layout show movements of each train.

Through the dispatcher's headphones pours an endless stream of information from engineers, switchmen, and maintenance crews. Into his microphone the dispatcher gives the orders that sidetrack a freight, highball the streamliner through, untangle the mess when disaster strikes.

A "day" on this railroad is only four hours long. (For convenience, the dreamers decided to speed up the rotation of the earth.) All clocks and timing devices work on a six-to-one gear ratio, allowing just four excite-ment-filled hours from dawn to dawn.

And dawns are very real dawns. Banks of floodlights begin to glow, then slowly brighten. First the outlines of the mountains show, then the long parallel lines of rails gleam in the dimness. Tower lights in the yards wink off; lights in cities and passen-

ger-train windows go out. Daylight comes.
Now the dispatcher, the men in the towers, and the maintenance crews know that in two hours black night will follow. Then come those 120 minutes when the engineers must stare through darkness trying to follow the tiny lights of their trains.

Each time the sponsors of the railroad gather for a contest, they face a prearranged schedule. There will be so many freight cars to be moved to their various destinations. The streamliner and fast passenger trains must travel so many miles, involving many laps around the main line. Cars must be shunted onto sidings and trains made up.

The operating schedule for each "day" will be different, but all schedules will be equally difficult. At monthly intervals during a period of perhaps a year, a different set of operators, from dispatcher to repairmen, will run the layout. The team most successful in handling its schedule will be adjudged the winner.

As to the prize . . . we're still dreaming, so money is no obstacle. Or perhaps the honor of being on the team that won the world's strangest and most elaborate game would be sufficient reward.

But that's not all. In this game, darkness and ordinary breakdown will only be minor -hazards. Pre-set devices will, at times and places unknown to any of the operators, let loose torrents of rain and blinding blizzards
of snow. The rain will come from a net of sprinklers above the layout, and the snow from dry-ice chutes. Maybe we'll need miniature snow ploughs to clear drifts.

But the pre-set timing devices will have even more sinister purposes. A number of small explosive charges will be placed at strategic points around the layout. The location of the charges and the moment of explosion will be unknown.

When those explosions occur bridges and tunnels collapse and landslides bury sections of track, or perhaps bend a single rail.

Such "minor accidents" will continually upset the operating schedule. But if a train wreck is involved-perhaps a string of 50 tiny cars toppling off a shattered bridge and plunging down a 30 -foot mountain into a river below-there will be real trouble.

Repairs to the right-of-way will be made by the maintenance crews. Popping up through the trap door nearest the point of trouble, they will lay temporary track, rebuild bridges, clear away landslides, put cars back on the rails. Damaged rolling stock will be taken to the shops beneath the table. Repairs will be rushed. A shortage of units might be disastrous.

It was suggested that one end of the shed be glass, to let spectators in a grandstand watch the drama of the toy-train paradise. This idea was enlarged until all the walls of the shed were windows, and the cost of op-
erations was paid for by charging admission.
Then somebody proposed that all sorts of hobbyists could be called upon. Model builders could produce miniature trucks, automobiles, farm equipment, tiny human beings-all built to scale. Garden-club members could lay out and plant fields and forests, using real grass, miniature flowers, and dwarf trees. Architectural students could design and construct buildings.

Then a man who had been pumping at the fire with a broken-down bellows said:
"Maybe we wouldn't need millionaires. Maybe just cooperation would do it."

But the discussion had already switched to a new and ultra-diabolical proposal.

Whenever the layout was in full operation, a short freight train would follow a schedule calling for almost constant movement. The boxcars of this train would be loaded with "dynamite"-small explosive charges that would be set off by any abrupt jar. Should this train be in an accident, or even be roughly handled by its engineer, blooey! The train would blow up, making an awful mess and taking out a lot of track.

About then the session broke up, and the drama suddenly became just a dream. But somehow it seems better to dream of things like that than the wars that most of the human race has always dreamed about.

Anyway, it was a swell idea. Somebody ought to build it.

## Soft Drums Are Lighter, Safer

TLEXIBLE drums, as flat as the proverbial pancake when empty, are going to compete with metal containers for the shipment of such items as oils, greases, fats, acids, paints, emulsions, and soaps.

The United States Rubber Co. is manufacturing the drums after nearly three years of development and testing work. Each drum is made in one piece of a cord fabric impregnated with synthetic rubber. Use of the new container is expected to save time and expense in shipping empties. More than 2,500 of them, collapsed, can be shipped in a standard railroad boxcar that would hold only 300 rigid drums.

Because the drums are considerably lighter than metal ones, the company expects them to find use in the transportation of liquids by air and for dropping liquids by parachute to ground troops.

The drums are tough, easy to lift, and can be rolled and stowed easily. They're noncorrosive, nonabsorbent, and resistant to weathering. When full, they retain their shape. They need no venting while being filled or emptied, and therefore eliminate a hazard in handling dangerous acids and combustible liquids.

Liquid is valved from partly collapsed drum. Atmospheric pressure flattens the container.

SEVENTY-EIGHT years ago, when the game was first played in England, it was called "Sphairistike" (sphere and stick). Today, it is known as "lawn tennis." But regardless of what you call it, or whether you play it on a grass, clay, composition, or indoor court, one of the prime requisites is a good tennis racket-and that means specialized skill in woodworking.

If you were to visit a tennis-racket plant, like the big A. G. Spalding \& Bros. factory at Chicopee, Mass., you would see skilled workers using the industrial counterparts of the same machines that make up a wellequipped motorized home workshop. Planers, circular saws, shapers, sanders, drill presses, and routers all play an important part in the forming of a tennis racket, as do such hand woodworking operations as gluing and laminating, sanding, countersinking, wood filling, and paint and lacquer


1 Here are basic parts that go into a tennis racket. The wood laminations are 64 -in.-long strips cut freehand with the grain from clear, second-growth mountain-ash boards.

spraying. Except for the strings, the leather grip, and a few reinforcing pieces of rawhide and fiber, the modern laminated tennis racket is a product of wood, glue, and skilled craftsmanship.

A Spalding racket actually begins on large tracts of land in northern New England where the lumber is grown. The most important wood involved is the clear, straight-grained, second-growth ash used for the thin laminations that form the heart and muscle of the racket. It takes approximately 60 years to grow an 8 - to 10 -inch ash tree that will provide only enough highquality strips for 200 rackets.

After the trees have been felled and cut

up into boards, the boards in turn are sliced up into thin strips by experienced workers who carefully follow the grain of the wood freehand as they guide the lumber through double-bladed gang saws. Carefully dried to the proper moisture content, the strips are then graded according to color and size and straightness of grain. At least six of these strips go into every laminated racket.

Once the lamination strips have been graded, the gradual building-up process of making the basic racket frame begins. Selected maple is steam-bent and cut to form the inner reinforcement for the head, or bow. The plug, or interior part of the handle, and the throat wedge, a V-shaped

piece, are sawed from kiln-dried basswood.
Finally, these assorted pieces of ash, basswood, and maple come together at a combination bending and pressing machine where they are coated with a plastic glue and formed under tremendous pressures into the laminated racket frame. Forces greater than 1,000 pounds per square inch press the glue-coated parts together around a metal form. Screw clamps are then applied, and the form is placed in a kiln to dry the glue. After about 12 hours of kiln and air drying, the frame is ready for the various woodworking operations that will convert it into a finished racket.

In rapid order, the frame is planed to

proper thickness, the string holes are marked and drilled, the head, or bow, is beveled and chamfered to shape, the handle pieces, or "flakes," are glued into place, and the handle is formed. Although machines do much of the actual work, the hands of skilled woodworkers guide the frame through the various operations.

## Weight and Balance Are Vital

Weight and balance are particularly important in a tennis racket. If either is off, a slug of leaded rubber, cut to provide the right weight, is inserted in a hole drilled in the handle butt. A wood plug holds the slug in place.

After the frame has been spray painted,

decorated, and lacquered, the leather grip is applied and the racket goes to the stringers. Here, again, deft hands place the vertical main strings and weave in the cross strings. Working with awls, pliers, and special hooks, the stringers are capable of pulling each string to a uniform tightness of between 50 and 55 pounds.

Finally, operators thread in the colored trim that you find at the top and bottom of the strings on most rackets. Oddly enough, neither this string trim nor the bindings on the racket head add any strength to the racket. They are merely decoration. Years ago, someone put them on a tennis racket and now both pros and dubs insist that they be there.

## How a Gas Pump Works

## It's a long way from the oldtime hand gas pump to the automatic machines that fill the tank and figure the price.

EVERY time you pull into your favorite service station for gas, you make use of a tricky mechanical device whose operations have probably intrigued many of the nation's 56 million drivers. The diagram at right shows how a pump fills your car.
The attendant removes the hose nozzle from the port and at the same time turns the "This Sale" dials back to zero. An interlock switch prevents delivery of gas until all indicator dials have been returned to zero.

This action starts a $\%$-hp. motor belted to an internal-gear pump (sliding-vane pumps and herringbone-gear pumps are also widely used). As the pump builds up pressure before the nozzle is opened, a safety valve opens a by-pass that allows the gas to return to the suction side of the pump to keep pressure from climbing too high. The opening of the nozzle to start the flow of gas causes a decrease in the pressure at this point and the safety valve snaps shut, allowing the gas to flow.

From the pump, gasoline moves to the air separator-a kind of settling tank that removes air bubbles. The airfree gasoline then goes to the meter-really a kind of turbine or pump in reverse. As the gas flows through the meter, it turns a crankshaftone turn for every gallon. These turns are then translated into gallons and dollars and cents on dials-accurate to .3 of 1 percent.

Last leg of the trip is to the top of the tank, where the gasoline sets vanes spining
behind a glass viewer to tell the customer that his gasoline is really airfree.

As the attendant lets up on the nozzle handle, a two-way pressure-regulating valve is tripped. This traps the gasoline in the line under pressure to keep it full and minimize loss through vaporization. If too much pressure accummulates, the valve bleeds it back around the pump, thus preventing damage to the hose.

Hoses get longer and longer. Some can deliver gas to an automobile a full 16 feet away. The extra length is automatically retrieved by weighted pulleys. Nozzles are of non-sparking brass, aluminum, or rubber, and usually have a two-speed adjustment for slowing the gas as a tank nears full.

Safety-fill nozzles with automatic shut-offs protect a car from spilled gas and save waste. Flow of gas past orifice sucks air from chamber, but as long as chamber is vented by air tube to nozzle, vacuum can't build up. When level of gas closes vent, vacuum moves diaphragm that drops pivot end of lever, closing valve.

PROBABLY one of the most unusual houses every built has just been completed at 1791 Washtenaw Street, Ypsilanti, Mich. It was constructed almost entirely of surplus materials bought from an automobile factory.

The walls of one room are finished in pyroxlin and vinyl cloth, the materials used in automobile interiors, and they make cleaning an easy job.

Stairway pads are made from automobile rubber floor mats.

The living-room furniture is covered with luxurious car-upholstery fabrics.

Surplus car upholstery was made into bedspreads, rugs, and draperies.

Auto deck-lid mats insulate the walls.
Surplus car seats provided soft chairs for the recreation room.

Even the bricks and lumber that went into the house structure were recovered from auto-company surplus.

The owner, M. E. Barenow, merely took advantage of the fact that the Kaiser-Frazer Corp., at Willow Run, sells discontinued lines of fabrics and surplus materials at re-

## Rubber Tires Replace Steel

This new butterfly-shaped tire (left above) for use on corn planters is made of rubber. The high shoulders press the soil into the furrow to cover seed dropped in front of the wheel. This unusual shape is
retained even when fully inflated. The new tire, made by B. F. Goodrich, replaces similarly shaped steel wheels that tend to clog up in wet earth and slip on hillsides, resulting in uneven distribution of seed. The rubber also cushions shocks, reducing wear.


Most Powerful Turbojets to Drive B-47
The most powerful turbojet engines being produced in the U . S. will soon be installed in the Air Force's only all-jet super-bomber-the Boeing B-47C.

The thrust of these Allison J35-A-23 engines has not been disclosed, but four of them will pack more power than the six now driving the big bomber. The reduction in
the number of engines is expected to result in weight and fuel economies and extend the flight range.

The new engines will have "cannular" combustion chambers-a big outer chamber to which air from the compressor is fed, and eight cans within it where the fuel and air are burned. The engine is 172 inches long and 37 inches in diameter.

## Propeller Squeezed From Hot Metal

$H^{\text {OLLOW-STEEL propeller blades for }}$ 11 high-speed combat and commercial aircraft are now being squeezed out like spaghetti. Extrusion-the art of shaping metal in a continuous form by forcing it through a die-is of course not new, but the method has never before been used to produce the complex shapes and tapered wall thicknesses required in prop blades. The process, developed by Curtiss-Wright and the Air Force, results in a stronger blade, and reduces hours of skilled handwork to a simple operation that takes only minutes.


White hot, the chrome-nickel-molybdenum steel billet is being inserted into the die container of the extrusion press for the first operation. The big press is rated at 5,500 tons.


Tapered tube emerges from last extrusion step. Blade will now be flattened with dies that impart proper twist. Nitrogen pumped inside gives internal support during this forming step.


THIS salty-looking British rescue craft has everything-including the kitchen stove. One of several now in service along the British coast, it has many features not usually found on boats of this type.

One refinement is the enclosed deck cabin, made possible by the use of weightsaving aluminum for all superstructure, in-
cluding the cabin itself, the mast, a canopy over the instrument panel, and the ventilators.

The boat is 64 feet 9 inches long, with a beam of 12 feet 9 inches. She carries a crew of eight and, even in rough weather, can carry up to 95 persons.

Especially designed for coastal rescue work, the Watson cabin-type lifeboat is shown under way in British waters. The boat can carry as many as 95 persons in a rough sea, has crew of eight, can run 230 miles at top speed without refueling.

## Giant Plow Helps Grow Cotton

Uprooting mesquite and black brush, one of the largest plows ever built is transforming almost worthless uncleared land near Corpus Christi, Tex., into cotton-growing land worth $\$ 300$ an acre. Its 10 -footwide plowshare, in foreground above, is
mounted at the rear of a powerful tractor. A bulldozer blade at the front breaks down heavy growth, and a steel canopy protects the operator from falling trees. Traveling at two m.p.h., the plow goes 22 to 26 inches deep, and clears 20 acres daily. A smaller tractor collects uprooted brush for burning.

## New Phone Links Fire Fighters

Masked firemen and their chief get twoway communication with the sound-powered Maskfone (right), developed by Mine Safety Appliances Co., Pittsburgh. Using a headset for listening, a fireman speaks into a diaphragm built into an oxygen or gas mask.

Powered by sound vibrations, the phone needs no separate power supply. It proved itself during a fire atop a Pittsburgh building. Without it, firemen would have had to descend 21 flights to report or get orders.


## Economical Three-Wheel Truck from Germany May Set New Style

Something new in trucks is this threewheeled Tempo, made in Hamburg, Germany, and just introduced in the U. S. Its maker claims it gets 35 miles on a gallon of gas-oil mixture, and carries a substantial load at $45 \mathrm{~m} . \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{h}$. The economical one-ton machine has four speeds forward
and one reverse, with chain drive direct to the front wheel (left below). It has a 400 c.c. ( $24.41 \mathrm{cu} . \mathrm{in}$.) water-cooled Ilo twocycle engine mounted integrally with the front wheel-the engine turns with the wheel. A gearshift lever extends from the dash; other controls are standard.


## Scientific Torture Makes Your Home Safer

IF A budding DiMaggio, practicing his swing in the living room, accidentally whams your TV screen with a baseball batand nothing happens-you're not just lucky. You can be pretty sure the prototype of the set's safety mask, before it ever went on the market, proved its ruggedness by standing up undamaged under a blow of five footpounds from a steel ball.

Banging television sets across the screen with steel balls is only one of the scientific tortures to which household appliances are subjected by engineers of the Underwriters' Laboratories, Inc., to make sure they can take far rougher treatment than they are likely to get in normal use. Safety improvements based on those tests are reducing the risks of modern living for practically
every man, woman, and child in the country.
Four hundred thousand products have been submitted for testing to Underwriters' Laboratories-in Chicago, New York, and San Francisco-by more than 6,000 manu-

familiar and respected "U. L." label; but on many there isn't. They include such diverse items as baby incubators and static eliminators, electric shavers and acetylene torches, matches and fire extinguishers, windowcleaners' belts and fire-retarding windows, lightning rods and the gasoline pumps installed at filling stations.

## No Such Thing as "Fireproof"

Among the U.L. engineers I talked with recently in their big Chicago laboratories there is a general air of cautious conservatism in discussing their work. They shudder at talk of "fireproof" buildings or materials or of "burglar-proof" safes and bank vaults. They bear down heavily on the word "resistant" in discussing safety against hazards. Strong-boxes for valuables are "thiefresistant" within certain limits, but never "thief-proof." Tiles, flooring, doors, and the like are "fire-resistant" up to a certain point; they are never "fireproof."

A typical U. L. test for an office safe is to


Cooking range is checked for fire hazards by thermocouples attached to 20 points on stove. With oven and burners on, tester notes whether temperature anywhere exceeds the safety limit.


Washing-machine wringer is tested by pressing on safety release with a spring gauge. Rollers must snap open at a push of no more than 20 lb . or wringer is not held to be safe for use.


Electric drills are strapped down and run for long periods against work loads simulated by a dynamometer to see whether they overheat and how their insulating material stands up.


Nonskid floor wax is tried out by noting at what angle a leather-shod mechanical leg slips on a waxed surface when it is moved gradually outward under a heavy vertical weight.
drop it off a three-story building onto a pile of bricks, apply flame up to $1,000^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$. to its steel walls, assault it for certain periods of time with electric drills and blow torches. If it passes, the engineers can guarantee that it can take abuse far greater than it is likely to run up against at the hands of skilled cracksmen; that, up to some definite degree of heat, records left in it will not be so scorched by outer flames as to be illegible.

A standard practice of Underwriters' Laboratories in testing household appliances is to subject them to strains five times as great as may be expected in normal use. Carelessness by householders in the use of appliances is assumed to be normal.

Occasionally, they figure, Mrs. Doakes will go off shopping and leave her automatic flatiron on the ironing board without pulling the plug. Will it set fire to the board? To find out, U. L. engineers leave flatirons, plugged in, on a sample ironing board for 500 hours at a stretch-three weeks, day and night.

The board will be charred. But if it doesn't blaze, that brand of automatic iron is considered reasonably safe from fire hazard even in the home of careless Mrs. Doakes.

The function of the Underwriters' Laboratories is not to say which particular household appliance or industrial product is better in competition with another. Practically all gadgets of nationally known brands are now on its approved lists. Its real function, rather, is to help manufacturers set and maintain high standards of safety.

Originally the laboratories were supported by the National Board of Fire Underwriters, an insurance organization, which is still a sponsor. Today the entire cost of their work is borne by the manufacturers whose products are tested. They pay on a time basis for work performed, plus the cost of materials and a share of the overhead. There is no direct profit in money-only in lives, limbs, and homes saved by scientific safety engineering.

## Cleat Stops Scaffold Accidents

Serafin G. Lopez, a sailor himself, knows how hard and dangerous it is to raise and lower a bosun's chair when you're sitting in it.

So he developed a combination cleat and shackle that always holds the chair safely, and yet will move easily when the rope is loosened (as shown in the drawing at left). The free end of the rope need not be knotted and unknotted every time the chair is moved, as is done now. In case the rope slips out of the worker's hand, it tightens itself on the cleat, preventing accidents. The shackle-cleat can also be used on painter's scaffolds, as shown in the photo above.

## Sound Waves Wash Clothes

Washers that shake the dirt right out of the clothes with powerful sound waves (PS, Oct. '46, p. 75) are now being made in Germany. This portable model weighs seven pounds, works in any kind of tub, and is said to finish a load in five minutes.


## Glow Tape Marks Blackout Shipments

Although it's nearly dark in this warehouse, the truckman below has no trouble finding his packages. They glow. Luminescent tape, protected by coatings made with Goodrich Geon resin, does it. Century Coating Co., Whitestone, N. Y., makes the tapes.

HERE is the plane our Air Force is putting its money on to defend continental U.S.A. against A-bombers coming in high and fast, by day or night, in any kind of weather: the Northrop F-89 Scorpion interceptor.

Its stinger is a battery of six $20-\mathrm{mm}$. cannon, and its feelers are radar and elec-
tronic computers for navigation, spotting targets, and training its guns.

The Air Force officially describes the F-89 as an airplane "in the 600 -mile-anhour class." Reliable reports say it cruises at $535 \mathrm{~m} . \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{h}$. and has a top speed of 706. Its two souped-up Allison turbojet engines boost the 15 -ton interceptor to its service

ceiling of 10 miles in a matter of minutes.
Northrop engineers credit the plane's sensational performance in part to its broad, ultra-thin wing. Because telephone engineers found a sniff of strange gas near a switchboard room, the Bell System is getting a new kind of storage battery. It will last 50 percent longer, run many more months without extra water, and hold its charge five times better than older types. It promises to save the phone company $\$ 1,000,000$ a year.

The strange gas in the story was stibine. The engineers, searching for the cause of a tarnish on dial switches, traced the stibine to the storage batteries kept by switchboards for emergency power. It was being formed from antimony mixed with the lead in the batteries as a hardening agent. More research showed that stibine had nothing to do with the switch tarnish, but did have a lot to do with lowering the efficiency of the batteries. By using calcium instead of antimony to harden the lead, stibine is eliminated and the better battery results.

The new battery, already in production, is designed specifically for telephone use. What about automobiles? Bell scientists won't say yes or no. But this battery is the same general type as a car battery. The rest is up to the industry and the public.

X-Ray Tester Gets Electric Eye to Speed Inspection


Electric-eye inspection, already used to count pills and discard green oranges, can now even examine what's inside a product. A new kind of electric eye-a crystal sensitive to X rays-makes this possible. Test setups have already gauged the fullness of cans of foods (photo at left above) and spotted empty spaces in blasting fuses (right).

The crystals used are cadmium sulfide, "grown" by Drs. Rudolf Frerichs, of Northwestern University, and John E. Jacobs, of the General Electric X-Ray Corp. When struck by X rays passing through the product, they generate a current, just as ordinary photocells do when struck by light, and thus work an inspection signal.

## Model Planes Vie in


, Dodging each other takes nimble footwork as model-plane pilots, keeping within circle of

Whirling dervishes fly up to six entries at once in the most exciting kind of miniature speed contest yet devised.

YOU see several grown men wheel round and round inside a 10 -foot circle. One lifts his hands high, and another ducks beneath them. Every three seconds the group dogtrots around the circuit, in a scramble that continues until 140 turns have been completed.

They're racing model airplanes. At the end of twin piano wires they hold with U-shaped handles, nifty little buzz-ships whip around a wide circle at $80 \mathrm{~m} . \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{h}$. in a 10 -mile race. After eight minutes or so, the whirling dervishes zoom their planes into a sharp climb. Props stop, and the I46 popular science

10 -foot diameter, race their craft around circular course on 60 -foot tethers of piano wire.

Prop kicks up gale as miniature plane awaits start of race. Using syringe, Keith Storey keeps its tiny fuel tank brimful, so plane will carry every precious drop permitted by rules.

planes glide down to landings. Then the perspiring and dizzy pilots make for the nearest place to sit down.

This new kind of racing is the most exciting contest yet cooked up by modelplane fans. Formerly competing speedsters flew singly, in individual runs against the clock. Now as many as six racing planes may take the air at once, to vie directly with each other. Mechanical starters loose them simultaneously. Timers count their completed laps, and the first one to finish the required number is the winner.

Pilot and mechanic form a team to race each entry. In a 10 -mile race, a plane may land three or four times to refuel. Then the team works fast to squirt fuel into the oneounce tank, spin the prop, and get the ship airborne again. To date, the record is 14 seconds from landing to take-off.

Rules specify a maximum racing altitude of 25 feet. A plane may pass either over or under one it overtakes. Its pilot must tell the overtaken pilot which he is going to do. The 60 -foot control lines serve not only to guide the planes in a circle, but also to maneuver them. The twin wires enter a plane's wingtip side by side, and work its elevators through a bell crank to which they are attached. Tugging one strand or the other makes the plane climb or descend.


Flight box beside plane being fueled is owner's portable service station. Usual contents include tools, spare parts, fuel, and dry cell, hooked up as shown to heat engine's glow plug.

Planes needn't be scale models but must resemble full-scale racers. Wing area must be at least 125 sq. in., and engine displacement between .201 and .300 cu . in. These single-cylinder, two-cycle engines deliver $1 / 2$ to $3 / 4 \mathrm{hp}$. at 18,000 r.p.m. Standard fuel is

a mixture of methanol and castor oil with nitrated elements added. For realism, every plane must carry a "pilot" fashioned to 1/10 scale.

Called "control-line team racing," the new sport dates from a meet at Burbank, Calif., some months ago, when a group of Pasadena enthusiasts tried a three-plane jump-off. Last year, for the first time, it
was included in the national meet at Dallas, Tex., and Don Post, of Glen Rock, N. J., became the first national champion. Now model clubs all over the country are scheduling similar races. The Academy of Model Aeronautics official rules have been taken directly from those of the F.A.S.T.-"First All-Speed Team" club-the original Pasadena group.

And that is just where the antenna for TUPI-TV was placed by General Electric engineerseven though all the equipment had to be hauled up by hand, mules, or cable car. Brazil has one other station (in Sao Paulo) and several thousand receivers.


## Electronic Sergeant Recruits Gls

The recruiting sergeant has gone electronic. As soon as a prospect steps on a mat outside the Armed Forces booth in New York's Times Square, an automatic tape player (above) spiels the advantages of enlisting. General Electric made the device.

This and other equally grueling tests are part of the work of the Engineer Research and Development Labs at Fort Belvoir, Va. Here the Army gets the low-down on various types of containers before using them to ship valuable supplies to the frozen wastes of the Arctic or the torrid hot-boxes of the tropics.

A vibration stand subjects crates to a terrific shaking such as they have to take in a railroad freight car or on a truck journey over rough roads. A giant ceiling-high press squeezes containers with a load up to 100 tons.

Besides being rugged, crates and packages must be able to protect contents from deterioration due to rust, sleet, cold, or heat. To pass, they must come through immersion in a water tank and prove their ability to withstand the man-made rigors of Arctic and tropic climatic chambers.

In early years of World War II less than half the material shipped overseas arrived in usable condition. The project has halved this loss-but the Engineers' goal is 95 to 100 percent safe arrival.

## Pneumatic Hand Saw Won't Kick or Grab

THIS pneumatic hand saw works like those teeth-jarring air hammers you've seen digging up streets. One big difference, though, is that it has two 21 -inch blades side by side, so arranged that one moves backward as the other moves forward. It makes 1,500 strokes a minute, but because of opposed action will not grab or kick.


Compressed air pushes forward a semicylindrical piston attached to one blade. As this blade moves forward, its motion is reversed by a rack and pinion and transferred to the second blade, moving it backward. At the end of the stroke, a cam trips a shuttle valve that closes air to the first piston and opens it to a piston attached to the second blade. This drives the second

Pry off the metal spine before discarding a loose-leaf book, and mount it on a cellar wall. Its rings will hold instruction sheets for your oil burner, washing machine, and power tools.


To make low fences for flower beds, bend wire hangers to a diamond shape. Stick straightened hooks into ground, and wire together adjoining points for added strength.


To repair a plastic hose with a hose mender, first soften the end of the hose by immersing it in very hot water. Use a mender slightly larger in diameter than the inside of the hose.


Steep or narrow attic and cellar stairs can be dangerous. Fix several screen-door handles along the way for handholds and ascending and descending will be easier and safer.


To fasten brackets to concrete walls, drill holes with a star or carbide-tipped drill, fill with plastic composition wood, and let dry. Common wood screws will hold firmly.

Do your Venetian blinds rattle and bang when windows are left open? Cup hooks and screw eyes between the bottom of the blinds and the sill will stop this.


To remove drip stains from asbestos shingles, use one cup of trisodium phosphate powder in a pail of hot water. Scrub thoroughly and rinse with clean water and a sponge.


To keep insects from crawling into the house between window frame and screen, seal cracks shut with white surgical tape. It adheres well and matches white woodwork.


Ordinary shoe trees won't work in women's strap-back shoes. But if you alter the heel knob as shown, the strap will fit in it securely and the shoe can be kept in shape.


A long carriage bolt, inserted through a bit of pipe and a washer, and then driven in the
ground, makes a simple hose guide. It serves as a roller past which the hose pulls freely.


## Rear Light Flashes Slow-Up Signal

If you were following the car above, a flashing amber light would warn you when its driver had taken his foot off the gas and was slowing down, even though he hadn't yet applied his brakes. It's equipped with an accessory called Slo-Lite, operated by a vacuum control that turns it on when the accelerator is released. It is made by Twentieth Century Mfg. Co., of Los Angeles.


## Home Vacuum Tests Waterproof Radios

The Lewyt Corp. used to test its waterproof Signal Corps radios for leaks by dunking them in water-risking damage to valuable equipment. Now they simply hook up an ordinary household vacuum cleaner (a Lewyt, of course) to the set and pump out most of the air. If a vacuum holds inside at a specified level, the set passes. If not, the parts aren't damaged by water.

## "Black Light" Illuminates Traffic Sign at Night

Shown below is a driver's night view of an unusual traffic sign near River Grove, Illinois. Painted with new fluorescent pigments, it looks like a conventional road
marker in the daytime. But at night invisible ultraviolet rays from the lamps above the sign cause the letters to produce a penetrating glow visible for 200 yards.

## Machinery travels in circles and a twostory building revolves to apply assem-bly-line methods in ring-shaped factory.

ELIEVED unique among the nation's 1,250 building-brick factories, a merry-go-round plant at Muirkirk, Md., has operated for 13 years almost unnoticed, since its odd design is conspicuous only from airplanes. In a ring-shaped structure of $140-$ foot overall diameter, traveling kilns ride a circular track to bake raw bricks to final hardness. A revolving two-story inner building forms the raw bricks from clay, and delivers them on a conveyor to any part of the ring.

Standard brickmaking machinery has been adapted to the circular assembly-line procedure. Mixed with water by the rotating knives of a pugmill, clay emerges from the extruding machine like toothpaste from a tube, and wires slice it into raw bricks. Heating in kilns serves to fuse minerals called fluxes in the clay, imparting rocklike hardness. Red bricks owe their color to oxide of iron, another common clay ingredient. At the Muirkirk plant, the Washington Brick Company produces 90,000 smooth red and textured bricks daily, selling most to contractors within 50 miles. END

Lower conveyor of central building retracts to clear roof columns as building revolves. Then it extends to deliver raw bricks to workers, who stack them in piles as at left.


Just as wires in kitchen gadgets slice cheese or hard-boiled eggs, big cutter uses wires to slice raw bricks from a column of moist and plastic clay, seen entering from lower left.


Traveling kilns (beneath roof) heat bricks 21 hours at $2,000^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$. to harden them. Leftover hot air, blown through flues, dries and preheats bricks that await firing elsewhere in circle.


## Big Pipes Sail to Work

San franciscans saw strange craft sailing in their bay recently. They were 480 -ton pipes as big as boxcars. Each was a section of a pair of intake tubes that will carry cooling water 400 feet from the bay to a new Pacific Gas and Electric steam plant on shore. Bechtel Corp. engineers cast the concrete pipes on land, floated them to the right spot, and then opened valves to sink them into position.


## Steel Ball Stores Rocket Fuel

It took nearly a ton of welding rod alone to make this tank for rocket fuel. The tank must hold 200 gallons of liquid nitrogen-at a pressure of 5,500 pounds per square inch and a temperature of $340^{\circ}$ below zero. Six extra-thick stainless-steel plates, pressed to the curved shape assumed by the faces of a blown-up cube, form the big ball. Research Welding and Engineering, South Gate, Calif., made the "Nitro-Sphere" tank.


## Indoor Drydock Cradles Two Big R3Y-1 Flying Boats

This maze of steel pipe four stories high is an indoor drydock for giant flying boats. Engineers call it a twin-hull buck. It holds two R3Y-1 turboprop planes during assembly at the Convair plant in San Diego.

Although the huge jig weighs about 1,000 ,000 pounds and contains 8,600 feet of 12 inch pipe, plus hundreds of feet of smaller pipe, it can be taken apart and reassembled in another location in a few days.

## Portable Dishwasher Uses Water Like Brush

Slowly revolving vane throws wave after wave of hot water against dishes in a brushlike action.

Hot water from a top spray first rinses dishes, then falls to the bottom where it is filtered clean again. A rotating vane then hurls waves of water against the dishes like

The new aerosol insecticide bomb above spreads DDT and chlordane crystals in a thick cloud of steam vapor and inert gases generated by dry chemicals. Set off by pulling a small tab, the cardboard Dispercide bomb is under no pressure when not in use and thus needs no metal container. Yosemite Chemical Co., San Francisco, makes it.
a whirling brush. Two top sprays and two power rinses follow. The lid opens automatically to allow steam to escape to start drying. The machine uses only five gallons but recirculates them so that the dishes actually receive 500. Dale Distributing Co., of N. Y. City, sells the wheeled washer.


## Fishing-Tackle Box Made of Glass

Here's a rugged fishing-tackle box that is said to be rustproof, permanently colored, and almost impossible to dent or damage. It's made entirely of Fiberglas, except for the rustproof hardware. The roomy Neptune has two cantilever trays and weighs five pounds. The Hamilton Metal Products Co., of Hamilton, Ohio, sells it for $\$ 17.95$.

## Papering

 a Room from A to Z
## Putting up wallpaper yourself cuts the cost of redecorating —and it's not so hard to do, once you learn the hang of it.

IHAVE just saved $\$ 65$ by repapering a hall, bedroom, and bathroom myself. There are tricks to hanging wallpaper, but these photos will show you most of them.

Preparing a wall. Fill cracks and holes with spackling putty and sand rough spots. If the surface has water-soluble paint on it-such as calcimine-wash it off. Wall-
paper will not stick well over water paint. If the walls have a high-gloss paint on them, wash them with one part ammonia and four parts of water to dull the gloss. Then give the surface a coat of glue size.

Lining paper-a plain paper that goes underneath and keeps wallpaper from pulling apart at the seams-should be put up first if you intend to hang paper directly on fresh plaster. You don't have to use lining paper, however, when you paper


Measure wall from baseboard to ceiling and add $5^{\prime \prime}$ for waste. Then subtract the length of your table and mark the difference on the table. (In this case, it was $20^{\prime \prime}$.) You then can roll out a strip as long as the table and use the mark on the table to add the amount needed to cut strips the right length.


Determine how many single rolls you will need by finding how many square feet must be covered and dividing that figure by 30. Deduct one single roll for every three standard windows and every two standard doorways. Then tear off paper as shown, after first creasing where each strip ends.


Continue spreading paste until you've covered about 4' or $5^{\prime}$ of the strip. Then pick up the pasted end by the corners, using your thumbs and forefingers as shown in this photo, and raise the end straight up.


Fold the pasted part back on itself as far as the pasted area extends. Smooth out any wrinkles. Slide the folded part sideways to line up the edges exactly. Then slide the folded part toward the end of the table to bring all of the unpasted patt of the strip up on the table.
over old wallpaper. Be sure the old paper is tight. If it isn't or if there are several layers, apply hot water and scrape it off.

Incidentally, most wallpaper is sold in double rolls to save waste, but don't let this confuse you. You'll figure in single rolls, and if you need an odd number, your dealer will cut apart a double roll.

Tools. Those you will need are shown on the first page of this story. Many wallpaper stores will rent you the tools. A $3^{\prime}$ by $8^{\prime}$ sheet of plywood topped with Masonite and laid on saw horses makes a table.

Joints. You have a choice of three kinds
of seam. For a lap joint, trim only one edge of the paper and overlap it about $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ over the strip previously hung. For a wire-edge joint, do the same with about a $1 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ overlap. For a butt joint, follow the instructions given with the photographs. A butt joint looks much better and is only a little harder.

If you use a lap joint, start hanging paper from the lighted side of the room. Then the lapped joints won't cast shadows.

Corner cutting. Measure the distance between the last strip and the corner. Trim the next strip to this width plus $1^{\prime \prime}$. Hang this strip, folding $1^{\prime \prime}$ around the corner.


Tie a cord across the top of your paste bucket. It will serve as a rest for the paste brush. Mix your paste according to the directions on the package. Stir it until it is smooth, creamy, and free of lumps. Then set the bucket on a box or stool near the end of the table to avoid bending.

Apply paste to the rest of the strip and fold it back on itself as you did the first part of the strip. Bring this end down to meet the other end of the strip. Having a good table helps; you can rent one in many communities.



Bring the ends of the folded parts together evenly. Then line up the edges of the folds with each other. The edges of the folds must be lined up exactly so the edges of the strip will be straight after trimming. Smooth out wrinkles or bubbles. [Continued on next page.]


Lay your straightedge along the edge of the folded strip. Line up the straightedge with the trim marks on the paper. If there are no trim marks, measure the distance from the edge of the paper to the straightedge at each end of the strip. The straightedge must be parallel to the edges of the paper.


Make sure your trimming knife is sharp. Keep a piece of fine emery cloth handy. Sharpen the knife on the cloth after you have trimmed every three or four strips of wallpaper. And keep a carton beneath the table into which you can throw wet trimmings.


Mount your stepladder carefully, holding the strip only by the corners and supporting it with the other fingers just as you picked it up. Hang the first strip in an inconspicuous corner or next to a door or window, where a mismatch when you finish will be less noticeable.


Place the top edge of the paper on the wall where it meets the ceiling. While still holding the top edge with thumbs and forefingers, let go with the other fingers. The lower part of the strip will drop. Catch it with your foot so the sudden jerk doesn't tear the wet paper. The bottom part will remain folded.


Unfold the lower fold after you have worked down to it with the smoothing brush. Reach under the fold, grasp the edge, and peel it down. With the lower fold opened, finish smoothing the strip all the way down to the baseboard.


Plumbing the first strip comes next. This is important. Frequently the starting point-a window or door frame-is not exactly plumb. The first strip acts as a guide for the whole wall. If you find that the first strip is not plumb, place your palms on it and slide it to the left or right until it is plumb.


Press down hard on the straightedge with one hand to keep it from slipping. Hold the knife against the straightedge and keep the cutting edge perpend:cular to the paper. Exert enough pressure to make the cut in one smooth stroke. Then turn the paper around on the table and trim the other edge in the same way.


Pick up the pasted and folded strip by grasping it at the edges right at the point where the ends meet. Peel back one end slightly and hold the corners by thumbs and forefingers. Use the other fingers to support the strip.
Warning: Make sure the corners you pick up are the top corners of the strip.


Press the top of the paper against the wall. Lap it on the ceiling or picture molding. Line up a vertical edge with a door or window frame or a corner. Lap the vertical edge on the frame or into a corner.


Start at the top and use your smoothing brush to smooth out all wrinkles and air bubbles. Work with diagonal strokes from the center out to the edges of the strip of wallpaper.


Use your smoothing brush to crease the paper sharply against the top of the baseboard. In the same way, crease the paper into corners and into the angle where walls meet ceiling.

Trim off waste by running your casing wheel along the line where baseboard meets the wall. Then trim excess at the ceiling and along door or window frames. Use a sponge to get excess paste off woodwork and the face of the paper. Clean the sponge by washing it frequently in running water.

Match pattern before cutting second strip. Hold roll against strip already on wall to find point near top where pattern matches. With some patterns, you may have to waste up to half a pattern. But usually you can avoid this waste by cutting second strip from a different roll, and the third strip from the first roll, etc.


Measure off and cut the second strip. Paste and trim the strip. Start hanging it at the ceiling. Butt the edge of the second strip against the edge of the first, carefully matching the pattern as you work your way down. Take your time and slide the paper up or down to make the pattern match exactly.


Use your seam roller after you have hung three or four strips. Start at the first seam and roll each one. Roll with long strokes and moderate pressure. If you press too hard you may cause a shiny streak to appear when the paper is dry. If the roller forces out any paste, wash it off at once with your damp sponge.

Hang ceiling paper first in rooms where both walls and ceilings are to be papered. Use a smooth wooden bar (a yardstick will do) to help support one end of the strip while your other hand works it into place. Allow the paper to lap the sidewalls about $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$. The paper on the


Trim around window and door frames with shears. Use the casing wheel to finish up trimming along the edges and tops of frames. Cut the short pieces for above and below windows from the same roll of wallpaper. Keep the casing wheel sharp by stroking it frequently on the emery cloth.

Press one end of the strip into place and then use your smoothing brush to smooth out the rest of the strip. Roll seams and sponge off excess paste just as on walls. An amateur should not attempt a large ceiling without a helper. walls will later cover this lap.



Does the antenna endanger your home? Can you install adequate protection?

MANY Popular Science readers have worried about lightning since putting television antennas on the roofs of their homes. Here are their questions-and the answers:

Should lightning protection be provided when an antenna is put up?

Yes. It costs little, and is required by electrical codes in most communities.

Have many homes been damaged because of a lack of such protection?

No, possibly because TV antennas have been concentrated in cities where tall buildings act as lightning rods. Only fairly recently have TV antennas begun to appear in areas where the lightning hazard is great-
est. It is difficult, moreover, to determine whether a TV antenna is responsible when lightning does strike.

Should an arrester be used on an antenna mast?

No. The mast should be well connected to a good ground. A water pipe is best.

What about the lead-in?
A lightning arrester should be used with an unshielded ribbon lead-in. When a coaxial cable or shielded down-lead is used, the arrester can be omitted and the shield grounded.

Where should the arrester be put?
At the point where the down-lead enters the house. It may be either inside or outside but should not be near any combustible material. An arrester connected at the mast end of the lead offers no protection against induced charges that hit the wire below.

What kind of arrester should I use?
A double arrester that protects both leads. If you can only get the single type, use one in each lead. Underwriters Laboratories test arresters for safety and proper performance. Look for the UL label.

Can I install an arrester myself?
Yes. Most approved TV arresters are made to fit ribbon lead-in. Just slide the wire in and tighten the screws or nuts as directed. With most types, you do not have to cut the wire or even strip the insulation. The center lead or clamp must be grounded.

Is a vent or soil pipe a good ground?
No. Neither is a fire escape. (Non-conductors are often used at the joints.) But the metal frame of a building, electrical conduit, or any underground piping system is a good ground. If necessary, you can bury metal rods or plates deep in the earth.

What size wire should be used for the ground connection?

Electrical codes specify sizes from No. 14 to No. 4. The heat generated by a lightning bolt will melt almost any wire, but the wire will do its job before it falls apart. Number 14 is adequate. It should be clamped-not looped or soldered-to the ground.

Does an arrester affect a set's operation?
Some arresters may weaken the signal in some cases. Reverse the receiver's AC power plug if this happens.

Should a set be turned off during a storm?
Not unless you're the nervous type. Turning it off may reduce the chances that your set will be rlamaged, but does not affect an antenna's vulnerability to lightning. END

Dehumidifier Reactivates Itself


There are no chemicals to replace, nor is there any drip pan to empty, in this new air dryer. It is designed to combat condensation and mildew in basements, "crawl spaces," and cottages closed for long periods.

Humid air is drawn past a dust filter through silica gel, where moisture is adsorbed. After 90 minutes, a valve closes the dry-air outlet, and a wet-air outlet opens. An electric heater then turns on and adsorbed moisture is discharged as warmwater vapor to the outside. After half an hour, the valve shifts back to drying position. Daly, Merritt \& Sullivan, of Falls Church, Va., makes it. The $\$ 125$ price includes air hose, clamps, and window panel. A humidstat controller is available.

## Square End Steadies Flashlight

Does your flashlight roll away from you when you lay it down? A square bit of metal on the end will curb it. If the flashlight is made of steel or brass, solder a square of $1 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ metal on the
 cap; if it is aluminum, attach the metal with rivets; and if the case is plastic, cement a plastic square on it, as shown in the drawing.-Arthur Trauffer, McClelland, Iowa.

## Fancy Button Makes a Drawer Pull

Decorative old buttons make unique knobs for small drawers in cabinets or cosmetic chests. Metal buttons with a wire loop on the back are easiest to mount. Run
 a small cotter pin through the loop and add a piece of metal tubing for a spacer. The spacer shown here is an uncrimped metal eyelet, obtained at a shoe-repair shop. A bit of copper tubing would also serve. Push the cotter pin through the hole in the drawer front and clinch the ends on the inside, drawing button and spacer tight.


## Here's a Trick that Often Helps When You Must Glue Small Pieces



When a small plastic, fiber, or wooden part from some gadget breaks, and simple edge-to-edge gluing fails to repair it, try "splinting" the joint with cement. Cement the edges and let the joint harden. Coat one side of the piece, allow it to dry, and then coat the opposite side. Repeat two or three times on both sides. This forms a thin sleeve over the break. Sand the surfaces smooth. You can also splint a piece by wrapping several turns of cellulose tape around it.-Frank Shore, New York City.

## Powered Tines Pull Garden Tiller

The power of this machine's 2-hp. aircooled engine is applied directly to the tines. They propel the rotary tiller at normal walking speed as they pulverize the soil. The tines can be adjusted from $7^{\prime \prime}$ to $21^{\prime \prime}$ in width. They can also be replaced by two wheels to convert the machine to other uses. By the use of attachments, the Garden Maker becomes a power sprayer, water pump, weed cutter, or lawn mower. The 72-lb. tractor is made by Windolph Tractor Co., of Portland, Ore.

## Faucet Washer Is Thumb Guard

When I use a small file to sharpen an auger bit, I slip a large rubber faucet washer over the tang of the file. It serves as a guard and keeps me from cutting my thumb on the sharp edges of the bit.-R. J. Addicks, New Britain, Conn.

If you need an offset chisel occasionally to cut around a corner or clean out the bottom of a mortise or groove, here's an easy, inexpensive way to make one out of an offset screwdriver. These screwdrivers are cheap, but will hold fairly good cutting edges. Saw off one end of the driver and file enough of a point so you can force it into a handle. File or grind the remaining tip to a chisel point. Touch it up frequently to keep it sharp.-Charles Smith, Jacksonville, Fla.

4 To steady a ladder, level the base. If the 4 ground is uneven, block up the higher foot with a large slab of wood. When working on slippery ground or concrete, tie a rope from the bottom rung to a suitable pipe or post.

1 To carry a ladder, slip your right arm through the rungs and grip the lower sidepiece. Hold the other side with your left hand (inset). If the ladder is wide, you can rest the upper sidepiece on your shoulder.

5 To keep your balance, look straight ahead. Men who work on ladders say it's bad practice to look up or down. For best footing, wear heavy rubber-soled shoes with heels. Thin rubber soles don't give the arch enough protection.



2 To raise a ladder, walk it into place. Rest 2 the base against a projecting curb or foundation, as shown above, and move your hands from rung to rung as you walk forward. To lower a ladder, just reverse the procedure.

6Don't try to carry heavy tools, materials, or paint pots up the ladder with you. You need both hands for safe climbing. The best way is to prepare your materials first, then pull them up after you are in position.


3 To balance a ladder, gauge the distance. 3 The space from the foot of the ladder to the wall should be a quarter to a third the ladder length. Make sure that the tops of the uprights rest on an even surface.

7 Always try to hold the ladder with at least one hand. If your work requires two hands, hook one leg around a rung. If you must lean to one side, hook the opposite leg. Never climb higher than the third rung from the top.


## Rehandling a Hammer Is 10-Minute Job

DON'T be a rhumba-beat Charlie (three smacks on the nail followed by three handle taps on the bench to reseat the hammer head). It's cheaper-and much less painful-to put on a new hammer handle than to call a doctor after you fail to duck
a flying head. You'll enjoy putting it on, and have a better tool to work with.

A hickory handle and a steel wedge will cost you about a quarter. Get a hardwood wedge, too, or saw one yourself. The photos show what to do next.


Head may be wobbly and still refuse to pull off. Quickest solution is to saw off the old handle just behind the hammer head, as above.


Should new handle be tight, use rasp or knife to trim it where hammer eye turns up shavings. Wedge end won't be tight, as eye tapers out there.


Lay the head across open vise jaws to drive out fragment of old handle in the eye. Use a flat-ended punch or a short piece of dowel to hammer on.


After driving handle in hard, saw off excess $1 / 8 \prime$ from head. Drive wooden wedge firmly. If it splits, drive the pieces. Trim protruding part flush.


If the new handle isn't slotted, saw a kerf for the wooden wedge. Cut it the long way of the oval cross section of the handle, and about $1^{1 / 14^{\prime \prime}}$ deep.


Place steel wedge crosswise on wooden one. Start driving with light blows, with handle on a solid surface. After sinking wedge, file flush. END


Filled with flowering plants and spotted in a corner of the lawn, any of these wheelbarrows will add a colorful touch to your garden.

Two of them can be built with odds and ends of lumber and a nail keg. The third one is an old-style barrow that was repaired and painted.
Notice that more than half the nail keg was used. You can cut through the metal bands on the keg with a hacksaw.

For a wheel, glue up and cut an $8^{\prime \prime}$ disk from $2^{\prime \prime}$ stock. Screw hubs on each side and drill a hole for a $12 \prime \prime \prime$ bolt that serves as an axle.-Hi Sibley, Nuevo, Calif.

## A Simple Way to Padlock Your Bolt-Action Rifle

A bolt-action rifle may be easily padlocked. The bolt is removed and a regular wire cleaning rod-not the unscrewing typeis pushed through the barrel from the breech end. A small key-shaped piece of steel with a hole in one end, as shown in the drawing, is slipped through the slot in the rod at the
muzzle end and secured with a small padlock. The bolt then may be replaced if the rod has been cut short and a new loop formed to make it fit the breech more closely. With the rod in place, the rifle cannot possibly be loaded or discharged.-Evan Wright, Topeka.

Touching Up a Scratch. A draftman's metal erasing shield is helpful for this job. Use it to limit your steel-wool rubbing to the edges of the scratch before applying touch-up paint. Use it again if you work over the area with rubbing compound.


Washers Stop Rattles. A tendency of your license plates to rattle can often be overcome by mounting them with rubber faucet washers placed between the plate and bracket. Enlarge the center holes if necessary for the bolts.


How to Curve Hose. A straight piece of rubber-and-fabric hose can be curved by wrapping it with No. 14 or 16 wire. Space the turns about $1 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ apart and anchor the ends securely. When the hose is first curved, it may still tend to collapse, but you can make it take its proper shape by pounding with a hammer and wood block.


Hinge Serves as Door Stop. An old strap hinge can be used like this to keep a garage door from blowing shut. Mount it vertically with part of one leaf projecting below the bottom edge of the door. Attach a light chain to the free leaf and the door and you'll be able to lift the hinge when closing the door.

## MORE Hints from the Model Garage



Wax in Joints Curbs Rust. While waxing your car, press a liberal amount in and around the fender welts and other joints. An old toothbrush will help force it in. Do not wipe away the wax. The excess will not be noticeable, and it serves as a good moisture seal, reducing the chances of rust forming in the joints.


Slotted Nut Locks on Stud. If the threads of a stud are stripped or damaged, you can repair it temporarily by slotting a nut and squeezing it in place on the stud with a pair of heavy pliers. The same trick can be used for removing a stud with no unthreaded portion exposed. The threads won't be damaged by clamping the nut.


Tag Holder for Battery Shop. Short pieces of garden hose slotted at one end make good holders for customer identification cards in a battery-charging room. Hose of the ordinary size slips snugly over most battery posts.


It Pays to Clean Wiper Blades. The initial smear that wipers often make when first turned on can be avoided by occasionally rubbing a soft cloth along the blades. This will remove the accumulation of grease, dirt, and oxidized rubber.

## Hidden Wear Boosts Your Car Expenses

YOU can save money on your car this summer by giving it a pin-point tune-up this spring. Hidden wear always robs an engine of power, pep, and fuel economy, but finding and eliminating it is sometimes a tricky, time-consuming job.

Such wear frequently occurs in the carburetion and ignition systems. The usual type of tune-up, or even a ring and valve job, may fail to bring back all the sparkling performance characteristics that your car

Accelerator pump must give a quick shot of fuel for good snap and pickup. Pump plunger shown was badly worn. A new leather and spring cost little. Inspect the bottom of well for dirt. Even small particles will jam the valve. Most pumps can be connected to the rocker shaft for long, medium, or short strokes to suit the driver and axle ratio. If in doubt, try each position.

lubricated every time you have the car greased. Washing the dirt from countershaft cover will usually reveal lubricating instructions. Some require oil, some grease, and others graphite. If wear is bad, a new assembly is usually your safest bet.
had when it was new, because of insufficient attention to the fuel or electrical systems.

In the carburetor, wear of only $.001^{\prime \prime}$ on the jet bore and a similar amount on the metering rod can increase gas consumption as much as 10 percent. A new rod and a new jet are the cure. But this won't do the job completely if you or your mechanic overlook a badly worn countershaft bearing or a dirty automatic choke.

For it is accumulations of wear that rob an engine of efficiency. One worn spot may not cause trouble. But half a dozen, piled one on another along a carburetor's metering system or a distributor's timing mechanism, can keep the best of engines below par.

Tracking down and repairing or replacing such worn parts is difficult but worth while. An old car, with its lower friction losses,
lever at right was impeded. Clean choke thoroughly with solvent. A bad cover gasket will let in cold air, keeping choke closed too long.

may even outrun the newest model on the road when you have finished the job.

Before you begin, however, make sure the rings, valves, plugs, cooling system, points, and fuel pump are in good condition and functioning efficiently. If they are not, your troubleshooting will count for nothing.

Your carburetor and distributor may not look the same as those pictured on these pages, but the principles are the same, and these photos show some of the pin points where age and neglect take their toll.

## Cleaning Reveals Wear

Because the details you are looking for are easily lost in gum and grime, clean all the parts thoroughly. Use a brush and gumcutting solvent.

If you have a magnifying glass, use it. Inspect all moving parts and linkages. Search out the surfaces that pivot, slide, rub, roll, bump, or contact each other in any way. Try with your fingers for sloppily fitting shafts and bearings. Poke and pry.

Wherever you spot bright and shining wear, fix it. Close up the hole, plate the shaft, or use a shim. Repair kits for rebuilding carburetors, distributors, and pumps are usually available at nominal cost.

Never remove a part until you have noted its original position. Automatic-choke covers, check valves, needle valves, insulating washers, distributor-drive keyways, and so on all have definite and specific adjustments and locations. Count the turns as you remove needle valves. Note distributor-rotor position when you remove the distributor from the engine. Make small scratch marks, file notches, draw sketches, and write down pertinent facts to jog your memory.

## Don't Redesign the Engine

In most distributors, two separate systems control the cam position when the points open or close-and therefore govern the spark timing. One system depends on manifold vacuum, the other on centrifugal force. Neither can operate if the breaker plate is stuck. Under variations in speed and load this plate is constantly moving, seeking to follow a "spark loop" curve ideal for the engine. Interference with its movement, or changes of other parts in relation to the plate, will keep the engine below par.

Throughout the job, avoid major alterations. Remember, you are trying to restore the engine to its original condition, not design a new one.


Wash out distributor with lacquer thinner and soak small parts in jar. Sticky deposits stop free movement of breaker plate and other parts.


Hardened grease may lock breaker-plate ball bearing. Wash clean with thinner and then lubricate lightly with petroleum jelly.


Ball bearing may wear dent in the distributor housing like this, giving uneven resistance that prevents proper spark timing. Groove liners are available for a quick repair.

Vacuum spark-control unit always suffers from crankease vapors and rust. A manual check for a springy action and free movement does not necessarily mean the device is perfect, but it shows up worst offenders. Replace if bad.


## Summer Driving Tips

You'll enjoy your car longer by taking the simple precautions these pictures suggest.


Carry a flare for emergencies. A coil spring attached to a board is a handy way to mount type of flare shown. Spring lets flare swing back and forth, making it more noticeable.


A block of wood with holes bored through it and sponge rubber cemented on one face will clean insects off windshield. Wet it before using.

AQUICK glance at this car shows a Nash grille, Cadillac fishtail fenders, Cadillac bumpers, and Lincoln Zephyr wheels. Inside there's a chrome-plated Ford V-8 engine, a Mercury steering wheel, and a Lincoln Continental transmission.

Richard R. Dixon, an apprentice sheetmetal worker in East Hartford, Conn., buught the car secondhand for $\$ 650$, and has spent more than $\$ 2,000$ and 2,000 work hours rebuilding it. He rebored the cylinders, added high-compression rings and heads, substituted a stronger crankshaft, installed an aluminum flywheel-and wound up with an engine that develops 165 hp .

He switched the springs to lower the
body, moved the shift lever from the floor to the steering column, reupholstered the seats in red and white leather, applied reinforced composition leather to the top, painted the body cream and the fenders maroon, and added many accessories. One of these, as you'll see from the engine view at left, above, is a built-in vacuum gauge.

Dixon estimates his car-originally a 1939 Ford convertible-will now do 125 m.p.h. But he never has opened it up.

## Bending Catch Keeps Wiper Blade On

On my car the wipers hang from the windshield top. On several occasions, the wind lifted a blade and swept it away. I have found that bending aside the key-type blade catch after the blade is installed prevents this.-James H. Carll, Schenectady.

## ICover the Races

## A veteran tells you how the Memorial Day Classic is photographed.

ON MEMORIAL DAY, 1948, Frank Salzarulo heard tires screeching while he was standing in the infield of the Indianapolis Speedway. That meant trouble, so he whipped his camera into shooting position, caught the car with the screeching rubber

Want a lift, VP? Paul Shideler, author of this article, invited U. S. Vice President Thomas R. Marshall for a ride in the belt-driven Comet Cycle Car that Paul used to cover the 1914 race at Indianapolis. Bill Herschell, Shideler's coworker, snapped the picture.

in his view finder, and snapped. Then he began looking around.
"This what you're looking for?" a bystander called, and waved a camera slide.

In his haste, Frank had tossed it 25 feet. He had followed my instructions almost too well-and gotten the remarkable picture on the bottom of the next page.

We have to be fast. Having covered the races at the Speedway since 1909, I tell photographers working with me to release the slide catch on their Speed Graphics in advance, pull out the slide just a fraction of an inch, and listen for screeching tires. Frank had been warned not to look first, but get his camera ready, then look through his view finder to see what was happening and in the same instant to pull his slide.

The photo I now prize most resulted from the sportsmanship of a gentleman named Ralph DePalma in 1912. Leading the field by more than 10 miles, with only two laps to go, DePalma's engine quit cold

on the backstre ch. But-smiling every step of the way and waving to the crowd at frequent intervals-he pushed it around the north turn and down to the finish line. There was never a better loser.

In the early days, pictures taken at a shutter speed of $1 / 1,000$ th looked like stills. So we learned to shoot at $1 / 500$ th, even though it blurred the car slightly, because that gave a visual suggestion of speed. Then, as car speeds rose, we upped our shutter speeds to $1 / 750$ th, and finally $1 / 1,000$ th, and began to swing our cameras with the car we wanted as it passed. Such "panning" blurs the background and suggests speed, yet sharpens the picture of the car.

At this year's race, our shutter speeds will be $1 / 1,000$ th of a second, and we will focus at 100 feet. If it's a bright day, we'll stop down to $f / 8$; if dull, we'll open clear up. And we will pan the races.

Tips to amateurs. We press photographers use Speed Graphics largely because they are our standard equipment and we are used to them. Other cameras can be used. With a spring-wound $35-\mathrm{mm}$. camera with a $90-$ to $110-\mathrm{mm}$. lens, you might get a
couple of dozen shots out of one exciting event.

A sunshade is imperative because you never know when you'll have to point your camera into the light. And set your aperture for the shadow side of the subject. You may get halos around the object that you want, but it will be sharp.

Press coverage. Covering the Indianapolis 500 for the press requires planning and teamwork. I station one man near each of the $2 \frac{1}{2}$-mile Speedway's four turns, and another at the pits where cars are serviced.

Memorable moment. I have never been nearer death than I was the day the Speedway opened. Louis Chevrolet was about to win a 25 -mile race. I dashed out to the middle of the track for a close-up. All the cars then burned castor oil and the smoke was terrific. I couldn't see beyond Chevrolet's car. A split second after I had snapped my picture, Bob Burman's car loomed out of the smoke coming 80 miles an hour, straight for me. He couldn't possibly veer more than a few inches. I froze in my tracks and sucked in my breath-and the car brushed my clothing.

## Folding Youth Bed Fits the Back Seat

HAVE you ever wanted to take young children on an overnight car trip? Or carry an awkward piece of furniture that would not quite go into the trunk? A folding platform placed ahead of the rear seat of the family sedan will solve both problems. It costs little to make, and anyone with a hammer and saw can put it together in an hour or so.

Scrap lumber about $3_{4}^{\prime \prime \prime}$ thick can be cleated together, as in the platform shown, or you can use a piece of plywood. Cut legs just long enough to raise the platform level with the cushion. Locate them so they are braced by the cleats when open.


When not in use, the platform folds flat, and stores nicely in the luggage compartment.

Platform consists of two sections hinged together. Each half has three hinged legs, the inner one located to clear the drive-shaft tunnel. Screen-door hooks lock the legs in position.


## Ways To Dress Your Doorway


#### Abstract

A canopy over the front entrance will accent it pleasingly, and as a bonus give shelter where you need it most.


DOES the door to your home open right into the weather? On such an entrance, a canopy would provide shelter while a person waits at the door, fumbles with a key, or opens an umbrella. And if your house is one of a row of look-alikes, a canopy will set it off from its neighbors.

Here are four typical houses to which canopies have been added. Note how greatly such a small addition changes the appearance of each house.

The flat-roof type, suggested for the house at the top of the page, is supported on two-by-fours and has a latticework for vines. The roof framework also may be two-by-fours, covered with sheathing or $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ ex-terior-grade plywood, with roll roofing or sheet copper over that.

The curved canopy is hung in brackets of $3_{4}{ }^{\prime \prime}$ outdoor plywood. Its roof rafters can be bandsawed from two-by-sixes. Over its sheathing or $\frac{13 / \prime \prime}{\prime \prime}$ outdoor plywood, the same kind of shingles or other roofing that is on the rest of the house should be used.

The hip roof for the canopy shown on a two-story house is harder to build. The necessary angle cuts call for careful layout and good carpentry. Don't tackle one like this alone unless you can do finicky work.

The modern cantilever roof at the bottom of the page is supported by a $4^{\prime \prime}$ lally column, anchored down against wind uplift. Rafters can be butted and toenailed, or hung by strap hangers, into a framework of tripled two-by-sixes. Ideally, the other rafter ends should be extended into the house and secured to the plate, but they could be notched into a member spiked on over the sheathing.

Adequate flashing to keep rain out between the house and canopy is vital. A flat roof should have enough forward pitch to shed water, and a gutter to lead it off.Carl T. Sigman and William L. Ward, Jr.

Hang Up Your Gloves to Dry Them
This simple wooden rack holds a pair of rubber gloves for drying. Two ${ }^{1 / 2 \prime \prime}$ dowels are fastened in a plywood base with waterproof glue. Space them about $234^{\prime \prime}$ apart and round off the tops. They should be smoothed by wetting, allowing to dry, and then sanding to remove raised grain. Repeat until no grainraising occurs. The base can be painted to resist dripping wa-ter.-Walter E. Burton, Akron, Ohio.


## Easy Way to Display Your Prints

Stainless-steel cap strip, used for edging tile board, makes attractive frames for glass-covered prints (below). Attach two lengths of capping to the wall, spaced so that the glass just slides between the strips. Framed in this way, prints can be changed easily.-G. H. Kuhn, Amsterdam, N. Y.


Your Small Wrenches Will Always Be Handy If You Carry Them This Way

## How to Defend Defense Metals

## Conservation begins at home. Properly guarded, many of your appliances should last forever.

THESE headlines tell a story we all should consider carefully-less steel for automobiles and refrigerators, less aluminum, tinware, and stainless steel for pots and pans, less copper or brass for civilian use, and less nickel, silver, and chrome for ornaments and household appliances.

You can help-both yourself and your country-by making your present metal articles last longer. Few metal articles except machine parts and tools that are subjected to hard use wear out in service. Instead, they corrode because they are neglected, or are worn out by bad cleaning methods. Properly cared for, most solid metal gadgets should last a lifetime. Even plated

ware can be kept in good shape for years to come. Making metals last longer is chiefly a matter of preventing corrosion and cleaning them properly.

## Making Your Oun Cleaners

Good ready-made cleaning and polishing compounds for all common metals can be bought in grocery and department stores and gas stations. If used discreetly, these should be harmless and effective. For those who like to make their own, several inexpensive and easily put together formulas that are harmless and effective are included in this article.

It also helps to know a few chemical and mechanical quirks of different metals. You can find these out by performing the simple experiments illustrated below.

Corrosion of iron and steel is caused by the reaction of these metals with oxygen and
moisture. Since the product, rust, is porous, it holds moisture and so accelerates corrosion of the metal beneath. Before rust can be stopped, existing rust must be removed. On large pieces this can be done with a wire brush or steel wool.

Iron and steel building materials, after being cleaned of rust (or when first installed), can be protected by first coating them with a metal primer and then with two or more coats of good oil paint. Tools can be protected by keeping them in a dry place and wiping them occasionally with lubricating oil, or with special oil-base corrosion preventives sold in hardware stores and gas stations.

## Electrons Are Mischievous

Often corrosion is speeded up tremendously by electrolytic action. Whenever two different metals are in contact in a conduct-

Simple Tests Show How and Why Metals Corrode


SILVER. Put a little
 iron sulphide into a glass jigger. Put this and a silver spoon inside a wide-mouth jar. Add a drop of dilute sulphuric acid to the sulphide. This will produce hydrogen sulphide gas. Cap jar tightly. Leave the spoon there overnight, and it will blacken, as at left. Sulphur compounds in foods and the air tarnish silver.


COPPER AND BRASS. Green film that forms is usually a carbonate caused by reaction of copper with carbon dioxide and moisture. To see this, put a polished strip of copper in each of two screw-cap jars. Pour a little water into both. To one, add a half teaspoon of baking soda and a little vinegar. Cap both jars tightly as soon as the carbon dioxide bubbling stops. Next day, the strip exposed to moist carbon dioxide will be green. The other will be bright.

ing solution, the metals act as the plates in a battery cell, and the more active metal tends to dissolve. Tinware furnishes a good example.

Since tin is a relatively soft metal, tinware should never be cleaned with harsh scouring powders or steel wool. Food can be dislodged from a pan by soaking in hot water that contains a detergent, then gently scraping the utensil with a wooden spoon.

## Some Films Are Protective

Galvanized iron-iron coated with zincalso sets up electrolytic action when the coating is broken. But in this case the zinc, being the more active of the two metals, tends to react and spread a protective coating of zinc oxide over the iron. This protective action, however, cannot go on indefinitely. So if the zinc coating becomes worn away too much or broken, paint the article.

The green film or patina that forms on unprotected copper and brass is usually a carbonate of copper caused by a reaction with carbon dioxide and moisture. If it forms on the inside of cooking utensils, it must be thoroughly removed because it is poisonous. Unlike iron rust, however, copper carbonate protects the metal beneath from further action. Whether it is desirable on copper gutters, roofs, and decorative objects, therefore, is just a matter of taste.

Silver tarnish is caused by sulphur compounds in foods and in the air. Hydrogen sulphide from the smoke of factories causes silver to tarnish more rapidly in cities than in the country. Tarnish can be retarded by wrapping stored pieces tightly in cellophane or tissue paper.

Tests made by the Bureau of Standards indicate that tarnish can be removed from silver with less loss of metal by-using the


TIN AND GALVANIZED WARE. Tinware is usually sheet iron coated with tin; gaivanized ware is iron coated with zinc. When intact, both coatings resist corrosion and protect the iron underneath. If coating is broken, electrolytic action occurs. But the results differ with the two types of ware. You can see this by scratching a tin can and a piece of galvanized ware (top photo) and leaving them in a damp place several days. Less active chemically than iron, tin causes iron to corrode faster than if it were not coated-and the scratch will spread. Zinc, being more active, produces a corrosion product that protects the iron-and keeps scratch from spreading.

STAINLESS STEEL. A thin coating of oxide produced by heating darkens the outside of polished stainless steel. You can duplicate this by holding a polished steel strip in a candle flame. Such a coating is so thin, however, that you can remove it easily from highly pol-
 ished ware with metal polish or a mild scouring powder and from less highly finished pots with steel wool.


ALUMINUM. Such pots darken when alkaline substances are cooked because impure aluminum oxide is formed. They also blacken if you cook foods that contain iron, the iron being deposited. Boil water containing soda or spinach in an aluminum pan, left. You can then brighten the pan without effort by boiling water containing vinegar, right. In actual cooking, acid foods such as tomatoes or sauerkraut will do the same trick. The dissolved aluminum oxide is apparently harmless and tasteless. Iron is beneficial.
simple electrolytic method shown on this page than by laborious hand polishing. If the silver does not come up as bright as you would like it, rub it with silver polish.

## Aluminum and Magnesium

Aluminum is exceedingly active chemically, and its surface oxidizes immediately in air. Fortunately, this surface film is so hard and compact that it stops further oxidation. Ordinary oxidized aluminum still reacts, however, to acids and alkalies-even weak ones used in cooking and cleaning. Alkaline scouring powders and cleaners should never be used. They darken and pit aluminum.

Magnesium is such an active metal that it rapidly acquires a dull coating, either white or gray, in moist air. Corrosion then stops. Vinegar and water will remove it.

Nickel plate and polished chromium can generally be cleaned satisfactorily with nothing more than a soft cloth moistened with warm water and a little mild soap or synthetic detergent. If this is not sufficient, use a mild scouring powder. You can make this as shown on the next page.

To clean silver: Electrolysis makes it easy to make flatware sparkle. (But don't use it on hollow ware, knives with cemented handles, or silver with a French or oxidized finish.) Just put the pieces in the bottom of an old aluminum pan or in a glass baking dish, the bottom of


To store silver: Make a bag from cotton flannel. Soak the material in a solution made by adding an ounce of zinc acetate to each pint of water. Squeeze out excess solution and dry the bag. Silver stored in bag won't tarnish. Wash the stored silver before using it.
which is covered with a strip of aluminum foil. Pour in a near-boiling solution made by dissolving a tablespoon each of washing soda and table salt to each quart of water. When tarnish disappears, rinse the pieces in clear water and dry them thoroughly.



To remove rust from tools: In a quart of water, dissolve a tablespoon of oxalic acid or a similar amount of acid-type automobile coolingsystem cleaner. Heat the solution and immerse your iron and steel tools. Use tongs or rubber gloves-the solution is caustic and poisonous. Rinse in clear water and dry the tools well after the rust has disappeared.


To clean magnesium: Griddles and similar articles can be swabbed with a solution made by diluting a little vinegar with an equal amount of water. Magnesium and its oxides readily dissolve in weak acids. But such cleaning is merely for looks. The coating protects the metal.


To make scouring powder. Measure out nine parts of whiting (from a paint store) and one part of trisodium phosphate (Oakite or Dif). Mix by shaking together in a box or bag for several minutes. This is an inexpensive, nonscratching, and effective compound for cleaning porcelain, brass, copper, nickel, chromium, and stainless steel. Wet with water.


To clean brass or copper: An old reliable formula for removing tarnish is salt wet with vinegar. After the pieces have been cleaned up, brush on clear lacquer to keep them shiny.

To make silver polish : Buy precipitated chalk at a drugstore. Make a paste by moistening with household ammonia that you have diluted four parts water to one of ammonia. After rubbing off tarnish, rinse the silver.


Thus indicator will help you keep track of the kerosene or oil left in a back-yard drum. ## Shop Light Moves Where Needed

This counterbalanced shop light gives the light you need just where you need it. It's fully adjustable up and down and side to side.

It consists of a pulley that rides along a taut supporting wire over the bench, and a weighted cord tied to the lamp socket. If the counterweight is right, the lamp stays put. Make sure there's no weight on the electric wire and leave enough slack for travel.


## Insulation Straps Cut from Tin Cans

While I was insulating my water pipes I ran out of pipe-insulation straps. So I snipped out the strips from empty fruitjuice cans. I punched an opening at one end and cut a tab at the other. These straps work as well as the regular ones, though the sharp edges have to be handled with care.-A. J. Fauldner, Syracuse, N. Y.



New dyes, stains, and paints make it easier . . . but your floor should first be cleaned and acid-etched.

## By Steve Mashek

IT'S now easier than it used to be to color your concrete floors, indoors or out. To meet the growing use of slab floors, manufacturers have perfected new colorings that are both attractive and durable.

Coloring concrete floors is still a lot more work than painting wood. But when you see what the new dyes, stains, and rubberbase paints can do for your porch, terrace, sidewalk, basement, or garden path-well, you'll find it worth the trouble.

Dyes and stains give roughly similar results, but differ in make-up and application. They are popular for outdoor use where evenness of color is less important. Unlike even the best paint, they won't rub off under hard wear. But if the density and surface condition of the concrete is not uniform, or it is badly stained or spotted, the color is
apt to let such imperfections show through.
Rubber-base paints, made especially for concrete, will uniformly color any concrete surface. Such paints are excellent for the slab floors of many modern homes and for basement recreation rooms. They also may be used on outdoor surfaces.

I put one of the chlorinated rubber-base paints to a pretty severe test in my own home after a disastrous experience with an ordinary oil paint. That paint peeled, cracked, and wore off badly where the traffic was heavy. With drum and disk floor sanders, plus a good deal of elbow grease, I removed the worst of it and replaced it with two coats of rubber-base paint. After two years, this floor is still in excellent condition -and my household includes four active children and a dog.

Hardeners. There are excellent products for hardening and dustproofing concrete. They are easier and cheaper than stains or paints, but they don't do much to beautify the surface. However, you might be inter-

Spot cleaning to remove oil, grease or soap stains can be done with a lye solution. Pour the solution on shavings or sawdust and let it
stand overnight. Then scrape the spot with a putty knife or old chisel. Repeat the treatment if the stain is stubborn.
ested in one of them for a shop or basement.
To treat a clean, dry floor, you just spill some of the hardener from a bucket and spread it with a mop or brush.

But if you want color, you must use stain, dye, or paint. Stains come in a lot of colors and can be used alternately. This enables you to make concrete look like varicolored stones. Typical dye colors are tile red, maroon, brown, and a soft green.

In rubber-base paints, many different colors are available, and by mixing these you can get just about any shade you want. My gray-green mixture is very attractive. A neighbor of mine used two gallons of concrete (light) gray to a quart of dark brown to get a neutral tan shade for his living room.

You can also tint rubber-base paints with oil colors, but there is some risk involved. If the concrete should later become damp, one manufacturer warns, the color might be affected.

That's why rubber-base paints were born. Oil-base paints peel off concrete when the concrete gets damp. Alkali is leached out of damp concrete, and softens the paint. Rub-ber-base paints are not affected this way.

Before a slab is colored in any of these ways, it should be cleaned and acid-etched.

Cleaning. The kind of cleaning required depends on the condition of the concrete. If your floor only needs a general cleaning, scrub it with a solution of trisodium phosphate dissolved 1 lb . to a gallon of warm water.

If your floor has oil paint on it, you'll have to remove all the paint before staining or dying. One way to remove paint is with lye.

[^7]But wear rubber gloves when you work with it. Goggles are a wise precaution, too.

Mix a solution of 1 lb . of lye to a gallon of water. Dissolve the lye slowly and be careful that it doesn't splash on you. Pour the solution on the painted concrete and let it stand an hour. Then scrub it with a stiff brush and flush the surface with plenty of clean water.

If you would rather not use lye, you can remove the paint with a floor sander. Use open-coat silicon carbide paper No. $3 \frac{12}{2}-20$, or No. 4-16 where there are several coats of old paint. You'll also need an edger to get close to the walls.

Even when using rubber-base paint, the makers would like you to remove all old paint. If you neglect to take off small patches that are not sticking properly, they will raise and peel when you apply the first

Dyeing. Pour dye in flat-bottomed container. Use stiff brush. Careful watching for light or glossy spots and hard scrubbing are needed.



General cleaning can be done with trisodium phosphate-1 lb. to a gallon of warm water. Scrub with a stiff brush (above) and then wash
with clean water. Etching with acid (above) removes slick surface from well-troweled concrete. Wear rubber gloves and boots.
coat of rubber-base paint. If that happens, however, you can scrape such places, spotcoat them, and cover them with the second coat of paint.

Besides old paint, you may have to remove spots of oil or grease. And in a laundry room there may be spots of soap. To remove oil, grease, and soap, spread sawdust over the spot, soak it with lye solution overnight, scrape it off, and wash it with hot water.

Acid etching is the second step. This removes the slick surface and opens pores so stain or dye can penetrate the concrete and get a good grip. It is more important before staining or dyeing than it is before painting. I know from experience that you can get by without etching most concrete, but the results are less satisfactory.

One gallon of muriatic acid mixed with

Staining. Apply with a paintbrush. First coat will foam. Brush it out just enough to get rid of the foam. Work to a wet edge.

2 gallons of water will etch 150 to 200 sq. ft . Mix it in an enamelware crock or a wooden bucket if possible. A galvanized bucket will do, however, if you first coat the inside with vaseline or axle grease.

Slosh the solution on the concrete and scrub it with a long-handled brush. It will fizz when it hits the floor. It should. That means it is working. Don't try to spread it too much. Work it in. You may need two or more applications. Keep it up until there are no more spots that feel slick to your touch. For small, stubborn areas, use a 50 percent solution.

When you're finished de-slicking, flush the floor with plenty of clean water and let it dry thoroughly. Outdoor slabs usually dry quickly, but a basement may take a couple of weeks.

Dyeing. Figure on 1 gallon of dye to

Painting. Second coat of rubber-base paint is being applied to this floor. Such paint goes on very much like ordinary oil-base paints.

each 175 sq. ft. Pour it into a flat pan and keep it stirred. Apply it with a long-handled brush. Keep putting it on for about 20 minutes-until the first part of the floor has taken on an even, dull tone. Then go over this area again, scrubbing in more dye. This is called fixing. If any glossy spots show, scrub dye off them and into light areas.

When you have dyed the whole floor and it has dried overnight, examine it in good light. If there are any glossy spots, just rub them hard to remove the excess dye. Then give the floor a day or two to dry (give a damp basement a week).

Dressing completes the job. It comes with the dye, and can be either the standard type or what is called the no-buff kind. If you use the standard dressing, scrub it on with that long-handled brush, give it an hour to dry, and then polish it with the same brush. If the brush sticks to the surface, let the floor dry a little longer. Clean your brush in turp and let it dry before you polish with it.

The only maintenance such a floor will require is occasional dry mopping or sweeping with a floor broom. When the dressing begins to wear off after months of hard use, simply put some more on the worn spots and buff as before.

Self-polishing dressing is brushed on, a full, wet coat, and let dry overnight. A gallon covers about 400 square feet.

Staining is a three-coat job, if you use one of the special concrete stains recently put on the market. You begin by brushing on the stain, putting it on quickly. It will
foam, and you should brush out the foam and then leave it alone. To avoid lap marks, work to a wet edge, just as in painting.

Give the first coat about eight hours to dry and put on a second coat in just the same way. The finish coat, however, is a different material that is sold along with the stain. Before applying it, you should mop the stained surface with water and hose it off to remove any residue. The finish coat is spread on with a soft cloth. It completes the coloring process, and also gives protection.

Rubber-base paint goes on very much like oil paint, and requires a thoroughly dry surface. You'll need a gallon of paint to put the usual two coats on 150 to 200 square feet of floor.

In addition to the paint, you will need some of the special thinner that is supplied for it. Ordinary paint thinner or turpentine will not work. You may want to thin the first coat slightly for easy brushing. And you'll need thinner for brush cleaning.

Allow 24 hours drying time between coats and after the second coat is put on before doing much walking on the floor.

The solvent used in this paint has an odd and rather penetrating smell, but not an unpleasant one. Don't leave any food-especially anything absorbent like butter-exposed in the room or it will pick up a strong flavor from the paint while it is drying. end

## The Correct Way to Solder Phonograph Plugs to Shielded Wire

Cut off $2^{\prime \prime}$ of braid and bare $1^{\prime \prime}$ of the inner conductor. Flare out end of the braid with a pointed tool. Slip the plug over the
wire until the bare tip comes through the prong. Flow solder down the wire into the prong. When the conductor is firmly bonded, clip off excess wire. Then solder the flared braid to the neck of the plug.

A jet engine powers the model. Loaded with a fuel pellet, the engine weighs $1 \underset{4}{1} \mathrm{oz}$. For each flight, you ignite a wick that sticks out. One pellet gives a 15 -second burst of power.

Model builder's $\mathbf{3} / \mathbf{4}$-ounce, 1 -footwide flying triangle resembles new experimental military aircraft.

$\mathbf{W}^{\text {OULDN'T }}$ you get a boot out of seeing a jet plane that you had built yourself zoom into the sky? This model will give you that thrill-and something more. You'll have the kick of working from a design based on the delta wing, currently among the hottest experimental-aircraft ideas.

Launched with a rubber-band catapult, it whistles up some 50 feet. Then the jet engine takes over and boosts the altitude an-
other 50 or 100 feet in swift 100 -foot spirals. The flight distance averages 1,000 feet, with 2,000 not uncommon.

Its engine is a Jetex 50, an English product distributed here by American Telasco Ltd., of New York. It burns a nonexplosive gas-producing pellet of guanidine nitrate.

Complete with engine, the $12^{\prime \prime}$ model weighs ${ }^{3} / \mathrm{oz}$.

Building the model. Trace the wing and fin on $1 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ balsa, using the accompanying full-size drawings. Cut with a single-edge razor blade or sharp knife. Sand both sides smooth and round off edges. Support the sandpaper with the flat of the hand, rather than a block, to prevent scoring fine grooves in the surface.

Lay out the fuselage on the balsa block so the flat sides correspond to the straight surfaces that contact the wing. After sawing the two pieces to shape, coat the joining surfaces with cement, allow it to dry, then recoat, and pin the parts together until set.

Slip-in wings are not recommended because the high speed requires rigid cementing of the wing to the fuselage.

Form a catapult hook and loop from $1 / 32^{\prime \prime}$ steel wire. A 10 -foot strand of $1 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ flat model airplane rubber makes a good beginning catapult. Later, you may want to try two strands or a loop.

Finishing. Sand the model all over with fine paper. Used dry, No. 400 waterproof paper works fine.

Apply several coats of colored dope diluted with an equal amount of thinner. Orange yellow is attractive and highly visible against either sky or foliage. An all-over coat of fuel proofer will give the model a dressy finish without adding much weight.

Is it safe? In flight, the engine case may reach a temperature of $260^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$., and must be allowed to cool before handling. The manufacturer claims the jet gases do not reach flame temperature. I have found, however, that the hot case and gases of my model scorch anything they contact. Nevertheless, this model is as safe to operate as anything involving matches and flame.

Just be sure to start fights at least 300 feet from any building or dry grass.

Glide-test it first. If possible make your tests-as well as the later power flights-on a grassy field to avoid damage to the model.

Flex the wing trailing edge up to correct for too steep a glide. Add weight to the nose to correct a stall. Use rubber bands or


Cut wing parts and fin from a strip of $1 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ by $3^{\prime \prime}$ quarter-grain balsa. This is stiffer, smoother, and more speckled than ordinary balsa. Its use is a must for a warp-free wing.


Slice off stabilizers, bevel edge slightly, and cement back on with rear edge raised $1 / \mathbf{s}^{\prime \prime}$. Manicure boards are handy for such beveling. Buttjoin the two wing sections with cement.
clay for temporary balancing, and embed equivalent metal weights for permanent correction. For a slight turn, raise the trailing edge on the side toward which you wish the model to turn.

Preparing for a flight. Attach your catapult to a five- or six-foot post, and release the model from near the ground, holding it near the fuselage between the thumb and index finger. Try this out before you attempt a power flight.

Bank the model opposite to the natural turn direction, and it will go into a spiraling climb, finally rolling into a gliding turn in the opposite direction. A one-length stretch of the rubber is right for the first catapult attempt. Later, for greater speed, you may increase this to three or four times the unstretched length.

Always insert the engine into the clip in
the same position wavoid changes of the thrust line.

And finally a power flight. Prepare for a catapuic taunen in the usual way. An instant before releasing the plane, light the wick. A convenient way of doing this is
with a burning piece of common chalk line.
The plane may slow down a bit before the jet starts to push. But when it does, you will see sudden acceleration, and the model will shoot away at dazzling speed on your first jet flight.

END


Use lightest balsa you can find for fuselage. Top and bottom sections are both cut from one $12^{\prime \prime}$ length as shown here. Jigsaw the pieces just outside the line. Then sand smooth.


Carve fuselage to follow the top template after cementing the two pieces tozether and marking a center line at top and bottom. Streamline with coarse, medium, and fine paper.


Using a twist of sandpaper, smooth $11 /{ }^{1 \prime \prime}$ screw-driver-access holes drilled in the belly skid. Cement fin and tow hook in place with double coating for strength. Sand fin to airfoil section.


Attach the engine clips after cementing wing to fuselage. Substitute $3 / 3^{\prime \prime}$ No. 2 wood screws for those that come with engine. These will hold better. Avoid tightening screws too much.


Decorating. Outline cockpit with a small brush, using black or aluminum dope. Fill in remaining area. Apply fin decals of your own choice. Protect with coat of hot-fuel proofer.

Flying tip. For sure-fire ignition, tamp wick tightly against charge and avoid sharp bends in wick. Keep protruding end of wick less than $1 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ long to prevent spark damage.


## Mother Will Appreciate Woodwork Like This

## This copy of a Colonial wall box for clay pipes makes an unusual ivy holder.

THE American colonists used decorative boxes like this to hold their long-stemmed clay smoking pipes. An authentic reproduction makes a handsome plant holder and the little drawer is a handy cache for house keys, playing cards, stamps, or other small items. Hence, it's a welcome Mother's Day gift.

In colonial times, the pipe box was a valued possession and often was made of fine mahogany, black walnut, or selected maple. I used old pine boards, resawed to 4", to make the one shown here, but any $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ wood will do.

The patterns given for front and back are half-patterns, to be laid out on both sides of a center line. Any conventional method of drawer construction can be used, but be sure that the grain of the drawer front runs vertically to match the wood above it. Use a drawer pull of matching wood, or brass.

Glue and brad the parts, and then round and sand all edges on the face of the box. Finish with water-thin coats of shellac, well rubbed down, and polish to a fine gloss with a wax polish.-J. P. Arnold, Doylestown, Pa.



Wood Frame Supports Fan in Window


This summer put your bedroom fan where it will do the most good-in a window. You can mount it in a simple frame of $3 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ or $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ plywood as shown below. The dimensions are for a $31^{\prime \prime}$ window and $12^{\prime \prime}$ fan, but they can be easily modified to fit other sizes. Make two overlapping sections and rout slots in the smaller one so the frame can be inserted in the sash channel, widened, and locked in. Bolt the fan to a baseboard and attach the base to the frame with shelf brackets. Cushion the bottom of the base with a sheet of felt. Varnish the frame and join the sections with brass bolts and wing nuts. Run the fan at low or half speed.Robert Hertzberg, Jackson Heights, N. Y.

Need a man-size ash receiver for your workshop? Use a coffee can. Make a lip by snipping two $2^{\prime \prime}$ slits and bending out the cut section. Double over the sharp edges. Water or sand in the bottom will extinguish your smokes and also weight the can.-G. Breuker, Brooklyn.


## Parallel Bar Made from a Ladder

A parallel bar can be made from an extension ladder cut into three pieces and then braced and bolted together. Legs should be bolted to stakes driven into the lawn. The small platform below this one helps little Martha Buck, of Ainsworth, Iowa, reach the bars. She won't need it when she's taller.


Maybe you have this same problem in your home: a 15 -month-old toddler (persistent too) who likes to open cupboard doors. I solved the problem of keeping them closed very simply-without secret catches. What did I do?

I put two ordinary cupboard latches on each door, spaced as far apart as possible. The child can't open the doors because he concentrates on only one latch at a time. -Theodore Hall, Willoughby, Ohio.

# How to Make Dutch Doors 

Their swinging halves add charm and convenience to a home.

You can make your own for much less than you can buy one.
Here's a choice of two.


This one's easy . . . and fine for a modern home.

FTOR the lower section, cut a piece of $1 / 4 \prime$ outdoor plywood to the width of your doorway and the height at which you want the break. Cut a second piece $\overline{5}_{8 \prime \prime}^{\prime \prime}$ shorter. Build a frame for this lower section of $1 \mathrm{k}^{\prime \prime}$ square stock, rabbeting the top member ${ }_{58}^{5 \prime \prime}$ by ${ }_{5 / 8 \prime \prime}^{5 \prime}$. When the ${ }_{1 / 4 \prime \prime}^{\prime \prime}$ inside panel is added to this; you'll have a ${ }_{88}^{5 \prime \prime}$ by $7_{8 \prime \prime}^{\prime \prime \prime}$ rabbet. Cut a corresponding one of the same size in the bottom rail of the upper door half.

Assemble the frame with waterproof glue and nails. Then glue and nail the plywood to both sides of the frame, setting and filling over the nails.

Upper section. This consists of four pieces of two-byfour, lapped together. Cut a $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rabbet $11_{2}^{\prime \prime \prime}$ deep around the inner edges on the side that will face outward. The glass goes here. Cut $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ by $1 / 1^{\prime \prime}$ wood strips to hold it in place.
Hanging the door. Work with the door as a unit so far as possible. Install a vertical latch bolt on the inside to lock the two halves together. Use a pair of butt hinges on each section. Dress off the outer edges as necessary to make the door fit perfectly.
Glazing. Use double-strength glass. After you are sure the glass fits, apply putty all around the rabbet. Bed the glass against the putty. Set the wood strips in place and nail them to the frame, driving the nails in parallel to the glass.



## This Diamond-Light Door Displays Craftsman's Skill

Take measurements from your old door, allowing $1 / 81$ extra on each side for final trimming. Allow $13 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ more in the length of all stiles to compensate for the lap of the top and bottom sections. For good proportions, make the top section a bit shorter than the bottom.

Cut the stiles and rails to length and square the ends. Lay out all parts on the floor in proper position, recheck for length, and mark adjoining pieces. In the drawing you'll notice that a $2^{\prime \prime}$ widening strip is doweled to the top of the bottom rail for an over-all width of $8^{\prime \prime}$.

Drilling for the dowels. Accuracy is important in drilling holes for the dowels. If possible, use a doweling jig for this step. After cutting the dowels to length, clamp the rails and stiles together for a dry run to see if you have a perfect fit.

Then take the bottom section apart and cut ${ }_{8}^{3 \prime \prime}$ by $5_{8 \prime \prime}^{\prime \prime \prime}$ grooves on the center of the inner sides of the stiles and rails. Reassemble the section to cut the cross braces. Rip these $4 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ wide from the $2^{\prime \prime}$ by $6^{\prime \prime}$ stock.

Fitting the cross braces. Take measurements directly from the assembled framing. Draw a center line down the middle of each piece and line this up with the frame corners. Next, scribe in the corners with a knife (not a pencil). Then scribe lines where the two braces cross. Identify each piece and corner with matching marks before cutting.

Now draw lines $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ beyond and parallel
Plywood wedges fit into bottom panel as shown at right. Notice that outer edge of each wedge aligns with the tenons cut on ends of the braces.

Miter the cove molding into the bottom panel and nail the pieces in place after removing your clamps and dressing off excess glue and any high edges.

Cut $3 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ slots $5 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ deep in inner edges of the bottom-section stiles and rails. Run slots to rail ends. Stop them short in stiles (above).
to the scribed lines at the end of each brace piece. Cut on the new lines. This extra length allows for $3 /{ }^{\prime \prime \prime}$ by $1 / 2^{\prime \prime \prime}$ tenons to secure the braces in the frame.

Half-lap the braces by cutting on the lines scribed where they cross. Be careful to get a neat fit on both sides. Run a ${ }_{88 \prime \prime}^{\prime \prime}$ groove $5_{8 \prime \prime}^{\prime \prime}$ deep along both edges of both braces and cut $3_{8 \prime \prime}^{\prime \prime}$ by $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ tenons on all four ends.

Remove one stile and clamp the braces in place. Now place the entire assembly on top of your sheet of $38_{8}^{\prime \prime}$ plywood and scribe the triangular panels. Add $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ to the scribed

Half laps join the muntins and stop strips at points where they cross. Careful mitering is
required where the ends ioin the outer framing. Glue and nail the stops in place.
line around each triangle. Cut on this new line. Assembly with glue and addition of molding then completes the bottom section.

Making the upper section. Glue up the rails and stiles of the upper section before cutting the framing for the diamond lights.

On the outside of the door, $1^{\prime \prime}$ by $1^{\prime \prime}$ muntins frame the diamond-shaped panels of glass. On the opposite side, the glass is retained by stop strips and molding.

Rip the muntins and stop strips from waste left from the $2^{\prime \prime}$ by $6^{\prime \prime}$ stock. Frame the inside of the opening with $3 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ by $1^{\prime \prime}$ strips. Then fit $1^{\prime \prime}$ by $1^{\prime \prime}$ muntins diagonally from corner to corner, half-lapping in the center. Next locate the exact center of each stiie and rail. Cut the shorter muntins so the ends are lined up with these center points. Half-lap the short muntins across the long ones.

Glue all the half laps and glue and toenail the muntins to the frame with finishing 1 ails, set and filled. The $11_{4}^{\prime \prime}$ by $1_{2}^{\prime \prime \prime}$ strips that run down the center of the muntins and separate the glass can be cut and fitted much like the muntins.

Cut single-strength glass to fit the sections. Then very carefully miter the cove
molding. A bevel square will help a lot in this. No putty is used, the molding being cut to a tight fit and pressed into place while nailing. When you paint the door, flow the paint into the joints.

Lapping the sections. After cleaning up both top and bottom sections of the door, make cuts for the lap where the two come together. Details are shown in the drawing.

Place a $1 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ spacer in the lap, fasten the units together with battens, and hang both units as a single door, fitting the top and bottom hinges first. Trim the edges.

Apply a sealer such as Rez or Firzite and paint the door as desired. A tubular barreltype lock with brass fittings was used on the door shown.

## Raise a Flag this Summer

## This two-part pole is easy to raise -and will serve for many summers.

HERE'S a flagpole you can put up and take down almost as easily as you raise and lower the flag itself. The pole was designed for a summer home or cottage.

It has two parts-a short post or "deadman" to be left permanently in the ground or atop the building, and a removable pole, bolted in place. Storing it away at the end of the season is no trouble, and reduces the chances of damage.

Both parts were made of $2^{\prime \prime}$ by $2^{\prime \prime}$ stock. The post was left square, but the corners of the pole were planed off. The post was painted, the pole varnished.

Because a suitable cleat was not available, a special one was made. One of the cleat bolts goes through only the pole. The other one and a regular carriage bolt hold the pole to the post. Cleat posts were made by drilling and tapping $11_{2}^{\prime \prime}$ rod. A flat filed on the cleat rod keeps it in place when the bolt is tightened.-John M. Avery, Dexter, N. Y.

## Holders Keep New Fuses Handy

You won't have to hunt in the dark for new fuses if you keep replacements near the fuse boxes in holders like those below. For plug fuses, drill $1^{\prime \prime}$ holes in a piece of $3_{4}^{\prime \prime}$ stock; for the cartridge type, make $7 /{ }^{\prime \prime \prime}$ blind holes in a strip of $1^{\prime \prime}$ by $1^{\prime \prime}$. Empty holes will serve to remind you when your supply is running low.-Walter Haase, Wethersfield, Conn.


## Its legs are made of rolling pins, coat hangers, and salad bowls.

If you need furniture for your summer cottage, why not make some yourself? This coffee table can be constructed with hand tools from parts already shaped and turned.

For pedestals and legs, you'll need two rolling pins, each at least $7^{\prime \prime}$ long, one rolling pin at least $10^{\prime \prime}$ long, two wooden coat hangers, two wooden salad bowls, and some $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ doweling for stretchers.

Saw the large rolling pin into two $5^{\prime \prime}$ lengths and file two flat areas on each piece where the legs will join. If they are longer than $7^{\prime \prime}$, cut down the small rolling pins. Saw hangers in half for legs, as at right. ' Cut the doweling into stretchers $91 / 2^{\prime \prime \prime}$ long. Dowels for joining the parts may be taken from the hanger crossbars. Bore the dowel holes, apply glue to dowels, holes, and end
 surfaces, and join the parts. Screw the bowls to the pedestals.

A picture frame backed with $1 / 1 /$ plywood makes the top. Upend the base, locate it on the plywood, and outline the bowls. Using these marks as guides, drill and countersink screw holes in the board so the screws enter the bowls, as shown in the drawing. Then brad and glue the frame to the plywood.

## Drawing-Pen Rack Is Magnetic

You can keep your drawing and lettering pens neatly arranged in a box by using small magnets and some lengths of iron wire, such as straightened-out paper clips. Cement the magnets to the sides of the box and place two wires across each pair. Attach another pair of magnets to the outside of the box to act as a door catch.-Andrew Brennan, Philadelphia.


## Fan-Driven Basement Air Cools Upstairs Room



HAVEN'T you sometimes wished you could spend sweltering days in the coolth of your basement? Ray Millholland, of Indianapolis, brings that refreshing air from his basement to cool a room on an upper floor. His simple "air conditioner" can be installed in a couple of hours in any house that has hot-air heating ducts. Besides cooling the upstairs room, it reduces basement humidity.

To duplicate his setup, you'll need an $8^{\prime \prime}$ electric fan, a few lengths of $3^{\prime \prime}$ vent pipe with an elbow, and a $12^{\prime \prime}$ by $12^{\prime \prime}$ by $12^{\prime \prime}$ wooden box. Make the box with a $9^{\prime \prime}$ hole in one side and a curved baffle facing the hole to deflect the fan stream toward the top of the box. Cut a $3^{\prime \prime}$ hole in the top.

Fit the vent pipe into this top hole, as
shown in the drawing, and into the air duct leading to the room you wish to cool. Run the pipe in as straight a line as possible to minimize resistance to the air flow through it. Put on the elbow, inside the duct, facing toward the room. If necessary, install a damper in the furnace side of the duct to keep the cold air from leaking back into the furnace.

An old vacuum-cleaner unit can be rigged up to the vent pipe instead of the fan box. Such a blower unit may run too fast, with objectionable noise, but you can slow it down by connecting a lamp bulb in series with it.

The fan unit shown draws less than 100 watts and lowers the temperature of a sec-ond-floor room by $3^{\circ}$ to $5^{\circ}$.

A wedgelike grip against the edges holds work firmly for milling. The table shown is for use with a milling attachment mounted on a lathe.

Hold-Downs for Milling. When a milling cutter must run clear across the work, ordinary clamps may interfere. The hold-downs shown grip the work firmly at the edges and do not project above it.

Each clamp calls for a plate with a bolt that enters a T slot, a collar, and two nuts, plus a piece of flat steel having a radius machined in one edge that matches that of


Sharpener Deburrs Edges. If you work sheet metal, this gadget is handy for taking the razor edges off sheared sheets. You can buy the main part - a disk-type knife sharpener - at any dime store.
Drill a $3_{8 \prime \prime}^{\prime \prime \prime}$ hole about $2^{\prime \prime}$ deep into a file handle. Cut two strips of sheet metal $5_{8 \prime \prime}^{5 / \prime}$ by $3^{\prime \prime}$, drill a hole near one end of each, and bend at $90^{\circ}$ about $12^{\prime \prime}$ from the hole. Then squeeze the long leg of each in the vise jaws to bend it up the middle as shown. Bolt or rivet the pieces to the sharpener and force the legs together into the handle.

To use the tool, simply draw it along the edge.-Will Thomas, Buffalo.


the collar. The plate must be tapped for cap screws at both ends.

With the studs tightened in the table slot a suitable distance apart, the holddown plates are set against the collars and propped against the edges of the work. The outer setscrews, with pads underneath, are turned up snug. Then the inner screws are tightened against the sloping plates (the photo at left above shows them only partly pulled down; until the plates wedge the work firmly -Joseph Tracy, Manhattan.


Spare the Drill-Press Vise. When you have to turn a drill-press vise on its side, with a clamp on its end as above, every twist of the clamp handle endangers the weak neck bridging the slot. A little too much muscle may crack the vise.

The little brass block shown is good insurance against this kind of damage. With it, you can clamp your vise as tightly as necessary with no fear of cracking it. Mill or file the block to a tight push fit. Drill across the vise for a brass pin to secure it.-Herbert Pfister, The Bronx, New York.


Coolant Brush. I found it annoying and messy to apply coolant on a long drilling job until I made a brush from an oil can. Cutting the spout short, I inserted some bristles, crimped the tip to hold them, and put coolant in the can. A swipe or two on the drill, whenever it was raised to clear out chips, wiped them off the flutes and supplied just enough fluid, but not so much as to splash it around and be troublesome.Albert Jusak, Cleveland.

## Quickie Drill Gauge.

 In grinding larger drills, you can check lip angles with two clean, new hex nuts. Line them up against a straightedge with the inside flats touching. Although the included angle is $120^{\circ}$ instead of $118^{\circ}$, this is close enough for all practical purposes. Will Thomas, Buffalo.

Chucking Taper Shanks. You can use drills and reamers having Morse-taper shanks in a regular chuck without spoiling them for use in a taper spindle. Grip the tool in the lathe chuck close to the shank, with the taper projecting, and support it with the tailstock center. Then turn a section of the taper to the maximum diameter the drill chuck will take. The drawing shows two sizes adapted for use in a $\frac{1 / 2}{2}$ "capacity chuck. For safety when working with such adapted tools, use low spindle speeds and clamps.-Bernard J. Corey, Thorold, Ont.


Collets Hold Stops. With a collet behind the lathe chuck, you can hold stops to locate work accurately for duplicate facing, turning, or cutoff operations. The stop need be only a short piece of stock.

The standard collet adapter has a big shoulder to facilitate its removal from the spindle. This shoulder prevents mounting a chuck. The answer is either a new adapter made without a shoulder, or another adapter with the shoulder removed. Insert it and the collet, mount the chuck, and position the stop inside, clamping it with the draw-bar.-J. C. Magee, Schenectady.

Measuring Bores. Ordinarily, calipers are set to inside diameters, and the measurements are then read with an outside micrometer, with a probable loss of accuracy. This is eliminated if you clamp a midget indicator to one caliper leg. Adjust in the bore so that the indicator reads zero. Then set your micrometer across the calipers as shown, turn the mike thimble until the indicator again reads zero, and take your measurement off the sleeve. I find this method as accurate as the use of vernier calipers.-Armen Bogossian, Brook-

## Kids always manage to get mitts, gloves, balls, and bats. Here's how you can give them bases and a diamond.

S
AND-LOT baseball diamonds are, in many cases, makeshift affairs. They are roughly laid out and pieces of wood or bricks serve as bases.

But it's easy to give the young players
in your neighborhood real bags for bases and a real home plate and pitcher's plate. Laying out a diamond is simple. The drawings on the opposite page give you the dimensions for both a baseball and a softball field.

Instead of the surplus utility bag shown in the photos below, you can use a gas-mask bag. Or you can sew up a bag of heavy canvas. Upholstery moss is excellent for stuffing the bases.

The bag shown below is about $10^{\prime \prime}$ by $14^{\prime \prime}$ and about $5^{\prime \prime}$ thick. Baseball rules specify a bag $15^{\prime \prime}$ square and from $3^{\prime \prime}$ to $5^{\prime \prime}$ thick. But small feet do not require that large a bag.

Home plate and the pitcher's plate are each made of two pieces of $3_{4}^{\prime \prime \prime}$ plywood held together with nails and glue. For the spikes that hold the plates in place, use sharpened pieces of broom handle or big dowels. Bore holes for the spikes through only one piece of the plywood. Drive a nail down through the other piece into the head of each spike.

An old Army utility bag can be converted into a sturdy base.


Stuff the bag tightly with upholstery moss. Don't remove any of the tie straps or the car-

rying strap until after sewing. With one corner sewn shut, pack moss tightly into corners.


Sew the bag with heavy thread. A curved upholsterer's needle makes the job easier. Cut off

carrying strap and sew it around bag. Grommet is used to tie bag to stake driven in ground.



A window-ledge bird feeder can be made from any fairly light, wide board-a sheet of ${ }^{1 / 2 \prime}$ waterproof plywood is ideal. This one is held in place by two hooks and a pair of corresponding screw eyes in the sill. Nail a batten to the underside of the board where it will bear against the window frame and steady the tray. And tack strips of molding around the top edge to keep the seed from scattering. Finish with an outdoor paint if desired. $-L$. G. Gibson, Oakton, Va.

## Emery Cloth Makes "Knurled" Knob



If a thumbscrew or knob is too smooth to afford a good finger grip, cement a strip of abrasive cloth around the rim with any good cloth-to-metal cement. The photo at left shows how the ends of the cloth are cut to form a strong, neat diagonal joint.-Walter E. Burton, Akron, Ohio.

## Washers Keep Drawer Knobs Tight

Drawer knobs won't work loose if you insert washers cut from sandpaper between the knobs and the drawers. Glue two sheets of fine or medium sandpaper back to back. When the glue is dry, scribe circles of the required size with the point of an old compass or dividers, and cut them out.-Arthur Trauffer, McClelland, Iowa.


## How to Make Quick, Clean Connections with Shielded Wire

When you use shielded wire in your electronic hookups, you can save yourself time and get better, cleaner results by separating the inner conductors from the braid as shown in the photos below.

First, bend the wire double and spreaddon't cut-the braid with a sharp pick. When
the inner wire or wires are uncovered, pull the braid straight to prevent binding and work the first wire back through the hole (center photo below). Finally, twist the braid a couple of times to stiffen it. If it's too flimsy, flow solder on it. Use braid for ground connection.


# How to Improvise a Signal Generator 

You can align radio circuits with a record player and another radio set.

WHEN you build or service a superhet receiver, you often run into the problem of aligning its circuits so that they will work together properly. Professionals do this with a signal generator, but it can be done if necessary by simply "borrowing" the right frequencies from a working set and using them to adjust the ailing one correctly.

Audio test. To be sure the trouble is not in the audio part of the set you are working on, you need a source of audio signals. Although these can be tapped off a "healthy" set, it's easier to get them from a record player, which supplies a clean audio signal of the right impedance and voltage. The leads from the record player that ordinarily are connected to an amplifier are used. If your player has a phonograph plug, you can separate the two leads by soldering short wires to the contacts of a matching jack.

Connect one of these leads to the chassis of the radio you wish to test and start the record player. Then connect your other lead to the grid of the output tube (point $A$ in diagram on next page). If you're not sure which tube-base pin goes to the grid, check it in a tube manual. If you hear the record through the radio's speaker, the output stage, speaker, and power supply are functioning. Checking similarly at the grid of any other audio tube in your receiver (such as point $B$ ) will tell you whether that part is working properly.
I.F. alignment: You can then proceed to align the intermediate-frequency stages with another radio. It should operate at the same I.F. frequency as the set you wish to align. Nearly all superhets now have standardized 455-465 kilocycle I.F. circuits.

If both sets are AC-DC types, you should be sure that their power plugs are polarized the same way to avoid shorts. Plug in and turn on both sets, and connect a neon tester across the two chassis or grounds. If the tester lights up, reverse one of the line plugs. Then see what happens when you connect the tester between one chassis and a water pipe. If the neon bulb lights, reverse the power plugs of both radio sets.

After plugging the sets in properly, tune in a strong station on the one that's operating. Don't bother tuning the other one, but connect the two chassis with a test lead in which a $.01-\mathrm{mfd} .400-$ volt condenser has been inserted. Put a similar condenser in a second test lead and connect one

end of the lead to the plate of the mixer tube in the operating receiver．Insulate the other end of the lead and touch the grid of the last I．F．amplifier tube（point C）in the set you wish to align with it．

With a small screwdriver or neutralizing tool（a non－metallic screwdriver），adjust the trimmer screws on the following I．F． transformer．Work first on the secondary trimmer，then on the primary．This changes the frequency of the transformer and，at some point，should allow sound to come through to the speaker of the set being aligned．Adjust trimmers for peak volume．

Move the test prod to the plate of the mixer tube（test point $D$ ）and adjust the trimmers on the first I．F．transformer．If the set you＇re aligning has two I．F．stages， （two tubes and three transformers）you have to align the extra transformer by re－ peating Step $C$ on the middle stage．

Once you have adjusted the I．F．trans－ formers for maximum response by this method，you can put aside your improvised signal generator and do the rest of the job by ear．（For further steps in tracking and aligning a superhet，see PS，March＇51， p．236）．－Joseph A．Saldana，Ft．Lee，N．J．

## How to Improve Kitchen Shelves

## Dividers can be put in quickly by anyone handy with tools.

VERTICAL dividers on a kitchen shelf will make it easier for your wife to store platters and odd-size plates. Here are two ways to make them, using $1 / 4 \prime \prime$ plywood.

If the shelf can be removed, or in new construction, cut $1 / 4 \prime \prime$ by ${ }_{1 / 4 \prime \prime}^{\prime \prime}$ grooves in the
shelf for the bases of the dividers (Fig. 1). Support the dividers in corresponding grooves cut in a back plate notched into the shelf. Use $1 /{ }^{\prime \prime}$ " stock for the back plate.

If you prefer not to disturb the shelf, you can make grooves by nailing in plywood strips (Fig. 2). Once the dividers are in place, a retaining strip keeps them there.

In either case, allow $2^{\prime \prime}$ space between the cabinet wall and the first divider to allow for the slight overhang of the hinge strip. Vary the dimensions if your shelf is wider or narrower than the $11^{\prime \prime}$ shown here.

## New Plastic Surfacing Material Is Applied Like Linoleum

A new plastic surfacing material, called Versibond, has a flexible rubber backing. It is suitable for use on sink and cabinet tops or as wall paneling and can be readily bent or coved. Unlike the rigid laminates, it is applied by contact pressure with an ordinary hand roller. Scissors, a linoleum knife, or a coping saw easily cuts the material, which resists cigarette burns. # Mechanics of Farming 



## By Ladd Haystead

- Because crop plants breathe during the daytime and rest at night, a new weeding technique to eliminate grass in cultivated fields has been developed in California. Light petroleum oils spread between the rows destroy the grass, but do not harm the growing crop. The reason for this is that the structure of grass is such that oil applied at any time will kill it. By morning, however, it has evaporated so that crop plants are not harmed by it.
- One of the greatest hazards of farming is the harvest-time loss of crop--estimated by some as high as 50 percent--caused when rain comes at haymaking time or early freezes make the corn soft. Driers that appeared after the war were not satisfactory, but shown here is what may

be the answer. It is a portable jet drier that will handle better than 100 bushels of corn per hour. The machine has a GE jet and a Habco heat exchanger that develops about 30 percent more drying efficiency than previously obtainable. The machine can be adapted for overhead bins, batch, or continuous drying.

Isolated areas, where commercial power lines are uneconomic, may get a boost from a new power plant under development at Oregon State College. It is a portable turbine operating on gas generated by burning sawdust, hogged wood, or shavings.

Noted in this column last month was the destructive 15 B wheat rust. Fluorescent-lit greenhouses at the


## Mechanics of Farming

University of Manitoba are now forcing three growths a year to test a new type of wheat that will resist this damage. Hopes for it are high.

At the N.Y. State experimental station in Geneva, a machine familiar to roadworkers has been converted into a farm tool that will sterilize five cubic yards of soil in two hours. Two blowtorches mounted in a revolving drum eight feet in diameter destroy fungi that cause "damping off" of seedlings.

- "It is the judgment of many scientists that if [plant] breeding research were to be discontinued, within a decade most of the varieties of crops now grown would succumb to diseases and the result might be starvation for millions of people," says Dr. R. M. Salter, Chief, Bureau of Plant Industry, U.S. Department of Agriculture.
- Adding high-purity oxygen to incubator air has improved the hatching of stronger and better-feathered birds in California and Utah. The theory is that eggs are starved for oxygen at higher altitudes. Further experiments will be carried on by the Linde Air Products Co. to see whether this treatment at sea level also will produce "two-day birds" at hatching.

Double-paned glass with a dry air space between to give insulation is gaining wide acceptance among farmers. According to Libbey-Owens-Ford Glass Co., it is being used mostly where controlled temperature and humidity is desirable, such as enclosures for livestock, poultry, and milking. In many instances a southwall installation has been chosen to utilize solar heat.

■ Notice to flies who don't mind DDT: Coming your way is Allethrin, a synthetic that has all the killing properties of pyrethrum, but no prospective wartime shortages. Allethrin, it is claimed, will kill where alternative poisons won't. The Bureau of Entomology and Plant Quarantine says that the new synthetic will provide a reserve against possible shortages of pyrethrum, an oriental import.

## Tank Cuts Water-Heating Cost

My automatic water heater proved costly until I installed the setup shown. It preheats water with heat normally lost up the furnace smoke pipe and stores the heated water in a tempering tank. ## How to Make a Plastic Clock Crystal

If the rectangular crystal on your alarm clock is broken, you can make another of unbreakable plastic.

First you need two wooden dies. Measure the outside dimension of the old crystal and cut a hole $1 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ larger, but of the same shape, in a piece of scrap wood. Trim down the cut-out waste block $1 / 41$ all around, and nail it to a larger piece of wood. Use $1 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ Plexiglas or Lucite for the crystal. Immerse the plastic in boiling water for a few minutes until it becomes soft and pliable. Place it over the hole in the die while still hot and smoothly and quickly press down on it with the small die block. Remove the excess plastic around the edges so that the crystal fits properly over the clock face.-William E. Danneman, Chicago.

## Clamping Block Loops Up Lamp Cords

To shorten overhead lamp cords, make this little clamp from scrap wood, plastic,
 or hard rubber. Cut a block ${ }_{3}^{3 \prime \prime}$ by $1^{1 / 2 " 1}$ by $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ and round off the corners. Bore two ${ }_{4}^{1 / \prime \prime}$ holes in the block, with centers $7 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ apart, for the lamp cord to pass through. Bore a centered $3 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ hole through the side of the block to take a round-head machine screw 1" long. With a hacksaw, slice the block in two, edgewise.

To shorten a cord, insert it in the block, as shown, and clamp tight with the screw, two lock washers, and a wing nut.

## Radioactive Thread Treats Cancer

A new tool in the treatment of cancer is a radioactive thread that a surgeon stitches into place. Made by inserting a radioactive cobalt wire into an extremely narrow nylon tubing, the thread is said to be flexible enough to limit irritation of the tissue. After a treatment is completed, the thread is removed like a conventional suture. Dr. William J. Myers, of Ohio State University Medical Center, developed the method.

## New Mold Drug Used to Fight TB

A close relative of streptomycin, and effective against tuberculosis germs that resist streptomycin, viomycin is still another addition to the powerful disease-killers derived from molds. When used in treating tubercular guinea pigs at the Mayo Foundation, researchers found that the new drug caused a definite slowing up and healing of the disease.

How birds know exactly when to start their long migratory flights is still an unsolved problem. Certain physiological changes, involving the disposition of fat in the body, however, are believed to be one important factor in tipping off the birds that it is time to migrate.

## Last minute news \& notes...

A UNIVERSAL FUEL, something that can be used in jeeps, tanks, jet planes, or what have you, is being sought by the U.S. armed forces. It would simplify supply problems, but "mechanical octanes" would have to be built into all types of engines to accommodate it. Contracts for experimental work on such engines are being let, but the outlook thus far is not encouraging.

AUTO MAKERS report that, despite the fanfare about the automatic transmissions, 200,000 more cars with overdrives (PS, April '49, p. 180) were sold in 1950 than in ' 49 , and production of these units has continued at a fast pace this year.

VETERANS who want to go to school or take correspondence-school training should do so pronto. In most cases, the Veterans Administration reports, they will lose their educational benefits if they have not started their courses by July 25, 1951.

X-RAY PICTURES now can be developed without a darkroom and examined by a doctor 45 seconds after they are taken. It is done with a new selfdeveloping film (PS, Jan. '51, p. 138) devised by the Polaroid Corporation. The armed forces will get it soon, and it is scheduled to be available for civilian use by the end of this year.

ELECTRIC SHAVERS, garage-door openers, and other such aids to modern living may be shelved in the next war. They send out electromagnetic radiations that the Defense Department says the enemy might use as homing signals to guide his bombers and missiles.

HOW MUCH LIQUOR an unconscious man has had now can be determined. It's done with an electrical instrument, devised at Yale, called an Alcometer. It will help distinguish between drunkenness and illnesses that
sometimes make a man act as though he were drunk when he isn't.

THE BEAVER, the high-wing monoplane built in Canada especially for bush pilots (PS, Nov. '49, p. 154), will be used by the U.S. Air Force. It won out over eight U.S. planes in recent liaison aircraft evaluation tests at the Wright-Patterson Air Force Base near Dayton.

A HIGH WIND high in the atmosphere, known as the jet stream, has been shown to be partly responsible for the weather down where we live--because it affects the pattern of lowerair movements. Canada and Sweden now are using data regarding it in their weather forecasts, and the U.S. Weather Bureau is including it among the factors on which it bases five-day forecasts.

AN ATOMIC SUBMARINE would be "a wolf that could go after its prey" rather than "a spider that must wait quietly for its victim to approach," the authorities say. Building the first one is expected to cost $\$ 40,000,000$, which is about four times the cost of a fleet-type submarine now.

A ROAD REBUILDER to reduce the need for detours has been developed in California. It uses old material in paving that is to be replaced. The asphalt is softened with a light oil, new material is added, and the road is instantly repaved as the rejuvenator moves down the highway.
