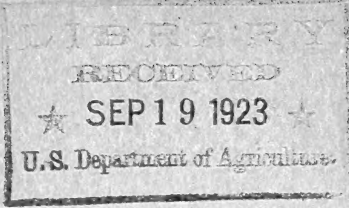

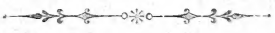

### Directions For Planting Small Evergreens.

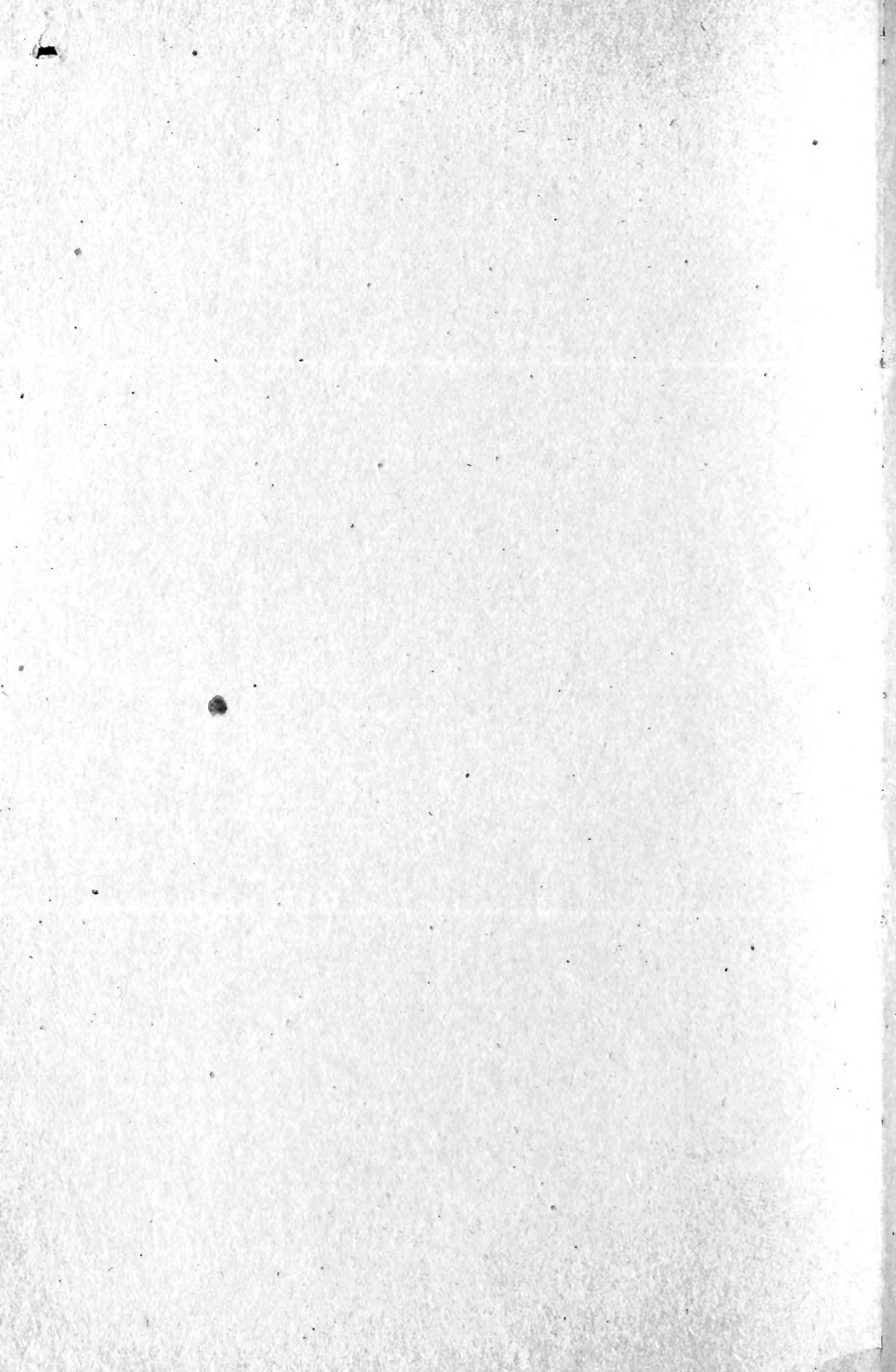
Never leave the roots of Evergreens exposed to the sun or dry wind for one minute. As soon as they arrive the package should be opened and the roots dipped in thin mud and planted in beds, in well worked garden soil as soon as possible, pressing the dirt firmly around the roots. If the weather is very dry, water occasionally and shade well with brush or boards the first season after which they can be transplanted to their permanent place. Evergreens planted in this way can be grown with as much certainty as apple trees.

Our small Evergreens are from seed bed except when noted as transplanted.
