





## Narcissi or Daffodils

HESE are among the most charming of our spring flowers defying in their earliness the rough winds of April to grace our borders and lawns. Plant them in masses, or have a few pots or pans in your window garden, but by all means grow some.

The Giant Trumpet class is recognized by the central crown or cup being as long or longer than the perianth (the petals surrounding the crown). The Medium Trumpets are distinguished by the crown or cup being shorter than the Giant Trumpets, measuring from those having a very shallow cup to the ones whose cups run one-third the length of the surrounding petals.



Peonies planted in September and October become well established and will give some blooms the following year. In the spring, work in bone meal and sheep fertilizer with the surface soil.

## AMARYLLIS-Giant Hybrids

Pot the bulbs so that they are firmly imbedded in the soil with half of the bulb exposed above the surface. Place in the dark for three to four weeks in a temperature of 50 to 60 degrees until well rooted. Bring to a sunny window and water sparingly until growth starts, after which water regularly and add a little liquid manure once a week. After blooming, take good care of the leaves until they turn yellow, then store bulbs in a cool dark place until repotting time next fall.
